



### Minot's Heroes behind the Mask

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. -

As COVID-19 restrictions reach into the ninth month, operations at Minot Air Force Base have not stopped due to the diligent and innovative efforts of the 5th Medical Group. Throughout 2020, the medical team and augmentees have met the challenges of COVID head on, allowing Team Minot to meet the demands of the mission. The Medical Group has implemented innovative ways to provide medical care and mitigate COVID exposure.

In order to expand COVID testing capabilities at the clinic, the 5th MDG teamed up with the 5th Civil Engineering Squadron to convert a garage into a drive up/walk through testing station. Additional coordination established trailers just outside the COVID testing garage to aid in treating those with COVID symptoms without exposing personnel in the main medical building. Both the garage and trailers are fitted with air filtration systems as well to reduce airborne COVID transmission.

With on-going disease spread, the need for timely and consistent COVID testing was also identified. The medical team established routine weekly pre-deployment testing for ICBM operators and Missile Security teams. This effort ensures our ICBM force is healthy and nuclear mission capable at all times.

The 5th Operational Medical Readiness Squadron's Dental Flight worked along-side flights such as Facilities and Bioenvironmental Engineering to install air scrubbers and establish supplementary measures to ensure the safety of patients and staff for dental visits. These efforts were especially effective to mitigate aerosol-generating dental procedures. Additionally, zippered doors were installed to enclose patient rooms and maintain the cleanliness of the air of the dental clinic. Continuous air sampling ensures effective ventilation and air changeover to reduce potential COVID transmission.

Additionally, the 5th OMRS Public Health team transitioned to a seven day operations schedule to conduct contact tracing for all positive cases and close contacts. Public Health

expanded their team 25 percent using medical personnel from other sections and other active duty volunteers to meet the case load. They often work into the night to ensure that all positive cases are contacted and isolated the same day test results are in.

The 5th Healthcare Operations Squadron's Pharmacy team combated patient exposure developing a drive up pharmacy. This allows patients to receive their medications while minimizing traffic in the medical building. The Laboratory team also transitioned to seven day operations, allowing COVID testing and processing to continue without interruption. They can process hundreds of COVID tests per day and ensure timely results are delivered back to patients and primary care managers.

When it comes to having to treat those dealing with symptoms, the primary care teams (doctors, physician assistants, nurses, technicians) deliver direct care for COVID

patients. They work tirelessly in full protective gear to listen to lungs and hearts, evaluate patient symptoms, and test and treat them as well. Having this high quality and timely care on base reduces the number of patients who may need urgent or emergency department care. Additionally, primary care providers increased their virtual appointment availability. This allows patients to talk to their providers about medication

chronic conditions from home without increasing physical exposure. Even non-primary care providers h a v e transitioned support to COVID the effort. care For example, the MDG physical therapists cover acute musculoskeletal needs

which frees up primary care providers to triage respiratory symptoms associated

The 5th MDG provides support to both on and off base beneficiaries. If an off base resident requires on base COVID testing, the medical team works with the 5th Security Forces Squadron to adjust gate operations to allow beneficiaries on base while minimizing exposure to main gate defenders. This includes notifying the gate personnel of the vehicles and other identifiers for those who would be coming on base for testing. Taking all these additional precautions and steps allow the continuation of those beneficiaries to receive care and keep our defenders safe from exposure.

WIN A 2021

Looking beyond standard appointments and medical needs, the 5th MDG continued to adapt to meet demands of both exercises and deployments. Public Health worked closely with those deployed during RED and GREEN FLAG exercises as well as the Bomber Task Force during their 14 day Restriction of Movement. They went above and beyond from established requirements to ensure proper symptom tracking and the wellness of all those deployed

During the operational readiness exercise GLOBAL THUNDER, Public Health adjusted exercise operations to minimize potential spread for participants. They analyzed areas for potential risk and implemented new maximum occupancy recommendations as well as pre-exercise restriction of movement to prevent COVID infiltration into the exercise. The 5th Bomb Wing led coordination with the 2nd Bomb wing to optimize mitigation methods during all exercise operations.

Though COVID-19 has brought many challenges for all of us, the mission never stops. In these unprecedented circumstances it is important to not overlook all those who work non-stop to keep giving high-quality medical care and enable our people to accomplish the mission. The people of the 5th MDG remain persistent in confronting new and existing COVID-19 hurdles. As things continue to change and new obstacles develop they will continue to adjust to overcome them and keep Team Minot strong.

