

# Northrop Grumman will lead a nationwide team to deliver the **Ground Based Strategic** Deterrent program

NORTHROP GRUMMAN

Grumman Corporation (NYSE: NOC) was selected by the U.S. Air Force to modernize the nation's aging intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) system under a \$13.3 billion contract awarded today for the engineering and manufacturing development (EMD) phase of the Ground Based Strategic Deterrent (GBSD)

The Air Force Nuclear Weapons Center announced that the effort will span 8.5 years and include weapon system design, qualification, test and evaluation and nuclear certification. The EMD award follows a highly successful three-year technology maturation and risk reduction (TMRR) phase-one effort under the GBSD competition. The Northrop Grumman team has demonstrated innovation and agility by applying a digital engineering approach and has achieved all TMRR design review milestones on time and on cost.

Work on the program will be performed at the Northrop Grumman GBSD facilities in Roy and Promontory, Utah, as well as other key Northrop Grumman sites across the U.S. that include Huntsville and Montgomery, Alabama; Colorado Springs, Colorado; Bellevue, Nebraska; San Diego and Woodland Hills, California; Chandler, Arizona; Annapolis Junction, Maryland; and at our nationwide team locations across the country.



# DoD approves grant for Magic City Discovery Center

On August 10, 2020, the Secretary of Defense instructed the Office of Economic Adjustment to invite organizations to submit grant applications and proposals based upon their ranking by the Defense Community Infrastructure Pilot Program (DCIP) Review Panel. The DCIP offers grants and supplemental funds to eliminate deficiencies in community infrastructure that support military installations and enhance quality of life for military families, resiliency or military value. Here in the City of Minot, a grant proposal was submitted and accepted. In addition to locally raised funds from various organizations and contributors, the grant funds will be used to construct the Magic City Discovery Center (MCDC). The center was one of 16 projects chosen to receive a grant from

The MCDC will offer a yearround learning and recreational center for all families living in the City of Minot and on Minot Air Force Base. The center will have exhibits and programs that offer high quality educational

experiences in the principles of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math. The programs will seek to encourage curiosity in children ranging from birth to 14 years old. Additionally, the exhibits and programs will offer the opportunity for parent involvement to enhance family life. The MCDC will offer a place where families can engage in indoor activities and stimulate young minds throughout the year even through the winter months.

"We are thrilled about the DCIP grant award and what this means for our military families and entire region." said Wendy Keller, the Executive Director of the Magic City Discovery Center.

All families coming to Minot Air Force Base, and those already residing here, experience the challenges of living in harsh climatic conditions. The severe winters make it difficult for families to enjoy the outdoors. Having the MCDC will offer a safe-haven for military families to gather and build friendships while their children learn and explore. During the colder weather, military families can grow support systems to stay strong and resilient together. Located on North Hill in the

City of Minot, the MCDC will offer a variety of exciting exhibits for all families to enjoy. The Magic Climber, a 32-foot high structure, will incorporate many different aspects of North Dakota from prairie dog burrows to an oil derrick and train trestle all building up to a wireframe B-52. An exhibit called "Air Forces" will be a place where children can explore the principles of aerodynamics and learn about the power of air and wind, highlighting the bond between the U.S. Air Force and the Minot community. Guests will also see other fun and exciting exhibits like Pattern Place, Outside My Window, Water Flow and Spark!Lab Invention Center. Children and their parents can explore aspects of mathematics, the natural world, the power of water and engage in problem solving activities to address realworld issues.

In addition to all the center will provide, military members will receive military discounts on admission and memberships. Furthermore, the MCDC will implement Military Appreciation

Days to continuously offer support for families of Minot Air Force Base. Alongside the opportunities for families, the center will offer community rooms to host events for various occasions as well.

"I am truly grateful as this is another example of how the City of Minot and Minot Air Force Base continue to work together to improve the quality of life for our community and is why only "THE BEST COME NORTH!", said Col. Walters, commander of Minot Air Force Base. "The Magic City Discovery Center will create an amazing learning environment for our children and I am excited to see the difference it will make for the Airmen and families of the installation.'

Having been approved for funding from the DCIP, the MCDC will be able to break ground and get construction underway. Construction is expected to begin in May 2021 and is scheduled to be completed by April 2022. This new addition to the Minot community will enhance quality of life and resiliency by strengthening the bond within and between military families.

Devils Lake elevation: 1,449.04 feet above mean sea level (MSL). Stump Lake elevation: 1,449.04 MSL.

