

### Assignment Incentive Pay to be authorized for Airmen, Guardians stationed at extremely cold locations

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --

Effective April 1, the Department of the Air Force approved a new incentive pay for Airmen and Guardians assigned to qualifying bases in the U.S. where the temperature is expected to drop below minus 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

Weather Assignment Incentive Pay is a single lump sum payment given to Airmen and Guardians after signing an agreement to serve a prescribed tour length of at least 12 months, depending on qualifying location.

Locations that meet this threshold include Minot and Grand Forks Air Force Bases and Cavalier Space Force Station in North Dakota, Clear Space Force Station, Eielson Air Force Base and Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson in Alaska, as well as Malmstrom AFB, Montana.

"Airmen and Guardians living in extremely cold conditions faced unique out-of-pocket costs," said

Alex Wagner, Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Manpower and Reserve Affairs. "In addition to the assignment and retention benefits of the pay, it also comes down to making sure we do our best to take care of our service members and their families stationed at these critical installations."

This payment intends to ease the financial burden of purchasing certain cold weather essentials, such as extreme cold weather gear, all-season and/or snow tires, tire mounts and alignments, engine block heaters and emergency winter car kits, as well as further incentivizing assignments.

Although AIP-CW is effective April 1, the first pay date is anticipated for July 1, 2024, meaning Airmen and Guardians who move to a qualifying location between April 1 and June 30 will receive payment retroactively.

The amount of AIP-CW Airmen

and Guardians are eligible to receive is based on criteria in the five pay levels outlined in the table below and is subject to change.

This change follows the Department of Defense implementation of the Fiscal Year 2023 National Defense Authorization Act, which included language authorizing special duty pay for members based in coldweather climate conditions and the FY24 NDAA, which clarifies the temperature parameters that qualify an area as a cold-weather location.

"We want to ensure Airmen, Guardians and their families have the resources needed to safely live and work in an extreme coldweather environment," Wagner added.





SLICE OF LIFE KIM FUNDINGSLAND

North Dakota's capital city of Bismarck took grew out of some of the wickedest days in frontier history. The Northern Pacific Railroad, advancing from the populated East, made it as far as the Missouri River. It was there that Edwinton, later renamed Bismarck, was born.

It would be several years before funds were appropriated to bridge the Missouri, which was then the edge of the Sioux nation. Thus, Bismarck was the end of the line for roughies, gamblers, and assorted lawbreakers fleeing from the East. Many of them vowed to make Bismarck their last stand, vowing to "die with their boots on.

An early directory of the soon to be booming frontier town listed a population of 1,000 adult men and an astounding 24 saloons. Bismarck's Fourth Street became notorious for drinking and gambling, shootings and slayings.

Many of the fatal incidents involved soldiers from Fort Abraham Lincoln, located across the Missouri River from Bismarck. One of the country's best-known personalities, Lt. Col. George Armstrong Custer, was commanding officer of the vaunted 7th Cavalry posted at Fort Lincoln.

Saloon frequenters that got into shooting row with a soldier could expect swift reprisal from others

wearing the Army blue. The Army did not interfere in such matters and civil authorities lacked jurisdiction on a military post.

The only time Custer ever exerted his authority over anyone in Bismarck involved the stealing of Fort Lincoln grain which was to be used as feed for cavalry mounts. He led a company of soldiers across the frozen Missouri and lined them up in front of a storehouse on Bismarck's Main Street.

The troopers opened the warehouse and removed sacks of grain clearly marked Ft. Abraham Lincoln. The warehouse was owned by John McLean, Bismarck's mayor, who was said to have shown the proper amount of surprise at seeing the stolen grain sacks.

A few months later Custer McCarthy arrested Charles for cutting wood within the boundaries of the Fort Lincoln reservation. He tossed McCarthy into the guardhouse but released him a few days later at the urging of two attorneys from Bismarck. Ironically, McCarthy was elected sheriff two months later.

It was a Custer-led expedition into the Black Hills of present-


day South Dakota that discovered gold, an event that ignited a gold rush and accelerated Bismarck's growth. The city positioned itself as the best jumping off point for gold seekers heading to the Hills. Businesses flourished, mostly providing the flow of goods of all kinds headed for the latest The Bismarck-tobonanza. Deadwood stage trail increased demand for horses, wagons, and

Deadwood quickly earned a reputation as a wild frontier town. The Eastern newspapers were enthralled with exciting tales from Deadwood. Clement Lounsberry, owner/editor of the Bismarck Tribune, made a trip to Deadwood in 1877 to see if the stories of lawlessness and mayhem were true.

He returned to Bismarck and wrote glowing accounts of Deadwood and Crook City, two well-known destinations in the Black Hills. However, Lounsberry added, "more murders occurred in the town of Bismarck during the first two years of its existence than has occurred in all of the towns of the Black Hills.

