# Sentinel agreement signed in historic ceremony

AIR FORCE GLOBAL STRIKE COMMAND

BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE, La. --

More than 150 personnel who took part in drafting the LGM-35 Sentinel Programmatic Agreement participated in a historic signing event Dec 16, 2022, which simultaneously took place in 11 different locations.

The Air Force's project to replace the aging LGM-30G Minuteman III with the LGM-35 Sentinel encompasses more than 34,000 acres of land, some of which is on property with both cultural and historical significance. The programmatic agreement, which has been in development for more than two years, will not only ensure the Air Force is in compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act, but has grown relationships with those who place great value on this land.

"The Air Force worked with all parties to develop an agreement that balanced the project's national security priorities with the protection of the cultural resources within the project area. This approach recognized that the lands impacted by the project are the ancestral lands of indigenous peoples represented by over 63 tribal governments," said Maj. Gen. Michael Lutton, Twentieth Air Force commander. "The agreement is designed to seek tribal input on the identification, documentation, evaluation and protection of sites and objects of tribal significance through all phases and areas of this project. Through a spirit of respect and cooperation, all parties worked to develop the strongest, most effective agreement possible."

This agreement, which provides process and mitigation measures the Air Force will follow with regards to cultural resources, was signed by the Mandan, Hidatsa, and Arikara Nation in North Dakota; seven State Historic Preservation Officers; the Wyoming Attorney General's office; the National Park Service Interior Region 6, 7 and 8; and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation. The Little Shell Tribe of Montana and the Ward County Commissioners also signed the Agreement as concurring parties. The Air Force is continuing to work with the remaining 55 tribes, 10 Federal Agency regional offices, 11 state and local governments and agencies, and five non-governmental organizations that are consulting parties and have assisted in developing the document.

"I just want to acknowledge that

we are tremendously pleased with the effort that the Air Force put into developing the consultation plan and carrying it out to engage in such an important number and array of stakeholders in that consultation, and to developing an agreement that very successfully incorporated historic preservation goals at every stage of the process and of the program," said Reid Nelson, Advisory Council on Historic Preservation acting executive director. "We appreciate your commitment. This stands as a model for us of how an agency can carry out such a comprehensive and effective consultation on such an important program."

This historic signing event would not have been possible without significant support from community partners and regional stakeholders.

"I wanted to thank the United States Air Force, all the other state federal and travel agencies and governments for their participation and our invitation to be part of this very prestigious event," said Three Affiliated Tribes Chairman Mark Fox. "Nowhere in the world do they honor, revere or respect our servicemen, and those who have served, more so than we do. It's a very important part of our culture. It goes back to our warrior's societies, in a protection of our own people, but now as part of the United States military as well. We are very proud of that.'

Normally. programmatic agreements are simply staffed through each signatory and invited signatory and then forwarded to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation for signature. However, due to the historical level of cooperation, all signatories met virtually to sign the document and further attest to their strong relationship and the importance of the agreement to national security.

"This is a historic agreement both in the scope of the project and the number of concerned parties,' said Maj. Gen. John P. Newberry, Air Force Nuclear Weapons Center Commander and Air Force Program Executive Officer for Strategic Systems. "The hard work and spirit of cooperativeness that allowed representatives from multiple tribes, state, federal and Air Force agencies to gather together on one day to fully execute this agreement is unprecedented and a true way forward to continue building on these relationships."

The ability to build such a document is largely credited to the mindset of all involved.

"Through this process, we acknowledged the lands impacted by this project are the ancestral lands of indigenous peoples," said Russell Bartholomew, AFNWC Sentinel Acquisition Program Manager. "It is important for all parties and individuals involved in this project to understand the long-standing history that has

brought us to reside on the land and our place within that history. Tribal governments and Native American communities have a strong and overlapping interest in lands far removed from their reservations and current localities. In recognition of this reality, this agreement will facilitate all Tribal governments being able to provide input on the identification, documentation, evaluation, and protection of sites of Tribal significance throughout all phases and areas of the undertaking."

The Sentinel system will replace the 400 Minuteman III intercontinental ballistic missiles, which have been in service for more than 50 years in Air Force missile fields near F.E. Warren Air Force Base, Wyoming; Malmstrom

AFB, Montana; and Minot AFB, North Dakota. Some Sentinel maintenance, training, storage, testing and support actions will occur also at Hill AFB, Utah; Utah Test and Training Range, Utah; Camp Guernsey, Wyoming; and Camp Navajo, Arizona.

