

### **Bully Vigilance 22**

The 91st Missile Wing conducted an exercise simulating the retaking of an intercontinental ballistic missile launch facility, Oct. 13, 2022. The exercise, called Bully Vigilance 22-2, involved over 500 defenders from the 91st Security Forces Group and 91st Missile Wing Inspector General Office.

"BV 22-2 was a weeklong exercise designed to test the 91st Missile Wing's ability to conduct readiness operations and protect our national defense assets, with the goal of evaluating areas to further improve the Wing's nuclear readiness and strategic deterrence capabilities," said Tech. Sgt. Corey Wood, Non-Commissioned Officer in Charge of Wing Inspections and Exercises.

The moment the simulated takeover was initiated, defenders from all squadrons in the security forces group were recalled to the base to arm up and prepare to retake the facility.

"The exercise was a good test of my leadership abilities for several reasons," said Tech. Sgt. Elias Aggen, a 91st Security Forces Group defender. "It kicked off during changeover for the missile complex, so we were trying to communicate between two different squadrons, the Missile Alert Facilities (MAFs) and other alert teams involved."


Aggen and his team of defenders had to assault approximately 800 meters of open terrain during abnormally strong winds, topping out at gusts of over 50 knots per hour.

"It was definitely a challenge trying to direct forces in that said Aggen. Members from the 791st Missile Security Forces Squadron and 91st Missile Security Forces Squadron were first on the scene, with the objective of securing the immediate area around the facility, allowing the other defenders safe entry. "It's not everyday that you're put into a situation to lead others, especially those you don't work with everyday," said Airman 1st Class Taylor Hendrickson, a 91st Security Forces Group defender. "But by falling back on all of the tools and tactics I have been taught during training and the mentorship of my senior leaders, the responding units and I were able to successfully execute the mission."

After neutralizing the simulated threats, the defenders reviewed their performance of the exercise and how they can improve in the future.

"The defenders of the 91 SFG showcased their dedication to providing security to our nation's most vital assets," said Wood.





**UPSIDE DOWN UNDER**

Most of us know about LaMoure because we've either been there or we're familiar with football and volleyball, in recent state tournaments.

LaMoure is just like any other small-town county seat in North Dakota. Its economy is based on farming. In fact, R.D. Offutt, synonymous with John Deere, got its start in Lisbon and LaMoure in the late '70s. LaMoure has a good school system, a strong Main Street and other attractions like nearby Lake LaMoure and it's about 100 miles southwest of Fargo.

But LaMoure has another... I'm not sure you'd call it an attraction... but it's definitely obvious as you come into town from either direction on N.D. Highway 13.

### North Dakota's Omega Tower...

Not for tourists, it's the Navy's 1,200-foot Omega Tower. This tower has baffled a lot of people, including some who live in LaMoure County. Why would the Navy operate a communications tower in the middle of the country in landlocked LaMoure, North Dakota?

Right out of high school in the late '70s and early '80s, I lived in nearby Edgeley and dated a couple of girls from LaMoure. I found out back then the tower was owned by the Coast Guard and was a relay point for communication between both

When GPS became fully operational, it made Omega obsolete and the tower was shut down in 1997. The Navy re-opened it in 2011 as a communications link to submarines. According to Navy public affairs, Omega transmits a low frequency radio signal that can penetrate solid rock and reach deep into either ocean, making it ideal for subsurface communication.

When the tower was built in the late '60s, it brought numerous military families to LaMoure. By 1979, when I moved to Edgeley for a job, the tower location had six military personnel operating the facility. Today, the Navy contracts with civilian employees who operate it.

If you look around the state, there are plenty of TV, radio and cellular towers that reach 1,200 feet in the sky. And when you drive past the Omega Tower just west of LaMoure, it looks like any other radio or TV tower, except for maybe the fence around the grounds.

The tower, and its presence in this southeast North Dakota community, has had a lasting impact on LaMoure itself. Most notably is the Omega Plaza in downtown LaMoure. Yes, it's one of the smallest communities in the state with a shopping center and its namesake comes from the tower.

There's also the Omega Motel and the "Omega Room" in one of the local restaurants.

That's about the extent of it. The residents and city leaders of LaMoure were savvy enough to not over do the "Omega" designation. Some communities will take a unique opportunity like this and completely blow it out of proportion. For all intents and purposes, LaMoure hasn't done that.

LaMoure is in the James River Valley, approximately 65 miles to the southeast of Jamestown, 20 miles east of Edgeley and 30 miles southwest of Lisbon. The tower itself, also sits in the James River Valley, so just imagine this tower communicating to the depths of the Pacific Ocean as you drive out of the valley east or west.

Consider this as well. The Omega Tower is 1,515 nautical miles from San Francisco Bay and it's 3,200 nautical miles from Hawaii. And we have trouble here in western North Dakota getting KFGO radio in Fargo, about 300 miles to our southeast.

