STRIKEWERX tackles B-52 maintainer's issue

BOSSIER CITY, La. -- Air Force Global Strike Command's innovation hub, STRIKEWERX, hosted a "Design Sprint" event Nov. 16-19 in Bossier City, Louisiana, to aid B-52 maintainers throughout the command.

The Design Sprint brought together industry and academia partners to improve the process for maintenance of brakes pads on the B-52 aircraft.

The 2nd Maintenance Squadron, which produces an average of 20 to 25 brakes per month for B-52s at Barksdale Air Force Base, La. and Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, is tasked with accurately drilling 96 individual pucks out of five stators/pressure plates. According to the Airmen of the 2nd Maintenance Squadron, the drilling of these pucks is done in specific spots, to a specific depth and all by eye, which can lead to costly damage to the plates.

Tech. Sgt. Nicholas Geiger, section chief for bomber hydraulics at the 2nd Maintenance Squadron at Barksdale AFB,

estimates a loss of \$106,000 each year due to damaged plates from miss-drilling, plus countless lost manhours from a labor-intensive process.

"This was a problem long before me, so our leadership was able to bring it to STRIKEWERX's attention, and I think it was an amazing event. We could have used something like this 10 years ago," Geiger said. "I am excited to see the prototype in action. This is a great tool to teach the Airmen how to drill the brakes correctly and speed up the process, while also making it safer for the Airmen to do their job."

The Design Sprint team produced two prototypes designed by Electroimpact, of Mukilteo, Washington, and Louisiana Tech University, and 3D printed at LSU Shreveport's Cyber Collaboratory. They were then tested at Barksdale AFB's maintenance shop.

"The problem seems small at first, a single backshop within the 2MXS spending 80 hours per month drilling, but when you look at how this one shop touches B-52 brakes across the command

and it's clear that this is a major issue that we can solve with our innovative approaches," said Maj. Ryan Chapman, Air Force Global Strike Command executive chief scientist. "This team of manufacturing experts across industry and academia moved quickly to develop a solution and invest in making our Airmen's ideas a reality."

The event exemplified how STRIKEWERX helps solve challenges faced by AFGSC in a quick, efficient way.

"Our second design sprint was a huge success in solving a complicated issue for the command's aircraft maintainers," said STRIKEWERX Director Russ Mathers. "Airmen who know the process and are performing the work were able to come in, work with academia and industrial experts, and see their idea not only supported, but realized, by AFGSC headquarters."

STRIKEWERX will continue to host Design Sprints to tackle various issues from around the command.

"If you are an Airman out there with an innovative idea, we want to know about it," Chapman said. "Your idea could be the next design sprint, you can have a team of industry and academia making your vision a reality, to solve AFGSC's issues and improve our lethality and readiness."

Bomber Task Force mission demonstrates regional commitment in CENTCOM AOR

CAPTAIN BILL URBAN, USN, U.S. CENTRAL COMMAND SPOKESMAN

U.S. Air Force B-52H "Stratofortress" aircrews assigned to the 5th Bomb Wing, Minot Air Force Base, N.D., conducted a short-notice, long-range mission into the Middle East on Nov. 21 to deter aggression and reassure U.S. partners and allies.

The non-stop mission demonstrates the U.S. military's ability to deploy combat airpower anywhere in the world on short notice and integrate into CENTCOM operations to help preserve regional stability and security.

"Bomber Task Force missions highlight the robust and varied USAF capabilities that can be made rapidly available in the CENTCOM AOR," said Lt. Gen. Greg Guillot, 9th Air Force (Air Forces Central) commander. "The ability to quickly move forces into, out of and around the theater to seize, retain and exploit the initiative is key to deterring potential aggression. These

missions help bomber aircrews gain familiarity with the region's airspace and command and control functions and allow them to integrate with the theater's U.S. and partner air assets, increasing the combined force's overall readiness."

