# Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve Seeks Nominations for new North Dakota State Chair

NORTH DAKOTA NATIONAL GUARD PUBLIC AFFAIRS

The North Dakota Committee of the Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR) is starting a search for the next North Dakota ESGR State Chair.

The State Chair is an official Department of Defense volunteer position with a three-year term of service. The North Dakota's State Chair provides leadership and vision for a team of dedicated volunteers throughout the state to carry out the ESGR mission.

ESGR is a Department of Defense program to develop and promote supportive work environments for service members in National Guard and Reserve components through outreach, recognition, and educational opportunities. ESGR executes this mission through nearly 3,300 volunteers nationwide providing proactive outreach to Service members and employers making them aware of their rights and responsibilities under the Uniformed Service Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA). ESGR provides nocost, neutral mediation to Service members and their employers when issues arise and manage a robust Employer Awards program to recognize the critical role supportive employers have in enhancing retention rates in the Reserve Component (RC).

"North Dakota employers consistently demonstrate very strong support for their Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, Marines and members of the U.S. Coast Guard Reserve," said David Somdahl, N.D. ESGR state chair selection team leader. "Those strong bonds were strengthened by Delton Steele, who has led these efforts as State Chair for more than five years."

Ideal candidates may have recent business experience and Veterans' status is not required. Those interested in serving should have an established network of employer and military contacts, working knowledge of the Reserve Components and military culture, and proven experience in budgeting, volunteer leadership management and recruiting, and strategic planning.

Proven leaders who are interested and meet qualifying skills for the North Dakota ESGR State Chair are encouraged to apply. Each interested candidate should submit a nomination package, including the following items:

1. Biographical summary or resume.

2. A letter stating his/her reason(s) for interest in serving, and thoughts and plans for leading the North Dakota ESGR state committee.

3. Other supporting materials, as appropriate (letters of recommendation, photos, etc.).



# Bussiere assumes command of Air Force Global Strike Command

BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE --

Gen. Thomas Bussiere assumed command of Air Force Global Strike Command during a ceremony Dec. 7, becoming the newest leader of the organization responsible for the nation's only intercontinental ballistic missile and strategic bomber forces.

Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. CQ Brown, Jr., presided over the ceremony.

"You provide strategic deterrence, global strike and combat support, so the Air Force can execute our mission to fly, fight and win. Airpower anytime, anywhere!" Brown said, speaking to AFGSC Airmen. "I am thankful for the continued professionalism of the 34 thousand Global Strike Airmen who operate, sustain and secure two-thirds of the nation's nuclear forces."

With this change of command, Bussiere became the seventh commander of Air Force Global Strike Command. He is responsible for the nation's fleet of Minuteman III intercontinental ballistic missiles, the land-based component of the nuclear triad. He is also responsible for all of the nation's strategic bombers, which include the nuclear-capable B-52H Stratofortress and B-2 Spirit, as well as the conventional-only B-1B Lancer.

Addressing an at-capacity crowd of Airmen, distinguished visitors, commanders and senior Air Force leaders at Barksdale's historic Hoban Hall, Bussiere said, "Our mission is critical to our national defense, and you are critical to our national defense.

"Every commander, chief, enlisted member, officer and civilian, it will take a whole team to compete and win," he added. "We can't do this without you."

The general also spoke of the legacy of the command and its long history.

"Our proud legacy of long-range strike is in both NAFs, and we continue to follow their footsteps as we position ourselves for a new era of strategic competition," he said. The legacy and embodiment

of long-range strike is right here in this command."

Bussiere is a 1985 graduate of Air Force ROTC from Norwich University in Northfield, Vermont. He has served in a variety of flying, staff and command assignments, including commander of 8th Air Force at Barksdale AFB, and deputy commander of U.S. Strategic Command at Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska. He is a command pilot with more than 3,400 hours in the T-38 Talon, F-15C Eagle, B-2A Spirit, B-1B Lancer and F-22 Raptor. He led F-15C combat missions during Operations Southern Watch and Vigilant Warrior and B-2 combat missions during Operations Allied Force and Iraqi Freedom.


