# Air Force makes more rights available for housing tenants

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-LACKLAND, Texas (AFNS)

The Department of the Air Force is implementing the remaining four rights for housing tenants including a universal lease, a process to resolve disputes with property owners and procedures for withholding rent when applicable.

The Department of Defense issued policy guidance in February 2021 on the implementation and timing of the remaining four provisions of the Tenant Bill of Rights, which expands protection measures for military families living in privatized housing. Along with the universal lease and dispute resolution process, the Tenant Bill of Rights ensures access to unit maintenance history, and establishes a process to withhold rent payment while in formal dispute resolution.

With a few exceptions, the Air Force expects all 18 tenant rights to be available to tenants in all Air and Space Force housing programs by the end of Fiscal Year 2021.

The expanded rights protect tenants and offer recourse if their housing concerns are not adequately addressed, said Col. Sara Deaver, Air Force Civil Engineer Center Housing Division

"Empowering tenants and amplifying their voice is at the heart of the department's comprehensive plan to improve the privatized housing program," Deaver said. "The Tenant Bill of Rights is our assurance to our Air Force and Space Force families that we recognize their rights and their needs as tenants, and that those needs are our top priority.

The universal lease standardizes general contents of the privatized housing lease from installation to installation. The maintenance history provision grants prospective and existing tenants seven vears of available maintenance history before a prospective tenant is asked to sign a lease or within five business days of an existing tenant's request. The formal dispute resolution process creates a structure for tenants to pursue disputes with project owners, and the rent withhold clause allows service members to withhold their housing allowance in certain instances while the dispute is being resolved.

"If tenants feel their rights are not being met, they should start by communicating the issue directly to the landlord," said Yvonne Brabham, Air Force Housing Division technical director.

"Solving problems at the lowest level typically yields the quickest results," Brabham said. "If the landlord hasn't resolved the issue after a follow-up call, they should escalate the issue to their military housing office."

If the military housing office

and other resources, like resident advocates, are unable to resolve the issue, the MHO can escalate the issue within both the military chain of command and the landlord's management structure. If tenants feel the issue is not being resolved at the local level, they can contact the Air Force housing section's toll-free hotline at 800-482-6431 and AFCEC will investigate the

As the DAF's housing program managers, AFCEC plays a central role in ensuring tenants are able to execute the rights outlined in the bill. Since 2019, program leaders have been executing an improvement plan consisting of 51 housing initiatives aimed at ensuring Airmen, Guardians and their families have access to safe, healthy housing.

"We've worked hard to overhaul the housing program to rectify shortfalls and strengthen commitment to Airmen,

Guardians and families," Brabham "Today's program has more oversight and leadership involvement, clear policies, better communication and puts more power in tenants' hands."

"With policy guidance now in place for the final four rights, the department is closing in on the finish line to fully implement all 51 improvement actions enterprise said Robert Moriarty, wide." Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Installations.

"We've implemented all measures at most of our installations and are working with those project owners to create state-specific addenda to ensure the final rights comply with state and local law," Moriarty said.

The Air Force is continuing to work with project owners to obtain agreements on the final provisions at the remaining installations and with few exceptions, expect those rights to be accessible for all tenants across the DAF by October.

Our first stop after the visitor's center was the 91st Missile Wing headquarters where Col. Christopher Menuey and members of his staff greeted Mr. Grabowski with smiles and handshakes. From there, we proceeded to the office of the Commander of the 740th, the Vulgar Vultures, Lt Col. Eric Ward. It was at this point when the reality of how Minot Air Force Base, and in particular, the 91st Missile Wing, dealt with the nearly 12-month pandemic. Lt Col. Ward, with the help of his staff, outlined how they kept the 91st Missile Wing operating without missing a beat during the COVID 19 pandemic. Pretty much all operating procedures had to be altered. 
and thus our freedom. I also know that in an interview with Col. Michael Walters, Commander of the 5th Bomb Wing, he pointed out many of

# VA launches new high-demand career program

A new career program rolled out by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs allows veterans to receive tuition for education, training, and housing.

The Veteran Rapid Retraining Assistance Program (VRRAP) provides help to those veterans who have become unemployed due to COVID-19.

# THE CAREER PROGRAM

The VRRAP offers sanctioned education and training programs under the GI Bill and through the Veteran Employment Through Technology Education Courses (VET TEC), leading to highdemand jobs, according to the VA. Educational opportunities include certificate programs, associate degrees, and non-college degrees.

Veterans admitted to the career program receive up to one year of tuition and a monthly housing allowance based on Post-9/11 GI Bill rates.