- N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: No new reports from the Missouri River System, Devils Lake, or north-central
- · Devils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: Wind limiting activity but work protected shorelines in 16 to 22 feet on windy days for walleye. Try spinners and live bait or crankbaits. Lots of activity around the bridges in the morning and evening vertical jigging for walleye.
- Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Look for a transition to vertical jigging with lots of small walleye yet.
- · Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: Weather slowing activity.
- Lake Metigoshe, Four Seasons, Bottineau: Scattered walleye and pike success but limited bluegill activity.
- Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Wind and cool weather limiting activity on the east end of Lake Sakakawea.
- Lake Sakakawea, Scenic 23, New Town: Scattered walleye success, wind and weather permitting. Try 14 to 30 feet with Lindy rigs and minnows or chubs. No consistent pattern or presentation.
- Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River tailrace continues producing some shore success for walleye during the day but best activity remains at night. Try crankbaits or spoons for salmon from shore during the day. Good catfish success during the day with a few trout



- · Watch duck identification with so many ducks not fully colored yet.
- Oct. 3: Nonresident waterfowl season opens.
- Oct. 3 & 4: Youth pheasant season.
- Oc.t 9: Moose season opens.
- Oct. 10: Pheasant and fall turkey seasons open.
- Oct. 11: Bonus blue-winged teal season closes.
- N.D. Dept. of Environmental Quality issued blue-green algae advisories for Epping-Springbrook Dam, Buffalo, Wood, Dry, East & West Stump, and Antelope lakes, Sather Dam, and Devils Lake.

- Lake Sakakawea/northwest N.D. lakes, Scenic Sports, Williston: Missouri River improving for walleye but Lake Sakakawea slow.
- Lonetree WMA area lakes. Harvey: No new reports.
- North-central/central N.D. lakes, Towner Hdwe. Hank, Towner: No new reports from the Souris River and area lakes.

#### **Hunting:**

 Cranes: Some scattered flocks in north-central parts of the state around the Towner area and southern Ward and Mountrail counties.

- Deer: Some archery success.
- Upland: Scattered grouse and partridge success along the eastern end of Lake Sakakawea but not much activity around the midsection. Fair grouse success around the Lonetree WMA area.
- Waterfowl: Good numbers of ducks and geese throughout areas with wetlands and lakes, including Lonetree WMA. Good waterfowl success in the Devils Lake area but not much for any in-migration of birds yet anywhere in the state, including north-central ND.

# **Ground Based** Strategic Deterrent Environmental Impact Statement

AIR FORCE GLOBAL STRIKE COMMAND

The United States Air Force is issuing this notice to advise the public of its intent to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement for the Ground Based Strategic Deterrent basing action and Minuteman III demilitarization at F.E. Warren Air Force Base, Wyoming; Malmstrom AFB, Montana; and Minot AFB, North Dakota.

The EIS will assess the potential environmental consequences of the proposal of GBSD, which will modernize and replace Minuteman III flight systems, weapon system command and control, and launch systems (launch facilities, control centers, and other ground infrastructure). It will also address GBSD and MMIII support locations at Hill AFB, Utah; the Utah Test and Training Range; and Camp Guernsey, Wyoming.

Due to public health concerns surrounding the coronavirus pandemic, the Air Force will not hold face-to-face public scoping meetings. Instead, scoping materials that would have been presented at the meetings are available on the project website at www.gbsdeis.com. For inquiries about the project, or to request printed or digital copies of the scoping materials, please contact the 75th Air Base Public Affairs Office at (801) 775-3652.

The Air Force invites agencies, organizations, and members of the public to review the scoping materials and submit comments online at www.gbsdeis.com, by email to gbsdeis@tetratech.com,

Comments will be accepted at any time during the environmental impact analysis process; however, to ensure the Air Force has sufficient time to consider public input during preparation of the draft EIS, please submit comments by Nov. 13.

The scoping process is intended to involve the public early with the planning and development of the EIS and to help identify issues to address in the environmental analysis. To effectively define the full range of issues and concerns to be evaluated in the EIS, the Air Force is soliciting scoping comments from interested local, state, and federal agencies and interested members of the public.

Air Force Global Strike

Command is comprised of more than 33,700 Airmen and civilians assigned to two numbered air forces, 11 wings, geographically-separated squadrons and one detachment in the continental United States, and deployed to locations around the globe. Mix 1/2 cup of the sour cream with the refried beans. Place in an oven safe dish and put in preheated grill. Wrap the left over brisket and pork in a double layer of aluminum foil and place in grill. Heat beans and meats for 25 minutes or until warm.