The Omega Tower is really an interesting little place, and it's little geographically, probably less than an acre, but it's quite strategic and is an effective communications tool for the U.S. military.

So if you're ever in that neighborhood, take a look and marvel at what the Omega Tower is and what it does. Meanwhile we'll keep our eyes on the Loboes football and volleyball teams as they work toward the 2022 state tournaments.

When you find out you're moving to Minot, the first thing you wonder about is the cold. When you move to Minot the first thing you'll think about is the cold. When you tell someone you live in Minot, the first thing they ask about is the cold.

Yes, there's more to North Dakota than cold winters – but we're kidding ourselves if we claim our winters aren't exceptional. Subzero temperatures and arctic wind chills are easy small talk topics. And if conversation ever stalls, you can always rely on that trusty saying, "It wouldn't be so bad if it wasn't windy." On second thought, if conversation stalls, just say something about "the wind" and you'll be back on track shortly.

All this to say, folks have a lot of presuppositions about the cold before they experience a Minot winter. Before my first winter I was sure I'd wear my heaviest coat every day. I was sure I'd need to stock up on hats, gloves and a warmer indoor wardrobe. I, like many other transplants, have spent copious time in Facebook

groups asking about the best winter gear and reading boot reviews online.

But then something magical happens. Winter comes - and while no one ever really gets used to a -30° windchill, most people don't think about it nearly as much as they expected. Cold temperatures are a funny and fluctuating thing in hot dish territory. When summer finally gives way to fall, allowing temperatures to dip into the 30s for the first time, the whole town grumbles.

Heavy parkas come out. Wool socks and hats appear. Chatter shifts from noting the humidity (which doesn't actually exist) to bemoaning the frost and discussions of Almanac predictions for the months to come. Then after a few weeks, those 30° days feel balmy, the perfect temperature to break out your ankle cropped jeans. Coats are reserved for really cold days with highs in the teens. But winter is long in Minot. Soon even those temperatures don't feel so bad. So you save your heavy coat for the really, really cold days. This cycle continues until you find yourself wearing a sweatshirt to preschool drop off on a morning with a -35° windchill.

I know this is true, because it happens to me every year. I know this is true, because it's not just me. I see other moms shuffling well-bundled kids across parking lots and scuttling from car to door – I see them wearing their fleece pullovers. I see them all winter long.

Is it laziness? Is it that the novelty of a heavy coat wears off as the cold months drag on? Is it the discomfort of driving in a parka? Or that if you wear a coat to Target, you'll just want to take it off as soon as you're inside? My reason is that I'm usually sweaty, cranky and running late by the time I've got my kids bundled up. I'm so eager to get going I don't bother with anything heavier than a small puffer jacket. Then I justify my decision by thinking, "I'm only going from the house to the car, anyway.'

Whatever the reason, it happens. Even to those who swear it never will.

Then, one happy day, the thermometer will read 45°. We all – locals and transplants alike - go out and bask in the sun, declaring it "T-shirt weather." A few weeks later, when the high is 60°, you can find me upending my drawers to find a tank top summer has arrived!

Up here, cold is relative. The definition of "cold" is constantly shifting. We all acclimate. Even the transplants.

So here's some friendly advice. Buy the good winter gear, but know it may hang in your closet unused, acting as a security blanket. It'll be nice to know you could wear it - if you wanted. It'll be nice to have it for playing in the snow or skiing. But your favorite winter coat will be the one that is light and comfortable. It'll

be the one you zip up on that first frosty morning in October. It'll be the one you wear through all the cold days until the grass starts to grow again in the spring. If you have that jacket, glove liners, and a couple good sweatshirts, you'll

Just give it a little time. Give it a chance. No matter where you come from, in time you too, will

justify wearing only a sherpa sweatshirt to preschool drop off with the logic, "I'll only be out of the car for a second or two."



### Fishing:

Lake Sakakawea elevation, Oct. 24: 1,833.68 feet above mean sea level (MSL); 14,200 cubic feet per second (CFS) Garrison Dam average daily releases.

Devils Lake elevation: 1,449.39 feet above mean sea level (MSL). Stump Lake elevation: 1,449.3 MSL.