Career program criteria include: • At least 22 years old and under 67 years of age.

•Not eligible for GI Bill or Veterans Ready and Employment Benefits.

• Not enrolled in a federal or state jobs program.

• Unemployed due to COVID-19. •Not receiving VA disability compensation due to inability to work.

•Not receiving unemployment compensation, including enhanced benefits under the CARES Act.

The application process began in early May, and the program concludes 21 months after its adoption (Dec. 11, 2022). It's limited to 17,250 participants, with funding capped at \$386 million.

# AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN

VRRAP was part of President Ioe Biden's American Rescue Plan, which seeks to bring relief to American workers adversely affected by the virus. According to the White House, more than 9.5 million workers have become unemployed during the pandemic.

According to James Oxford, national commander for the American Legion, veterans whose career paths have been altered or blocked altogether by the COVID-19 pandemic can use a fresh opportunity in the post-COVID economy.

"We need to remember that many of these veterans who were gainfully employed before the pandemic achieved their gainful employment through GĬ Bill education and training benefits," he said. "Those benefits may now be exhausted, and they stand

unemployed or underemployed today due to the pandemic, without new directions or resources to pursue them. Veterans have proven highly capable through military service to learn new skills and disciplines, often under fire, and they are extremely wellpoised to rapidly make the most of the assistance envisioned in this

## ORGANIZATIONAL SUPPORT

Travis Horr, the director of Government Affairs for Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans of America (IAVA), says the organization is extremely supportive of VRRAP and worked closely with congressional and VSO allies to develop the Veterans Economic Recovery Act.

"We are glad to see that VA has already started taking applications for veterans that qualify to take advantage of this program and look forward to its full implementation," he said. "IAVA firmly believes that this is a critical piece of legislation that will address veteran unemployment."







# COVID-19 pandemic not over, concerns over delta variant growing

WASHINGTON (AFNS) --

Nearly 68% of active duty personnel have been vaccinated against COVID-19 with at least one dose. But that still leaves many service members vulnerable to the delta variant of the virus, health officials at the Pentagon

Due to the effectiveness of the Defense Department's ongoing vaccination program, COVID-19 case counts across the department are dropping and installation commanders have been reducing local health protection conditions, or HPCON levels, Dr. Terry Adirim, the acting assistant secretary of defense for health affairs, said during a press briefing at the Pentagon.

"However, the delta variant poses a threat to that return to normal," Adirim said. "We are particularly concerned with the impact of the delta variant on our unvaccinated or partiallyvaccinated population, and its potential spread at installations that are located in parts of the country with low vaccination rates.'

According to the military health system, the delta variant of the COVID-19 virus is more transmittable, causes more severe disease, and results in higher cases of hospitalization and death than any other strain of the virus.

"The pandemic is not over, and we are not done with our all-out efforts to encourage vaccination," Adirim said.

The DOD has an active whole genome sequencing program in place to identify what strain of the virus is present in those who test positive for COVID-19, Adirim said.

"We're closely watching our DOD case counts, positivity rates and the prevalence of the delta variant among all the other variants of concern," she said. "We anticipate that health protection conditions could change at some of our installations in the future based on outbreaks that result from the high transmutability of the delta variant.

"The more virulent delta variant is spreading quickly through communities with lower vaccination rates," she said. "... and it is likely to become the predominant variant in the United States. The delta variant poses a threat to our service members who are not fully vaccinated. The best way to beat the delta variant is to be fully vaccinated."

Studies have shown that one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine is only about 33% effective against the delta variant, while two doses are at least 88% effective, Adirim

"We are investing great effort

into ensuring our service members and other beneficiaries get both doses," she said. "So the bottom line is get vaccinated, they are safe and effective."

Across the entire DOD, including military personnel, family members, civilians and contractors, there have been 303,000 cases of COVID-19 and 355 deaths related to the disease.

"Right now, there are about 21 individuals hospitalized for COVID-19 in DOD facilities," said Army Lt. Gen. Ronald J. Place, Defense Health Agency director.

"This is a decline from a peak of 240 inpatients on January 8 of this year, essentially the lowest point we've had since the earliest days of the pandemic," Place said.


"If those who have not yet been vaccinated need further proof of the vaccine's effectiveness," Place said, "it's the status of those currently hospitalized within the military's health system. Of the 21 COVID-positive individuals in DOD hospitals, none of them are vaccinated.

