## **Training the Human Weapons System:** *B-52 FTU adopts innovative CRAFT program*

BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE, La. --

It cost \$9.7 million to train a B-52 Stratofortress pilot, according to a 2019 RAND Corporation study.

But until recently, there was no scientific, holistic program at Barksdale Air Force Base designed to ensure that aircrew functioned at maximum cognitive and physical capacity.

That changed earlier this year when the 93rd and 11th Bomb Squadron, the two units running the B-52 Formal Training Unit, implemented the Comprehensive Readiness for Aircrew Flying Training program, also known as CRAFT.

Leadership at Air Force Global Strike Command initially brought CRAFT to Barksdale AFB to provide the best training possible for its B-52 aircrews, said Lt. Col. Aaron Bohl, 93rd Bomb Squadron commander.

The program melds cognitive function, physical fitness, and nutrition to maximize warfighting capabilities.

The B-52 FTU is the first Air Force Global Strike Command entity to use the program.

"It's an investment in the aircrew as a human weapon system," said Bohl. "CRAFT is about building the future B-52 warfighter that can operate in any environment necessary." CRAFT is currently geared toward B-52 trainees in Initial Qualification Training and aircrew in the Flight Instructor Course.

A specialized team consisting of two cognitive performance specialists, Dr. Johannes Raabe and Dr. Tucker Readdy, Mandy Enloe, a strength and conditioning coach, and Heather McKenzie, a registered dietician, run the program.

The team collaborates closely, using best practices from the 19th Air Force CRAFT program to develop strategies and techniques specifically for the B-52.

specifically for the B-52. "There are unique demands and responsibilities for B-52 aircrew," explained Raabe about developing CRAFT for the B-52 community. "You wouldn't train a basketball player like a football player or even a pitcher like an outfielder."

To better understand those demands, the CRAFT team immersed itself in the B-52 world, interviewing subject matter experts, reviewing relevant research, analyzing data, and working in the B-52 simulator.

"Just being in the simulator helped me develop an appreciation of the level of stress aircrew might feel," said McKenzie. "And analyzing the jet's physical space helped me to understand best how to incorporate proper nutrition and hydration into the program."

All those efforts are helping them develop a curriculum where aircrew gain practical application of how to best work in stressful conditions, said Readdy.

"A session might involve reducing heart rate when completing a difficult task such as air refueling," he said. "We'll bring them to a state of stress and fatigue and teach them strategies and techniques that bring them to a physiological and psychological state where better decision-making can occur."

The team explained that such lessons would be readily transferable to actual sorties. In addition, a deeper understanding of proper nutrition and hydration will underpin all the physical and cognitive efforts.

CRAFT in the B-52 community is in its early stages of development. But the team members agreed that leadership at AFGSC and the FTU had laid a strong foundation for success.

"They've given us the time and resources to do this right and make it successful," said Raabe.

Readdy said the CRAFT curriculum is nearly ready for implementation, and the team should be able to measure the program's impact in the coming months.

The volunteers provided their time and resources to bake approximately 9,000 cookies that would be delivered by the First Sergeants to the squadrons of the 5th Bomb Wing and 91st Missile Wing.

The holidays can be a tough time for any service member, but thanks to a group of spouses and volunteers from the Minot Area Chamber Economic Development Corporation (Minot EDC) who had came together to bake cookies for Airmen, they were able to bring smiles and a slice of home to those Airmen.

Some Airmen at the Missile Alert Facilities (MAF) are as far as two hours away from the base. For Airmen these times can be an extra challenge, but due to the hard work from the volunteers, leadership from the 91st Security Forces Group were able to deliver well over 1,000 cookies to each MAF.

"I think it's going to be awesome," said Karen Gibson, key spouse mentor for the 740th Missile Squadron. "I think it's going to improve the morale for people unable to see their families on Christmas Day."



Editor's note: This article is reprinted from the Jan. 20, 1997 edition of the Cavalier County Republican in Langdon. I wouldn't do this now, at my age, but back then, I was hell bent on getting my newspaper to its readers.

Right in the middle of the fourth blizzard of the season, a decision had to be made. Usually the Republican is printed at 8 a.m., Friday in Grafton. But seeing how a blizzard with dangerous wind chills was howling through the state, I woke up Friday morning thinking we would be printing the paper on Saturday.

