Let's get Hiking: Woodland Trail



Hiking is notably one of the adventurer's favorite summer pastimes. Hiking, otherwise known as walking in naturefilled outdoors locations, is described by the American Hiking Society as having tons of individual benefits: "Walking is one of the lowest impact sports around. This means that while you derive all the cardiovascular benefits of other aerobic activities, you do so with a minimum of stress, strain and pounding to your body." According to them, hiking can reduce the risks of hypertension, diabetes, heart disease, obesity, anxiety, osteoporosis and arthritis. With all these added health benefits and the relative ease of the activity, it stands to reason that this venture should be enjoyed

by everyone, especially when the weather is nice. Minot residents are in luck when it comes to having the opportunity, lovely summer weather and the close proximity to various nature filled trails to hike. One such beautiful and easily accessible trail is the Woodland Trail located in North Minot.

The Woodland Trail is maintained by the Minot Parks District. Its location is tucked away on HWY 83 Bypass, after crossing the Souris River and before reaching the HWY 52 intersection. Visitors can find the small parking lot, vault toilets and trail sign at the start of the walk. This mostly-tree-covered pathway has multiple ways, forks and options to explore. The cleared hike spirals through trees, grasslands, bridges and river beds. It is a fairly easy hike with no large hills or treacherous landscapes, which makes it ideal for kids and pets alike. The trail, though marked clearly, does have multiple shoot-outs and a mazelike fluidity that lends its hand to confusion of direction if one is not paying attention.

The Woodland Trail is an easy way to get outdoors with the family and engulf in nature; however, it is not the only hiking trail in Minot. In 1919, during the infancy of military aviation, the 2nd Observation group was founded on Aug. 15 at Luke Field in the Territory of Hawaii. In 1921, the group was re-designated as the 5th Observation Group, flying the DeHaviland DH-4 aircrafts. Now, nearly a century later, the 5th Bomb Wing and their fleet of B-52H Stratofortresses assume the mantel of "Guardians of the Upper Realm," continuing their storied legacy.

"This is the most strategic installation in the Department of

"I can assure you folks, right now the world is watching. Adversaries and allies alike are watching what Minot Air Force Base does. It watches as we reassure our allies and deter our adversaries and because of that unblinking eye, every day this wing executes its primary mission. A no-fail mission. And in these last 2 years, I've seen you answer the call time and time again."

Col. Walters assumed command of the 5th Bomb Wing in July of 2020 and since then has lead the Bomb Wing to several achievements, including 10 Air

Force-level awards, 108 Air Force Global Strike Commandlevel awards, the first sub-zero temperature generation in 15 years and the 2020 Brigadier General Frederick W. Castle Memorial award as the top Strategic Bomber Wing.

"Teammates, you set the standard for others to follow," said Walters. "Simply put, you showed others what right looks like; pride and professionalism that's second to none. So every Warbird operator, maintainer, defender, first responder, engineer and support services personnel, your selfless acts,


your grit and determination, are truly awe inspiring. You are the personification of 'Only The Best Come North'."

On June 23rd, 2022, Col. Walters relinquished command of the 5th Bomb Wing to Col. Daniel S. Hoadley and with it, the Wing's 5.4 billion dollar nuclear stockpile, 28 B-52s and the Department of Defense's largest personnel reliability assurance program.

"Warbirds, we share a weighty responsibility," said Hoadley.

"In an era of great power competition, the nation expects us to provide global strategic deterrence indefinitely... it's a tall order for sure. But we must do this. We can do this. We will do this. Because only the Best Come North."

The global strategic bomber presence mission is one of the Air Force and Department of Defense's most crucial missions, ensuring our allies that we are both willing and able to decisively strike anywhere in the world at any time. The Airmen of the 5th Bomb Wing now look to Col. Hoadley to carry on their already successful legacy and with that, pledge that they are ready to execute lethal global strike tonight & every night.

We have dedicated staff ready to guide you through career assessments and job searching, building an impactful resume, and conducting mock interviews. You may qualify for the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) program. WIOA can provide funding for classroom training or work with an employer who can provide onthe-job training (OJT) - learn while you earn!