"I am so humbled and proud to lead this historic command," he said. "Strikers, you are the best in the world at what you do, and I know you will continue to do great things for our nation."

I was watching the CBS Evening News recently and Roxana Saberi gave a report on the World Cup from Doha, Qatar. I don't normally watch the CBS Evening News but that name and face rang a bell.It took a minute to recall who she is. If you don't know or remember, she is from North Dakota and has quite a story.

Often times when people from North Dakota become famous, they're athletes, actors, politicians or business executives. Saberi, who grew up in Fargo, is arguably the best journalist to come out of North Dakota since Eric Sevareid.

Ironically she was born the year

# Who is Roxana Saberi?...

Saberi's story starts in Fargo where she graduated from Fargo North High School in 1994. She was involved in piano and soccer and later played college soccer for Concordia College in Moorhead, Minn. She was inducted into the Fargo North High School Hall of Fame in 2007.

graduated Saberi from Concordia in 1997 with degrees in communications and French. But that was only the beginning of her impressive educational resume.

She later earned a master's degree in broadcast journalism from Northwestern University in Illinois. Following that, she received a second master's in International Relations from Cambridge University in England, where she also played on the Cambridge soccer team.

Perhaps more importantly, at least to people in Fargo and the rest of North Dakota, Saberi was crowned Miss North Dakota 1997 and became one of the 10 semifinalists in the Miss America pageant. At the conclusion of that event, she was presented with the Scholar Award.

most influential news agencies on the face of the earth, and is now employed by CBS. She got her start in Fargo in 2000 as a reporter

In 2003 she moved to Iran to work for the U.S. based Feature Story News. During the three years she had press credentials at FSN, she sent reports to South African News, Deutche Welle (German), Vatican Radio, Radio New Zealand, Australian Independent Radio News and PBS.

In 2006, her credentials were revoked and the Iranian government shut down the FSN bureau. But, she had a second press credential and continued doing reports for the BBC. Later that same year, her British press credential was revoked.

In 2009 she was arrested in Iran on espionage charges and was later sentenced to eight years in prison. Upon appeal, her sentence was reduced to a lesser charge of possession of classified material and given a suspended sentence. She denied both allegations.

recognize dual citizenship and her case proceeded to court.

Following her release later in 2009, she wrote a book about her experience of being imprisoned, interrogated and even tortured to make a false confession of espionage. "Between Two Worlds: My Life and Captivity in Iran" is the title of the book. It is available on Amazon Kindle, audiobook and hard cover.

In 2013 her professional career made another leap after she was hired by Al Jazeera as a U.S. correspondent and producer. Al Jazeera's headquarters are located in Doha. In 2016, Al Jazeera America went off the air and in 2018, Saberi became a CBS correspondent working out of its London bureau. She was reporting from Afghanistan when the U.S. military pulled out of the country last year in August.

Saberi has received numerous awards for her work in journalism since she began her professional career at FSN.

If you watch CBS News, keep an eye out for Saberi's reports. She's done extremely well as a TV journalist and to think it all started at Fargo North High School.






### MSgt Edward Zilli

# **Dispute Resolution** in Housing



Under provisions included the Military Housing in Privatization Initiative Universal Lease and Department of Defense Tenant Bill of Rights, Tenants living in privatized housing have the right to prompt and fair resolution of housing disputes. Housing disputes could include issues and/or complaints related to rights and responsibilities established in the lease, such as maintenance and repair, rental payments, inspections, or fees and charges. All disputes must first attempt to be resolved at the lowest level possible between the Tenant and the Landlord (Minot AFB Homes). If the dispute is unable to be resolved at this level, the Tenant can then work with the Military Housing Office (MHO) and/or the available Tenant Support Resources such as Chain of Command, Resident Advocate, Legal, Medical, and the Air Force Housing Call Center (AFCEC). If the dispute is still unable to be resolved via the informal dispute process, the