During the mission, the bomber aircrews integrated with air operations centers and other AFCENT assets such as F-15E "Strike Eagles," F-16 "Fighting Falcons," KC-10 "Extenders" and KC-135 "Stratotankers."

CENTCOM is committed to preserving and protecting the freedom of navigation and the free flow of commerce throughout the region. The United States does not seek conflict, but continues to be postured and committed to respond to any contingency around the world.

The last U.S. long-range bomber presence in the Middle East was in early 2020.



Everyone Can Make Thanksgiving Safer

Wear a mask

- Wear a mask with two or more layers to stop the spread of COVID-19.
- Wear the mask over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin.
- Make sure the mask fits snugly against the sides of your face.



Stay at least 6 feet away from others who do not live with you

- Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread COVID-19 or flu.
- Keeping 6 feet (about 2 arm lengths) from others is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.



Wash your hands

- Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Keep hand sanitizer with you and use it when you are unable to wash your hands.
- Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

- Use single-use options, like salad dressing and condiment packets, and disposable items like food containers, plates, and utensils.

- Have a small outdoor meal with family and friends who live in your community.
- Limit the number of guests.

- Limit the number of people in food preparation areas.
- Have guests bring their own food and drink.
- If sharing food, have one person serve food and use single-use options, like plastic utensils.





•N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: Devils Lake back bays icing over but no activity recommended yet. A few anglers testing ice conditions on Antelope Lake but no reports. No Missouri River System reports.

•Devils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: Some areas of Devils Lake icing over but the main lake is still open. A few anglers on upper basin lakes but watch for some open water areas.

•Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Some walk-on activity on smaller area upper basin lakes but Devils Lake is still open with no activity.

•Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: Anglers generally waiting for good ice conditions before venturing onto area lakes.

•Lake Darling, Upper Souris Nat'l. Wildlife Refuge, Foxholm: Check ice conditions along the way if venturing onto Lake Darling. Refuge now open to late season upland bird hunting, as well as archery deer and muzzleloader license holders. Prairie-Marsh Scenic Drive closed until spring.

•Lake Metigoshe, Four Seasons, Bottineau: A few anglers starting to test the ice but no reports.

•Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Weather permitting, a few anglers are going on the east end of Lake Sakakawea in boats with occasional walleye

Department of the Air Force selects six candidate locations for US Space Command Headquarters

The Department of the Air Force, on behalf of the Office of Secretary of Defense, has selected six candidate locations for the U.S. Space Command Headquarters.

The six locations include Kirtland AFB, New Mexico, Offutt AFB, Nebraska, Patrick AFB, Florida, Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado, Port San Antonio, Texas, and Redstone Army Airfield, Alabama.

Self-nominated communities from across 24 states were evaluated as potential locations for hosting the headquarters.

The Department of the Air Force evaluated each location and will now conduct both virtual and on-site visits at each candidate location to assess which location is best suited to host the U.S. Space Command Headquarters. This assessment will be based on factors related to mission, infrastructure capacity, community support, and costs to the Department of Defense.

The Department of the Air Force anticipates selecting the preferred location for U.S. Space Command Headquarters in early 2021.

In the interim, Peterson AFB, will remain the provisional

location for U.S. Space Command Headquarters until a permanent

location is selected and facilities are ready to support the mission.

Common Military Acronyms

MILITARY ONESOURCE

Sometimes it feels like the military has a language all its own made entirely of acronyms and abbreviations. And while your service member is probably fluent in this strange tongue, you may need a little help to keep up.

MILITARY ACRONYMS: THE BASICS FOR NEW RECRUITS

AAFES: Army and Air Force Exchange Service. The retailer that operates post exchanges on Army and Air Force installations.

AIT OR "A SCHOOL": Advanced individual training. The hands-on career training and field instruction each service member receives before being qualified to do a specific military job. This specialized schooling varies by military branch.

ASVAB: Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery. A multiple-choice test a prospective recruit takes before enlisting to see if they are qualified to join and which military jobs they qualify for.

DOD: Department of Defense. The department of the U.S. government responsible for military operations.

