

Team Minot: Looking to the Future

Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Charles Q. Brown, Jr. as well as members of a U.S. Congressional delegation visited Minot Air Force Base, N.D. on April 29, 2021.

"Minot Air Force Base is proud to show General Brown and the Congressional delegation the innovation and determination of the Airmen who make our critical operations possible every day," said Col. Michael Walters, Commander of the 5th Bomb Wing.

Brown serves as the senior uniformed Air Force Officer responsible for the organization, training and equipping of all active-duty, guard, reserve and civilian forces serving in the U.S. Air Force.

During his visit, Brown had the opportunity to see how the Airmen of Team Minot have never stopped their operations during the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as see how nuclear modernization is a priority for Air Force Global Strike command.

"The U.S. Air Force has the unique ability to see, sense and strike any target at anytime, anywhere in the world. The roles Team Minot Airmen play in this core mission of the Air Force is critical to generating airpower everyday – not just sometimes at some places, but anytime, anywhere," said Brown.

Brown received a tour of a B-52H Stratofortress from Capt. Donovan Carroll, 69th Bomb Squadron weapons and tactics chief, and Maj. Ryan Taylor, 5th Operational Support Squadron wing weapons officer, where he learned about its capability to carry nuclear or precision guided ordinance with worldwide precision.

Brown was then escorted to the Weapon Storage Area, where the 5th Bomb Wing and 91st Missile Wing house and maintain some of their most important assets. It was there that Brown was briefed on the AGM-86 Air-Launched Cruise Missile by MSgt Jon Bryant, 705 Munitions Squadron noncommissioned officer in charge of missile maintenance. The missile, which can be loaded with conventional or nuclear payloads, is an essential part of the 5th Bomb Wing arsenal.

Afterwards, Brown attended a demonstration and discussion of the new female body armor. The armor, designed specifically to better accommodate the female physique, is one of the many steps the Air Force has taken to provide a more inclusive environment for all Airmen.

"I'm grateful for the feedback Airmen have given us on this new Female Body Armor," said Brown. "Being a diverse and inclusive force won't work if we don't have meaningful, sustainable and lasting change - that change starts with Airmen sharing their perspectives and leaders who

listen."

Near the end of his tour, Brown had the opportunity to visit the 91st Missile Wing's missile alert and launch facilities where he received briefings on their daily operations and the importance of the intercontinental ballistic missile program.

"It was an honor to have the opportunity to show and discuss the ICBM mission and the incredible Airmen behind that mission with General Brown and the Congressional delegation," said Col. Christopher Menuey, Commander of the 91st Missile

The Ground Based Strategic Deterrent, or GBSD intercontinental ballistic missile, will replace the LGM-30G Minuteman III, enhancing the accuracy, security and reliability of the nuclear triad.

"By updating the missile portion of the nuclear triad, we ensure a credible, capable and safe nuclear deterrent that provides our Nation and our allies an umbrella of deterrence while discouraging others from use of

nuclear weapons," said Brown. "Modernization of the ICBM program is both strategic and costeffective."

On Aug. 31, 2020, Brown published his strategic approach, Accelerate Change or Lose. In it, he highlights the importance of the development of our Airmen as leaders, the need to stay ahead of the long-term strategic competition between rival nations and promoting dignity and fairness in the Air Force culture.

True to Brown's action orders, Team Minot continues to look for ways to bolster and embody Brown's motto of "Accelerate Change or Lose."

"We have the opportunity to shape the Air Force for what we need in the future," said Brown. "There's a good reason why the Action Orders are bookended with Airmen and Design Implementation – if we empower our Airmen with the right training and resources, they will shape and build the future of our Air Force - the force we need to meet the challenges of today and




[What keeps me motivated] "The airmen, just being able to help the airmen get the job done, I enjoy working with them," said Bailey.

Elevating the Future of Healthcare






Get To Know Your MHO

HEAT allows Service Members to get information about on and off base Family Housing and to begin the process of applying for Military Family Housing and Privatized Family Housing.

Website: https://www.homes. mil/heat

Military Housing Office (MHO) Process:

- The MHO sends a welcomemail this to every eligible person on the inbound list arriving within the next 3 months and anyone requesting on or off base housing information. This e-mail included the link to the HEAT website https://www.homes.mil/ heat. This website gives the military member the option to choose the type of housing they are interested in.
- When the members replies with their choice of either on or off base housing, the MHO e-mails $\,$ them information on privatized housing (on base) or community housing (off base).

located near U.S. military bases. The MHO inspects properties found on this website to insure they are suitability based on environmental, health, and safety considerations. At this time there are no off-limit or restricted areas in the City of Minot for military members to rent or buy. We also provide them with a listing of all the property management companies and private owners in the local area. In addition, the MHO provides members with the North Dakota Landlord Tenant Handbook, so members can be informed about their rights when they rent in the local community. The MHO is here to rendered assistance as a mediator of landlord/tenant disputes.