Second step, make a list of your skills. What are your hard skills? Hard skills are technical, tangible skills – using computers, bookkeeping, repairing equipment, operating a payloader, serving customers. What about your soft skills? Showing up on time, courteous to teammates and customers, working as a team, you



In 1960, the Belgian Congo, a colony in West Central Africa, was granted independence and became the Republic of the Congo. Due to a power-sharing struggle between two opposing political parties and continuing unrest, a civil war broke out. The United Nations deployed troops to help keep the peace as the nation was torn apart. In order to evacuate refugees from the Belgian colony, Operation NEW TAPE began on July 8, 1960. The operation evacuated over 300 American civilians, delivered more UN troops, and flew other humanitarian relief missions. USAF in Europe provided were social distanced. By contrast, Col. Walters handed off the guidon for the 5th Bomb Wing to Col. Daniel Hoadley with a much larger audience, years after the height of COVID. At our first interview late in the summer of 2020, Col. Walters shared that he, and his family, had chosen Minot because "it's hard." Our conversation would continue with an explanation. Minot is hard for the obvious reason: the weather. People from more temperate climates do not acclimate well to the below zero temperatures. But Col. Walters explained that it was more than that which makes Minot

"hard." It was the percentage of first term Airmen that arrive in Minot, many of whom live in the dorms on base, a fair distance from downtown Minot and the activities the community offers. But in Col. Walters' eyes, it is working through those issues that molds those Airmen for performing the mission at Minot Air Force Base.

At the end of his two-year journey, Col. Walters has mixed emotions on the eve of his last day as Commander of the 5th Bomb Wing. "The mission is challenging,

He describes both Minot Air Force Base and the community of Minot as amazing. "Our mission is 24/7. We are constantly being watched by our allies and our adversaries. "What I would like to think is that they saw me as the person that maximized the opportunity in this office to make the wing better, to make the Airmen better, and to make the conditions better for our families and to advocate for our force and families." After pausing a minute, Col. Walters finished the interview with another thought, that he cared so much that he pushed us to be a better version of ourselves. Best Bases in the Air Force: Joint Base Elemendorf-Richardson

A common first topic of discussion amongst any newly-introduced Air Force family is, "Where all have you been stationed? And where has been your favorite?" This usually leads to many fascinating conversations about the military life experience, such as how one person's dream location is another family's worst nightmare. It cannot be avoided that some locations and bases are more highly sought after than others and some assignments are preceded with dread. I was worried it would just be ice and snow for most of the year, and I was worried about not making friends quickly because I assumed people didn't leave their houses much in that weather. It didn't take long to see that my assumptions were wrong." When moving to Alaska, Melissa and her active duty husband, MSgt Jason Lawyer from 5 CES, had just welcomed their 3rd daughter and were nervous to make a go in a completely new environment. But it ended up being their favorite base and location. Here's why:

MELISSA'S TOP 5 REASONS TO LOVE ANCHORAGE ALASKA AND JBER

1. THE WILDERNESS WAS ON BASE- There is miles of wilderness on base and it didn't take much to be in the woods, or to find a lake, campsite, creek, playground or even a moose.

2. EVERYTHING WE NEEDED WAS CLOSE BY- We were close to stores and needs, but then you could drive 20 minutes in either direction and you can see so much Alaskan beauty.

3. PEOPLE ARE WILLING TO LEND A HAND- I was afraid of being able to make friends quickly. But because everyone living there is so far from their families and friends from the Lower 48, we found that people were incredibly welcoming and willing to help you out however you needed it.

4. ENDLESS ADVENTURE-Alaska has an endless list of amazing things you can do. Our family (including our 3 girls), did





In a large skillet, cook the onion, then add garlic. Add beef

or lamb and cook until browned. Drain off grease.

Add tomato sauce and vegetables to meat. Cook for 4-5 minutes, stirring often. Add Guinness, Worcestershire sauce, thyme, and salt and pepper to taste. Boil until the liquid has reduced by half and thickened (about 15 minutes).

Add the potatoes to the boiling water and cook for 15-20 minutes or until soft but not mushy. Drain and cool. Mash the potatoes with butter, milk, salt and pepper to taste.

Once meat mixture is done cooking and the potatoes are mashed, divide the meat mixture between two dishes. Top with mashed potatoes then with the cheese.

When ready to cook, set the Traeger to 350 ° F and preheat, lid closed, for 10 to 15 minutes.

Bake for 30-45 minutes or until potatoes are golden brown and cheese is melted. Serve hot. Enjoy!





•Lake Sakakawea, Van Hook Bait & Tackle, New Town: Continued good walleye bite in the Van Hook Arm throughout much of the Arm with the north end the most consistent. Try a variety of presentations with a general switch to nightcrawlers. Lots of eater-sized fish close to the upper end of the Arm using live bait presentations with bigger fish towards the south end and the river channel using crankbaits.