MEPS: Military Entrance Processing Station. Where service members take the ASVAB, get a physical, choose their military job and swear in.

MOS: Military occupational specialty. This is a service member's specific job in the military, from artillery and aviation to engineering and intelligence.

OPSEC: Operational Security. The process of identifying and protecting information about military operations.

PT: Physical training. Key to military readiness, service members will be expected to meet fitness standards throughout their enlistment.

PX: Post Exchange. A store at a military installation that sells merchandise and services to military personnel and authorized civilians.

MILITARY ACRONYMS: CHAIN OF COMMAND

CO: Commanding officer. The officer in charge of a military unit, such as captain for a company (Army) and squadron commander for a squadron of aircraft (Air Force).

JSC: Joint Chiefs of Staff. A group of senior military leaders who advise the president, the Secretary of Defense, the Homeland Security Council and the National Security Council on military matters.

NCO: Noncommissioned officer. A military officer who has not received a commission, such as sergeant (Army) and warrant officer (Navy).

XO: Executive officer. The second-in-command to a commanding officer.

MILITARY ACRONYMS: MILLIFE PAPERWORK

BRS: Blended Retirement System. The military's new retirement system, which extends benefits to about 85% of service members, even if they don't serve a full 20 years. This system uses the Thrift Savings Plan described below.

DEERS: Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System. A database of military families and others entitled to receive TRICARE and other benefits.

LES: Leave and Earning Statement. This bimonthly statement reports what you've earned, how much has been withheld for taxes, your leave balance and what allotments you have. Service members in the Air Force or Army may choose to receive their pay monthly, in which case the LES would be reported only once a



month instead of twice.

POC: Point of contact. The person you contact about a specific program or assignment.

TRICARE: Military health care program. TRICARE provides health benefits to service members, retirees and their families.

TSP: Thrift Savings Plan. Similar to a 401(k), the TSP is a government-sponsored retirement savings and investment plan. The TSP is a fundamental part of the military's new Blended Retirement System, described above.

MILITARY ACRONYMS: FINANCE AND HOUSING

BAH: Basic Allowance for Housing. Compensation service members receive to cover the cost of housing when government quarters are not provided.

COLA: Cost of Living Allowance. Compensation service members receive to offset the cost of living in more expensive areas of the U.S.

OHA: Overseas Housing Allowance. Compensation service members receive for housing outside the U.S. when government quarters aren't available.

POC: Privately Owned Conveyance. A service member's personal vehicle that is not owned by the government.

MILITARY ACRONYMS: LOCATIONS

CONUS/OCONUS: The continental U.S., or CONUS, is the 48 connected states and District of Columbia. OCONUS is outside the continental U.S.

DITY: Do-It-Yourself, or a personally procured move, which can save a service member a lot of money moving. This is often associated with moving during a permanent change of station.

FOB: Forward operating base. A temporary, secured operational position that supports strategic goals and tactical objectives.

PCS: Permanent change of station. The relocation of an active-duty service member to a different duty location. Service members may PCS every few years.

PPM: Personally Procured Move. A move a service member plans and conducts on their own, instead of having the military do it. PPM expenses may be reimbursed by the military.

TDY: Temporary duty station. A temporary assignment at a location other than a service member's permanent duty station.

A family business - 20 AF directors share their mil-to-mil journey

F. E. WARREN AIR FORCE BASE, Wyo. --

Something on the chart didn't look right. Two directors coming to Twentieth Air Force Headquarters with the same last name? Was this a typo? No, they each have a different first initial. They are the same rank and are married to each other? This is different. But it is becoming more common to see couples working together at the same base as the Air Force prioritizes joint spouse assignments and its commitment to Airmen and their families.

Every day, roughly 100 Sentinel Warriors, Airmen and civilian, work at Headquarters, Twentieth Air Force, located at F. E. Warren Air Force Base, Wyoming. Their goal is to ensure our ICBM force remains ready to conduct global strike across three missile wings, one air base wing and two geographically separated units (GSUs). Joining the team this summer is the Barringtons, a couple who have spent a combined 48 years in the Air Force serving the ICBM mission and its Airmen.