Tenant may pursue the formal dispute process; however, this can only occur when all informal dispute resolution options have been exhausted and documented. What steps should a resident take when issues arise? 1. Residents should immediately notify Minot AFB Homes of the issue and submit a work order if the issue is maintenance related (701-737-9312). 2. Next, the resident should follow up with Minot AFB Homes, directly with maintenance or with the community office 701-727-0007 or minotleasing@bbcgrp.com. 3. If the issue is still unresolved, residents should contact the MHO at 701-723-4661 or 5ces. ceih@us.af.mil. Residents should also consider engaging with their chain of command or shirt. 4. If further assistance is needed, residents should contact the Privatized Housing Resident Advocate at 701-818-7075. The sooner an issue is addressed, the sooner resolution can be found.

• N.D. Game & Fish Dept. game wardens: Scattered walleye success on Lake Audubon with lots of anglers testing early season success. East end of Lake Sakakawea and small area lakes slow yet. No reports from Devils Lake or north-central area lakes.

• Devils Lake, Ed's Bait Shop, Devils Lake: Fair to good for perch. Try East Bay on the main lake or the towers. Access with ATVs yet.

• Devils Lake, Woodland Resort, Devils Lake: Try 16 to 20 feet for walleye and 25 to 32 feet for perch with rattling presentations working structure. Test ice conditions along the way.

•Lake Darling, Karma C-Store,

· Ice is never completely safe. Avoid areas with vegetation, moving water, pressure ridges, and springs. Check conditions as you go along on the ice and don't move around at night.







# North Dakota's Most Fascinating Landscape: Abandoned Buildings

There are many standout features that make weather North Dakota a curiosity to the newcomer. The bone-chilling, drastic winds; the neverending sunlight in summer; and the expansive, seemingly endless sky are all features that make North Dakota life so captivating, albeit sometimes intimidating. While gazing across the horizon in this state, it is almost impossible not to notice another unique feature in the landscape: abandoned buildings and structures. While not entirely unique to North Dakota, the curious amount of decrepit, abandoned structures and houses left to fall to ruin by exposure are certainly very noticeable. Meteorologist and photographer Zachary Hargrove came to this discovery and decided that the abandoned building through the state makes a perfect backdrop for his weather photography tour.

Zachary Hargrove's book, entitled Abandoned North Dakota, Weathered by Time, is a captivating collection of photographs depicting extreme weather with abandoned buildings throughout the state of North Dakota. As a meteorologist, Hargrove was known to snap photos of clouds and extreme weather situations. He quickly realized that the stark contrast of North Dakota's abandoned building made for very interesting photographs. Thus, he began to actively hunt for buildings to photograph which led to his book of buildings. Hargrove traveled state to find completely the off the beaten path locations and abandoned buildings and sometimes entire abandoned towns to photograph.

He came across many interesting places on his travels, but he said the most fascinating was the San Haven Sanatorium in the Turtle Mountains. As a former tuberculosis recovery center, this haunting massive building has been left to complete decay and

nature has taken over. When asked why there seemed to be such a large amount of abandoned buildings in this state, Hargrove mentioned that he doesn't think there are vastly more here than elsewhere, but only that since there are hardly any wild-grown forests or trees, they are much more visible. To explain why so many places are abandoned in the first place, Hargrove said, "The biggest reason is probably the railroad. There were little junction towns that popped up and then suddenly weren't needed when the railroad changed courses. When there was nothing coming in, whole towns were just dissolved. Also, the Dust Bowl and Great Depression hit the area hard and many farmers just packed up and left their farmers and house behind, having no use for them anymore." Hargorve noted that photographing and remembering abandoned buildings is important because capturing this small glimpse of history before succumbing to time and exposure is instrumental in helping us remember the past. He said, "People had lives and memories in these places. Taking a picture keeps that memory alive for just a little bit longer."

