



# **Together We Can** First Sergeants Work with MAFB Community to Give Back

The Minot Air Force Base First Sergeant's Council is working hard to bring the holiday spirit to local families in need. In order to give back to the community, they recently collaborated with Girl Scout Troop 10183 Unit 167 to collect nonperishable donations for the food pantry, as well as for the Thanksgiving Dinner Giveaway hosted by Operation Warmheart, a subsidiary of the First Sergeant's Council.

"The goal of the Thanksgiving meal is to feed those families in need," said MSgt. Moses Ellis. Each boxed meal contains Thanksgiving staples, from meat to traditional sides. In past years, the effort has brought holiday dinners to over one hundred families. This year's event will be held on Nov. 21, 2020 at the commissary.

Donations given by the Girl Scouts and the Minot community have helped to significantly reduce the incurred cost of the event from \$12,000 to just over \$600. This substantial reduction of cost, which is the best it has been in

nine years, is made possible by the overwhelming support that the council recieves from the community.

Moving forward, the council plans to continue working closely with the community to bring resources to those in need. They also hope to build an even stronger partnership with the base commissary, an important contributor to their mission.

with Thanksgiving Along donations brought by the Girl Scouts, the First Sergeant's Council is also preparing for the annual Angel Tree. Set up at the commissary shortly after Thanksgiving, the tree holds holiday wishes from local children. Ellis said that there is usually an

overwhelming amount of families buying gifts compared to the amount of families who are a part of the angel tree. "We can't seem to put more angels up fast enough," he said. "It's great to see that so many people are in the giving spirit around the holidays."

The First Sergeant's Council

hopes to continue that giving spirit year-round. Many people don't realize that the pantry is always taking donations. There is a box set up at the front of the commissary where individuals can donate. Food such as mashed potatoes, soup, canned fruit, cereal, pasta, and taco shells are just a few of the most popular items.

SMSgt. Chrishana Dameron, council Vice President, works alongside MSgt. Lawrence Blanco to run the food pantry. They believe that it is an important part of supporting the community and improving the lives of Airmen and their families. "Sometimes people don't want to tell you when they're hungry," Dameron said. "We want them to feel comfortable asking for help.'

The pantry discreetly helps an average of 20 personnel a month, whether it is Air Force members, their families, or civilians who work on base. Community use of the pantry fluctuates throughout the year, but the council has noticed a correlation between Covid-19, long winters, and pantry attendance. At the end of the day, their mission is to take care of Team Minot, no matter what hardships those individuals may be facing.

they are sent to local shelters in Minot to avoid waste. From there, shelters use the food to give meals to community members in need.


While the pantry has plenty of food donations in the future.



# **VCSAF Wilson ends longest** tenure in AF history

WASHINGTON (AFNS) --Air Force Vice Chief of Staff Gen. Stephen "Seve" Wilson retired Nov. 13 in a ceremony at Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling in Washington, D.C., ending the longest tenure in the position.

Retired Gen. David L. Goldfein, the 21st Air Force chief of staff, presided over the ceremony.

"It's just an honor to do this: not only for an incredible leader who has left a legacy as the longest-serving vice chief of staff in the history of the Air Force, but also for a man I admire, and someone I'm proud to call my friend," Goldfein said.

Goldfein went on to name a few highlights of Wilson's career, from his time as a T-38 Talon instructor pilot to his most recent role as the Air Force's second highest ranking officer.

"When I got a call from (Retired Gen. Mark Welsh) telling me I was about to be selected as the 21st chief, and did I have any recommendation for vice chief," Goldfein explained, "I only gave him one name: Seve Wilson. We're a great fit for each other. The philosopher and the

engineer."

Wilson served as VCSAF from July 2016 to November 2020. During this time, he led the Spark Tank competition, conceived the Vice Chief's Challenge and partnered with Massachusetts Institute the of Technology to establish an artificial intelligence accelerator that combines the efforts of Airmen, MIT students and professors to produce the digital tools necessary for real world operations.

"It's been an amazing, amazing ride," Wilson said. "We've been more than fortunate to meet some incredible folks along this journey."

The 39th vice chief of staff said he was proud to serve alongside Airmen and lead them, giving them the resources they need to propel the Air Force into the future.

"That's our job; find them and unleash them," he said. "As the vice chief, I got the best part of the deal, because I got to work hand-in-hand with world-class Airmen ... doing what is probably one of the

most important things we can preparing the next generation."

Wilson was also an advocate for resiliency and innovation programs, and an advocate for nuclear modernization, hypersonic weapons, artificial intelligence and multi-domain operations. He was also instrumental in the development of the B-21 Raider.

