We've had exceptional drought and six days that have hit 100 degrees or more, causing people to wonder if we are reliving the "Dirty '30s." Regardless, your garden plants will suffer when there is drought and intense heat. The best thing you can do is keep them watered because one thing I've learned is that many garden plants will survive up to 130 degrees if they are kept wet. I know this because I purposely experiment with them in my greenhouse, which on hot days, will range between 130 and 140 degrees.

2 CUP FRESH BASIL 1 CUP CHOPPED FLAT-LEAF PARSLEY 1/2 CUP TOASTED WALNUTS 1 ORANGE, JUICED 2 TEASPOON ORANGE ZEST 1/2 CUP OLIVE OIL 1 CUP PARMESAN CHEESE, GRATED SALT BLACK PEPPER 4 WHITE FISH STEAKS 1/2 TEASPOON COARSE SEA SALT 1/2 TEASPOON BLACK PEPPER When ready to cook, set temperature to High and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes. In the meantime, make the pesto: In a blender jar or food processor, combine the basil, parsley, walnuts, orange juice, and orange zest and blend until finely chopped. With the machine running, slowly add the olive oil in a stream until the mixture is emulsified. If it seems too thick, loosen it up by adding a small bit of water - a tablespoon or so. Scrape into a bowl and stir in the Parmesan. Taste for seasoning, adding salt and pepper as needed. Rinse the fish steaks under cold running water and pat dry with paper towels. Brush both sides with olive oil and season with salt and coarsely ground black pepper.

Arrange the fish steaks on the grill grate. Grill for 12 to 15 minutes, turning once with a thin-bladed metal spatula, until the fish is opaque and breaks into chunks when pressed with a fork.

If desired, stick the probe of an instant-read meat thermometer through the side of the fish toward the center: You want a temperature of about 140-145° F. Transfer the steaks to a platter. Drizzle with the prepared pesto and garnish with orange wedges and fresh basil, if desired.

alike can get heat stroke.

Yes, heat stroke isn't just a human concern when temperatures stretch into the upper 80s, 90s, and – heaven forbid – hit the century mark.

Heat stroke in dogs is serious, especially with so much increased interest in people getting into the Great Outdoors and dogs are such great companions to share that outdoors experience. Plus, hunters should gradually be increasing the amount of conditioning and training time for their hunting dogs.

It's especially important to ease into training if that dog hasn't been swimming or playing in the Great Outdoors lately. After all, when it's too hot for people to be out it's definitely too hot to train and condition Fido.

Never unleash a couch potato hunting dog without proper conditioning, keeping in mind that letting it become a couch potato in the first place can lead to other health issues.

The best time to be out – regardless of whether it's training and conditioning for hunting or just the sheer joy of being outside – is to try to steal a few early morning minutes even though evening hours may provide more time rather than trying to squeeze it into an early morning rush.

It's important to watch for signs of hyperthermia, the more technical name for heat stroke. It can occur even into the fall months, especially early season hunts – or even walking Fido on those autumn mornings or evenings.

It's still summer and upland season is more than a It's critical to cool the dog's internal body temperature if any of those symptoms occur.

However, never use ice or cold water to cool a dog. Instead, get the dog into to a cool, shaded area and, if possible, put a fan on it. That's where a portable, battery-operated dog kennel fan is handy – or even It's also the time of year when humans and canines those portable hand-held fans designed for people. Just the air movement alone can help.

> If possible, take an initial reading of the dog's temperature with a rectal thermometer. Then try to cool the dog with water - but remember it can't be cold so use only cool tap water. It also helps to place cool towels around the groin area. Another towel could also be placed around the dog's ears.

Continue cooling with cool tap water until additional temperature readings indicate the dog's body temperature is down to 102 degrees.

Offer cool fresh water but don't force the dog to drink. Simply wetting its nose and lips can help. The key is to avoid hyperthermia in the first place by never allowing dogs to overexert in hot weather – it doesn't matter if it's a walk in the park or training for agility or hunting.

Always carry fresh water and keep the dog hydrated, regardless of the time of year and temperature.

It's also a good idea to keep a light towel available should the dog need to be cooled down.

This is North Dakota - hot weather can occur in November and blizzards in October. Be prepared.

Hunting dogs live to hunt. They will hunt until they physically can't.

It's up to the human in control to ensure their Hunting Maniac remains safe and healthy and even if Fido doesn't hunt, it's still equally important to avoid heat stroke.

Be careful in hot, humid weather.

In addition, it's natural for many dogs to run to Dogs don't sweat. Instead they pant to help keep a lake, river, or wetland when they're warm to cool





# No Matter How Far the Trip, Always Check Your Vehicle

Last summer while I was traveling with my family on another "Adventure Club" road trip we drove pretty much during the day, and making frequent stops "sight seeing" along the way, looking for old cars and trucks. We used all the safety rules that we stress to others: We got plenty of sleep the night prior to traveling and I as the primary driver was ready to take a break if I needed to, even if this delayed our return home and increased the cost of the trip. We left my headlights on to increase my visibility to other motorists, and wore comfortable clothes to keep the temperature in the car a little cool, but still comfortable.

