Test launch demonstrates safe, ready Minuteman III deterrent

AIR FORCE GLOBAL STRIKE COMMAND PUBLIC AFFAIRS

BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE, La. (AFNS) ---

A team of Air Force Global Command Airmen launched unarmed an Minuteman III intercontinental ballistic missile equipped with a test reentry vehicle at 12:03 a.m. Pacific Time Sept. 2 from Vandenberg Air Force Base, California.

The test demonstrates that the United States' nuclear deterrent is safe, secure, reliable and effective to deter twenty-first century threats and reassure U.S. allies. Test launches are not a response or reaction to world events or regional tensions.

The ICBM's reentry vehicle traveled approximately 4,200 miles to the Kwajalein Atoll in the Marshall Islands. These test launches verify the accuracy and reliability of the ICBM weapon system, providing valuable data to ensure a continued safe, secure and effective nuclear deterrent.

"This operational test launch is the culmination of months of hard work and preparation that involve multiple partners," said Col. Omar Colbert, 576th Flight Test Squadron commander. "I couldn't be more impressed with the team that we partner with to successfully execute this mission. The men and women from the 90th (Missile Wing), 91st (MW) and 341st MWs, 576th FLTS, Air

Force Nuclear Weapons Center, and the 30th Space Wing here at Vandenberg, among other mission partners, made this look easy, but it was far from that. Our phenomenal results are a testament to the dedication and professionalism of these proud organizations, and their hard work sends a visible message of deterrence to the world."

The test launch is a culmination of months of preparation that involve multiple government partners. The Airmen who perform this vital mission are among the most skillfully trained the nation has to offer.

The missile came from the 91st Missile Wing, but due COVID-19 restrictions, maintenance actions were performed by technicians from the 91st and 90th Maintenance Groups and missile combat crews were supplied by all three Missile Wings as well as the 576th Flight Test Squadron. This demonstrates that even during the pandemic, Air Force Global Strike Command maintains various levels of redundant capability to assure a national deterrent.

"This operational test launch especially challenging considering the effects of the pandemic, but the task force from all three missile wings did an outstanding job coming together

to accomplish this important mission," said Maj. Patrick McAfee, task force commander. "From the deposture at Minot (AFB) to reposture, alert and launch at Vandenberg (AFB), this team exhibited the professionalism they bring every day to our nation's nuclear deterrent force."

The ICBM community, including the Department of Defense, the Department of Energy, and U.S. Strategic Command, uses data collected from test launches for continuing force development evaluation. The ICBM test launch program demonstrates the operational capability of the Minuteman III and ensures the United States' ability to maintain a strong, credible nuclear deterrent as a key element of U.S. national security and the security of U.S. allies and partners.

The launch calendars are built three to five years in advance. Planning for each individual launch begins six months to a year prior.

Air Force Global Command comprises more than 33,700 Airmen and civilians assigned to two numbered air forces, 11 wings, geographically-separated squadrons and one detachment in the continental United States, and deployed to locations around the globe. The command oversees all bomber and ICBM operations for the U.S. Department of Defense.

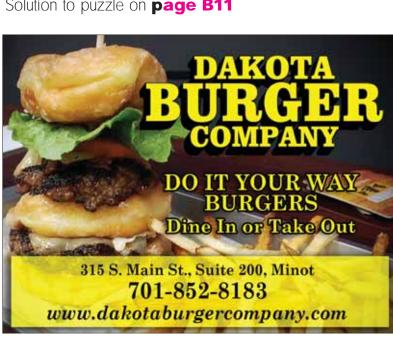

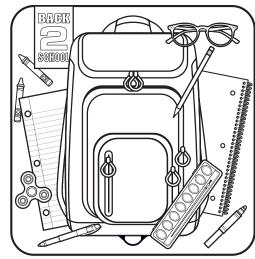

B-52s return from flights in Baltic Sea region

Three B-52 Stratofortress strategic bombers from the 5th Bomb Wing at Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, operating out of RAF Fairford, England, returned from flights in the Baltic region focused on integration and interoperability training with European allies and partners in the region, Aug 31.