Minot Area Chamber EDC (MACEDC) Task Force 21 is pleased to announce the full speaker line up for the North Dakota Nuclear Triad Symposium on Tuesday, April 23, 2024. The symposium will focus on sustaining credible nuclear deterrence amidst growing challenges while speakers cover the state of nuclear deterrence, threats from the Chinese and Russian regimes, America's Strategic Posture Commission report, Congressional and State of North Dakota updates, modernization projects underway, and a briefing on the Sentinel project.

Check-in and continental breakfast begin at 7:00 a.m. (CDT). welcome and opening comments will take place promptly at 7:50 a.m. The symposium is scheduled to conclude by 1:45 p.m. Lunch will be provided.

The event's keynote speaker is career space and missile officer Lt. Gen. Michael J. Lutton, the Deputy Commander, Air Force Global Strike Command (AFGSC) and Deputy Commander, Air Forces Strategic-Air, U.S. Strategic Command, Barksdale Air Force Base, Louisiana. Prior to his current assignment, Lt. Gen. Lutton commanded the Twentieth Air Force, AFGSC, F.E. Warren Air Force Base, Wyoming. From June 2014 - June 2016, he served as Minot Air Force Base 91st Missile Wing Commander. Lt. Gen. Lutton will be opening the event with an Air Force Global Strike Command

"Minot Air Force Base serves as the bedrock of nuclear deterrence as the only base with two legs of the nuclear triad," Brekka Kramer, MACEDC President | CEO shared. "It is critical for leaders at all levels to understand nuclear deterrence, the threats that face our nation, sustainment of current missions, and the importance of seeing through the major modernizations projects that are underway. This work includes preparing the state for Sentinel."

Col. Tytonia S. Moore, Deputy Intercontinental Director of Ballistic Missile Modernization, Site Activation Task Force will be discussing the modernization and implementation of the Sentinel project. Sentinel is the weapon system to replace the aging Minuteman III intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) system, representing the modernization of the land-based leg of the U.S. nuclear triad. What makes Sentinel unique is the off-base construction and footprint it covers, including 15 missile alert facilities and 150 launch facilities.

U.S. Senator John Hoeven, U.S. Senator Kevin Cramer, U.S. Representative Kelly Armstrong, and North Dakota Governor Doug Burgum will share their perspective about the importance of nuclear modernization and the role North Dakota plays in protecting the

William A. Chambers, Maj. Gen. U.S. Air Force (retired) and Commission Executive Director, Institute for Defense Analysis will speak about the America's Strategic Posture Commission Report, which highlights strategic challenges requiring urgent action.

The National Defense Industrial Association (NDIA) President & CEO Hon. David L. Nordquist is also scheduled to speak. The NDIA Northern Tier Chapter, which includes the states of North Dakota,

South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, and Minnesota, is an event partner bringing to the table briefings on China and Russia. James P. (Phil) Wisecup, Vice Admiral, US Navy (retired) will speak on China, and Dr. Anna Batta, Associate Professor of International Security Studies Air War College at Maxwell Air Force Base, is an expert discussing Russia.

The half-day symposium will take place at the Clarion Event Center, 2200 Burdick Expressway East, Minot, N.D. There is no cost to attend this in-person symposium and registration is now open.

Individuals must be registered to attend. The event is expected to fill quickly so early registration is encouraged.





THIS WEEK IN USAF HISTORY

THE DOOLITTLE RAID

**APRIL 18, 1942**

After the attack on Pearl Harbor, the United States Army Air Forces and Navy began formulating a plan for a reprisal attack on the Japanese Empire. They recruited Col. James "Jimmy" Doolittle to train the pilots who would be a part of the raid. On April 18, 1942, 16 B-25 Mitchell Bombers from the 17th Bombardment Group, led by Col. Doolittle, took off from the Navy's USS Hornet 650 miles off the coast and made a path towards Tokyo.

The bombers hit targets in Tokyo, Yokosuka, Yokohama, Kobe, and Nagoya. On the way back, fifteen of the aircraft crash-landed or had crews bail out due to low fuel and one made it to Russia. Three crew members died and eight were taken as Japanese POWs. According to Pacific Air Forces, Doolittle thought that he would be court-martialed upon his return. However, the Doolittle Raiders received the Congressional Gold Medal in 2015 and Col. Doolittle received the Medal of Honor for one of the greatest surprise attacks of the time. While the damage left by the raid was not severe, it was a serious morale booster for the US.





### Sweep dreams: Minot Airmen build camaraderie and resilience through curling

"This is my first year in the league; I kind of threw together a hodgepodge team of Airmen and we started curling," said

Mathews. "I think this a good program because it helps you get closer to your fellow Airmen and it's a fun way to relieve stress.'

As with any team sport, curling requires a substantial amount of teamwork and fosters camaraderie among teammates. Janssen says playing in the curling league enhances these qualities in the Airmen who participate as

"You heard some of the shouting and yelling going on during the game," said Janssen. "There's so much communication going on out there, you've really gotta listen to the calls being made and be a team player."

According to Mathews, finding activities to engage in during the winter at Minot AFB may be a challenge for some Airmen. He says the Minot AFB Curling Club is a great option for those looking for something fun to do in their free time.