Wilson added that his successor, Gen. David W. Allvin, is the right leader in the right place to continue building the future force.

"You are officially the last standing team member of Team 21," Goldfein said to Wilson. "So this event closes out the team. And how exciting to welcome Dave and Gina Allvin as the 40th vice chief of staff. A great congratulations to him and to Gina. He and CQ (Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Charles Q. Brown, Jr.) are going to make an incredible team."

Allvin was promoted to general Nov. 12 and will assume the title of VCSAF on Nov. 16.

# AFWERX announces virtual Accelerate Event Dec. 7-11

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --AFWERX will hold its inaugural Accelerate event, being held virtually, Dec. 7-11. The event will highlight how AFWERX is institutionalizing air and space innovation across the Department of the Air Force. It has grown from three successfulinnovationexperiments into one organization that will accelerate affordable and agile capabilities by expanding the defense industrial base as the preferred partner for commercial technology innovation and broadening the network of Airmen creating innovative concepts.

As part of the event, the Air Force's catalyst for innovation fostering will feature collaborative initiatives, partnerships and engagement opportunities provided through the synergistic efforts of their three new teams: AFVentures, Spark and Prime.

"Innovation inhabits the DNA of the U.S. Air and Space Forces," said Secretary of the Air Force Barbara Barrett. "Now AFWERX unites the creativity of AFVentures, Spark Innovators, and Agility Prime with the expertise of the Air Force Research Laboratory. Every day we celebrate our partnerships, and we welcome new pacesetters who are inspired to help protect the nation."

To accelerate collaborative capabilitv development, AFWERX is deliberately establishing relationships with a breadth industry, investor, interagency, and international stakeholders. These partnerships will often focus on nontraditional stakeholders to accelerate the collaborative fielding of novel capabilities using novel risk mitigation.

The event will highlight industry and investment partnerships created through AFVentures. While AFWERX will consider a broad trade space of technologies from across all providers, this event will show how expanding the defense industrial base with commercial technologies will help: 1) identify technology trends; 2) leverage commercial research and development; 3) accelerate fielding to match commercially relevant timelines; 4) drive affordability through economies of scale; and 5) launch new domestic and partner commercial sectors that might otherwise be lost to competitors by providing deliberate risk reduction to commercial industry and investors.

advanced connectivity and collaboration tools, AFWERX will empower and expand innovation networks to rapidly capability identify gaps and develop concepts that, when enabled by these new technologies or through this new network, will result in affordable rapid fielding. This empowerment involves training to develop this workforce of the future, as well as pushing the limits of virtual collaboration to access the breadth of ideas and grow the innovation workforce at scales never before imagined. This event will show the successes of the Agility Prime "flying car" program and introduce new potential "Prime" programs. Fundamentally, with effective technology and concept engagement, AFWERX rapidly drives affordable capability to the field. Successful fielding is essential to build trust in this AFWERX approach. Periodically, diverse partnership engagement will help identify key technology

sectors that if "primed" by AFWERX engagement, could advance national security and prosperity. Additionally, to field these programs in an affordable and timely manner, AFWERX will engage in rapid transition process improvements, establishing a core transition competency that will also help rapidly field smaller agile programs.

The five-day virtual event will include a variety of keynotes, fireside chats, workshops, networking opportunities and

panel discussions focusing on AFWERX's efforts to accelerate collaborative capability development, emerging technology trends, research and development, and fostering innovative and courageous problem-solvers for the U.S. Air Force and U.S. Space Force.

"In partnership with the rapidly accelerating U.S. Space Force and in alignment with Gen. Brown's vision to accelerate change, the teams in AFWERX: AFVentures, Spark and Prime, are poised to build partnerships to accelerate," said Col. Nathan Diller, AFWERX director. 





Prior to school withdrawal, the Military Child Education Coalition (MCEC) in conjunction with the Center for Public Research and Leadership (CPRL) recommends the following list in addition to general student documents: Copy of current school's distance learning policies and practices, course description list/syllabi with note of any changes made due to distance learning, practice and official standardized test scores, student work samples that represent typical work level, and for high school students specifically, reference list of teachers,

administrators, and coaches for letters of recommendation. For the enrollment process MCEC and CPRL recommend the following: Review enrollment checklist prior to arrival to include residency requirements, closely review your child's initial class placements and address any errors immediately, meet (virtually) with your new school counselor or principal to establish a relationship, and become familiar with the Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission. There are School Liaisons assigned to each installation, contact Minot AFB's School Liaison at 701-240-2380 or email mafb.school.liaison@ us.af.mil; Ms. Labadie will be able to help with your enrollment in local schools or refer you to the School Liaison at your new installation.

