

# U.S. and Partner Aircrews Conduct Middle East 'Presence Patrol'

Coalition and regional partner air forces joined two U.S. Air Force B-52 Stratofortresses, two KC-10 Extenders, three KC-135s Stratotankerers on a presence patrol mission across the U.S. Central Command area of responsibility June 8, 2022.

The bomber's flight originated at Minot Air Force Base (AFB), North Dakota, and flew over the East Mediterranean, Arabian Peninsula, and Red Sea before departing the region.

"Presence patrols, like todays, show the United States' continued commitment and interoperability with our partners in the region," said Lt. Gen. Greg Guillot, Ninth Air Force (AFCENT) commander. " These highly coordinated efforts demonstrate our combined ability to provide global reach and joint security to the region."

The flow of air power throughout the theater during this presence patrol was significant due to the number of joint and regional partners participating and the long duration of the U.S.-based mission, which demonstrated U.S. capabilities to rapidly respond to threats worldwide.

The nine-hour presence patrol

flew into the USCENTCOM AOR over the Red Sea and conducted rejoins with partner nations along the flight path before departing the region.

The B-52 and their aircrew are assigned to 5th Bomb Wing, Minot AFB and flew the mission under Air Force Global Strike Command's bomber task force mission-set. USCENTCOM, through Ninth Air Force (AFCENT), has facilitated three presence patrol missions in 2022 as a demonstration of the U.S.led coalition's commitment to promoting regional stability. The last bomber-led mission across the Central Region involved one B-52 and occurred Mar. 29, 2022.

# PCSing Support



**5TH BOMB WING** 



Moving is stressful, but there are tools available to help ease this transition. Military Ône Source provides a customized PCSing checklist at https://planmymove. militaryonesource.mil/. After completing a short questionnaire it will populate a series of checklists based upon your responses that can be followed step by step. Additionally, the site can be used to discover general information for your next installation. A common question received in regards to a pending PCS is, "Where can I find an application for housing?" Air Force Housing suggestions the following: if you desire to reside in government-owned or privatized housing, log into the Housing Early Assistance Tool (HEAT) website, https://www. housing.af.mil, or at https:// www.homes.mil and click on the "HEAT" Logo after you select the installation of your choice. HEAT creates an easy on-line experience and will connect you with the Military Housing Office (MHO) prior to your PCS transfer. HEAT also allows you to agree to release your personal information, to include contact information, to the Privatization Project Owner (Privatized Partner) team at bases with privatized family housing so they can provide you information directly. Once you agree, the MHO will send the Privatized Military Housing Office (PMO) your information. HEAT is available at all AF installations and the installations are prepared to assist you when  $yo\bar{u}$  submit your housing request through HEAT. Use HEAT to reach out to the installation housing office of your choice or PCS destination to request housing information and to request the application for housing. The MHO will send you pertinent installation and

community information based on your housing choices to include community housing support, as well as, forward you the required documents (e.g., DD Form 1746, AF Form 4422) needed to complete the application for housing. Each installation MHO will provide you details on how to return required documents including a copy of your PCS orders, if available, for their action. The MHO will provide you with specific information for status of government-owned housing based on your projected arrival to the installation. Or, if you requested information about privatized housing, the PMO will reach out to you directly regarding privatized housing options. You can continue to reach out to the MHO through HEAT, email or call them directly if you require additional information.

# **BEK TV - Local Makes The Difference**

In a recent discussion an active duty parent asked me "How do I tune in BEK TV?" They are covering Minot High School Girls Soccer in Mandan (it was the North Dakota State High School Girls Soccer Tournament). Another question came from an Air Force retiree. "I hear that BEK TV is carrying a Minot Mayoral Forum. This is my first year being able to vote in Minot, and I just want to get to know a little more about the candidates."

As fate would have it, I had just recently interviewed BEK TV, and BEK Communications Cooperative CEO Derrick Bulawa. The office for BEK TV is in Bismarck, but the cooperative is based out of Steele, North Dakota.

Mr. Bulawa started with BEK Communications in January of 2006, and at that time North Dakota was home to the legacy networks; ABC, NBC, CBS, and PBS over the air, with all other signals being on cable and based on subscriptions.