"It's been an active first week for BTF. After accomplishing an impressive feat with a single-day mission that overflew 30 NATO countries, we continue to visibly demonstrate our capability to extend deterrence globally" said Gen. Jeff Harrigian, U.S. Air Forces in Europe and Air Forces Africa commander. "Our forward presence in the Baltic Sea region today shows our solidarity with NATO and sends a clear deterrence message to any adversary."

The flight included long-planned training with Belgium, the Netherlands, and the U.K. The B-52 bombers also integrated with Italian Eurofighters, German Eurofighters, and Portuguese F-16s, for an overflight of Riga, Latvia.

KC-135 Stratotanker aircraft from the 100th Air Refueling Wing, RAF Mildenhall, England, enabled the long-range strategic Bomber Task Force Europe mission by providing aerial refueling support.

Ongoing bomber missions showcase the Air Force's ability to continue executing flying missions, sustain readiness, and support our allies and partners, regardless of any external challenge to include the current global COVID-19 crisis response. These bomber missions represent the U.S. commitment to our allies and enhance regional security.

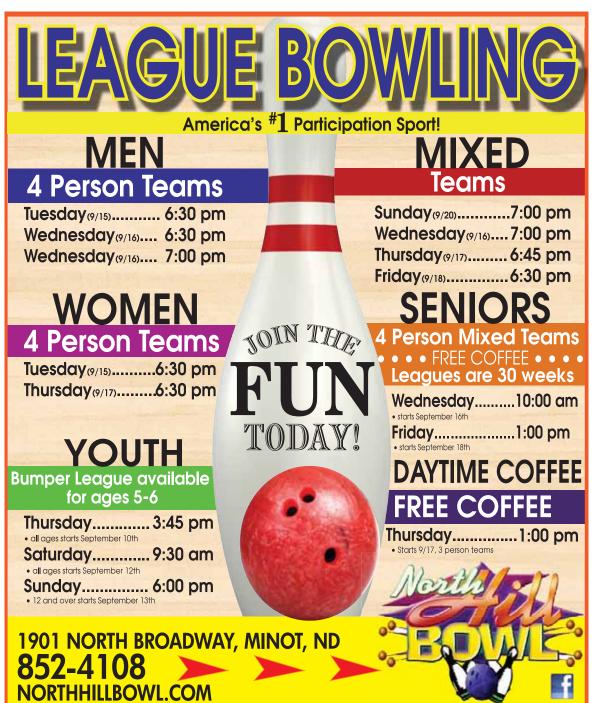

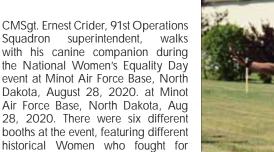

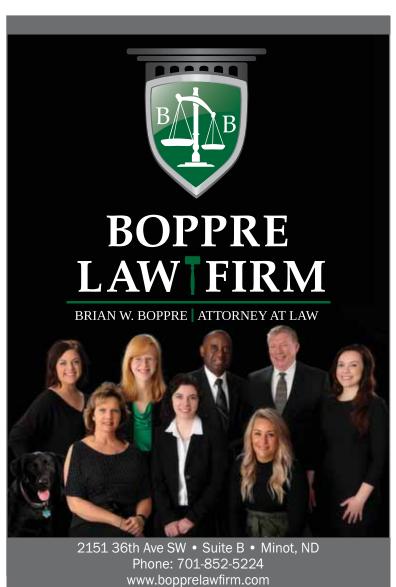

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Smooth move: PCS tips and tricks

So, it is your first time moving with the military. Or maybe it is your third, or tenth time, relocating the contents of your entire house to a new place called

During our first PCS, I felt completely overwhelmed by the details and logistics. I was a new military spouse, a new mama and traveling to a new home that transferred us nearly 3,000 miles from our family support system. I had no clue what I was doing, but I somehow managed to complete that move (and the next two) and keep my sanity intact.

Here are some packing and organization tips that helped make the transition easier, plus a few tricks that I learned for the next time.

Part 1: Before the move and pack out.

A new duty station is in your future. It's exciting and overwhelming. Here are a few tips to get you started.

1. Triple check your orders.

On the first copy of orders, my name was spelled incorrectly. On the second, they listed my husband's birthdate inaccurately. By the third error – yes, there was a third – I was anxiously awaiting revised copies. Fortunately, after much persistence, the correctly amended document arrived just in time. Without accurate orders, you cannot move forward with scheduling everything needed to relocate – make sure you triple check the details.