- N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: Devils Lake remains slow for walleye, although more anglers are on the water. A few more white bass starting to show up, however. No reports from north-central area lakes or Missouri River System.
- · Devils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: Warming weather helping to slowly warm water temperatures with public docks in place. Most success is on the main lake with little to no runoff in Channel A and feeder creeks and coulees. Pike spawned out with walleye towards the end of the spawn. Try the west side first with water warming sooner.
- Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Still somewhat slow walleye success although Pelican Lake producing better activity. Water temperatures remain cool.
- Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: Increasing angler numbers on Lake Darling with the lake now open for boat fishing. Look for some pike success. Also try Grano.

- Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Wind permitting, anglers continue working the east end of Lake Sakakawea for walleye although success slowed with the spawn getting underway. Also try Douglas Bay with jigs or live bait rigs and minnows.
- Lake Sakakawea, Scenic 23, New Town: Activity remains slow in the Van Hook Arm with walleye likely in their post-spawn lull.

SMOKED TURKEY JERKY



INGREDIENTS

- 1/4 CUP WATER
- 2 TABLESPOON HONEY
- 2 TABLESPOON ASIAN CHILI GARLIC SAUCE
- 2 TABLESPOON LIME JUICE 1 TABLESPOON MORTON TENDER QUICK
- HOME MEAT CURE 2 POUND (4-5 LB) BONELESS TURKEY

In a mixing bowl, combine the soy sauce, water, honey, chili-garlic paste, lime juice, and curing salt, if using. With a sharp knife, slice the turkey into 1/4" thick slices with the grain, which helps it hold together better as it dries. (This is easier if the meat is partially frozen.) Trim any fat, membrane, or connective tissue.

Put the turkey slices in a large re-sealable plastic bag. Pour the marinade mixture over the turkey, and massage the bag so that all the slices get coated with the marinade. Seal the bag and refrigerate for several hours, or overnight. When ready to cook, set temperature to 180 ° F and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes. Remove the turkey from the marinade and discard the marinade. Dry the turkey slices between paper towels.

Arrange in a single layer directly on the grill grate. Smoke for 2 to 4 hours, or until the jerky is dry but still chewy and somewhat pliant when you bend a piece. Transfer to a re-sealable plastic bag while the jerky's still warm.

Let the jerky rest for an hour at room temperature. Squeeze any air from the bag, and refrigerate the jerky. It will keep for several weeks.

International Airman: A1C Ramsay's Journey to Citizenship

MINOT AIR FORCE BASE, N.D. --

The United States Armed Forces has had a long history of immigrants serving in the military ever since the Revolutionary War. While not only making the grand commitment of serving the nation, they have also sworn to protect the rights of the citizens of the nation as well – even if they themselves don't have those rights.

U. S. Air Force Airman 1st Class Jessica Ramsay, who is a Paralegal for the 5th Bomb Wing's Judge Advocacy Office at Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota, has found that the current system could better support its people, the Air Force's most valuable asset, in relation to the naturalization process.

"My family had emigrated from South Africa to Australia for a safer life, and then from Australia to the States due to an economic recession," said Ramsay. "I am so blessed to live in the United States, the freedom and opportunities are like no other."

She had never imagined that she could have joined the military, especially as an immigrant. She also didn't know the proper steps to take towards enlisting as a foreign national.

She credits her interest in

the military to a neighbor back home who was a retired Air Force Lieutenant General. While listening to his stories and learning about all of the opportunities that the Air Force had to offer, she knew that this was the path she needed to take for her life.

"I have always been interested in global and international security, language, and adventure," said Ramsay. "Being a part of this incredible mission has inspired me every day, I'm so thrilled to be here."

Ramsay's naturalization process was difficult and quite frustrating for her at times as she found that she didn't have the proper resources in order to file.

"I struggled mostly with acquiring information and contacting the agencies about my case and the steps I needed to take to file for naturalization as a service member," said Ramsay. "The biggest challenge I encountered was finding the reliable and current information that reflected the latest changes in naturalization law."

The holes that she had found in the process made it difficult for service members undergoing the process. After seeing other Airmen go through the same challenges, she had started doing research and discovered that the issue was much larger than she thought it would have been.