# **AFGSC Role in DAF Program**

BASE, La. -

As the Air Force gets after developing the technologies and tactics necessary for the Department of Defense's latest warfighting concept, Joint All Domain Command and Control, resources are also being invested into the development of the Advanced Battle Management System.

The Advance Battle Management System (ABMS) is an "internet of things" that connects sensors, assets and the nation's decision makers via a secure data network across the five domains (JADC2), thus allowing decisions to be made more efficiently and cohesively.

While ABMS is a Department of the Air Force level program, participation in its development and testing is happening at every level, Air Force Global Strike Command included.

In recent remarks, Gen. Tim Ray, AFGSC commander, touched on ABMS and how its technology folds Strikers into the JADC2 warfighting concept.

"ABMS is a collection of things that help us power JADC2," Ray said. "It is about moving data,

incredibly good decisions."

There have already been a number of experiments testing the ABMS technology and according to Maj. Gen. Andrew Gebara, Director of Strategic Plans, Programs, and Requirements, Air Force Global Strike Command Airmen have been there all along.

"Striker Airmen are integral and have been involved from the very beginning," Gebara said. "We have tested new resilient

communications for our bombers, nuclear security command and control procedures, as well as new abilities to morph data in our missile fields, all through the ABMS process."

The Airmen of AFGSC have not only been heavily involved in the development of this program, but will continue to play a great role in ABMS and how it fits into the Air Force's vision of tomorrow.

"When Chief Brown says 'accelerate change or lose' what he is saying is we need to get the information to the people who need it, and that is Airmen,' Gebara said. "When we work to fuse information or get it to the person who needs it, whether it be a 1st lieutenant on console all the way up to the President of the United States through nuclear command and control [...], connecting those human elements is absolutely key."

As an emerging communication and networking technology, ABMS is a prime example of how the Air Force is modernizing to fight the battles of tomorrow by getting after the production of advanced technology today.

# U.S. Strategic Command concludes key command, control exercise

Throughout the exercise, USSTRATCOM continued to fulfil its 24/7 global responsibilities, including strategic deterrence, nuclear operations, joint electromagnetic spectrum operations, global strike, missile defense and analysis and targeting.



commander. The raid was a jointforce operation that began early on Nikiporenko. (USAF) the morning of November 21, 1970. While Navy carriers used flares to create a diversion, Air Force and Army Special Forces flew in under the cover of night. Once inside Son Tay, it was revealed that the POWs had been previously relocated. All military personnel involved returned safely after the 27 minute raid. While it failed to free POWs, the Son Tay Raid was still considered a success. North Vietnam consolidated POW locations to prevent other raids, making POW communication easier and raising morale and hope for the future It also served as a basis for future joint-force missions. "Military leaders... were so motivated and committed to the rescue of the prisoners that their desire for solidarity and unanimity overrode any realistic appraisal of what was facing them," said John Gargus, the lead navigator for the mission. # Allvin promoted to general, ready to become Air Force Vice Chief of Staff

Air Force Lt. Gen. David W. Allvin formally received his fourth star Nov. 12, fulfilling the last necessary step before he is elevated to vice chief of staff, the service's second-ranking military position.

In a brisk, precise and socially distanced promotion ceremony held at Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling, Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Charles Q. Brown, Jr. published the order for Allvin's fourth star and said he was excited to begin their journey together as the Air Force's leading military officers. With his promotion accomplished, Allvin will officially become vice chief of staff on Nov. 14.

Calling Allvin a "deep thinker" whose career "is chock full of accolades," Brown said Allvin has the qualities that are needed to lead the Air Force forward.

"He's been a distinguished graduate from just about everything he's done," Brown said in brief remarks, adding that Allvin "has a deep passion to get things done." "I'm really excited to have him

joining me to help lead our Air Force with Secretary Barrett and also working very closely with (Chief of Space Operations) Gen. Raymond as we stand up the Space Force," Brown said.

When Allvin becomes vice chief of staff he will complete a total turnover of the highest military leadership in the Air Force. Brown was named Chief of Staff on Aug. 6, taking over for retiring Gen. David L. Goldfein. Eight days later, Chief Master Sgt. JoAnne S. Bass was elevated to become the Air Force's 19th Chief Master Sergeant. Bass succeeded retiring Chief Master Sgt. of the Air Force Kaleth O. Wright.

In his remarks, Allvin thanked his family and those with whom he's served who've provided guidance and wisdom over the years.

Speaking to Department of the Air Force Secretary Barbara Barrett who was in attendance and to Brown, Allvin said, "You had several skilled people who could have been perfect for this job. So I take it as commitment that I owe to you to make sure that I am worthy of this."