2. Obtain Power of Attorney.

Power of Attorney (POA) is an excellent document to have on hand for many situations. It is helpful to obtain one before your PCS, so you can sign forms in lieu of your spouse. Even if they are scheduled to be home for the move, we all know last minute things happen, and plans often change. It is one less stressor to be able to continue your move without worrying if your service member will be home while the packers load up your household goods (HHG).

3. Purge, purge, purge.

Moving is an excellent reason to sort through that old box of clothes in your closet, organize a garage sale, recycle that miscellaneous Tupperware and donate items you no longer use. Purging through the excess also removes unnecessary items from your total weight allowance.

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checklist.

There are so many great organizational packets and binders available to choose from to help make your PCS transition as smooth as possible. I created my own binder with relevant checklists, important documents, information, travel and hotel itineraries, budget, utility bill tracker and vehicle shipment

5. Set aside pro gear.

A separate weight allowance is provided for job-specific items and tools during an official military move. This includes equipment, papers, books, field gear, reference materials and tools of up to 2,000 pounds for the service member. An additional 500-pound gear limit is available for spouses too.

6. If it is irreplaceable, keep it with you.

Birth certificates, marriage certificates, passports, medical records, sentimental jewelry and photos, and any other details of importance stay with me in my carry-on suitcase. If it cannot be easily replaced, it stays on my person during the move.

7. Inspection walk through.

TSP (Transportation Service Provider), or your carrier, is responsible for conduction a premove inspection survey of your entire home. This allows them to estimate the total weight of goods, determine the number of rooms to pack and crates needed, note any issues, and confirm your pick-up day and time. Ensure the reviewer prepares an accurate appraisal, double-check you reveal any hidden storage compartments or closets, and ask any questions you may have before moving day.

8. Record an inventory video. Pictures are worth a thousand words, but a video can provide additional protection in the case of damages or missing items. Before the movers come, take a walk-through video of your entire home, including opening drawers and cabinets, to have on hand to dispute any challenges.

9. Take décor off the walls. The movers are not responsible for removing any items hanging on the walls - this includes curtain rods, mirror, picture

4. Have a PCS binder and frames, hardware, decorative items and storage racks. Taking these things down yourself also allows you to organize them by room before the packers arrive.

10. Unplug everything.

Movers are not required to unplug your appliances and electronics. They may, however, charge you extra to complete this task. Make sure you disconnect all plugs from the wall outlets before the packers arrive, defrost and drain major appliances, such as refrigerators and washing machines, and take down any window air conditioning units.

Part 2: The move itself.

The day has come, and it's time to get the move started. It's easy to forget things in the chaos of the day. Here are my tips for the day of to keep you on track.

1. Record your serial numbers and keep an inventory list.

There will be a separate inventory sheet provided for high value items. Make sure to record the serial numbers of your electronic devices, smaller valuable items and other important equipment. Keep a copy for your records available in case any discrepancies arise.

2. Keep your drawers organized.

Empty kitchen drawers into gallon bags or large containers before the packers arrive. This keeps everything organized by drawer together, making unloading a breeze. It also ensures the utensils stay clean and free of debris.

3. Sheets and curtains in storage bins.

Wash and dry sheets, curtains, bedding and shower liners and then store them in clear plastic storage bins. The movers will usually load the entire container into a large moving box, and your items will stay clean and fresh for immediate use at your next destination. For extra freshness, I will also include a dryer sheet or satchel of dried lavender in the tote.

4. Pay for the extra insurance. Upgraded insurance will be an option provided by TMO. They will most likely tell you that you do not need it, because the military will pay for any damages. But there are some circumstances

and perils – or unforeseen events in the box will easily capture where this may not apply. For us, the additional peace of mind, and greater care by the moving company packing your belongings, is well worth it.

5. Add copies of your orders to every box.

Hopefully, all your boxes arrive at your new home as planned. If a box does disappear or end up en route to an alternative destination, a copy of the orders where those goods should be forwarded.

6. Have someone watch your

Packing up your entire home is a big project. Having a trusted neighbor or friend hang out with your kids for a few hours after the movers arrive can alleviate some stress.