•Lake Sakakawea/Missouri River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River tailrace inconsistent following recent weather fronts. However, lots of small walleye success continues. Try jigs and minnows around the "blowout" area or late night hours in the chutes from boats for walleye. Fair to good for catfish from boats during the day scattered throughout the river. Look for improving trout and salmon later into the summer months. Try the boat ramp, rocks, or campground from shore using nightcrawlers or minnows for walleye and catfish during the day or crankbaits from shore at night for walleye. New BLOS capability on the horizon for B-52s, first IRIS air demo complete

The Air Force has moved one step closer to equipping B-52s with a new beyond line of sight communication capability called IRIS.

The 49th Test and Evaluation Squadron executed the first air demonstration utilizing the BLOS communication system paired with an Iridium Certus terminal on a B-52 Stratofortress at Barksdale Air Force Base, June. 22, 2022.

"In a wartime scenario the single point of failure often lies in our ability to communicate," said Capt. Richard Brown, 49th TES Conventional test flight commander. "If we can't send and receive mission critical data from our aircraft reliably and efficiently, then we will lose. The IRIS system is one of the many datalink solutions that we need in order to equip the warfighter for today's fight.

While the bomber crew took to the skies, a combat operations team from the 608th Air Operations Center provided command and control and assessed the voice and data transfer capabilities that were observed from the IRIS-equipped B-52 to include the transmission of real-time images and videos.

The IRIS system, which leverages the Low Earth Orbit Iridium NEXT satellite constellation guarantees global complete coverage. Additionally, IRIS will forgo using the dated 2.4 Kbps bandwidth capacity of Iridium for the much improved L-Band speeds of Iridium Certus, a broadband service that has a bandwidth capacity of up to 704 Kbps.

"Today, we learned that the IRIS System can be immediately employed using current joint tactics for operational and tactical control of long-range strike aircraft," said Lt. Col. Paul Goossen, 608th AOC Combat Operations Division chief.

The AOC team also acknowledged the method of "how" the Service acquires a new capability plays a significant role in the timeline of fielding the new capability.

"We found that the AFWERX SBIR's program works to find rapid prototype solutions through commercially available means," said Chris Morales, 608th AOC Combat Operations Division deputy chief. "Sometimes the solutions to global problems can be found in your local community from small vendors.'



process to attain a SBIR Strategic Finance contract to support IRIS. This will allow for permanent bomber integration and seamless coordination across geographic air operation centers using the system. IRIS is set to replace the Global Iridium Bomber Set (GLIBS) that has been in service since 2017. BLOS communication The

system is one of AFGSC's solutions to integrate the B-52 fleet into the greater Joint All-Domain Command and Control (JADC2) problem set. IRIS is one of many programs on the horizon responsible for the B-52 paradigm shift from a legacy sustainment platform to a lethally modernized multi-domain aircraft.

FISHIN' FOR 'CATS' Patricia Stockdill

They probably missed out in the "handsome" category when it comes to being a fish. They probably don't even fit the "cute" category.

After all, the channel catfish calling the Missouri River tailrace home – or any channel catfish anywhere else for that matter – lack the glittery greenish-gold of walleye or the cutesy bluegill and crappie physique. In fact, they probably remind some folks of the lowly bullhead.

Or maybe even a drum - and not the kind of drum that makes music.

Catfish have this big mouth – really big mouth.

And whiskers – four of them, in fact.

And they're kind of gray-brown – not exactly eye-catching. Sadly, they really don't get much love from North Dakota anglers. Some anglers, though, may remember when bullheads and other native species were highly sought after during a fishing outing.

However, that was before a cooperative Garrison Dam and Valley City National Fish hatcheries and N.D. Game and Fish Department program began with the agencies working together to enhance fishing opportunities in the state.

Most notably, it introduced walleye to an increasing number of lakes, elevating them to near king-like status among anglers in terms of desirable catches.

Since then pike, sauger, bullheads, and even channel catfish just don't have the glitz and glamour that comes with walleye fishing. Granted, anglers still seek those other species out, but walleye are king.

Yes, channel catfish seriously lack angler love, although they receive a little show of affection from anglers who treasure fishing for them on the Red River. For the true catfish angler, the Red River has a hefty reputation for big 'cats and catch-and-release is hugely popular. But that's a couple of hundred miles away.

The Missouri River System offers a nearby alternative. There they get love from a few folks who know the secrets to their whereabouts on the Little Missouri River, the upper end of Lake Sakakawea, and maybe even Lake Oahe downstream of Bismarck-Mandan.

Thankfully, there is also a niche of anglers with catfish love for those calling the Missouri River tailrace below Garrison

Presentations used when targeting catfish on the Missouri River aren't much different from what one might use when fishing for The King – walleye: Try vertical drifting with smelt or nightcrawlers - or any typical walleye rigging because anglers are typically working the fast water of the tailrace chutes or immediately downstream.