We thank our service members and DOD personnel who have been vaccinated and continue to strongly encourage our remaining service members, DOD retirees, all of their families, and DOD staff to get vaccinated — for themselves, for their families and for the community."

# **AFLCMC Focus Week returns July 26-30**

The Air Force Life Cycle Management Center is hosting the third Focus Week of 2021 from July 26-30.

Dozens of courses are available, ranging from career and functional area-specific training, coaching, seminars, and personal development classes. Focus Week also provides an opportunity to earn continuous learning points.

"This quarter, we are beginning to phase some of the courses back to the classroom so be mindful of the course location when registering," said Jason Sibrel, AFLCMC Focus Week program manager. "For those interested in distance learning, there are numerous online classes available."

Platforms include teleconferences, Defense Collaboration Services, Zoom, and Microsoft Teams.

A few courses on the schedule for acquisition professionals include: Artificial Intelligence 101, The Only Constant is Change: Keeping Fresh with the Adaptive Acquisition Framework, and Robotic Process 101.

For those interested in applying the benefits of artificial intelligence to the Air Force mission, Artificial Intelligence 101 is available July 29. This virtual course will provide enrollees with a basic understanding of artificial intelligence, as well as its numerous applications in relevant center programs. Artificial Intelligence 101 is worth one continuous learning point.

The Only Constant is Change: Keeping Fresh with the Adaptive Acquisition Framework

seminar for acquisition professionals, which provides insight into the ins and outs of the framework, including updated Air Force and Department of Defense guidance. This virtual course is scheduled for July 26 and is worth one and a half continuous learning points.

In Robotic Process Automation 101, instructors will share valuable tips for using software, such as UiPath, which allows users to automate repetitive, high volume tasks in their office, like filling out forms and copying and pasting data. Suited for anyone interested in a smart solution, this course provides a number of useful resources. Robotic Process Automation 101 is scheduled for July 26 and is worth one continuous learning point.

Aside from the functional areaspecific courses, AFLCMC Focus Week offers several career and personal development training opportunities. Examples include: USAJOBS/Resume Writing/How to Interview/Jobs Board Block Training, How to Write SMART Standards for Employees, and AcqDemo for Employees.

USAJOBS/Resume Writing/ How to Interview/Jobs Board Block Training combines multiple training topics into a single training session. From the application to the interview, facilitators provide enrollees with key skills necessary to assist them with pursuing career opportunities and advancement. Designed for anyone seeking to improve their career, this course is scheduled for July 30 and is worth two continuous learning points.

For government civilian

employees, two courses are available to assist with annual performance appraisals. For those using the Department of Defense Performance Management and Appraisal Program, How to Write SMART Standards for Employees is a two-hour virtual session in which participants review the DPMAP performance management process, identify the characteristics of elements and standards, and learn how to write specific, measurable, attainable, relevant and timely standards. The course will also prepare students for performance evaluation conversations with their supervisor. Hosted via Zoom, this course is scheduled for July 29 and is worth two continuous learning points.

DOD Civilian Acquisition Workforce Personnel Demonstration Project for Employees will provide enrollees with details on program compensation flexibilities, strategies, processes and program support tools. AcqDemo for Employees is scheduled for July 29 and is worth three continuous learning points.

Course registration is available for all military, civilian and most contractor personnel, as long as the contract allows for the attendance of training and the course is open to all, Sibrel said.



Sadly, they really don't get much love from North Dakota anglers. Some anglers, though, may remember when bullheads and other native species were highly sought after during a fishing outing.

However, that was before Garrison dam and Valley City National Fish hatcheries and a N.D, Game and Fish Department cooperative program with the agencies working together to enhance fishing opportunities in the state.

Most notably, it introduced walleye to an increasing number of lakes, elevating them to near king-like status among anglers in terms of desirable

Since then, pike, sauger, bullheads, and even channel catfish just don't have the glitz and glamour that comes with walleye fishing. Granted, some anglers still seek those other species out, but walleye

Yes, channel catfish seriously lack angler love, although they receive a little show of affection from anglers who treasure fishing for them on the Red River. For the true catfish angler, the Red River has a hefty reputation for big 'cats and catch-and-release is hugely popular. But that's a couple of hundred

There is an alternative, though — the Missouri River System. There, they get some love from a few folks who know the secrets to their whereabouts on the Little Missouri River, the upper end of Lake Sakakawea, and maybe even Lake Oahe downstream

Thankfully, there is also a niche of anglers with catfish love for those calling the Missouri River tailrace below Garrison Dam home.