Col. Catherine Barrington, 20 AF Operations and Communications director, and her husband Col. William Barrington, 20 AF Logistics and Plans director, arrived at 20 AF a couple of months ago, after serving as group commanders together at the 91st Missile Wing at Minot AFB, North Dakota.

While this is a first for 20 AF, for the Barringtons, this isn't their first rodeo. After meeting at the Air Force Academy in 1993 and marrying 4 years later, they have been very fortunate to get stationed together many times throughout their careers.

"We knew early on that it was important to look for

compatibility with our AFSCs," said Cathy. "Being missile operations and maintenance has made it a little easier to match assignments and pursue our career goals."

Like many military-to-military families, the Barringtons spent some time apart, so they know first-hand the stress many military-to-military couples feel when trying to match up assignments or make long distance work. Their time apart occurred early in their careers before communication was as simple as picking up a cell phone and calling or video chatting.

"Before cell phones, we had to limit how often we called each other because the telephone bills were expensive," said Bill.

Besides being stationed apart, being a military-to-military couple can pose many challenges like matching up assignments, training and TDYs, and balancing work and family life.

"Shortly after I arrived at my first assignment, someone told me that we would never be able to make our careers work, unless we wanted to spend a lot of time apart," said Bill. "But thanks to many amazing leaders who have looked out for us, I've been able to watch Cathy progress in her career without having to sacrifice my own career, our family life or spending too much time apart."

Cathy, Bill and their two sons, Will (15) and Adam (13), enjoy all the opportunities and experiences that come with being a military family and have learned to face the challenges head on. When asked what's the secret to making it work, they both looked at each other, smiled and said "a team approach and communication".

"We have been fortunate that the ICBM community has focused on joint spouse assignments for a long time," said Bill. "We

have benefited from engaged leaders who kept us together and allowed us to pursue our careers. We also enjoy working together. Now we get to work together again at Twentieth Air Force, and make a difference for Airmen and the mission."

As directors, not only will they be working for the Airmen and the mission, but they will serve as examples for what is possible for joint spouse assignments in the Air Force. As the Barringtons have demonstrated during their 23-year marriage, the Air Force can be a great place for couples and families.

"It's been an amazing experience and we wouldn't change a thing," Cathy adds.

Staying Connected With Your Child's Teachers During a Deployment

MILITARY ONESOURCE

No matter where you are around the country or the world, you can still support your child's education. With communication technology and strong interest, you can keep up with their grades and stay in touch with teachers. Let your child know that school and education are important — whether you're home or deployed. Set the stage for success:

- Meet with teachers prior to deployment. Set up a meeting before you prepare for deployment so you can work out a plan to stay connected.

- Use the school's online resources. Department of Defense schools use GradeSpeed to keep families up to date on grades and attendance. Civilian schools may have similar services.

- Ask your partner for help. Your partner can be your "boots on the ground" for all things

educational. Reinforce your partner's role to your children — set your partner up for success.

- Kids tend to perform better in school when their parents are involved in their education.

Plan ahead to stay involved

- Make a plan to stay active and involved in your child's education at every stage.

- Discover technologies. Find out what communication technologies you can access once you deploy.

- Talk about how to stay in touch. Ask your child's teachers before you go about the best way to stay in touch. It might be through email, a school website or even texting.

- Share when you want to be informed. Tell teachers what specific issues you want to know about, such as a low grade or an unexcused absence. It's a good

idea to let your child know, too.

Keep in touch

There are lots of creative ways to stay in touch with your child and support his or her education. Try these ideas:

- Stay in regular contact with your child's teachers. Check in as frequently as your mission allows via email or telephone.

- Send a class gift. Pick up something special from the area of the world where you're deployed. You'll be the kids' favorite parent. If it relates to what the class is studying, you'll be the teacher's favorite parent, too.