"A well-designed PA is meant to find the balance between the Air Force construction project and the protection of the cultural resources within the project area," said Stephanie Newcomer, Air Force Civil Engineer Center Environmental Impact Statement project manager. "This Sentinel PA does that and has mitigated measures identified ... to uphold that balance over the next 20-plus



It's interesting to note there are many communities with the same name as counties. The odd thing about it though, is that a lot of communities that have the same name as counties, are not in the same county,

I can think of six that are: Grand Forks, Pembina, Rolette, Bottineau, Bowman and LaMoure. To begin this oddity, let's start in Cavalier County. When I worked in Langdon, I would often get phone calls asking how things are going in Cavalier. I would tell them Cavalier is in Pembina County and they all seemed so

Also back then, I had made a trip to the state capitol and ran into then state dairy commissioner Bob Dykshoorn. He asked me how I like living in Cavalier. "Oops," he said before I could reply. We both tried to analyze why Cavalier isn't in Cavalier County.

There are others around the state. McKenzie County is a huge land mass in the northwestern part of the state, but the town of McKenzie is about 15 miles east of Bismarck... in Burleigh County. Steele is about 40 miles east of Bismarck, but Steele County is in the east-central part of the state with Finley as the county seat.

The town of Mercer is in McLean County while the county of Mercer is next door to the west. Hettinger is not in Hettinger County. Instead, it's in Adams County, in the southwest. However, Hettinger County is immediately to the north of Adams County.

Golden Valley County borders the Montana state line, but guess where the town of Golden Valley is located? It's about 20 miles west of Beulah in Mercer County.

County/city combination oddities...

McHenry County isn't even close to the town of McHenry. The community is in Foster County, near Carrington, while the county is in the north central, near Minot.

The town of Dickey is close, but isn't in Dickey County. Dickey is in LaMoure County and Ellendale is in Dickey County.

There are most likely other examples I'm missing. Some of the smallest towns aren't always accurately listed on the map.

So why is North Dakota set up this way? Do other states deal with the same confusion? Nobody seems to know the answer. It would probably take research on each county and namesake communities to find out how it all came about.

If you look at territorial maps, there were a lot of communities that sprang up with odd names associated with the county they


were in. These Dakota Territory towns grew up so fast, few people had time to think of a decent name, thus they were named whatever popped into people's

The one that comes to my mind is Emmonsville, in Emmons County. This of course, was long before Linton or Hazelton existed. Braddock was there, but the others weren't. When it was learned the railroad was bypassing many of these communities, people started moving and creating communities along rail lines that had names we are familiar with today.

Some communities had decent names, but changed them somewhere along the line for whatever reason and two of those examples come to mind.

The first is Edwinton that later became Bismarck and St. Joseph, which later became known as it is today, Walhalla.

How was Napoleon named? How about Oakes? notice it's spelled different than trees that are "oaks." It's always an interesting topic.





Think about famous or notable US ski destinations, is North Dakota anywhere on the list? Probably not. However, just because it may not be Vail or Aspen, this northern state still has lots to offer the casual skier and adventurer than one might give it credit for. Buried amongst the Turtle Mountains and in the northern section of the state, lies the simple, yet beautiful, hometown ski resort of Bottineau Winter Park.

This fully- equipped winter ski resort offers equipment rentals, chairlifts, ski/snowboard lessons and a cafeteria style lodge to stay warm in the North Dakota winds. The resort's website https://skibwp. com/, explains it like this, "We bestow 8 alpine trails ranging from beginner to expert. You'll find two user-friendly conveyor lifts on the beginner hills, one handle lift, one rope tow, and one triple chairlift to get you to the top. Ski on fully groomed trails while you take in the views of the Turtle Mountains."

Besides skiing and snowboarding and all the awesome ways for people to impress with athletic ability, there also lies this writer's favorite part: the snow tubing! If you are new to winter weather and have not yet experienced this exhilarating, yet fabulously easy and enjoyable activity, don't let it pass you by. The long runs are fast and perfect for any age. What makes it even better is that the hardest part of snow tubingdragging the tub back up the mountain- is all taken care of with these equally enjoyable conveyor belt hitch that hooks and drags the tube back up, while the rider gets to stay in the tube! Ah, it is a blissful way to spend a day in the beautiful snow with all the fun and no snow face planting.