The tailrace and its catfish provide an opportunity for those who grew up fishing for 'cats to find that experience in North Dakota. Tailrace anglers typically catch nice, eater-sized catfish in that 1- to 3-pound range as they work the tailrace chutes from boats. Or they may find them fishing the wing walls, although that's often at night. They can even catch some from shore during the day.

The presentations used when targeting catfish aren't that much different one might use when fishing for The King — walleye: Try vertical drifting with smelt or nightcrawlers — or any typical walleye rigging because anglers are typically working the fast water of the tailrace chutes or immediately downstream.

With most fish less than 5 pounds in the tailrace, one's line weight really doesn't matter — anything from 8-pound up to 16-pound test line.

One trick that could make a difference in keeping or releasing a catfish is the size of hook — try larger hooks such as a No. 2 or larger - if the hook is too small it's more difficult to get the hook easily out.

It's hard to say why channel catfish don't get much love. Maybe it is their appearance. Maybe it's because they're not named "walleye".

But take a trip to the tailrace and try to catch a few of those nice eater-sized tailrace catfish. Cook them up. While catfish will likely never attain the popularity they enjoy elsewhere - and most certainly could never topple King Walleye from its perch on Top of the Hill – they're a great reason to get out, fish, and enjoy the outdoors.

And maybe they can get the angler love they deserve as a true native North Dakota fish.

For those who already know the great taste of catfish caught in fresh, cold water the Missouri River tailrace is a neat spot to check out. Just head downstream of Garrison Dam along N.D. Highway 200 by Riverdale.



"As a career field we've been on alert almost since the Air Force




was founded," said Dewoina. "I have to say it's the people here that motivate me. We're all in this together."

# Air Force awards contract for new long-range missile system

KIRTLAND AIR FORCE BASE, N.M. --

The Air Force announced on July 1, 2021 the award of an Engineering and Manufacturing Development contract for its Long Range Standoff (LRSO) weapon to Raytheon Missiles and Defense.

The contract is for about \$2 billion and a sole-source acquisition. The work will be performed in Tucson, Arizona, and is expected to be completed in February 2027.

The LRSO is the replacement for the aging AGM-86B Air Launched Cruise Missile. The ALCM was fielded in the early 1980s with a 10-year design life. The aging ALCM will continue to face increasingly significant operational challenges against emerging anti-access/area-denial threats until replaced.

The Air Force determined Raytheon provided the best overall value to the warfighter and taxpayers based on the selection process' evaluation factors.

The contract is cost-plus-fixed-fee, with performance incentives, for a 66-month period of performance. Upon successful completion of the EMD contract, the Air Force Nuclear Weapons Center will incorporate EMD data to inform the weapon production negotiations.

The Air Force Nuclear Weapons Center is the lead for the Air Force's LRSO acquisition effort.

"The LRSO program office

capitalized on a pioneering reliability and manufacturing approach to establish a very capable and mature design during the Technology Maturation and Risk Reduction phase," said Maj. Gen. Anthony W. Genatempo, AFNWC commander and Air Force program executive officer for strategic systems. "The team has continued that approach with its EMD strategy to provide the best overall value to the warfighter and taxpayers, while meeting the nation's deterrence needs in the future."

"The LRSO team has strived for nearly three years to ensure the Air Force achieved a stable cruise missile design meeting the nation's requirement for a credible air-delivered nuclear deterrent for many years to come," said Elizabeth T. Thorn, program manager. LRSO "Awarding the EMD contract marks our next step in finalizing development, fully maturing our manufacturing techniques, and proving LRSO meets its operational requirements."

The LRSO program office is part of AFNWC's Air Delivered Capabilities Directorate at Eglin AFB, Florida. The center is responsible for synchronizing all aspects of nuclear materiel management on behalf of Air Force Materiel Command in direct support of Air Force Global Strike Command.

# Air Force personnel, manpower applications fully migrated to cloud

SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

The Air Force Digital Transformation Activity culminated a three-year effort when it closed its Data Center July 9. This effort resulted in the migration of all applications, services, equipment and manpower to a virtual cloud provider.

The migration to the cloud hosting services saves money, replaces outdated hardware, increases information security and reduces system vulnerabilities, preventing data loss to unauthorized entities. Applications such as Air Force Promotions System, Virtual Military Personnel Flight, AFPC Secure, etc., are all now hosted completely on the cloud.

"The cloud provides better security with more flexibility and less redundancy," said Greg Parsons, Air Force A1 Plans and Integration director. "It provides the ability to modernize servers and the associated software required to operate the infrastructure, faster than the previous data center allowed at a fraction of the cost."