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DHA launches new Air Force military hospital and clinic websites

Gen. Ronald Place, Defense Health Agency director. "This change will make it easier for our service members, retirees and families to find the information they need to navigate and access health care information. As our service members and families move across the country and around the world, having a standard website will be one less thing they will have to learn at their new location."

Upgrading the military's online resources by improving the military hospital and clinic websites, and relying on user input for future enhancements allows service members, retirees and their families worldwide to help drive future updates to ensure they get the web



experience they want from the Military Health System.

"No matter where our military forces are deployed or what service they belong to, all members will enjoy a universal experience and consistent information about the TRICARE benefit and local military health services," said Diana Logreira, DHA chief of Digital Communications.

The website enhancement is part of the transition of administrative oversight of MTFs to the DHA under the 2017 National Defense Authorization

While the new website design supports consistent information sharing for TRICARE beneficiaries throughout the entire Military Health System, local hospitals and clinics will manage their site to keep their own beneficiary population informed on issues specific to that facility.

As another alternative, some military branches will also pay for up for 20 hours of care per child during an official change of station move.

7. Organize and label your belongings by category.

Use color coded stickers or markers to label your boxes by room (ex: green = living room, yellow = bathroom, etc.). To make things even quicker to find, add the sub-category (ex: baby clothes) so you know exactly what is in each carton without having to dig through every box for that room.

8. Inspect the items your movers mark as damaged before you sign the inventory sheet.

Make sure to go over the

inventory sheet with your moving company, and double check every item marked as damaged before you sign the inventory sheet to ensure you agree with the labeled condition. Sometimes, people just sign the inventory sheet without cross referencing the notes of damage, which can result in surprises while unpacking

9. Research your new station. Maybe you have a few months before your move (or maybe just a few weeks!) but researching your new local area is advantageous. Schools, neighborhood, amenities, living on base vs. off base, area parks and attractions and specific stores in the region are some of the beneficial things to learn

about before arriving at your new home.

10. Save money.

PSC moves are expensive, and those costs can add up quickly. Often, you have a government travel charge card to absorb the expenses of your move. In our case, we were not authorized to use the card for our move. Instead, we needed to pay costs out of pocket and get reimbursed later (make sure you keep all the receipts to submit!). Saving money is crucial for unexpected events too.

- Lake Sakakawea, Van Hook Resort, New Town: Walleye remain somewhat slow.

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Department of the Air Force to survey members on interpersonal violence

WASHINGTON (AFNS) --

The Department of the Air Force will soon survey total force Airmen and Space Professionals about their experiences surrounding interpersonal violence.

The survey is scheduled to be distributed the week of Sept. 7 to all Airmen and Space Professionals including civilians, active duty, Guard and Reserve members.

"We're asking for people to

participate in a survey to help us better understand their individual experiences surrounding interpersonal violence in our ranks," said Brig. Gen. April Vogel, director for manpower, personnel, recruiting and services at the National Guard Bureau, and the interpersonal violence task force lead.

This survey is part of a twopronged approach in which the survey data and the data gathered from reviewing past cases

involving interpersonal violence will be used to identify any themes or areas for improvement. Interpersonal violence can range from stalking and bullying to domestic violence, sexual assault and abuse.

"Our goal is to determine if we are keeping our Airmen and Space Professionals safe when they are facing interpersonal violence," Vogel said. "The survey information will be used to shape our plan of action

and recommendations to senior leadership."

Survey participants may also volunteer to take part in a limited number of small focus groups by opting in at the end of the survey. Participants will remain anonymous throughout the survey process, and if members choose to take part in the focus groups, their survey data remains separate from their personal contact information. Additionally, there is an opportunity for command leadership teams to provide their perspectives.

"We encourage participation from our total force service members with anything to share regarding their experiences dealing with interpersonal violence, to include command leadership teams," Vogel said. "We want to hear your stories."