Bottineau Winter Park is open most days from 10am - 5pm and they try to extend the season until April 1 or until the weather determines. As with other ski resorts, they do have to pay close attention to weather and sometimes have to close due to high winds (which happens a lot here) and extreme cold temperature. A great place to stay up to date on their activity is their Facebook Page. Rentals/lift ticket prices are very affordable and a complete list of prices can be found on their website, https://skibwp.com/prices/.

SAC CHANGES MINUTEMAN & PEACEKEEPER ASSIGNMENTS TO INCLUDE MIXED GENDER CREWS **JANUARY 1, 1988**

Up until the late 1970s, the United States Air Force restricted female service members to only noncombat positions. In 1978, women were finally given the chance to serve on Titan II missile crews, and their roles in the missile field only grew from there. However, for some time, missile crews were restricted to all-male or all-female assignments. It wasn't until January 1, 1988 that Strategic Air Command changed the policy for Minuteman and Peacekeeper crew assignments to permit mixed gender crews in launch facilities. This inclusive effort aimed to reduce scheduling issues and increase opportunities for female Airmen.

After the integration, SAC stressed the importance of guaranteeing equal career progression for men and women. This was one major step forward in the journey towards women's equality in the armed forces.

# Airmen Against Drunk Driving Ready to Respond

At 10 PM most of us are thinking about retiring for the evening after a long day at work, maybe watching a movie or playing a video game. Since October, Albert Roybal has been going on the clock at 10 PM waiting for a phone call that will spring him into action to help a fellow Airmen.

Albert is a volunteer driver for Airmen Against Drunk Driving, and for a majority of the weekends since October he has been on call every Thursday, Friday, and Saturday night from 10 PM until 3 AM, giving rides home as needed to Airmen who call the AADD phone number and request a ride home from Minot bars and lounges.

"I wanted to be busy, so I volunteered for AADD. I also have had friends in my shop and relatives who have gotten in trouble, and I want to prevent that," according to Albert.

So, a normal Thursday and Friday would be working from 7 AM to 3 PM as a Training Monitor, heading home for some down time, and then at 10 PM his AADD shift starts, and he will accept calls for rides home until 3 AM. "On Friday mornings my boss lets me come in a little later because he knows I have been up covering my AADD shift until 3 AM," says Roybal. "I'll be one of two or three drivers that will be based in Minot and give rides in the city.'

On most nights, the AADD drivers will be called to give an average of two rides. "It takes me about 20 minutes from the time I get the call until I arrive to pick up an Airmen for a ride," Roybal continues.

Once an AADD driver picks up a person who has made the decision to call and get a ride rather than risk the consequences of a DUI, the conversation quickly turns to their duties on base, where they are from. "In general it's a pretty friendly conversation," says Roybal.

A common thread amongst the volunteer drivers for AADD is their desire to help their fellow Airmen. "Most of the people I've picked up should not have been driving. I'm happy to give them a ride so they aren't on the road being reckless, and more important according to Roybal,"they aren't hurting someone else. That's an important part of giving them a ride rather than have them drive.'

Airmen Against Drunk Driving is a totally volunteer organization. On most weekends there will be 3-4 drivers stationed in Minot, and 3-4 drivers stationed on base waiting to accept phone calls and give rides. A recent donation of \$10.00 gas cards from On The Run has helped provide fuel for the drivers, but it's only a stipend of what it could cost for a weekend's worth of fuel.

SRT has provided the AADD line at no cost, and several businesses in Minot have donated funds to cover additional expenses.

For Roybal, he has been in Minot for four years. He's originally from Las Vegas so "the road conditions up here are kind of a 180 from Las Vegas. But pretty soon you learn, like I have, how to drive...slow down on curves and don't push down hard on the pedals."

What does Albert Roybal do on his off time when he's not volunteering for AADD? "Well, I have a 2005 Prius, and I'm learning more about how to fix it. And I am also learning how to



# A NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION

"Much has been given to us, and so, much will surely be expected of us; and we must take heed to use aright the gifts entrusted to our care...So it is peculiarly incumbent on us here today so to act throughout our lives as to leave our children a heritage, for which we will receive their blessing and not their curse."

That quote spoken July 4, 1886 in Dickinson, N.D. was from a man who would later in life be known as Pres. Theodore Roosevelt. He would also be considered the "conservation president" for his role in natural resource conservation.