- N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: Decent walleye activity working wind-blown shorelines along Devils Lake. No other area reports.
- · Devils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: Weather permitting some late season walleye success working any of the bridges. Try jigging. Some larger fish showing up with crankbaits.
- Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Little activity with weather front moving through and anglers waiting for the transition to ice fishing.
- ·Lake Darling, Karma C-Store, Ruthville: No new reports with little activity.
- •Lake Metigoshe, Four Seasons, Bottineau: Not much activity but the few anglers out continue finding occasional walleye.
- Sakakawea/Lake Lake Audubon, Cenex Bait & Tackle, Garrison: Some continued walleye activity on the east end of Lake Sakakawea prior to the weather change but little activity since then.
- •Lake Sakakawea/Lake Audubon, Hwy. 83 Lawn & Leisure, Garrison: East end of Lake Sakakawea producing walleye in Douglas Bay prior to the weather change and wind. Try vertical jigging with minnows in 25 to 30 feet. No reports from Lake Audubon.
- •Lake Sakakawea, New Town: Continued fair walleye success in the Van Hook Arm, weather permitting. Work a variety of depths with fish transitioning into shallower water and on the move.
- Sakakawea/Missouri Lake River, Scott's Bait & Tackle, Pick City: Missouri River tailrace

- Check all PLOTS signage before driving on with vehicles when waterfowl hunting to ensure landowner allows vehicles.

### LOOK BACK

THIS WEEK IN USAF HISTORY

15TH AIR FORCE ACTIVATED IN TUNISIA

November 1, 1943 -

On November 1, 1943, the Fifteenth Air Force (under the United States Army Air Forces) was activated in Tunis, Tunisia for the strategic bombardment of enemy targets in Europe. Maj. Gen. James H. "Jimmy" Doolittle served as the first commander, and under his charge, the Fifteenth Air Force flew its first mission of 112 B-17s and B-24s to Austria only one day after its activation. Eventually, the Fifteenth's headquarters operated out of Italy as well and gained the capability to reach targets in

France, Germany, Poland, Czechoslovakia, and the Balkans. Along with the Eighth Air Force and Royal Air Force Bomber Command, the Fifteenth was a pivotal instrument used by the Allied Forces to carry the strategic air offensive to Europe. On September 15, 1945, the Fifteenth was inactivated. Recently, in August of 2020, the numbered force was reactivated with an integration of wings and resources from the Twelfth and Ninth Air Forces under Air Combat Command.





# **2022 DEER GUN SEASON**

The 2022 deer gun season marks the first time the state's gun hunters experienced a decrease in the number of available licenses since 2016.

And it's largely because of big impacts caused by a small biting insect – a reflection of just how hard a 2021 epizootic hemorrhagic disease (EHD) outbreak hit North Dakota's deer population. It's also the first time no whitetail licenses were issued in some units in more than 30 years.

With the deer gun season opening soon - Nov. 4 -8,000 fewer hunters will be afield with several units, including those units along the Missouri River System, with a significant slash in the number of licenses.

For example, hunters looking over 2022 deer gun applications found a "zero" by the Antlered Whitetailed Deer and Antlerless White-tailed Deer options in Unit 3C bordering either side of the Missouri River and Lake Oahe south of Bismarck-Mandan.

Weather — a severe drought — played a major role in the outbreak's severity by creating conditions ripe for the spread of the disease. The drought resulted in receding lake levels and drying wetlands, creating conditions ripe for midges, the tiny biting insects carrying EHD.

Deer congregated near whatever available water they had and that's where the midges were, infecting otherwise healthy deer. In addition, infected deer develop high fevers and they often seek water in an attempt to cool that fever.

EHD hit portions of North Dakota in 2021 where it hadn't been reported historically. Typically EHD impacts whitetails in southwestern North Dakota, which means they've also developed better immunity to the disease. This time it extended east of the Missouri River System.

With the drought creating conditions allowing EHD to spread beyond its typical area, it hit deer with little to no immunity. Otherwise healthy deer died. Even some mule deer and pronghorn died and they're less susceptible to EHD than whitetails.

Boaters and anglers reported dead deer. Upland and waterfowl hunters did, as well. So, too, did landowners harvesting crops last fall and rural residential dwellers. Weather also made it more challenging to determine EHD's impact, in large part because lack of snow cover early in 2022 made it difficult to complete winter aerial deer population surveys.

That meant hunter harvest surveys and field observations played a key role in helping the N.D. Game and Fish Department determine EHD's impact and the resulting number of available licenses for the 2022 season.

Another set of numbers also helped the state's wildlife managers determine the need for license reductions - information furnished by the public reporting observations of sick or dead deer. Along the Missouri River System and more heavily populated Bismarck-Mandan area as well as in northwestern North Dakota around Williston, that meant more people were reporting dead deer along the river and Lake Sakakawea, and in some cases, in yards and near farmsteads.

It was enough to warrant an opportunity for hunters in 22 units stretching across about one-half of North Dakota to turn back their deer gun tag before the 2021 season and more than 3,000 hunters did.

Despite the reduction in available licenses this year, North Dakotans still like to rifle hunt for deer — 73,700 hunters applied for one of the 64,200 available licenses, not counting gratis landowner licenses.

Deer can be resilient creatures and when weather and habitat conditions allow, their population can rebound relatively quickly.