1/2 CUP CILANTRO, FINELY CHOPPED 1 1/2 CUP CHEDDAR CHEESE

To assemble double decker tacos, spread a thin layer of the heated beans on a soft taco shell and wrap that on the outside of a crisp taco shell.

When ready to cook, set the grill temperature to 325 Degrees F and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes.

Fill the crisp taco shell with the brisket and pork, guacamole, salsa, onion, sour cream, onion, cilantro, and cheese to taste. Enjoy!





# Air Force improves lactation support for nursing mothers

SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --

The Department of the Air Force recently announced new guidance that will improve support to nursing mothers when they return to work after having a baby.

The updated policy, which is effective immediately, increases flexibility with lactation breaks and also mandates access to a refrigerator for the purpose of storing human milk.

"Many women choose to continue breastfeeding after they return to work," said Christy Nolta, deputy assistant secretary of the Air Force for reserve affairs and Airman readiness. "We should do what we can to support that choice, making it easier for nursing moms to continue to serve. Changes like these contribute to readiness, and improve quality of life for our service members and their families."

In August 2019, the DAF released the initial lactation policy, which required commanders to provide nursing mothers with dedicated space in the immediate vicinity of the workplace for the purpose of pumping breastmilk. The policy was well-received, but feedback from the field suggested it needed some adjustments.

"We continued to receive feedback from the field, so we updated the guidance to further empower leaders across the

department to establish proper lactation rooms and provide overall support for nursing mothers," Nolta said.

The policy changes were championed by the Women's Initiative Team, and the changes align the Air Force with public law, Office of Personnel Management guidelines, and Department of Defense guidance. The WIT consolidated feedback, consulted with experts and routed recommendations.

"Every mother and infant are unique, and so are their breastfeeding needs," said Lt. Col. Jeanette Anderson, Air Force Surgeon General perinatal nursing consultant and women's initiative team member. "The amount of time needed to produce breastmilk varies from woman to woman, and this updated policy recognizes that."

The changes, which are outlined in an Air Force guidance memorandum signed Aug. 15, detail responsibilities and procedural steps to better enable commanders to align the needs of nursing mothers with mission requirements by supporting nursing mothers with a private, secure and clean area within unit facilities.

"Breastfeeding is incredibly important not only to the individual mother-baby dyad (care for the two individuals as a unit in the first three months

post-partum), but also in the role it plays more broadly in the health of our women and children," said Lt. Col. Larissa Weir, doctor of medicine and fellow of the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology. "Policies which support breastfeeding and promote increased duration of breastfeeding are policies which promote the overall health and readiness of our force."

Under the new policy, unit commanders are required to meet the needs of breastfeeding women by identifying a private area as a lactation room within unit facilities. The room may be temporary or permanent, depending on needs and availability. Lactation rooms must be private, lockable from the inside, sanitary, and have access to refrigeration, hot and cold water and electrical outlets.

"Transitioning from maternity leave to work can be a difficult time," said Tech. Sgt. Natalia Wood, aircraft maintenance Airman and Women's Initiative

Team member. "Having a dedicated, clean pumping space and a cold storage solution at work allowed me to harmoniously take care of my family and accomplish the mission. The Department of the Air Force's continuous commitment to providing practical lactation spaces assures me the military cares about my family and my readiness."

Voter registration and ballot request deadlines for the November 2020 elections are as early as Oct. 5 2020 in some states. Voters should complete a Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) each year to ensure they are able to participate in elections

as military absentee voters. Send completed voting forms and ballots to your local election officials.

If you've already completed a FPCA in 2020 and requested electronic delivery of your ballot, you'll be receiving your blank ballot or instructions for how to access your ballot soon, if you haven't already received it. If you're not sure about the status of your absentee ballot request, contact local election officials where you're registered to vote, or check the status of your registration via your state's voter registration verification website.

To allow time for mail processing and vote counting, return your paper ballot to your election officials by Oct. 5, 2020. After you send in your ballot, you can verify that your election office received it.

Many U.S. elections in the past 10 years have been decided by a margin of less than 0.1%. All states are required to count every absentee ballot as long as it is valid and reaches local election officials by the state's deadline.

# 5 pandemic-proof activities

COVID-19 restrictions have sucked the fun out of 2020, military members and veterans across the country are proving that enjoyment during a pandemic is still possible.

Outdoor activities (running, hiking, biking, camping, paddle boarding, lawn games, etc.) are still on the docket, as well as video games, home gyms, niche virtual communities and more.