She had learned military naturalizations were denied at a higher rate than those for civilians. Service members that fail to do so face severe consequences such as not being able to reenlist, deploy, obtain security clearances, and be prohibited from accessing sensitive information in relation to their career fields. Therefore, the importance of going through this process is crucial.


Ramsay had put in the effort to write out a package outlining broken processes and challenges that she has found in the system. As her way of enacting change, she suggested improvements that she'd like to implement at Minot AFB and the Air Force.

"I presented this package to my leadership, and worked with Maj. Hiatt, a Judge Advocate, to perfect it and so far, it's spreading like wildfire," said Ramsay. "I am so grateful that my leaders are working with me to make sure my voice, and the voice of other immigrant Airmen are heard."



A darling of a lake

Lake Darling didn't start out being a little darling of a lake. It's not a natural lake and its creators didn't envision it would offer almost year-around angling opportunities. Nor did they envision it would provide canoeing and kayaking opportunities from May 1 through Sept. 30.

Instead, the lake, one of the focal points on Upper Souris National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) northwest of Minot, was designed to be part of the refuge's mission to provide a regulated water source for downstream marshes within the refuge, as well as marshes even farther downstream on J. Clark Salyer NWR near Upham.

It's also about protecting downstream residents from flooding.

An important part of bringing the United States out of the Great Depression and providing work for Americans in the 1930s, the Works Project Administration and Civilian Conservation Corps built the refuge in 1935. Lake Darling Dam was completed year later, filling in July 1936.

Named after Jay "Ding" Darling, a political cartoonist and first director of the U.S. Bureau of Biological Survey the modern day U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service — the refuge embraces about 32,000 acres of the Souris River valley. The lake accounts for about 9,600 acres of the refuge.

While the refuge's origin is all about droughts and floods, protecting and providing habitat for wildlife — especially migratory bird species - and protecting humans, as Lake Darling filled with the dam's closure native fish species like northern pike and bullheads thrived. Its flooded vegetation provided ample spawning habitat. Early years drew the attention of avid pike anglers, providing Minot residents and those from surrounding areas new-found, year-around fishing they could only dream about.

As walleye became popular throughout the state through a joint effort of the Fish and Wildlife Service and N.D. Game and Fish Department, they, too, gained popularity on Lake

Nowadays, almost 90 years after the refuge and lake was established, Lake Darling provides boat fishing, canoeing, and kayaking opportunities from the N.D. Highway 28 bridge south to the dam. It offers six boat ramps and 14 shorefishing locations. Four access points have picnic tables and grills while nine have restroom facilities.

As North Dakota faces the reality of a potentially dry summer, inflows into Souris River and Lake Darling are minimal, at best. Only the future knows how potentially

lower lake elevations could influence fishing.

But this is the Northern Great Plains and the ebb and flow of drought and flood is perhaps the greatest constant – along with the rollercoaster ride of weather — for residents. It's an interesting ride along an interesting journey and one that makes Lake Darling and the refuge intriguing and special all at the same time.

Lake Darling facts:

Established in 1936.

- 68 miles of total shoreline.
- 26-foot maximum depth.
- 10-foot average depth.
- Approximately 9,500 square-mileage drainage basin.
- Game fish species include northern pike, yellow perch, and walleye – even an occasional bass.
- The refuge and lake are open from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m.
- Users need to pack-in, pack-out all garbage.
- As a National Wildlife Refuge, special use regulations apply: No swimming, water-skiing, personal watercrafts, littering, open fires, unleashed pets, fireworks, all-terrain or utility-terrain vehicles, off-road vehicle travel, geocaching, camping, vegetation or animal collecting (including antler sheds), or removal of any artifacts.
- Lake Darling Dam is located in Ward County, although much of the lake itself is within Renville County.
- Renville County's Mouse River Park is located north of the refuge west of Mohall.

What's the Difference between Life Estate and **Transfer on Death Deeds?**

A life estate deed and a transfer on death deed seem to accomplish the same goal at first glance. They both fully convey property to a Grantee upon your death. However, there are key distinctions between the two and your particular situation helps determine which is right for you.

Life Estate Deed

A life estate deed allows you to transfer property while reserving an interest during your lifetime or during the lifetime of someone else. Once the person who holds the life estate passes away, the Grantee fully owns the property.

With a life estate deed, both the Grantor and the Grantee own an interest in the property as soon as the deed is signed. The Grantor owns a life estate and can be referred to as the "life estate owner." The Grantee owns a future or remainder interest and is called the "remainderperson."