For those lucky deer gun license holder fortunate enough to draw a tag in 2022 a year after the major outbreak, it's still an opportunity to take rifle in hand and head into the Great North Dakota Outdoors.

And just maybe the outlook for the season will be better than what was anticipated just a few months

She had been flying during the night into 40 mph headwinds of heavy weather & made a forced landing into a peat bog with her Vega Gull aircraft. The year of her historic flight was 1936. Now for the rest of the story: The 'bomber pilot' turned out to be none other than the Minot Force Base's Chaplain,

Buddy Walker! In speaking to him I mentioned to him that my father, 1st Lt. Lonnie Tompkins, had been a Command Pilot of a B-17G during World War 2 in the European Theatre of Operations, stationed at Tunis, on the African continent and later in Ammendola, Italy. Sometime after the war, he became a construction supervisor for Halvorson Construction and built a B-52 hangar and the MAFB Chapel with the revolving

I was delighted to learn that Chaplain Walker not only was the Chaplain at that very same Chapel but that he had cared enough about it to have it restored!

Meeting Chaplain Buddy Walker was the highlight of the evening for me. He is someone everyone should meet and a splendid ambassador for the U.S. Air Force!

He cares about the history of our Air Force and takes care of its future through his ministry.

Well done Chaplain Walker!

### B-21 bomber to be unveiled Dec. 2

SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --

The Air Force confirmed Oct. 20 it plans to reveal the B-21 Raider Dec. 2 during an unveiling ceremony hosted and sponsored the Northrop Grumman Corporation at its production facilities in Palmdale, California.

The B-21 is a long-range, highly survivable, penetrating strike stealth bomber that will incrementally replace the B-1 and B-2 bombers, becoming the backbone of the U.S. Air Force bomber fleet.

"The unveiling of the B-21 Raider will be a historic moment for our Air Force and the nation," said Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. CQ Brown, Jr. "We last introduced a new bomber over 30 years ago. As we look to the threats posed by our pacing challenge; we must continue to rapidly modernize. The B-21 Raider will provide formidable combat capability across a range of operations in highly contested environments of the future."

The Department of the Air Force is investing in the aircraft's longrange strike capability as part of its seven Operational Imperatives as it develops the advanced communications, sensors, and a broad mix of weapons and supporting systems needed to deter our adversaries and prevail

We must invest in long-range

strike in a highly contested environment by integrating the B-21 bomber with advanced communications, sensors, and a broad mix of weapons and supporting systems.

After unveiling, the B-21 program will continue its rigorous testing campaign with a combined team of professionals from the Air Force Test Center, Air Force Operational Test and Evaluation Center, and Northrop Grumman. Their work will verify performance and identify areas for improvement for the weapon system.

"The B-21 program is a powerful example of America's long experience with fielding advanced military technology through an innovative, adaptable and efficient defense industrial base," said Andrew Hunter, assistant secretary of the Air Force for Acquisition, Technology and Logistics. "The Air Force made the decision early in the life of the program to make the flight test aircraft production representative, which is paying dividends as we look towards first flight."

The B-21 weapon system is manufactured under the Air Force's contract with Northrop Grumman. It is designed with an open systems architecture, enabling rapid insertion of mature technologies, and allowing the aircraft to remain effective as threats evolve over time.

safety precautions therefore, they may cross in the middle of the block or run out into the streets unexpectedly. Drive with caution in the neighborhoods and pay attention. Drive slowly!

Remember, Halloween can be fun for everyone as long as we take care of each other and our children. Follow these simple tips and you are sure to have a fun and frightful Halloween.

Halloween is a cherished tradition but the excitement of the night can cause children to forget to be careful. Approximately four times as many children aged 5-14 are killed while walking on Halloween evening compared with other evenings of the year, and falls are a leading cause of injuries among children on Halloween. There is no real "trick" to making Halloween a real treat for the entire family. The major dangers are not from witches or spirits but rather from falls and pedestrian/car crashes. Many Halloween related injuries can be prevented if parents closely supervise school-aged children during trick-or-treat activities.

Parents can help prevent children from being injured at Halloween by following these safety tips from the American Academy of Pediatrics, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the National Safety

Children should understand and follow these rules -

- Walk, do not run, from house to house.
- · Cross streets at the corner, use crosswalks (where they exist), and do not cross between parked cars.
- · Be reminded to look left, right, and left again before crossing the street.
- Wear clothing that is bright, reflective, and flame retardant.
- Use costume knives and swords that are flexible, not rigid or sharp. Parents and adults should -
- Make sure that an adult or an older responsible youth will be supervising the outing for children under age 12.
- Plan and discuss the route trick-or-treaters intend to follow. Know the names of older children's companions.

When ready to cook, set the grill temperature to 325 Degrees F and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes.


Mix 1/2 cup of the sour cream with the refried beans. Place in an oven safe dish and put in preheated grill.