Esports

"Since the pandemic hit, we have seen an uptick in people actually engaging with each other and being more social," says Travis Williams, co-founder of Military Gaming League (MGL) — an esports league specifically designed for active duty, National Guard members, reservists and veterans. "We're getting more and more games together, which is really cool. It's one of the only things you can do if you're sitting at home all day.'

Williams, a current Army reservist, started MGL in 2018 with Daniel Ball, a fellow former soldier. They wanted a way to stay connected with the military community while sharing their passion for gaming. Over 3,000 military members and veterans now hang out virtually via MGL — including a 50% upswing in month-to-month membership compared to last year.

Besides being able to compete in online tournaments and other gaming-related events, Williams and Ball say their members can experience positive mental health and career benefits.

"What's very powerful is communicating and getting outside of yourself," says Ball. "They're able to have that mental connection with folks who have

Though it may seem like the that common ground. We hear story after story of people who have said this gaming has saved or changed their lives.'

Phone a friend

Your phone can hook you up with far more than just Facebook. Consider downloading an app like REI's "Hiking Project" that shows you all your local trails, "Yonder" for getting started with 25 outdoor activities, "WildLab Bird" for help birdwatching or "FishBrain" to join the world's largest community-based fishing group.

Nature needs

While the "people portion" of many outdoor amenities may be closed (think interpretive centers or staffed boat ramps), nature is always open. Warrior Expeditions is a nonprofit "outdoor therapy" program for veterans, taking more than 250 on long-distance nature expeditions since 2013. Sean Gobin, the program's CEO, says he's seen a huge surge of military interest in the outdoors since March.

"It's so important to maintain your physical and mental health by getting outside, especially when a lot of us are working from home and getting sedentary," he said. "Nature therapy is free and accessible everywhere."

Though Gobin's nonprofit had to cancel official hikes, bike rides and boat trips for 2020, he encourages all military members and their families to get outside anyway — and if you can safely do so in a group, even better.

"Endorphins from physical activity help combat depression and burns off anxiety. It's multifaceted," Gobin said. "Also, to have your own close bubble of people you can connect with is very beneficial."

Utilize base resources

Don't forget about your base's MWR office, as well as outdoor recreation and/or Information, Tickets & Travel. Besides helping with always-open activities like camping, these resources offer up-to-date information on from-home base-sponsored entertainment.

If you're far from base, call anyway and ask what's open in your area. There's a good chance they'll know.

At-home gym junkie

Before restrictions hit, Air Force Master Sgt. Merrissa Pough participated in in-person fitness competitions. When everything closed, she went online, switching to virtual competitions while also starting a Facebook-based exercise class geared toward military members preparing for annual PT tests.

You can use equipment you have to exercise from home, Pough says — even vour children.

"You can incorporate them into your workout," said the mother of three. "To sit at home and eat and gain weight, just lose yourself, you're not putting yourself in the best position to fight off a virus."

She recommends using this time to really focus on your nutrition.

"This is a good time to take a look at what you're actually eating and learn to make better choices, make a game plan for when your schedule does pick up," Pough said.

A pandemic game plan, if you will — and one that cannot be thwarted.

### THIS WEEK IN AIR FORCE HISTORY



#### **October 2, 1981**

#### 5 FAQs about Life Estate Deeds

As attorneys, we receive a lot of questions on a daily basis. One of the topics we are asked about most frequently are life estate deeds. Many people hear about these documents from the news, articles, or friends and wonder if it is something they need to add to their estate plan. Life estate deeds are very useful tools but there are some caveats.

Here are five most frequently asked questions about life estate deeds:

- 1. How does a life estate deed work? Like a regular Warranty Deed or Quit Claim Deed, a life estate
  - deed conveys your property from you as the Grantor to someone else as the Grantee. The difference is that a Life Estate Deed reserves a life estate for you.
- 2. What does "reserving a life estate" mean?

Reserving a life estate gives you the legal right to continue to use the property during your lifetime. You would continue to care for the property and pay property taxes while also being able to live on it, farm it, rent it, etc. Once you pass away, the legal ownership would automatically transfer to the Grantees upon recording of the death certificate.

- 3. What if I change my mind? Is a life estate deed revocable?
  - A life estate deed is not revocable-at least, not without the consent of all of the parties involved. As such, you want to be very careful with life estate deeds to ensure they meet your wishes for now and for the future.
- 4. Will a life estate deed protect me from creditors?

