U.S. Air Force B-52s return to Europe for ally, partner training

Six U.S. Air Force B-52 Stratofortress bomber aircraft from the 5th Bomb Wing, Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, arrived Aug. 22, 2020, at RAF Fairford, England for a long planned training mission where the aircraft will conduct theater and flight training across Europe and Africa.

The strategic bomber missions, which have been occurring since 2018, provide theater familiarization for aircrew members and opportunities for U.S. integration with NATO allies and regional partners. The bomber missions enhance readiness and provide the training necessary and respond to any potential crisis or challenge across the globe. There have been more than 200 successful flight sorties coordinated with allies and partners since the Bomber Task Force missions began.

"B-52s are back at RAF Fairford, and will be operating across the theater in what will be a very active deployment. Our ability to quickly respond and assure allies and partners rests upon the fact that we are able to deploy our B-52s at a moment's notice," said Gen. Jeff Harrigian, U.S. Air Forces in Europe and Air Forces Africa commander. "Their presence here helps build trust with our NATO allies and partner nations and affords us new opportunities to train together through a variety of scenarios."

Ongoing planned bomber missions showcase the Air Force's ability to continue to execute flying missions, sustain readiness and support our allies and partners, regardless of any external challenge to include the current global COVID-19 crisis response or other current events within Europe and Africa.

• Lake Sakakawea elevation, Aug. 24: 1,841.43 feet above mean sea level (MSL); 26,400 cubic feet per second (CFS) Garrison Dam average daily releases.

Devils Lake elevation: 1,449.65 feet above mean sea level (MSL). Stump Lake elevation: 1,449.61 MSL.

• N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: North-central area lakes remain slow. Missouri River tailrace continues producing catfish. No Lake Sakakawea or Devils Lake reports.

• Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Continued fair to good for walleye using a variety of presentations with smaller fish in the shallows. Work deep for larger fish. Try along the highway or slip bobbers around New Mil Bay and Pelican Lake.

• Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: Continued fair activity at Lake Darling. No reports from other area lakes.

• Lake Metigoshe, Four Seasons, Bottineau: Continued bluegill and pike success with occasional nicesized walleye.

Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Work a variety of depths for walleye on the east end of Lake Sakakawea. Small fish more active during the day in 14 to 35 feet. Work shallower in late afternoon and evening for larger fish. Try pitching jigs shallow or pulling crankbaits in deeper water. Slower presentations seem to be better. Also try slow death hooks. Most activity is around the mouths of bays but try working up into bays, as well.

• Lake Sakakawea, Indian Hills Resort, Garrison: Continued small walleye success. Work 22 to 28 feet with nightcrawlers.

 Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River tailrace slowed for catfish, possibly due to highly variable water releases from the dam, depending on the time of day. Try rocks at night using crankbaits for walleye. Slow from boats. Lake Sakakawea continues producing walleye off points in 35 feet. Move around with better success in the morning. Try Riverdale Bluffs. Fair to good for salmon in 85 feet and deeper using white-on-white presentations with smaller squids. Also try herring and flies. Work from the intake structure to Deadman's Bay with most activity along the face of the dam to Government Bay. Look

with better success around the south end of the Van Hook around Independence Point in 25 to 30 feet. Some smallmouth bass success around White Earth Bay. Try the pump house on the Missouri River for walleye. Good for catfish, too. Blacktail Dam producing panfish. • Lonetree WMA area lakes,

Four day trips for Dakotans

State tourism officials are encouraging North Dakotans to ride out the coronavirus by enjoying day trips to special destinations in the state. Here are four:

• Theodore Roosevelt National Park

This over 70,000-acre national park stretches from Medora to Watford City and is full of outdoor activity opportunities such as hiking and mountain biking. It is named in honor of Theodore Roosevelt, who ranched in the North Dakota Badlands. The park is home to wildlife such as bison, wild horses, elk and bighorn sheep.

• Maah Daah Hey Trail

The Maah Daah Hey Trail's 144 miles can be hiked or ridden by horse or by bike. The trail travels through the North Dakota Badlands and the Little Missouri National Grassland. For an extra challenge, visitors can ride one of the Badlands Race Series races that stretches across the trail. Devil's Lake

Devil's Lake is North Dakota's largest natural body of water and is known as the "Perch Capital of the World". Fishing is a popular activity on the lake, as the lake has large numbers of fish such as walleye, northern pike and white bass. Aside from fishing, visitors can expect opportunities such as birdwatching, hunting and scenic hikes and drives.

• White Horse Hill National Game Preserve

Overlooking Devil's Lake, White Horse Hill National Game Preserve is a refuge for birds and other wildlife. Visitors at White Horse Hill National Game Preserve can observe wildlife like bison, elk and white-tailed deer. A mile-long selfguided trail can be followed along a wooded stream and a wooded terrain to observe wildlife and scenic views.

COVID complicates normal summer fun routine



Lake Metigoshe State Park has seen a significant uptick in visitors this year, according to Park Manager Bill Demming.

During what normally would have been the beginning of a busy season, Jeff Baker of Rez Famous Lemonade on the Turtle Mountain Indian Reservation is kicking off June with local lemonade sales to drive-up customers.

Summer on the reservation in north-central North Dakota is typically busy for Baker with weekend powwows and the occasional car show or community event. While he normally expects about 16 weekend business opportunities between April and November, this summer is different.