Next Friday on Dec. 18th 2020, we will be honoring our medical professionals for a Medical Professionals Appreciation Day to highlight all the incredible and tireless work they have done in the battle against COVID-19.

When ready to cook, set Traeger to 325 ° F and preheat for 15 minutes. When the grill is hot, place ham directly on the grill grate. Cook for 30 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a small saucepan over medium-low heat, melt the apple jelly. Whisk in the apple juice, mustard, bourbon, lemon juice and ground cloves, then remove from the heat and set aside.

After 30 minutes, glaze ham with the apple bourbon mixture. Continue cooking for another 30 minutes or until internal temperature of thickest part is 135 ° F. Remove ham from grill and rest for 20 minutes before serving.



"OPERATION CHRISTMAS KIDLIFT" **BRINGS SOUTH KOREAN ORPHANS TO SAFETY DECEMBER 20, 1950** 





During the Korean War, Air Force Chaplains Lt. Col. Russell Blaisdell and Col. Wallace Wolverton set up the Seoul Orphanage Reception Center to provide food, clothing, shelter, and medical aid to approximately 4,000 orphans in the South Korean capital. When Chinese forces began pushing towards Seoul, the chaplains feared for the children's safety in the midst of a war zone. On December Capt. Tone Nobile, a flight nurse, comforts 19, 1950, Blaisdell met Col. T.C. Operations. Along with Lt. Gen.

William Tunner, Commander of Combat Cargo Command, they were able to call in 12 C-54 Skymasters from the 61st Troop Carrier Group. Over 1,000 orphans were airlifted to safety on December 20. Nurses and medics from the 501st Air Evacuation Squadron also provided aid to the children, and most of them were able to make it out of harm's way because of the valiant efforts of the Airmen involved.

Sweeping an ice surface with a broom to position a large granite rock in as ideal of position as possible: Welcome to the Northland and the sport of curling.

It's a uniquely "northern thing" but just like anyone learning a new sport or activity, with a little time and patience comes an understanding of curling.

Fortunately for Minot area folks, the Minot Curling Club offers an array of opportunities to learn – and perhaps get hooked – on curling. "It's fairly easy," offered club treasurer Mark Hildahl. Like any other sport, the goal is for a team to score more points than its opponent. But instead of using balls in a variety of shapes like most other sports, curlers employ a curling broom and granite rock on specialized ice.

It's easy to get introduced to curling: The Minot Curling Club offers an open house tentatively scheduled Jan. 4 through Jan. 7, 6:30 p.m. each night. Participants learn the basics of curling - rules and "how to" along with the opportunity to curl. "It's a little bit like shuffleboard on ice but it's a lot more exercise," Hildahl described.

The club also offers "Learn to Curl" events for organizations, businesses, and groups new to curling. The cost is \$170 but includes ice time, instruction, and equipment, Hildahl added.

The club's winter leagues are scheduled to begin in January, Hildahl continued. Normally leagues run from November through April but the Covid-19 pandemic delayed start-up. Covid protocol will be implemented when the league begins and adjusted if needed.

It's an open league, Hildahl explained, with curling beginning at 6:30 p.m. every Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday through the season. Leagues are open to anyone, he added, with children as young as 12 participating and those into their 80's. "We've had curlers into their 90s," he suggested.

Annual club membership includes dues and rink expenses. In addition, equipment is provided.

Leagues are open to spectators, as well. Typically the club has 15 to 20 teams participating in league play and there are often 40 people on the ice at any one time.

The club hosts two tournaments throughout the year: Its February Winterfest Bonspiel held in conjunction with Minot's Winterfest and the Shirt Sleeve Bonspiel takes place the last weekend in March.

Hildahl said the club is working with the Minot Air Force Base to launch a base league with play taking place twice monthly.

Covid concerns shouldn't be an issue, Hildahl offered. Social distancing is typically the norm in curling. Plus it takes place in an arena with indoor temperatures around 30 degrees – and it's on ice.

Curling doesn't require a major investment of gear or clothing. Hildahl recommends anyone interested in learning and participating simply wear clean, running-type shoes if they don't have curling shoes, sweatshirt, gloves - any kind will do – and loose-fitting pants because of moving and bending.

The specialization of curling comes into play with its ice surface and rock, which is specialized granite. Curling ice isn't the same as skating or hockey ice. It's highly maintained and extremely smooth.

While anyone of any curling skill level can participate, the captain of a curling team - the "skip'' - is typically the team leader and most experienced curler. That person is the team commander, of sorts. Knowing and understanding what the rock does - "reading" it – comes with experience.

Much like reading greens on a golf course experience and time are the best teachers.