Either the life estate owner or remainderperson can convey away or sell their share of the property at any time. Specific value tables help determine the value of both interests based on the life estate owner's age. However, a life estate deed is irrevocable-this means that if you

convey your property to your children and reserve a life estate to yourself, you can't change your mind and take it back. Ownership can be made whole again if either the life estate owner or the remainderperson choose to convey their interest to the other


One advantage of the life estate deed is that it starts the clock on five year look back periods for things such as Medicaid eligibility. Some disadvantages are its irrevocability, as previously stated, and that it can open the property to creditors of the remainderperson.

Transfer on Death Deed

A transfer on death deed allows you to retain full ownership during your lifetime and conveys your full interest to the Grantee upon your death. During your lifetime, the Grantee has no interest in the property.

The main advantage of the transfer on death deed is that it is very flexible—it can be revoked at any time unlike the life estate deed. However, because the property fully remains within your control, a transfer on death deed does not start the clock on the five year period and so the property would still be counted among your assets for Medicaid eligibility.

Ultimately, the decision between a life estate and transfer on death deed is dependent on why you want to transfer the property. If you simply want to avoid probate while still having full control over your property, a transfer on death deed might be the best choice. If you're concerned that you may have to apply for Medicaid in the relatively near future, a life estate deed might be a better option. In any case, a conversation with an estate planning attorney can help you make the right choice for your situation.



Spouses of Team Minot teach resilience through crafting

In her nearly 13 years as a military spouse, Anna St. Andre has learned about the importance of a tight-knit spouse community and just how valuable resilience skills are in a military world. So, while living at Aviano Air Base in Italy, St. Andre began a program to help spouses create meaningful connections and learn valuable skills through fun activities.

She brought her idea to Minot Air Force Base, N.D. and recruited other experienced military spouses who were passionate about resilience to create the Design and Unwind program. The goal of the program is to help spouses create beautiful crafts while also making connections, building friendships, having fun, and learning resiliency tools to help them thrive in the face of adversity. "It's something that could be of great value in getting spouses together and understanding that we all have these commonalities, struggles, and adversities that we go

through and sometimes it's better to know that somebody else is going through the same thing that we are..." said St. Andre.

The first Design and Unwind

Event was held on April 25, 2021 at the Jimmy Doolittle Event Center. Spouses were able to create a decorative canvas sign and learn about a core resilience skill-- "reframe".

Working alongside St. Andre to bring Design and Unwind to MAFB are John Jeziorske, Carri Walters, Tricia Weiser, and Bree Carroll. Each of these spouses has his or her own unique experiences with the military life, but they all share the same passion for helping others to learn to be resilient.

"I'm a firm believer that we are not meant to do this alone. We need each other and we need community," said Walters, a 20 year military spouse. "My hope is that spouses will attend, laugh and have a good time, make new friends, and learn a skill

that will help them the next time they are faced will challenging circumstances."

In a world full of constant change, resilience is an important skill for spouses to learn so that they can cope with the unique challenges they face every day. "I think nothing can really, truly ever prepare you for life as a military spouse. You can read all the articles you want and listen to advice, but until you're put in that situation, nothing really prepares you for the long days with kids or the lonely nights while your husband is deployed or working long hours. Resilience isn't just getting through, it's surviving and thriving. Sometimes those skills get forgotten. The resilience skills that we teach in this program are important because they help us change and have that growth mindset... It's important to understand that although these situations are things that we can't necessarily control, we can control the way that we overcome them and see them, and come out stronger on the other side," said St. Andre.

The Design and Unwind on April 25 was the first event of its kind available to both the 5th Bomb Wing and 91st Missile Wing spouses. The team that organized the event hopes to make it sustainable so that it can continue to impact the lives of Team Minot spouses for generations to come. They are planning the next event for June and hope to continue it every few months with a different craft and resilience lesson each time.

THIS WEEK IN USAF HISTORY

LT. COL. JOE JACKSON SAVES A THREE MAN COMBAT CONTROL TEAM

MAY 12, 1968 -

During the Vietnam War on May 12, 1968, former Lt. Col. Joe Jackson was commander of an unarmed C-123 transport aircraft. The plane was flying an emergency mission in South Vietnam after a special forces camp at Kham Duc was overrun by the enemies, who were in complete control of the area. Over the radio, Jackson learned that a three-man combat control team had been accidentally left behind after the camp was evacuated. Jackson

made the decision to respond and descended to the landing strip of the camp under heavy fire. After landing, enemy forces dropped a rocket near the plane, but fortunately it was a dud. Jackson was able to rescue the CCT and bring them to safety in Da Nang. Despite the amount of enemy fire during the rescue, the C-123 was found to have no damage or bullet holes upon arrival. For his herosim, Jackson received the Medal of Honor on January 16, 1969. He passed away on January 12, 2019.