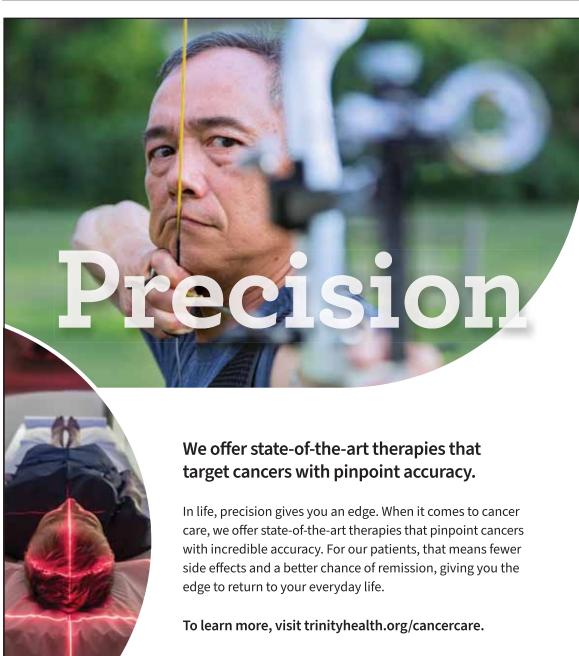
The task force stood up in July to explore processes, programs and leadership actions associated with keeping Airmen and Space Professionals safe when faced interpersonal violence situations.

Bolstering NATO alliances on land and in air

23RD EXPEDITIONARY BOMB SQUADRON, MINOT PUBLIC AFFAIRS

RAF Fairford, England --

No stranger to Estonia, Lt. Col. Michael Middents, recently completed a Bomber Task Force mission to the Baltic region on Aug. 31, 2020.

Estonia, located in Europe's region, is where Middents completed his officer Developmental Intermediate Education (IDE) at the Baltic Defence College. Middents is the 23rd Expeditionary Bomb Squadron commander currently leading the Bomber Task Force in Europe operating out of RAF Fairford.

By sending its officers to receive military education in allied nations, the United States demonstrates its commitment to its allies, in this case, to Estonia, the Baltic nations and the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. The Department of Defense encourages its members to complete trainings such as these to bolster not only the professional development of its service members but to also enhance the interoperability between U.S. service members and allied nations and partners.

"Our presence there is huge, it sends a message of solidarity," Middents said. "It shows that the United States is committed to its Baltic Allies through the college and the networking it provides.'

Middents completed IDE as a major from 2016 to 2017 with 54 other members of the course. This was not his first time in Estonia, however, he previously visited Estonia as an Air Force bomber liaison officer, which seldom happens. Middents said

that acceptance in the course is highly competitive not only within the Air Force, but also within other branches as only up to four officers are picked to attend it every year. The course is taught at the Estonian National Defence College in Tartu, Estonia, which was founded in 1919 by the then Commander-In-Chief of the Estonian Armed Forces.

The Baltic Defence College is a joint project run by the three Baltic nations of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania. The Middents attended prepares students to become joint command and general staff officers as well as trains them in the NATO joint planning process. Attendants are from countries such as the Baltics, Canada, Norway, Germany, Ukraine, Serbia, Armenia and Azerbaijan to name a few. As an Englishbased course, Middents said that he found it easy to communicate while others used English as a second or even third language.

Middents gained credibility with Russian speaking students by being able to contribute to the conversation in Russian.

"The Baltic nations joined NATO in 2004 and since then our joint exercises have enhanced the allied relationship and interoperability," said Middents.

Middents was able to apply his knowledge of the Baltics to the current BTF rotation.

Belgium, the Netherlands, and the U.K. conducted training with Middents' flight while other aircraft from Italy integrated separately for a flyover of Riga, Latvia. The task force deployed to RAF Fairford is the latest demonstration of the agile ability of the United States to generate its assets in other countries and provide bomber support to any number of its NATO allies while sending a clear message of deterrence to any adversary.

"The focus and unique part of this mission [Baltic Leg] was that we were going out there to train with the interceptor capabilities of the allies in the area" said Middents. "We trained with Italian Eurofighter Typhoons out of Siauliai Airfield in Lithuania supporting the Baltic Air Policing mission."

Baltic Air Policing is a regional security mission in which NATO nation air forces rotate out of

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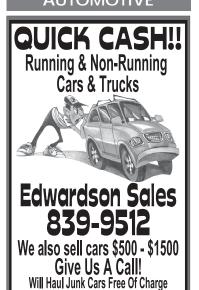


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