"So, we started the sport broadcast in 2007" according to Bulawa "but that was primarily in our service area, right, because we were the local phone company, cable operator and internet company." BEK has a major competitor in their service area, that being MidContinent Cable, and so Bulawa and his BEK team went to work on a plan to compete and own more market share. "So, we developed our own sports channel, and we covered all of the Class B schools in our service area. That was a successful venture." But BEK would soon launch a new high definition product. Eventually BEK would own a large cable footprint in South Central North Dakota. But BEK's cooperative family, like SRT in Minot, would soon become part of the BEK TV sports network structure. "All of a sudden, we have partner cable operators all around the state. And then it grew, and we had 100 games a year, 200 games

a year, 300 games a year...but we had reached a point where we had pretty much every cable operator on board, but we want to grow it. It wasn't over the air yet, and we weren't on any cable signals" continues Bulawa. As fortune would have it, licenses became available in Bismarck, Minot, and Fargo. Those licenses eventually became the property of BEK TV, and so the over the air BEK TV signal would be combined with cable & streaming. The broadcast signal has been available for about 5 years.

But it would be the 2020 election cycle that would bring about a new arena for BEK TV. "Our members we disappointed with how the social media and over the air broadcast stations had the exact same narrative" says Bulawa, "In the social media platforms all of the information that North Dakotans cared about would be blocked. And that became very aggressive during the election cycle. So our members said go get into the news and opinion business, go fix the social media business, and let North Dakotans make the choice of what they want to But BEK TV does not want to drive political platforms, they just want to provide a network that carries all opinions. "We're going to build a news channel to go along with our sports channel" says Bulawa. In order to be the best of the best local station BEK TV has picked up properties like the Green Bay Packers pre-season games, the Indoor Football League and is working towards establishing bigger and brighter stars in general, "We are constantly working towards growing the programming talent on our station. We want to have a sufficient platform so that we are able to allow anyone to do their own show. Left, right, in the

middle, it doesn't matter. Our job is to get it (programming) out to the market. The market will decide who wins, and who loses." The BEK distribution does not rely on typical social media platforms that can be blocked. Platforms like You Tube and Facebook continue to block programming. "So we don't use them. Instead, we have leveraged other platforms and that became attractive to national personalities that had been blocked" continues Bulawa "And of the over 500 television products that are out there, in the September through March time slots were always in the top 10, and frequently in the top 5, so we know people are finding us."

So, the answer to both questions is fairly simple. BEK TV over the air in Minot, ND is channel 26.

For those looking for BEK TV on MidCo Cable, it is channel 612.

Looking forward, BEK TV is a local station, willing to air local programming, whether it be sports, news. In news "We have Joel Heitkamp on one side and Rick Becker on the other, and I can tell you right now that no local station, anywhere in the United States, will carry that much diversity in programming. But we not only are, but we will continue to do more of it every day...and keep expanding the local sports channel." says Derrick Bulawa, and he says it with enough conviction that there is no uncertainty in my mind.





# What Do Military Chaplains Do?

When it comes to Military Chaplains, they have a different role than most other military members. Yes, they wear the uniform, and they have a chain of command, and get all the same benefits that are afforded to the other Airmen. They are in the military. However, they are also a little bit different. What makes them this way? Well, first of all, chaplains have a rank, but are always referred to as Chaplain. Secondly, they have complete privilege and confidentiality when military members talk to them, which is unheard of for any other active duty member. Nothing that is said to chaplains during a counseling session can go to an Airmen's leadership or even their spouse. It is comforting to know that whatever is shared with a chaplain won't be shared unless it is requested. As 5th Bomb Wing Chaplain Mark Bradshaw put it, "You are in the driver's seat during counseling sessions." He said each person leads what they want to talk about.

To get a firmer grip on what exactly Air Force Chaplains do on a regular basis, this reporter sat down with Chaplain Mark Bradshaw and True North Chaplain Brian Harris to get some deeper input and knowledge into what an average day for the life of an AF chaplain at Minot AFB looks like. Ch. Bradshaw said, "Every day is different; I have to be extremely flexible. I will have unit engagement by walking through squadrons and attending meetings when needed." He said that the most important thing he does is to, "build bridges [with Airmen] for when they need time to talk to someone." Ch. Bradshaw mentioned that it is important to him, and all Chaplains, that Airmen see them and know who to turn to when they need someone to talk to. Ch. Harris, who is assigned to True North -a program specified to increase wellness, mental health, religious faith and overall wellbeing by supporting resilience while embedded with certain unitssaid that his days are filled with "trying to mirror the mission." He said he tries to be with the Airmen and do the job they are doing as much as possible. He said Airmen are the reason for the Chaplain job and he wants to be with them and amongst them whenever he can. Both Chaplains, who joined the military later in life, admitted that they were doing other ministryfocused careers, but felt led to join the AF when the opportunity presented itself. Both men have captivating and heartfelt stories of why they joined when they did, but both passionately agreed that they could not have been able to make the life-changing leap

without their extremely supportive wives and families.