In some cases, yes. For example, perhaps when you are elderly, you need to go into a nursing home. Nursing homes are very expensive, and you might need Medicaid to help pay for your care. If five years had passed since you signed the life estate deed, that property would not be counted against you in your application to qualify for Medicaid. However, a life estate deed might not be protected against a Grantee's creditors. For example, perhaps you convey the property to your children, reserving a life estate for yourself, and one of your children has creditors such as Judgments against them. It is possible that a lien could be placed against the property for those debts.

5. Does a life estate deed avoid probate?

It does! Because the life estate is reserved only for your lifetime, once you pass away, legal ownership goes directly to the Grantees with no need to go through probate.

# Devils Lake, Minot, Grand Forks Schools Win National Blue Ribbon Award

NORTH DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

BISMARCK, N.D., Sept. State School 24, 2020 -Superintendent Kirsten Baesler on Thursday congratulated three North Dakota schools for being honored as National Blue Ribbon Schools for 2020.

Sweetwater Elementary School at Devils Lake and the middle schools on North Dakota's two U.S. Air Force bases – Nathan Twining at Grand Forks, and Memorial at Minot – are among 367 schools across the country that the U.S. Department of Education has designated as Blue Ribbon schools in 2020.

It is the second Blue Ribbon honor for Sweetwater Elementary in the last six years. All three schools were honored as examples of academic excellence.

"To be named as a Blue Ribbon school is to be honored as one of our nation's best," Baesler said. "The pandemic has not hindered the fantastic teaching and learning that is going on at these schools, whether it is taking place in the classroom or through distance learning."

"It takes a great deal of eort to become a national Blue Ribbon School, and the teachers and administrators at Sweetwater, Twining, and Memorial collaborated, worked as teams, and rose to the occasion," Baesler

The Department of Education recognizes public and private schools in which students reach exceptional levels of academic achievement, or record substantial improvements in their students' learning. Sweetwater, Twining, and Memorial were all honored as "exemplary highperforming schools."

Nationwide, 317 public and 50 nonpublic schools were recognized as 2020 Blue Ribbon schools. There are almost 134,000 public and nonpublic schools in the United States, with about 56 million K-12 students, according to the National Center for Education Statistics. Sweetwater Elementary and the Twining and Memorial middle schools have a combined enrollment of about 530 students.

"I'm beyond thrilled. Our students and our sta have worked so hard," said Shari Bilden, principal at Twining Middle School. "We're also very fortunate to have supportive parents in our community on the base. They do put education rst,

and they do support us in many ways, and we are very thankful and grateful for that.'

The Blue Ribbon award is "going to be a really good morale boost," Bilden said. "It's something positive. There have been a lot of stressors. I think the timing is really crucial to be receiving this positive information, this positive award."



Elementary Sweetwater was last honored as a Blue Ribbon School in 2014. Schools that receive the award may not be considered for it for the following ve years, which means Sweetwater won a second Blue Ribbon during its first year of eligibility.

"It's not only an honor, it's a pat on the back to everyone who works so hard to continue to search for and practice the most eective strategies for our kids, not only for our teachers, our paraprofessionals and other sta, but of course, our kids," said Dr. Debra Follman, Sweetwater's principal.

"We really practice kids rst here," Follman continued. "With the pandemic, people have just pitched right in. Everyone is doing everything they can to keep our kids safe and everyone else safe, and at the same time, make sure our instruction is at the highest level, and learning is at the highest level."

Dr. Stephen Young, principal at Memorial Middle School at the Minot Air Force Base, said the Blue Ribbon award "is really arming of the work that we do here. To receive it at this time, I think, is especially rewarding. It tells us we're on the right path. It is a recognition that we're doing good work."

However, the award also comes with "a challenge to continue that work," Young said. "We can't sit back and take it easy

at this point. As we think of continuous improvement, the inherent challenge is always to strive to be better."

To be considered for the Blue Ribbon award, a school must complete a comprehensive application that asks for student demographic information, test results, attendance rates, curriculum information, the number of students who have disabilities, and the number who are eligible for free or reducedprice meals.

It asks about the number of teachers, paraprofessionals and school support employees in the school, how administrators and teachers encourage family involvement in education, and each school's strategy for developing their students' potential.

"There were a lot of things pulling at their time and energy during this past year because of the pandemic," Baesler said. "these school districts needed to complete a large amount of work and effort in order to prove, and provide the evidence, to the U.S. Department of Education that they were indeed worthy of this distinction.