The word "conservation" has many meanings. One dictionary alone (Merriam-Webster) listed three, including "the careful use of natural resources (such as trees, oil, etc.) to prevent them from being lost or wasted." Conservation is not preservation. Nor is it the blatant use of natural resources without regard to future generations. Conservation, with all of its different interpretations, provides for the wise use of natural resources.

Perhaps we humans should think about the heritage and legacy we leave for future generations and that, too, is part of the meaning of the word "conservation".

Actually, the United States has done quite well in that regard and Pres. Theodore Roosevelt laid much of the groundwork. When he was one of the founders of the Boone & Crockett Club, it wasn't to recognize the "big bucks" hunters are so enthralled with today.

Instead, it was to establish the concept of fair chase and setting a standard for the ethical manner of hunting. In turn, that helped conserve wildlife because, as hunters, it can establish a distinct connection to wildlife and the need for conservation.

As president, he created national wildlife refuges, parks, and forests.

In his belief that natural resources should be used wisely, he supported creation of several dams for water supplies. He didn't believe in preservation that would keep or prevent the public from accessing the very land they owned - national parks, national forests, or national monuments, for example - because preservation

ultimately is detrimental to wildlife and natural resources. After all, how can someone appreciate, respect, and value something when they have no access to it to understand

Equally, he didn't believe in abusing the nation's natural resources.

When a person thinks about everything used in one's daily life, the source comes from one place —Planet Earth. It's obtained by only two means — it's mined or dug and

Everything comes from the soil or below the soil.

Plastics, wood, materials used to manufacture clothing, the material in products such as aluminum, steel, and

Everything we eat; everything we wear; everything we use to power our lives – jets, trains, electricity, food, etc. comes from either the soil or what's below the soil. Conservation isn't about preservation.

But, equally, it isn't about going off the deep end of environmental extremism.

Conservation is about using the resources we have been blessed with wisely.

It's about using those resources so they are available for future generations.

Conservation is about giving back and it's about thinking beyond today.

It can be subtle things like picking up a piece of garbage so it's not polluting a wetland. It can be planting trees, native grasses, and plants that benefit wildlife of all sizes as well as people. It can be recycling products.

Conservation can be volunteering and dedicating part of yourself and your time to organizations that advance the definition of conservation, which coincidentally, ties in nicely with the role of being hunter. After all, hunters can and should be the leaders in conservation.

Perhaps that should be a New Year's resolution — to bring a little conservation into your life and work.

The results will live on forever.

"We are prone to speak of the resources of this country as inexhaustible; this is not so." — Theodore Roosevelt.

You toss a stick of chewing gum in your mouth and off you go. As you approach the gate you fumble for your ID. You're thinking if you could just get through the gate you'd be home free! You're hoping for that quickie ID check and a friendly wave to proceed. As you hand the guard your ID card he's observing your every move. He noticed the way you approached the gate - weaving (because you were fumbling for your ID card, of course). He notices your glossy pupils and the way your eyes fail to focus. risks associated with drinking and driving. If you take a minute or two to plan the evening you can save yourself great embarrassment, you can save your career, and most importantly, you can live to enjoy

another of those great nights out. While many of us have heard of Operational Risk Management, or ORM, many of us don't use it when we're off-duty. This common misconception is worth exploring.





# New reporting options for sexual harassment victims

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --Uniformed Airmen Guardians who experience sexual harassment now have the option to file a restricted or unrestricted report with the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response office to access advocacy services and supportive referrals.

This change now allows members to seek support services for both sexual harassment and sexual assault from one office.

Brig. Gen. Debra A. Lovette, Integrated Resilience director, said the new policy reflects the Department of the Air Force's commitment to expanding support for victims, and strengthening a culture of respect, dignity and honor for all who serve.

"Sexual harassment does not reflect who we are as an organization and has no place in the military," Lovette said. "For service members victimized by this harmful behavior, it can be crippling, preventing them from coming forward out of fear of further harassment or the perceived lack of support from their leaders or co-workers. This new policy will allow service members to make a report confidentially, if they choose, while still receiving support and care from their sexual assault response coordinator or SAPR victim advocate."

The new policy, which took effect September 30, expands services to DAF military members who are sexual harassment victims and implements FY 2022 National Defense Authorization Act and Independent Review Commission requirements. The Equal Opportunity Program will continue to process and track military sexual harassment complaints.