Changing gear to a topic that has put military chaplains in the focus a bit more, the disapproval of the Covid-19 vaccination religious waiver was the next discussion. According to the Chaplains, religious waivers are an official exception for a service member to obtain based on sincerely held religious beliefs that may be in opposition to a specific military policy. Most of the time these beliefs revolve around clothing or hair regulations. When an Airman seeks a religious exemption, they must first interview with a Chaplain. The Chaplain then has to determine if their belief is sincerely held by asking questions and getting to know the individual. The next step in the religious exemption process requires the Chaplain to make a recommendation to the Airmen's commander about the sincerity of the religious belief at hand. Ch. Harris then brought to attention the AF Policy Directive: ACCOMMODATION OF RELIGIOUS PRACTICES IN THE AIR FORCE. This official and public document states the Air Force's stipulation for what can and cannot be approved as a religious exemption. This document states that a religious waiver must not allow "adverse impact on military readiness, unit cohesion, good order and discipline, or public health and safety for both the individual and unit levels." But, Ch. Harris wanted to remind individuals that Chaplains are always the first stop for religious issues within the military and they are there to listen and give advice to both commanders and legal

about religious accommodations within the military.

There is so much more that could be said about these two chaplains, the work they do on the base, the people they help and the passion they have for the Airmen, but each said the best thing about their jobs is being with and caring for people. Ch. Harris said, "I get to be around people that I would not usually get to be around. Few pastors have the opportunity to see the missions and see Airmen. [I love having the] accessibility to individuals and making investments in eternal lives." Ch Bradshaw said that he loves that he gets to be, "... another member in uniform but his commission is to go out and care for the Airmen." As is evident from the interview with these two members, the mission of the AF Chaplain is to firmly maintain the Five R's: Relationships, Resilience, Respect, Religious Freedom, & Relevance. Military Chaplains everywhere wish to "Remind you about the vertical part of you that is made to connect with spiritual things and with God. But to also remind Airmen that God can help build relationships." - Chaplain Harris.







### BRUSHING UP ON BOATING SAFETY AND REGULATIONS Patricia Stockdill

Summer is officially only days away even though boaters, anglers, and watercraft enthusiasts have already enjoyed some time on the water – wind permitting, that is.

In celebrating summer's arrival it doesn't hurt to test one's brain power when it comes to water, boats, safety, and perhaps above all, North Dakota's laws when to avoid getting a ticket or worse, having something bad happen.

And so, with a muted drum roll playing somewhere in the background, here's the "Know your boating regulations and water safety quiz, North Dakota style" for the season: • Question: What's the better life jacket for water skiers and tubers to wear – one with four nylon straps or one with a zipper? Two bonus points when providing correct justification for the answer – and, yes, it has to be the correct answer. • Answer: One with four straps. And, yes, two bonus points for the right reason – it's because straps are stronger than zippers upon impacting water.

• Question: The United States Coast Guard has four categories, or types, of approved personal flotation devices (PFD). What is the designed use of a Type IV PFD?

• Answer: It's not meant to be worn but instead designed to throw to someone in the water.

Question: Can a child under the age of 12 operate a motorboat, including a personal watercraft, if it has a motor more than 10-horsepower alone in North Dakota?
Answer: Nope, someone 18 years of age or older must

accompany them.

• Question: Here's a two-part question and two correct answers garners the victor with two bonus points: Does North Dakota require boat owners to register their boats (OK, technically boats really should be referred to as watercraft in the official jargon of water safety regulations and laws)? If so, what agency is responsible and does that include any type of boat that floats?

• Answer: Yes, residents need to register their boat, AKA watercraft, if it is propelled by a motor. The N.D. Game and Fish Department is the responsible agency in charge of that detail.

• Question: Just in case a boat doesn't have a capacity plate

• Question: How much is North Dakota's ANS (Aquatic Nuisance Species) fee, which is used to help the State of North Dakota address ANS issues?

• Answer: \$15, which runs concurrently with the state's threeyear watercraft registration period.

• Question: Are there lakes in North Dakota where motorized watercraft aren't allowed?


• Answer: That's another "yup". Some lakes are "Idle speed only" or "Electric motor only" so check the regulations and definitions to be on the safe and legal side of things.

• Question: What are the three basic things every boater, angler, and watercraft user can do to help reduce and prevent the spread of ANS?