More than 42 systems were migrated to the virtual data center following extensive testing to ensure compatibility with the new operating system.

"The new servers are not physical servers but a virtual version that can be upgraded quickly, which decreases security

vulnerabilities," Trautmann, Platform Operations Division chief. "Technological debt is not incurred with the continuous need to upgrade physical systems. We can patch and upgrade systems near-real-time and do not have to purchase new hardware since the servers are virtual.'

The Data Center closure is part of the federal data center consolidation initiative focused on the evaluation governmental information technology investments for more modern technology. In addition, the cloud provider is certified to protect Department of the Air Force information and is accredited by the Federal Risk and Authorization Management Program and Defense Information Systems Agency, which are both accreditation bodies for the government and DoD.

The FedRAMP is a U.S. government Program Management Office that provides a standardized approach to security assessment, authorization and continuous monitoring for cloud service providers - ensuring the highest security standards are met. DISA will provide an additional level of security controls to ensure CSPs are adhering to all DoD data guidelines in accordance with DoD policies.



# AFMC plays key role in record Air Force DITPR compliance

The Air Force made history recently by becoming the first agency ever to achieve a 100% compliance rating in the Department of Defense Information Technology Portfolio Repository.

With nearly 700 IT investments totaling more than \$1 billion, Air Force Materiel Command manages one-third of the Air Force portfolio and played a significant part in this historymaking achievement for the service.

"The Air Force has only been able to achieve 99% compliance until this recent report," said Holbrook, AFMC Directorate, Communications Assurance Division representative. "A 100% rating is no easy task, with over 200 questions covering each investment in the area of budget, the Federal Information Security Management records management, Section 508

compliance and more. It was a team effort, and we're proud to be part of this historical achievement for the service."

The DITPR is a web-based system that tracks all DOD IT systems, to include basic identifying information, acronyms, sponsoring component contacts and more. The information in the system provides senior leaders and decision-makers with a comprehensive view of DOD inventory, portfolios and capabilities, and supports resourcing decisions across the enterprise.


All AFMC IT investments are required to be registered in the Air Force Information Technology Investment Portfolio Suite, which feeds the DITPR record. The other services maintain equivalent repositories that feed the DITPR. Service and agency chief information officers ensure completeness of the inventory and data accuracy annually.

Among the mission-critical

and mission-essential IT systems tracked, some of the everyday AFMC systems listed in the DITPR include the Command Human Resources Intelligence System, Education and Training Management System, Reliability and Maintainability Information System, Depot Maintenance Accounting and Production System, and the Automated Civil Engineer System, among others. A separate application tracks systems that reside on the DOD Secret Internet Protocol Router Network (SIPRNET).



The Airmen and Family Readiness Center has a new Family Support Coordinator for the Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP): Jenny Hartman! For 11 years, Ms. Hartman worked under the Navy's EFMP in San Diego, Calif., before coming to Minot Air Force Base in May

As the EFMP-Family Support Coordinator, she focuses on liaising with support services

and providing resources to the families enrolled in the program as they "When families are moving from one duty station to another and they are enrolled in the program, we make sure that we meet with them and request any information regarding services they may need in the next duty station so we can facilitate that for them. For example, there may be families enrolled in the program because they have a child in special education at school. So we make sure that the duty station is aware that the child is receiving special education and things like that," she explained.

EFMP was originally created to support special needs children of Airmen, but the program has since expanded to offer resources to all family members who may need it. They coordinate with a family's future duty station and offer comprehensive information on the the need for EFMP due to having

base, parent training programs, support groups, relocation assistance, financial management, school information, and more. All of these services are aimed at easing the unique burden on military families as they move to their next home.

"It's kind of like a warm hand-off, so they don't end up in the location totally lost," said Hartman. "When you're moving from one location to another it a child with severe asthma. "When I needed the program, I didn't know it was available. If I had known about it, I would have slept much better," she said. Ms. Hartman hopes to bring the word about EFMP to the families of Minot AFB so that they don't have to walk the difficult journey alone.

"What I enjoy the most [about being a Family Support Coordinator] is making an impact

> in someone's life...taking the hard piece of moving from one location to another and making it easier on them. Moving is a struggle, but if I can give you the phone number of someone who can help you with housing or help you establish special education for your child, that makes me feel like I have accomplished something," said Hartman.

> If there is one thing that Hartman would like the families of Minot AFB to know, it's that "We're here for them. No question is too big or too small and we will try our best to find an answer or resource for them to make the transition easier."