- Ask your partner or child's guardian for assistance. Your child's designated guardian can oversee homework, talk with teachers and help your child get to school on time. Discuss successes and challenges with your care partner regularly. If your partner



or child's guardian has difficulty speaking English, ask the school to provide a translator.

Find time during your deployment to work on strengthening your connection with your child's school. Your commitment to staying involved



Department of the Air Force restores previous military tuition assistance cap and AF COOL funding

SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

WASHINGTON (AFNS) -- The Department of the Air Force restored military tuition assistance to \$4,500 per fiscal year and Air Force Credentialing Opportunities Online preparatory course funding for fiscal year 2021, effective immediately.

The Air Force noted increased usage of tuition assistance since the start of COVID-19 and continuing into the new fiscal year.

"We are excited our members are taking advantage of their time under COVID(-19) to improve themselves and pursue education. The Department of the Air Force was able to reprioritize funding to encourage our service members to maximize their development through these educational benefits," said Lt. Gen. Brian T. Kelly, deputy chief of staff for manpower, personnel and services. "The Department of the Air Force is committed to education and to the continued professional and personal growth of our Airmen and Space Professionals in support of our nation's defense."

As a result of the reinstatement, both programs will resume the same benefits as before.

For military tuition assistance,

Airmen and Space Professionals are eligible for up to \$4,500 per fiscal year and a maximum of \$250 per semester hour or quarter hour equivalent to cover tuition and allowable fees. For AF COOL, funding for preparatory courses, also known as boot camps, is restored. AF

COOL funding limits remain at \$4,500 per life-time.

"Voluntary education and military tuition assistance programs continue to be important to the development of our force," said Chief Master

Sgt. of the Air Force JoAnne S. Bass. "I'm glad we were able to take a look at the budget again and allow our Airmen to focus on self-improvement, especially during a time where our world has become increasingly virtual during COVID(-19)."

Additionally, Department of the Air Force officials noted comparing school costs, utilizing other resources such as Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support's (DANTES) subject standardized tests (DSST), college-level examination programs (CLEP), pursuing Community College of the Air Force degrees and other funding sources, such as scholarships and grants, all help maximize education benefits.

"I am thankful for great leaders who put service members first," said Chief Master Sgt. Roger Towberman, senior enlisted advisor of the United States Space Force. "I couldn't be happier to see us enable the best growth, education, and development possible."

A LOOK BACK THIS WEEK IN USAF HISTORY

OPERATION SUN RUN BREAKS TRANSCONTINENTAL SPEED RECORDS
NOVEMBER 27, 1957

On November 27, 1957, USAF pilots of the 363rd Tactical Reconnaissance Wing completed "Operation Sun Run" and broke three transcontinental speed records. Sun Run included six pilots, six McDonnell RF-101C aircraft, and the new KC-135 Stratotankers that would perform the mission's in-flight refueling. Each flight took place between Los Angeles and New York, with two of the aircraft making a full round trip. Lt. Gustav Klatt set one record, flying from L.A. to New York in 3 hours, 7 minutes and 43 seconds. Capt. Robert Sweet established the new round-trip record of 6 hours, 46 minutes and 36 seconds, as well as the New York to L.A. record of 3 hours, 37 minutes and 32 seconds. "At that time the Air Force was only 10 years old, and this operation was an early endeavor to showcase the capabilities, speed and range of the first supersonic photo reconnaissance aircraft refueling from the first jet tanker," said Christopher Koonce, the 20th Fighter Wing historian at Shaw AFB, SC. "It was an early display of the three effects of airpower: global vigilance, global reach and global power."