With most fish less than 5 pounds in the tailrace, one's line weight really doesn't matter – anything from 8-pound up to 16-pound test line.

One trick that could make a difference in keeping or releasing a catfish is the size of hook – try larger hooks such as a No. 2 or larger - if the hook is too small it's more difficult to get it out easily.

It's hard to say why channel catfish don't get much love. Maybe it is their appearance. Maybe it's because they're not named "walleye".

Or maybe it's because most folks don't remember or don't know that for a long time catfish were deservedly prized as great eating, native North Dakota fish.


Take a trip to the tailrace and try to catch a few of those eater-sized tailrace catfish. Cook 'em up. While catfish will likely never attain the popularity they enjoy elsewhere - and most certainly could never topple King Walleye from its perch on Top of the Hill - they're a great reason to get out, fish, and enjoy the outdoors.

And maybe they will get back the angler love they deserve as a true native North Dakota fish.

For those who already know the great taste of catfish caught in fresh, cold water the Missouri River tailrace is a neat spot to check out. Just head downstream of Garrison Dam along N.D. Highway 200 by Riverdale.

The tailrace and its catfish provide an opportunity for those who grew up fishing for 'cats to find that experience in North Dakota. Tailrace anglers typically catch nice, eater-sized catfish in that 1- to 3-pound range working the tailrace chutes from boats. Or they may find them fishing the wing walls, although that's often at night. They can even catch them from shore during the day.

Channel catfish are native to North Dakota and the Missouri River System.



NOTES ON BEING SAFE **Obeying the law**, prior planning key to fireworks safety

The Fourth of July is right around the corner and most of us are probably planning a special event of some type, some folks might even be looking forward to setting off their own fireworks display. More than 11,000 people are injured in the United States each year from fireworks. Most injuries are the result of the lack of adult supervision and misuse of the fireworks. If you plan on using fireworks to add to the celebration this year here are some important reminders:

· Observe local laws. The sale of fireworks is legal from June 26 until July 5 and they may not be purchased by persons under the age of 12.

Fireworks Permitted on Base Are; Sparklers, fountains, smoke devices, snake and glow worms, trick noisemakers such as party poppers, string poppers or snappers, and toy pistol caps.

Fireworks Specifically Prohibited on Base Are; Explosive or aerial fireworks, roman candles, and rockets or similar devices. If prohibited fireworks are discovered in your possession on the base, the fireworks will be confiscated and you will face administrative/ disciplinary actions.

Fireworks are allowed in Ward County but NOT within in the city limits of Minot. If you are caught within city limits vith fireworks you will have to appear in court, pay a minimum \$150 bond and be fined between \$50 to \$75. It is also a Class B Misdemeanor.





handy for emergencies, and douse used sparklers.

People should watch what clothing they wear when using fireworks. Loose clothing can catch fire, and shouldn't be worn while handling fireworks.

· Never try to re-ignite fireworks that have malfunctioned. Wait 20 minutes before soaking them with water and throwing them away.

· Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Have a "designated shooter."

The transportation and storage of personal fireworks on Minot AFB is prohibited. The fact is there are no safe and sure ways to use fireworks - it's that simple! In 2008, according to the National Fire Protection Association, fireworks caused an estimated 22,500 reported fires. These fires resulted in one death, 40 injuries and \$42 million in direct property damage. Fireworks, even the smallest of firecrackers, are explosives

and very unpredictable. Some have very short fuses and some have hard to light fuses that can suddenly begin a rapid burn. Rockets and cones tend to have no programmed guidance system, making people and buildings unwanted targets.

Each year thousands of Americans, many of them children, are victims of fireworks accidents. In 2008, U.S. hospital emergency rooms treated an estimated 7,000 people for fireworks related injuries. These accidents are not minor; they include the loss or disfiguration of fingers, hands, arms, faces, vision, hearing and severe burns. Sparklers, which can burn as hot as 1000 degrees have caused countless tragic injuries to small children since parents assume they are safe for children to use.

By observing these reminders, people can help prevent unfortunate accidents. Remember, in case of an emergency, call 911.

Use fireworks outdoors only.

Never let children handle light fireworks. Even or sparklers can be dangerous if unsupervised. 16 percent of those injuries involved sparklers. That number increases to 33 percent of the injuries to children, five or younger, when they used sparklers. Those injuries could've been avoided if adults provided adequate supervision.

Never ignite fireworks while holding them. Only light one at a time, and move away quickly. · Make sure there's enough room to ignite fireworks, and keep them away from buildings, vehicles and flammable materials. Have a full bucket of water