"Our main venue is weekend powwows," Baker said. "Now, basically 100% of those have gone away. That's 95% of my business, other than midweek selling."

Delvin Cree of New Town, a member of the Turtle Mountain Band, said smaller powwows were held when he was younger and would be a beneficial possible alternative after the loss of the annual big powwows this summer.

"I know in my family we have several dancers and I kind of would like to see them have a small powwow like we did decades ago," Cree said. "Today we have the pandemic that is preventing us from having gatherings and we have the (protest) situation in Minneapolis. We dance as a prayer for everyone. In a sense, that's how we pray."

The cancellation of local powwows is one of the ways North Dakota is impacted during general limits on travel this summer throughout the country. According to research conducted by Longwoods International, 69% of American travelers are changing their summer travel plans due to the pandemic.

Sara Otte Coleman, director of tourism and marketing for the North Dakota Department of Commerce, said the department "did kind of retool our marketing" to encourage dollars spent closer to home.

"We know that people have tremendous interest in North Dakotans discovering what's right here in state," Otte Coleman said.

The North Dakota Tourism

Division launched a campaign at the beginning of 2020 encouraging North Dakotans to "follow your curiosity, not the crowds". Otte Coleman said this was to urge North Dakotans to explore recreational opportunities within the state that they hadn't before in place of a typical trip outside the state.

Some of the encouraged activities include mountain biking on trails such as the Maah Daah Hey Trail in the Badlands and taking day trips to some of North Dakota's lesser-known local recreational opportunities.

Otte Coleman said the state lost \$428 million in visitor spending between March 15 and May 15. A large part of visitor spending for North Dakota typically comes from Canadian tourism, which has been halted by Canada's closed border.

"Having the border closed has definitely been a bummer for us," Otte Coleman said. "The win for us would be if we can differentiate ourselves as a safe alternative for visitation for this summer and fall."

In some parts of the state, the summer is already booming with North Dakotans visiting local destinations instead of traveling out of state. At Lake Metigoshe State Park, Park Manager Bill Demming said the area has seen a large uptick in guests compared to last summer.

The park opened up for full service on May 21. For the next three weekends, every campsite and almost every cabin has been reserved, Demming said.

"It's pretty much unheard of that every one will be rented this far out," Demming said. "At least on the weekends, we're experiencing quite the uptick."

Some guests visited Lake Metigoshe early to quarantine in the area, drive through the park and use the trails that were still open. For extra precaution, Demming said staff at the lake have increased the amount of cleaning all facilities, and public restrooms are closed from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. to allow for extra time to deep clean them.

Half of the picnic tables on the west side of the park have been removed to make room for social distancing and hand-washing stations. Traditional amphitheater programs at the park have been put on hold in place of safer activities such as a virtual egg hunt on Easter and scavenger hunts around the park. "It's really been very popular," Demming said about the safe alternative activities that have been introduced. "We've had a lot of positive feedback on social media for providing these services."

As the summer begins and North Dakotans start to explore the state, Otte Coleman said it would be a great time to discover new and different ways to safely have fun.

"Our communities are really taking a great approach to opening up some of the larger group functions using our ND Smart Restart protocols," Otte Coleman said. "I feel really confident that visitors can enjoy the amenities they expect to."

Continuous Process Improvement Earning The Green Belt

How can we make things more efficient?

How do we maximize operations with the resources we have?

Where do we weed out waste? Continuous Process Improvement, or CPI, is an online education program that has been developed. The goal of CPI is to, implement a Green Belt training program to provide total force military and civilian members with knowledge on Lean, Six Sigma, Theory of Constraints, Plan Do Check Act, facilitation techniques, and practical problem solving to facilitate CPI development.

"Congress reviews the programs, and then provides funding," according to Marc C. Green, Manpower Analyst, "and as it is with most programs, we are expected to do more with less. The CPI program is designed to leverage creative individuals to come up with innovative ideas to create maximum efficiency."

"The eLearning is intended to standardize and broaden Air Force capability to establish an innovation and improvement environment that is more capable

of identifying, evaluating, testing and scaling opportunities across the Air Force, and beyond, to produce more effective and efficient outcomes that result in excellence in all we do."

The long-term goal is to establish CPI as fundamental skills airmen relentlessly use in pursuit of more efficient outcomes in every task, process and organization.

"The Air Force is the most innovative branch of the service" according to MSgt Christopher Reeves, "and Green Belt certification is designed to maximize the innovation process with the training they need to develop and employ skills to maximize the process."

The CPI course is a 3-month course that combines studentpaced computer based training with three scheduled class meet ups where the student can interact with a mentor to hone their new skills. "Graduates of the Air Force Green Belt training earn a USAF Green Belt training certificate, 3.3 Continuing Education Units (CEU) credits, and a Specialty Experience Identifier."

"The course is modelled to look like civilian programs like Sigma Academy." Green continues, "This is a fantastic opportunity as graduates of this program are highly sought after and will receive higher pay when they move into the civilian sector."

In addition to the online Green Belt certification course, the 5th Force Support Squadron offers monthly three day Lean Six Sigma and Practical Problem Solving Method classes where students can learn the fundamental skills needed to evaluate and improve processes within each organization right now. It is highly encouraged for students who are interested in attaining Green Belt certification to do both, the online and local class, as students are able to take advantage of the in-class exercises to work on finding solutions for process issues they may have at their work centers.