About 10 a.m., on Jan. 10, I got a call from John Morgan at the Walsh County Record in Grafton. He said it was basically up to us, but his print crew would understand if Saturday became a work day.

Following that conversation, I went out and shoveled the

## Another blizzard, another day in North Dakota...

sidewalk. I could see OK and I worked up a sweat shoveling. Thus, my decision was made to get the pages to Grafton to get printed on time, or at least on the same day.

When a person feels they must travel during questionable weather conditions, there are several extra precautions that must be taken.

So before leaving Langdon at 11:15, I contacted the Cavalier County Sheriff's Department and they told me flat out not to drive the 70 miles to Grafton because of the dangerous windchills that were hovering around -80 degrees Fahrenheit.

I loaded extra clothing, food and gassed up. N.D. Highway 5 was clear of snow, but visibility was about 300 feet all the way to Cavalier, which is 34 miles.

Going south toward Grafton was a little different. The road was clear, if you could see it. Visibility in the Hoople area was next to nothing, but it improved south of town. The toughest part of that 70 miles was going east on N.D. Highway 17 into Grafton.

There were some big drifts blocking the road and the only

thing I could do was hit them at 50 miles per hour and hope to make it through. The snow was soft, but some of the drifts were three to four feet thick. That last 10-mile stretch into Grafton was a real challenge.

Even though I called the Morgans before I left Langdon, they were still surprised to see me arrive.

Anyway the paper was printed and while the presses were running, Shane Moen, one of the pressmen called out, "the mail can't get through, but I can still read the Republican."

The return trip to Langdon was even more of a challenge because now I was bucking a 40-mile-perhour wind in open country. John Morgan gave me his mobile in case I stalled on the route.

Normally that drive is a pretty easy ride, but I had to stop in Cavalier to fill gas because one of the rules of driving in dangerous conditions is keep your gas tank full.

The snowplows had gone on N.D. 17 and the storm was actually beginning to pass, so Grafton to Cavalier was OK. It was N.D. 5 that became the problem when I turned west. I encountered the

same size drifts as I did earlier on N.D. 17. I just hit them at a good speed and blew right through them.


I got back to Langdon just before dark and unloaded Monday's edition at the post office.

My lesson in all this was right at the Osnabrock corner. A mailbag blew out and onto the highway. I simply walked across the highway, picked it up and returned to the cab of my vehicle and my cheeks were numb. I couldn't have been out of my vehicle more than a minute. So when weather people tell us exposed skin can freeze within a minute, believe them.

We also had trouble getting our grocery store fliers because the Super Valu truck was stranded in Fargo. As a result, the Republican was thin last week, but it was delivered on schedule.

The key to dangerous winter driving conditions is preparedness. First, my vehicle was properly winterized and I had enough food for a full day. I took well-traveled roads thinking somebody might eventually find me if I stalled and believe it or not, there were people on the road that day.

## All About Pets

AF Life with Pets

As many Airmen and families already know, military life is not easy. Here are a few tips to help you make manage your busy Air Force life while also taking proper care of your pet!

•Get a low maintenance pet—snakes, certain varieties of fish, hamsters and other rodents, and turtles are just a few ideas of pets that are relatively low maintenance compared to your everyday dogs and cats. It's still important to provide adequate enrichment, environments, and food for them, but if you do all those things, these pets will be just fine during long work hours. Be sure to check with you housing authority first to make sure these pets are allowed.

•Find a "lazy" pet—high energy and working dog breeds are not recommended for owners who are away from home a lot and do not have the time, energy, and resources to keep their dogs fully enriched. You could consider bringing home a characteristically "lazy" breed instead. Basset Hounds, Boston Terriers, Bull Mastiffs, and Maltese are a few dog breeds that pop up often in the conversation around low-energy breeds. However, it's still important to note that all dogs are different. You may find a dog that is a couch-potato by nature, or you may find a "low-energy" dog that wants to go 24/7. Make sure you consider the needs of certain breeds and individual dogs (or cats) before adopting, and even if you have a low-energy dog, you still need to meet their basic requirements. Which is why working people should consider.

•Outside help—for shorter periods (a week in the field, a 12 hour day at work), it would

be beneficial to hire a pet sitter, dog walker, or even a neighbor or family member who is willing to help out. While some pets won't go crazy at home all day, they still need to be provided with socialization and enrichment. See if you can find someone to pop in every few hours to play with, feed, and let your pet outside! Doggy daycare is a great option for many canine parents, and while cats and other small pets are usually alright left alone, it's never a bad idea for them to have someone to play with. Don't be afraid to reach out to the base community through Facebook or your friends/family for help if you're feeling overwhelmed with your pet-parental duties. Chances are there is someone out there who is willing to help you and your pet out.