Under the new policy, military members have two options for reporting sexual harassment to the


SAPR office:

Unrestricted Report - This reporting option allows a service member to report sexual harassment to a SARC or SAPR VA and receive victim advocacy services from that office. This reporting option will result in the SARC or SAPR VA notifying the victim's commander and the installation EO office, who will initiate an investigation (or clarification report via EO complaint processes) of the sexual harassment allegation(s).

Restricted Report - This reporting option allows a service member to confidentially report sexual harassment to a SARC or SAPR VA and receive victim advocacy services from that office. This reporting option does not trigger an investigation or notification to the service member's command or installation EO office unless there is written consent from the service member or if there is a clear and present risk to the health and safety to the service member or another person, as determined by the servicing legal office.

SAPR victim advocacy services for sexual harassment do not replace Military Equal Opportunity complaint processes. Military members may choose to make an unrestricted report with the SAPR program to receive victim advocacy services such as crisis intervention, safety assessments and counseling referrals, and they may also file a separate MEO complaint through the EO office.

DAF The Unlawful Discrimination, Harassment, and Sexual Harassment Hotline (888-231-4058) functions as a referral line to facilitate potential EO concerns or complaints to the appropriate installation for resolution. It is not set up to provide victim assistance, advocacy,







# **NOTES ON BEING SAFE**

# **SLOW DOWN**, **AND BE CAREFUL**



**5TH BOMB WING** OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY



Although it may seem a bit intimidating at first, it doesn't take much time for first-time winter drivers to learn to properly tackle snow-packed and icy roads in the local area. Patience is key when heading out on winter roads for the first time, many people end up in accidents each year because they drive too fast for the conditions. The following are things drivers should remember when the snow and ice starts to fall.

For maximum power when starting cars in cold temperatures, turn off all accessories, including the radio and heater, before turning the ignition key. For carbureted cars, depress the accelerator once and release it. For fuel-injected vehicles, don't touch the pedal. Turn the key and hold it for about 20 seconds. Don't over grind the starter; it can damage it. Let the engine run for at least a minute before driving. Don't accelerate too quickly for at least a mile or two.

Not all vehicles handle in winter weather conditions the same, and it's important for people to know how to handle their vehicle in demanding winter weather. It's a good idea for people to carefully practice slowspeed maneuvers on an empty snowor ice-covered parking lot. The vehicle owner's manual also outlines handling characteristics.

Front-wheel-drive vehicles generally handle better than rearwheel-drive vehicles on slippery roads because the engine's weight rests on the drive wheels to improve traction. The back end of rear-wheel drive vehicles, especially pick-up trucks, tends to slide from side to side when turning on icy roads. To compensate, people with rear-wheel drive should add weight in the trunk or truck bed to give the wheels more

Even a little bit of ice and snow can turn a 2,000-pound car into an unguided bobsled. To avoid accidents, drivers should pay special attention when approaching intersections.

Slow down before approaching an intersection. Scan left, then right, then left again for pedestrians and vehicles cars on cross streets. If you're having trouble stopping, they probably will too. Prepare for drivers sliding into intersections from the side, then decide if you can safely get through the intersection or stop to avoid hitting an oncoming vehicle. After stopping, press the accelerator slowly to get going again. Vehicles with manual transmissions should start in second gear to keep the wheels from spinning.


When approaching an icy hill, find a path with the best traction. Watch the cars ahead of you, and steer clear of spots where people are spinning their wheels or sliding backward. Try driving on unpacked snow; it sometimes offers better traction.

Build speed gradually you're still on level ground. If you have shift-on-the-fly four-wheel drive, shift into it before you reach the hill. When you reach the crest, begin to decelerate slowly, shifting into a lower gear to allow engine drag versus your brakes to cut your

Slow down before you enter an icy curve. Any sudden acceleration or deceleration in a turn could send you

Controlled speed and smooth steering and braking helps prevent If your wheels lose grip, gradually release the pressure from the pedal you're using. Smoothly steer in the direction you want the

People who get stuck in snow, ice or mud often do the wrong thing and stomp on the gas pedal and end up spinning their wheels and digging in deeper. To free your vehicle, try turning the steering wheel gently from side to side and use light foot pressure on the accelerator. Then rock the vehicle forward and backward while pointing the front wheels straight ahead. It's a good idea to check the owner's manual first because this procedure can damage the transmission on some cars. If you're still stuck, stay with your vehicle and make use of your winter survival kit until assistance