Any Minot AFB resident is sure to have noticed a specific abandoned building. Known by many names and often gossiped about is the long with-standing leaning barn on Highway 83 between the city and the base. This almostcollapsed building near Ruthville is often the center of conjecture among base residents. Ás the building is drastically noticeable, residents can't help but wonder: when will it finally fall over? After every major wind storm, the question in the air is to wonder if it still stands. As this story goes to press, the leaning barn is indeed still standing! The Northern Sentry wanted to get some more information on the history of the building, but after some research



and digging the property of the land on which the building sits was found, unfortunately all methods to establish communication were unsuccessful. So the mystery of the leaning barn remains a mystery. It is anyone's guess as to when it was built, for what purpose and when it will finally collapse into the earth.

Abandoned buildings are a part of the North Dakota landscape that blends in to those who live here but are fascinating eye sores to the newcomer. While Mr. Hargrove was able to uncover some of the mystery surrounding some of these buildings, there are dozens and maybe hundreds more that remain lost to history.



### YES, AQUATIC NUISANCE SPECIES ARE AN ISSUE EVEN IN THE WINTER

It's the dead of winter, vegetation in the Great drain Outdoors is dormant, and it's too darn cold for many things to survive when exposed to freezing trans

temperatures. While that's generally true, it doesn't mean aquatic nuisance species (ANS) isn't a concern in the winter. Admittedly, the spread of ANS vegetation such as Eurasian water-milfoil is significantly less of an issue in the winter.

However, ANS is a year-around problem. It doesn't matter if it's on any of the three most popular ice-fishing destinations in North Dakota – Devils Lake, Lake Sakakawea, and Lake Audubon – or elsewhere. ANS can still find its way into the smaller lakes during the dead of winter, especially nice little panfish or northern pike destinations.

And, yes, ANS violations occur in the winter. Admittedly, the number of violations decreases because aquatic vegetation lurking on fishing boats, trailers, and other equipment is a non-issue on any lake when its surface is a gargantuan ice cube.

The problem is bait.

Make that illegal bait.

The problem arises if anglers bring bait into North Dakota, which is illegal. Live bait must be purchased in North Dakota. The only live legal bait in the state are fathead minnows, creek chubs, and sticklebacks. The lone exception is anglers can use live suckers on the Red River jointly shared as the Minnesota-North Dakota eastern border – but it still has to be purchased in-state.

However, some states allow shiners and suckers. In most cases, nonresident anglers don't realize North Dakota has bait restrictions as part of its efforts to keep

drain plugs or stand pipes, such as live wells.

North Dakota's ANS regulations allow anglers to transport live bait in water in 5-gallon or smaller bait buckets.

However, that isn't just a summer regulation – it applies year-around.

While the focus tends to be on zebra mussels, other ANS species not already in North Dakota could be lurking in neighboring states and simply haven't found their way across state borders. Even though vegetation wouldn't survive exposure to freezing air temperatures, other ANS could be in water if an angler filled a storage container or bait bucket from the lake they were fishing in.

While ANS such as adult zebra mussels can be visible with the naked eye, ANS such as spiny water fleas are microscopic.

In addition, curly-leaf pondweed is an aquatic nuisance species that loves cold water. It grows in cold water and can start growing early in the spring – sometimes even under ice. Curly-leaf pondweed is already in some of North Dakota's most popular lakes, including Lake Sakakawea, Lake Audubon, and Lake Metigoshe.

Regardless of the time of year, anglers love to travel when fish are biting and it's possible ANS could hitchhike along for the ride even in the dead of winter. While there's less potential in the winter, it's not something to overlook.