•For bigger challenges, consider finding a temporary foster home for your pet. Family members, close friends, and even willing community members are always options for long-term pet care instead of rehoming. There are also "deployed pet" help sites that can connect you with temporary fosters, such as Dogs on Deployment and Guardian Angels for Soldier's Pets. If you're thinking about rehoming your pet due to the cost of PCSing with them, consider applying for SPCA International's Operation Military Pets grant.

Taking care of pets is a big responsibility, but when we bring them into our home, it's our duty to treat them with the care and love that they give us as well. Military life can make it more difficult, but there are so many resources out there to help.





#### THE 2023 NORTH DAKOTA **LEGISLATURE AND** HOT BUTTON TOPICS

January means more than snow, cold, and the depths of winter in North Dakota on odd-numbered years. It also marks the beginning of another session of North Dakota's biennial legislative assembly.

Legislators, lobbyists, sportsmen and sportswomen, and others wrangled over some pretty contentious issues over the decades, shaping where the state is at today when it comes to access, habitat, and hunting and fishing opportunities.

A tug-of-war between resident waterfowl and pheasant hunters, the outfitting and guiding industry, landowners, the economics it means to the state, and the role nonresidents played in the entire mix dominated legislative sessions in he late 1990s and early 2000s. As time marched on, the controversy over resident-

nonresident hunting largely waned.

Creation of the state's Outdoor Heritage Fund (OHF) meant another tug-of-war for a couple of legislative sessions as the program developed and evolved.

North Dakota's laws stating private land is open to hunting unless posted otherwise was often a hot button item with several sessions dealing with a move to change the state's laws to "no hunting without permission."

It's possible that hot topic may have slowed to a simmer after the 2021 legislature created the novel approach requiring the N.D. Game and Fish Department to develop a system allowing landowners or a designated individual to electronically post land as closed to hunting in lieu of physical signs.

Either method qualifies a land parcel as being posted as closed to hunting. As it was back in the days of physical "no hunting" signs, it's the hunter's responsibility to know prior to accessing private land if it had been posted electronically or with paper signs.

with the sunset, one issue rising to the top could be hunting over bait as it relates to Game and Fish Department authority.

The agency has the authority to ban hunting over bait, which it has done, in a unit and surrounding units within 25 miles of a unit with confirmed cases of chronic wasting disease (CWD), a neurological disease that, if contracted by a cervid, is always – always – fatal.

Because there is no cure for CWD and it can only be confirmed when an animal is dead, states and Canadian provinces have taken measures to try to control and possibly slow the spread of the disease.

Limiting baiting, which has been banned entirely in several states, is just one of the ways wildlife veterinarians, biologists, managers, and researchers try to implement in efforts to slow its spread.

The bottom line is they will die. CWD, caused by a misfolded protein (prion) has no known cure.

It is contagious and transmitted freely among members of the cervid family.

In addition, current science indicates that once CWD is found in an area, its deadly prions remain in the soil for extremely long periods of time.

However, not all hunters recognize the need for longterm, visionary management of wildlife, nor the challenges wildlife agencies across the United States face when dealing with a disease that is 100 percent fatal if an animal contracts it, which is the case if moose, elk, and deer contract CWD.

Nor do all hunters and landowners recognize the longterm, deadly consequences if CWD becomes the "norm" among cervid populations, especially when it comes to an agency telling them they can or cannot hunt big game over bait.

It's also the landowner or designated individual's responsibility to electronically post land by a specified date, which currently is July 1. That allows time to enter the data into the array of programs, available for download on smartphones and tablets, in time for the beginning of hunting season.

Even though several contentious issues have waned

Instead, some focus on their own short-term goal of getting their deer – preferably a large buck.

And that means baiting and the Game and Fish Department's authority could likely be the hot button 2023 legislative item for hunters and anyone concerned about the state's wildlife.

#### NOTES ON BEING SAFE

## DON'T FORGET ABOUT YOUR PETS!





Pet owners should be made aware of winter's dangers, which include harsh weather; leaked antifreeze and road salt. Following are recommendations on steps you can take in order to ensure that the season is not marred by disaster.