As we were traveling from state to state I took notice of the changes in road signs, road surfaces and the occasional appearance of emergency vehicles. On one trip traveling through Nebraska I saw a car in the ditch that had evidently rolled over. The state patrol was already on site. I wondered what had happened? Was it rain? Did another driver cut them off? Were they drinking and driving? Did they just push it too far?

Thinking about what might have caused their accident prompted me to think about how I was driving. Was my speed too fast for conditions? Did I need to adjust my driving? If you can identify the cause of the accident you can adjust your driving and avoid the same fate.

We also noticed other signs along the road and considered what we could learn from them. These signs told a sad story but did not present the details of what may of happened. As we traveled a mere 700 miles, we saw scores of crosses and wreathes on the side of the road, memorials to people that lost their life on that particular spot on that stretch of road. What happened? Who were they? Where were they headed? The crosses and wreathes provided no answers, but caused me to do some thinking. Were they military PCSing or going home to see family? Were they on the road as a means to make a buck? Were they moving to a new place to find a better way of life? Were they on a family vacation trip? At one place there was a group of seven crosses in one place, was this a whole family that was lost? Discussing this with my wife, we came up with no real answers, only a lesson learned, traveling on the road is serious business, and lives can be lost.

Be prepared when you head out on the roadways of America, do the "Vehicle Check," plan for emergencies and delays, look for visual indicators of problem areas and come home safely. Don't make someone put up a cross for you





# VA announces new options to help Veterans avoid foreclosure

#### U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

WASHINGTON The Department of Veterans Affairs is offering a new COVID-19 Refund Modification option to assist Veterans who require a significant reduction in their monthly mortgage payments because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

In some cases, Veterans can receive a 20% payment reduction — in others, the reduction can be even larger.

This new option is part of the of Biden-Harris administration's expanded, government-wide effort to help homeowners retain their homes as they weather the economic challenges resulting from the ongoing pandemic.

Under the COVID-19 Refund Modification, VA can purchase

a Veteran's past due payments and amounts of unpaid principal, depending on how much assistance is necessary, subject to certain limits. Loan servicers also modify the loan. These efforts help ensure that the Veteran can afford future mortgage payments. "The COVID-19 Refund

Modification provides Veterans a lasting and affordable solution to keeping their homes and avoiding foreclosure," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "As our country recovers and rebuilds from the economic devastation brought on by the pandemic, VA and the Biden-Harris administration continue to make every effort to help Veterans keep a roof over their

head as they get back on their feet."

Like with VA's COVID-19 partial claim option, the Veteran's deferred indebtedness from a COVID-19 Refund Modification will be established as a junior lien. The junior lien will not accrue interest; will not require monthly payments; and will only become due when the property is sold, the guaranteed loan is paid off, or the guaranteed loan is refinanced.

Veterans can get a COVIDrelated forbearance through Sept. 30, 2021.

Military Housing Office (MHO) Process:

• The MHO sends a welcomemail this to every eligible person on the inbound list arriving within the next 3 months and anyone requesting on or off base housing information. This e-mail included the link to the HEAT website https://www.homes.mil/ heat. This website gives the military member the option to choose the type of housing they are interested in.

• When the members replies with their choice of either on or off base housing, the MHO e-mails them information on privatized housing (on base) or community housing (off base).

• If they choose on base privatized housing, we forward the contact information the member provided to Minot AFB Homes (BBC), so contact can be made with the member.

• If they choose off base community housing, we send them the link to https://www. homes.mil/homes. HOMES.mil is a publicly accessible Department of Defense (DoD) website and is designed to connect Service members and their Families with community housing rental listings





Try jigging Raps in deeper water or nightcrawlers in the shallows. Better success is west around Douglas Bay along the north shore or Silo

•Lake Sakakawea/northwest N.D. lakes, Scenic Sports, Williston: Lake Sakakawea continues producing walleye throughout much of the west end from Lewis & Clark State Park to the east. Locate structure using slow death rigs or spinners and nightcrawlers. Yellowstone and Missouri rivers starting to see some walleye success, as well, with continued catfish activity. Not much activity on small area lakes although Kota-Ray Dam still producing some panfish.

•Lonetree WMA area lakes, Harvey: Continued walleye success across area lakes.

•North-central/central N.D. lakes, Towner Hdwe. Hank, Towner: Not much activity on the Souris River of area lakes.

The USAF would branch into its own Proclamation designating August 1, 1946 as Air service nearly one month later. Truman addressed the nation after proclaiming the first Air Force Day, saying "I remind all of our citizens that the air of the AAF.