Eight different aquatic nuisance species have been identified in at least one lake across the state: Common carp, silver carp, grass carp, bighead carp, Eurasian water milfoil, curly-leaf pondweed, flowering rush, and zebra mussels.

It's easy to be compliant, especially in the winter – simply don't transport water from any lake and use only legal bait bought in the state. Go to the N.D. Game and Fish Department website, (gf.nd.gov/ans) for regulations, ANS species descriptions, lakes in the state where an ANS has been identified, and more details.

Another winter ANS problem that can arise is some newer 3-season icehouses have water storage compartments allowing anglers to keep bait – or fish – inside without fear of freezing.

That presents an issue because North Dakota's ANS regulations require all anglers to drain water from compartments on any recreational equipment with

AIRMAN 1ST CLASS SARAH POST, 90TH MISSILE WING PUBLIC AFFAIRS

F.E. WARREN AIR FORCE BASE, WYO. -- The 90th Missile Wing continued modernization efforts on the Minuteman III Intercontinental Ballistic Missile system with the start of Launch Control Center Block Upgrades at the Kilo-01 missile alert facility near Dix, Nebraska, Dec. 2, 2022.

Airmen from 20th Air Force, the 90th Operations Group and the 90th Maintenance Group here are working with Northrop Grumman personnel to complete operationally-equivalent technological upgrades, starting at the K-01 MAF and working their way through the 14 additional sites.

"This is our first operational install for this program, and we have gone through a lot of development and production, so being in the deployment stage now is a big deal," said Kamala Parker, Northrop Grumman LCCBU program manager. "Additionally, we have had tremendous support from the 90th Missile Wing, which has made the process much easier."

Much of the equipment in the LCCs has been operational since Minuteman III came online roughly 50 years ago. The block upgrade program is designed to replace antiquated or obsolete equipment and support the weapon system with newer technology. The LCCBU effort is focused on upgrades to the journal memory loader and printer, as well as replacing the floppy disc drive with a flash data drive. Additionally, the LCCs are getting upgrades to the oxygen regeneration unit, which is responsible for generating breathable air in the event of a strike on the MAF.

"With these updates, we will have the support equipment needed to sustain MMII operations for the remainder of the weapon system's life cycle," said Maj. Cory Seaton, 320th Missile Squadron assistant director of operations and the wing director for the LCCBU deployment effort. "This will ensure the safety, security, reliability and effectiveness of our current ICBM while we begin the process of bringing Sentinel online in the coming years."

Innovation and modernization of the land-based leg of the nuclear triad is imperative to deter peer adversaries from hostile actions against the United States, our allies and partners.

# *Transition through innovation: Taking care of mission, Airmen and families*

As the world adapted to the challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, so too did the intercontinental ballistic missile force within 20th Air Force. For decades the missile operators, or missileers, pulled alerts in a 3-day ATO rotation model (alert, travel, off-day), but to mitigate the risk COVID presented, the force had to make some changes. Those changes opened the door to more creative ideas to better meet the needs of the mission while caring for Airmen and families.

"In [response to] COVID, crews were deployed for two weeks and had to drastically adjust training and quarantine to meet the mission," explained Lt. Col. Joseph Shannon, 10th Missile Squadron commander at Malmstrom Air Force Base, Montana. "During this initial model, [operations leaders] began to critically think of a better way to accomplish this mission while mitigating the strain on the crew force and maintain their proficiency beyond the pandemic. COVID allowed the opportunity for nuclear ops to explore something beyond the ATO [schedule] that was in place prior to beginning COVID operations."

As we learned more about the virus and administered vaccines, sending two crews out to each missile alert facility for two consecutive weeks evolved into one-week alerts and from there to squadron deployments.

each missile Historically, responsible for squadron is manning five of the 15 MAFs and underground launch control centers in their wing's area of responsibility. To create a better battle rhythm once operations began returning to a new normal, the three ICBM wings implemented squadron deployments. In this new construct, one squadron becomes responsible for manning all 15 of their wing's MAFs/LCCs for a week at a time rather than just their traditional five.