One of the hazards a pet may face in winter is exposure to extreme cold. A pet's feet, ears and other areas of the body not covered by much hair get cold and can very well become frostbitten. Signs of frostbite include skin that is pale and cool to the touch and decreased sensation in the affected area. After thawing, there may be pain and the skin may look as though it was burned. If frostbite is suspected, gently thaw the area with warm water; then take your pet to a veterinarian.

The National Humane Education Society agrees with other humane organizations in advising owners of cats to keep them inside all year round. The cat can get enough exercise inside and won't get lost or injured. An enclosed "outdoor" environment such as a screened porch is certainly ideal for fresh air and sunshine but windows with a ledge or built-on perch can also provide much all-season pleasure.

During the cold weather, it is a good idea to knock on your car's hood or sound the horn before starting the engine, as cats permitted to run free can climb up inside the engine seeking warmth should swallow any antifreeze, call your veterinarian at once.


#### ROCK SALT UNDERFOOT

Rock salt is another substance to be wary of in winter. As it is abrasive, it may cut into an animal's paws and burn their mouths. Dogs may eat rock salt which will cause vomiting. When bringing in a pet from the outside during an icy-cold day, check its feet. Remove ice balls between the animal's toes and wipe its feet with a damp towel, especially after walking on heavily salted pavement.

Never let your dog off the leash on snow or ice, especially during a snowstorm--dogs can lose their scent and easily become lost. More dogs are lost during the winter than during any other season, so make sure they always wear I.D. tags.

Thoroughly wipe off your dog's legs and stomach when he comes in out of the sleet, snow or ice. He can ingest salt, antifreeze or other chemicals while licking his paws, and his paw pads may also bleed from snow or encrusted ice.

Own a short-haired breed?



Never leave your dog or cat alone in a car during cold weather. A car can act as a refrigerator in the winter, holding in the cold. The animal can freeze to death. If your dog is sensitive to the cold due to age, illness or breed type, take him outdoors only to relieve himself. Never shave your dog down to the skin in winter. Leave the coat longer for more warmth. When you bathe your dog, completely dry him before taking him out for a walk. Make sure your companion animal has a warm place to sleep away from all drafts and off the floor, such as in a dog or cat bed with a warm blanket or pillow in it.

Taking good care of your pets in winter and protecting them from the hazards of the season will bring a little warmth into the long, cold days of your own hibernation.

Deciding on whether to keep your dog outdoors depends largely on the dog's coat and the outside temperature. Ideally, the dog should live indoors, as part of the family. However, if the dog must live outdoors, adequate preparation for the cold months is essential. Be aware that large, long-haired dogs fare better outside during the winter than others.

#### HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

Ethylene glycol, the major ingredient in antifreeze, attracts both dogs and cats because of its sweet taste. But it is extremely poisonous. A tablespoon can kill a cat, and half a cup can be fatal to a 25-pound dog. Within two days, a fatal dose will cause prolonged vomiting, severe kidney pain, ulcers in the mouth and excruciating death from kidney failure. If your pet

## MIC3: Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission





Happy New Year! We are excited for what 2023 has to hold for our community especially with the Month of the Military Child approaching in April. However, I would like to reshare insights on the Military Interstate Children's Compact (MIC3).

There are unique needs for Prek-12 military-connected families Navigating educational systems across the United States is challenging as you prepare to relocate to a different community. As you prepare to PCS with your military-connected student, one available resource to ease this transition is the Military Interstate Children's Compact (MIC3).

MIC3 is an interstate compact across all 50 States and the District of Columbia. The compact addresses the challenges of the children encounter military on their frequent relocations stateside. It allows for the uniform treatment as military children transfer between school districts in member states. The Compact only applies to public schools and focuses on specific impacts on military connected children such as the transfer of records, course sequencing, graduation requirements, exclusion from extracurricular activities,

redundant or missed entrance/ exit testing, kindergarten and first grade entrance age variances, and power of custodial parents while parents are deployed.

Military Interstate Children's Compact (MIC3) covers students of Active Duty Members of the Uniformed Services, including members of the National Guard

and Reserve on active duty orders (Title 10), members or veterans who are medically discharged or retired for one year, members who die on active duty, for a period of one year after death, and uniformed members of the Commissioned Corps of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and United States Public Health Services (USPHS).

MIC3 is an incredible resource and is the policy ensuring consistency of the educational experiences of military connected student.