Staff Sergeant Theodore Debauge is an air transportation specialist with the 5th Logistics Readiness Squadron Air Transportation Function. In his position, he oversees the transfer of cargo and passengers from start to finish. Debauge is an essential part of the planning phase right down to the execution phase. Through the use of an application on his computer, he can determine optimal loading procedures ranging from cargo to people. By plugging in weights and calculations, he can figure out exactly how to place cargo onto any aircraft in the United States Air Force. Once the proper procedure is determined, Debauge and his team then load the cargo onto large pallets and secure it. Afterwards, the pallets are stored on a long loading truck where they will eventually be moved onto an aircraft using a forklift. "My favorite thing about the job is load planning," said Debauge. "There are only two people on this base who can

decide how to load any incoming aircraft, that's me and one other Airman." As an air transportation Airman, Debauge also needs to know what cargo to load and how to load it in the event of a "contingency operation". This may include the loading of medical or communications equipment or any variety of gear needed from the base. For that reason, he must always be ready at a moment's notice to load the necessary equipment in the event of an emergency. In addition to preparing cargo for Team Minot operations, Debauge also coordinates deployment operations. Similar to a TSA screening area, he will check-in passengers and check their luggage before leaving for a deployment. "It's a bit tougher here, but it's very rewarding," said Debauge. "I spend a lot of time looking at the big picture and why my job matters. I meet the Bomb Wing's intent and make sure Team Minot's mission goes smoothly."

Late season upland opportunities

North Dakota hunters have some late season upland bird hunting opportunities that weren't available until after the state's deer gun season ends.

It's almost a tradition onto itself when Audubon, Des Lacs, J. Clark Salyer, Lake Alice, Lake Zahl, Lostwood, and Upper Souris U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service National Wildlife Refuges (NWR) open for upland bird hunting – with the focus typically on pheasants – each year on the Monday after the deer gun season closes.

Three other national wildlife refuges in eastern and southern North Dakota are also open.

Not all of the refuges have an abundance of sharp-tailed grouse, partridge, or pheasants – or many at all – but it's still a unique opportunity.

National Wildlife Refuges have specific wildlife and habitat missions and they can vary greatly depending on their location. Their focus in North Dakota is generally migratory bird habitat and resting areas for spring and fall migration. They're open to hunting because it's compatible with their primary mission, just like fishing is allowed on Upper Souris National Wildlife Refuge's Lake Darling. And ice-fishing access is available at various locations on Audubon NWR.

While North Dakota has the largest number of National Wildlife Refuges in the United States, only those ten major refuges are open for upland bird hunting. They offer a mosaic of grassland, native prairie, and woody areas for sharptails to call home. Their wetlands also provide cattails for pheasants to hunker and hide, especially after icing over and waterfowl have migrated south.

Each refuge has specific regulations in addition to North Dakota's statewide hunting regulations. That's because National Wildlife Refuges are managed by the Fish and Wildlife Service, not the Game and Fish Department, and hunting is an additional opportunity, not their main focus.

As an example, one special regulation is the required use of nontoxic shot when upland bird hunting, not just on the recently opened refuges but on all Fish and Wildlife Service land, including Waterfowl Production Areas.

Each refuge also has designated zones where no hunting is allowed because of proximity to buildings, etc.

The best thing a hunter can do to learn more about late season upland bird hunting opportunities is to contact each refuge:

Refuge websites can also provide helpful information, often including maps. An easy way to find a refuge is to google, www.fws.gov/refuge and then type the name of the refuge. Those with two words in their name, such as Upper Souris or Des Lacs, use an underscore between the words. Upper Souris NWR's website is, www.fws.gov/refuge/upper_souris, for example.

Many of the refuges also provide other hunting opportunities when possible, including upland bird hunting earlier in the year but, remember, it's specific to each refuge so it's worth taking the time to check out each one's hunting regulations for other species.

Hunting dogs are welcome to accompany hunters on all of the refuges; however hunters definitely need to keep them under direct control. But no hunter wants to worry about a lost dog regardless of where they're at.

Hunters also need to adhere to the state's upland game bird regulations and even though the late season opportunity didn't start until after deer gun season closed, it still closes on the refuges when the season closes statewide, which is Jan. 3, 2021.