This created a pattern of whole squadrons pulling alert together every three weeks, which allowed for more predictability, unit cohesion within the operations groups and more consistent interaction with the same missile security forces squadrons, facility managers and chefs.

On the flip side though, "the unprecedented predictability of squadron deployment rotations to all wing launch control centers is matched by its equally unprecedented inflexibility," said Lt. Col. Ryan Graves, 320th Missile Squadron director of operations at F.E. Warren AFB, Wyoming. "The challenges of maintaining our alert force during the COVID-19 pandemic demanded immediate adaptation to mitigate health risks, but over time our missile units used the dynamic environment to embrace a culture of innovation. As the threat of COVID-19 continues to wind down, [we] will move towards a hybrid scheduling option capitalizing on the lessons learned from the many scheduling constructs utilized over the past several years." This leads to the next change in the ICBM force alert structure as they look to align with the shifts the Air Force has made from the Air Expeditionary Force deployment construct to the Air Force Force Generation (AFFORGEN) construct. While missileers typically do not deploy oversees due to their mission requiring them to be deployed-in-place stateside, the



operations groups within 20th Air Force have found ways to apply the AFFORGEN concept.

"Adopting the AFFORGEN model in a three-week cycle of Prepare, Ready/Commit, and Reset has allowed us to create an overall stability to the deployment schedule - operators know when they will be deployed, when they will train, and when they will be in rest status," said Col. Tory Kindrick, 341st Operations Group commander at Malmstrom AFB. "Ensuring that squadron commanders retain the decision authority to deploy forces within their ready/commit week allows flexibility to meet the needs of the mission and our people, which is the bread and butter of command."

This flexibility is displayed with each wing's approach to accomplishing the mission.

Within the 341st Operations Group squadron deployment construct, the 10th Missile Squadron has "implemented flight deployments where each tactical flight took control of a squadron AOR, providing a sustainable war fighting construct, continuity, and true ownership of each AOR by a given flight commander," explained Shannon. "Which leads us to the healthy state that we reside today."

The 90th Operations Group at F.E. Warren AFB plans to return to the traditional model of each squadron manning just their five MAFs/LCCs. The alerts will continue to be a week long, but with the introduction of "multiple, optional changeover days and return home travel for topside periods," as described by Col. Jared Nelson, the 90th Operations Group commander. The aim is to create a better schedule for those with unique situations who may have been at a disadvantage with the rigid 7-day alert construct: nursing mothers, mil-to-mil couples, missileers with young children and

single parents.

As Lt. Col. Eric Buss, 321st Missile Squadron commander at F.E. Warren AFB, puts it, "every crewmember has a unique story and circumstance. Our missileers, facility managers, and squadron staff make sacrifices every day, ensuring our critical mission never fails...having the flexibility to accommodate their personal lives is a force multiplier. As a father of three, with a deployed military spouse and daughter who requires constant monitoring, our family is no exception. Our squadron members are not a commodity taken for granted and we will do everything in our power ensuring the mission is accomplished while meeting the needs and taking care of our Airmen and families.

The 91st Operations Group at Minot AFB, North Dakota will leverage the added flexibility afforded to commanders and maintain the current squadron deployment construct where they have seen the most gains in unit cohesion, command and control, and mission ownership. For example, their 742d Missile Squadron "takes the entire missile field for a week, owns mission execution, debriefs the mission during our training week and gets better every deployment wave" explains Lt. Col. Amanda Filiowich, 742d Missile Squadron "Additionally, commander. commanders have the freedom of maneuver to accommodate special circumstances and family situations on a case-by-case basis which positively affects morale."

The differing methods reflect flexibility, but also a focus on creating a better environment for Airmen and families while still meeting the core AFFORGEN purpose of balancing today's combatant commander needs and building high-end readiness for the future.