• Answer: This is a critical question because doing the right thing not only helps save the state's fisheries but protects industrial and municipal water supplies by reducing negative impacts on intake structures: Here's another drumroll leading up to the correct answer. . . : First, clean the watercraft by inspecting equipment and removing plants, animals (think things like zebra mussels here), or mud before leaving an access site. Next, drain all water completely before leaving. And, finally, dry all equipment or simply wash with hot water before using again.

• And the final question and final drumroll...: Where is the best place to get the complete North Dakota Boating Safety Guide?

• Answer: It's right on this link from the Game and Fish Department website: (gf.nd.gov/boating/safety-regulations#unsafe-use).

• Answer: Yup, there is. Simply take the boat's length times its width and divide by 15 to get the number of maximum capacity of people.

Some of the most important places to look for aquatic nuisance species latching onto a watercraft include the trailer hitch, axles, hull, rollers, and the trailer itself, motor and prop, and boat bilge, live well, dock lines and anchor.

## Car care checklist for summer road trips • Part 2

It's time for a drive vacation. You mapped a route, booked hotels, and made a checklist of things to do before you go. AAA reminds you to also make car maintenance part of your summer road trip preparation. Use this car care checklist to ensure your vehicle is ready for summer travel.

#### **Check belts and hoses**

Reinforced rubber drive belts power the engine water pump and accessories such as the alternator and air conditioning compressor so you should inspect and replace any that are cracked, glazed or frayed. Note that modern multi-rib or drive belt materials do not show easily visible signs of wear. As a general rule, replace drive belts every 60,000 miles.

Inspect and replace worn, brittle, bulging or excessively soft radiator hoses. Check for leaks around hose clamps and at the radiator and water pump.

#### Keep the AC running cool

Take a test drive with the air conditioner running. If you notice a decrease in cooling capacity, take the car to an auto repair shop for diagnosis. Also have the cabin filter inspected and replaced as needed.

At my age, the opening of Roosevelt Park's pool still makes me excited and the past Friday, June 3rd, was no exception. To me, when the pool opens, that signals that summer has arrived in Minot. Never mind meteorological summer or the summer solstice. Parks are places loved by kids and adults, especially in the summer. Parks are places of fun, friends, and family togetherness on warm and even hot days. At the pool, I love the feel of the warm concrete on my bare feet, and the smells of burning charcoal, sun block, and chlorine make me relax into the deck chair and let my mind wander. The hope of an ice cream truck and its tinkley tune are alive in my heart. The river and the railroad remind me of nature and humanity on the move. The talk and laughter of the kids on the slides and in the pools makes me appreciate all the summer activities that occur at Roosevelt Park, especially the July 4th food and music that come to help us Minotans (I've lived here for 24 years) celebrate our nation's Independence Day on the lush green grass and under the fully leaved trees.

During my childhood days in western Pennsylvania, ice cream was to be had at the concession stand. This common practice is known throughout the industrial and non-industrial world as Lockout/ Tagout, better known as LOTO. So what is LOTO?

Lockout-Tagout is a safety procedure which is used in industry and research settings to ensure that dangerous machines are properly shut off and not started up again prior to the completion of maintenance or servicing work. It requires that hazardous power sources be "isolated and rendered inoperative" before any repair procedure is started. "Lock and tag" works in conjunction with a lock usually locking the device or the power source with the hasp, and placing it in such a position that no hazardous power sources can be turned on. The procedure requires that a tag be affixed to the locked device indicating that it should not be turned on.

Modern machinery can contain many hazards to workers, from things like electrical, mechanical, pneumatic or hydraulic sources. For example a typical industrial machine may contain things like hot fluids, moving presses, blades, propellers, electrical heaters, conveyor belts with pinch points, moving chains, ultraviolet light, etc. Disconnecting or making safe the equipment involves the removal of all energy sources and is known as isolation. The steps necessary to isolate equipment are often documented in an Isolation Procedure or a Lockout Tagout Procedure. The isolation procedure generally includes the following tasks:

standard addresses practices and procedures necessary to disable machinery and prevent the

release of potentially hazardous energy while maintenance or servicing activities are performed. With this being said you may ask yourself "if I unplug a radio or microwave oven after use, do I need LOTO?' No you do not. Exposure to hazardous energy is controlled completely by unplugging the equipment from an electric outlet and where the employee doing the service or maintenance has exclusive control of the plug. This applies only if electricity is the only form of hazardous energy to which employees may be exposed. This exception encompasses many portable hand tools and some cord and plug connected machinery and equipment.

In closing, when dealing with LOTO and you are not sure, do not hesitate to ask for assistance. The shop supervisor, the person doing the actual work, or the Wing Safety office can provide more extensive detail concerning LOTO in your work center.