He added, "Thank you very much for your faith and your trust in me. ... The idea that I was invited to this team to wear this rank and do this job is something I take very seriously and is very humbling. I am excited." Like Brown and the man Allvin is replacing, retiring Gen. Stephen W. Wilson, Allvin is an experienced pilot, with a command rating and more than 4,600 hours in aircraft as diverse as the C-17 to F-15 and F-16 fighters. Additionally he has logged 800 flight hours as a test pilot.

He also is well equipped to help Brown devise and guide policy, practices and culture across the Air Force's global operation and at a time of changing threats and challenges.

During the ceremony, Allvin was awarded the Defense Distinguished Service Medal for his most recent assignment as Director for Strategy, Plans, and Policy, for the Joint Chiefs of Staff. In that position, he provided insight and analysis that enabled "the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff to provide military advice to the president, the secretary of defense, and the National Security Council."


He was also a senior member of the U.S. Delegation to the United Nations Military Staff Committee at the Pentagon. In that role he provided "strategic direction, policy guidance and planning focus to develop and execute the National Military Strategy.

Allvin, who graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1986, has commanded at the squadron and wing levels, including the 97th Air Mobility Wing, Altus Air Force Base, Oklahoma.

That history and experience will serve Allvin well since he arrives as vice chief at a time significant change and challenge. He will be a chief advisor to Brown and Barrett as they reconfigure the Air Force to confront peer competition. Allvin will be an important voice helping Brown and Barrett ensure a successful partnership with the newly formed U.S. Space Force. All of that will take place amid a shifting political climate and budget pressure.

Despite his broad and diverse experience, Allvin is stepping into a job known for being unique and challenging.

It is a job that requires highly accomplished, experienced officers like Allvin who are comfortable often operating in the shadows. While influential, the vice chief often achieves important goals without the spotlight that accompanies other officers of similar rank.



# Just what is a Game and Fish advisory board? Patricia Stockdill

The N.D. Game and Fish Department announced in late October that its fall advisory board meetings will be held virtually and interested participants can email advance questions to be addressed when the meeting goes live.

Honestly, it's probably a question even longtime North Dakota outdoor enthusiasts ask themselves: "What is a Game and Fish advisory board and what does it do?"

Before delving into that million-dollar question, here's a little background on the structure of the Game and Fish Department and how it functions in North Dakota: The state's governor appoints the head of North Dakota's wildlife and natural resource agency, the N.D. Game and Fish Department, and the official title is Director.

As an appointed positioned, the Game and Fish Department director is a member of the gubernatorial cabinet. The individual is tasked with administering the agency's mission and indirectly works for the citizens and its resources. But the director answers directly to the governor - most recently, newly re-elected Gov. Doug Burgum.

Unlike other states whose wildlife and natural resource agency may receive general fund dollars or even lottery revenue, in North Dakota the Game and Fish department relies solely on hunting, fishing, and trapping license sales along with its allocation of federally authorized Sportfish and Wildlife Restoration funding, an excise tax hunting and fishing equipment manufacturers pay.

That program, administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, in turn divvies up money to states based on a formula. It funds a major share of North Dakota's wildlife and fisheries work, such as aerial surveys and fish population sampling. However, none of those funds can be used for wildlife law enforcement.

The State of North Dakota has an abundance of gubernatorial-appointed boards and the Game and Fish Department has one, as well. The Game and Fish Department advisory board is just that – an advisory board. Department but they are just that – recommendations. The state is divided into eight advisory board districts, balanced between agriculture and sportsmen and sportswomen interests.

But it is just as the name describes an advisory board.

North Dakota is likely one of a small number of states – if any – with an advisory board structure rather than a commission format.

The Game and Fish advisory board meets as a whole twice a year following two rounds of public meetings, which provide opportunities for outdoor enthusiasts to express any concerns they may have, get agency updates, and visit one-on-one with Game and Fish Department staff.

And that circles back to the October announcement of virtual meetings rather than the traditional gathering of hunters, anglers, and folks who simply care about the outdoors. With covid-19 issues persisting, the decision to host fall meetings online mirrors the online spring meeting format.

Typically, advisory board members organize their meetings and the gathering is an opportunity for the public to bring issues, ideas, and concerns directly to the people responsible for fish, wildlife, and natural resource management.

Like so many things in 2020, scratch the inperson meeting.

Instead, people are asked to email advance questions for the Nov. 30 and Dec. 1 meetings to (ndgflive@nd.gov). Topics geared towards the western half of North Dakota – including Lake Metigoshe, Lake Sakakawea, Lake Audubon, and the Badlands - will be discussed during the Nov. 30 livestream. The Dec. 1 livestream is geared towards eastern North Dakota, which includes Devils Lake.

People can log onto either or both meetings,