"I think it builds resilience and helps Airmen get their mind off the cold of Minot. A lot of people may get up here and think there's not a lot to do; well, this is something you can do," said Mathews.

Janssen added, "It breaks us out of those winter blues and gets us out here competing and having fun; it's a great way to close out winter and get a jump start heading into spring."

As the Minot AFB Curling League's 2024 season came to a close, the Sweep Dreams and the Lobstahs curling teams took to the ice one last time. In a hard fought match, championship game. 

The average military youth will move six to nine times between their kindergarten and senior year. The dandelion is often used to represent military youth as the seeds of a dandelion are blown all over and yet, it blossoms wherever it lands. Like the hearty flower our military youth will find the means to thrive in each of their new locations, but not without struggle. "When we stood in our new, strange house it echoed. It didn't feel like mine. The base itself is surrounded for miles and miles on every side by open flat fields- isolated and desolate. School friends were hard to come by and I felt like a foreigner," Ryan Weed- North Dakota 2021 Military Youth of the Year. This feeling of being an outsider is normal for "the new kid;" military children will face it over and over again. As a community and in partnership with our local schools, youth sponsorship programs are available with the base Child & Youth Programs and within the local school districts. At Minot, both the Youth Center and several schools in the district offer a transition support program for new students. If you are new to Minot

or soon to be PCSing, get in contact with the School Liaison for more information on youth sponsorship here in Minot and at your next installation. "I'm sure no matter how many times I move, it will never get easy. The weight may not get lighter, but I will get stronger... Roots take time to grow but they will- if we are willing to see each new experience as a chance to find something new. It may not be what you expect or hope but there is goodness if we are willing to look for it," Ryan Weed- North Dakota 2021 Military Youth of the Year. Moving is difficult, but for military children it also offers unique and invaluable experiences. Military children learn to adapt and

often demonstrate their resilience through social skills such as the ability to maintain relationships over long distances. Military children also tend to be more open-minded as they experience diverse cultures and traditions. Like the dandelion our military children will eventually flourish in their new environment, though it may take some time and care. If your child is to the area, having difficulty adjusting, or you are soon to be PCSing there are resources available to support a successful transition. 
her friends have moved away, so it wouldn't be the same.

### NATIONAL DISTRACTED **DRIVING AWARENESS MONTH**

April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month, the National Safety Council data indicates that roads across America are the most dangerous that they've have been in years. Did you know on a typical day, eight people are killed and hundreds more are injured in distractionaffected vehicle accidents. Your family, friends, and even coworkers face distracted driving risks on every trip, from the driveway to the parking lot at work or the local grocery store and back home again.

Every day the majority of us get behind the wheel of a vehicle to drive to and from work or to simple run errands. However, how many of us are truly paying attention to the road? Did you know that distracted driving can greatly increase the chance of having a vehicle accident, becoming injured, fatally injured, or harming others? While all too often this question is answered with the cost of lives, many drivers are still placing themselves and others at risk. common distractions include: texting and talking on a cell phone, grooming, talking to a passenger, eating or drinking, using the navigation system, adjusting the radio, etc... Any of these activities may result in three types of distractions:

All driver distractions are not created equal. As a example, efforts to end cell phone use are greater than those to end other dangerous behaviors for significant reasons, which include:

1. Risk – One of the biggest reasons for crashes is the danger associated with the behavior.

Drivers using cell phones are four times as likely to crash, and there is no difference in

between handheld and handsfree phone use.

2. Frequency – At any given moment, there are far more drivers using cell phones on our roadways than there are drivers distracted by other risky

activities (like applying mascara or reaching into the back seat). According to the National Safety Council approximately 9 percent of all drivers are talking on cell phones at any given daylight moment.


3. Prevalence – Cell phone use while driving is widespread. More than 2 in 3 drivers reported


talking on their cell phone while driving in the past month, and nearly 1 in 3 said they do so fairly often or regularly according to the AAA Foundation Traffic Safety Culture Index.

Cell phone use may not be the most dangerous distraction, but when you combine the risk (the likelihood of a crash) with the frequency (how often drivers are doing the behavior) and prevalence, the reason for putting an end to this deadly behavior becomes clear.

Drivers who used their cell phones and were involved in a crash likely believed they could

their phones safely. They didn't start their call with the intention of injuring or killing another person or themselves. Don't become a statistic. Make today the day you stop using your cell phone while driving. Pledge to drive cell free at nsc. org/pledge. Ultimately all of these activities mentioned above divert your attention away from the primary task of driving. Everyone who travels by car, as a driver, passenger, or even bystanders is at risk of being injured or fatally injured. Play it safe, find a safe place to stop your vehicle before using your cell phone. Navigation systems and radio devices should also be adjusted before you begin to drive. Don't risk it!



network of peers and adult advisors, and create a sense of community with other military teens at Cheley Colorado Camp, which borders Rocky Mountain National Park.







### **SMOKED BACON CHEESE BALL**





INGREDIENTS

1 LB CREAM CHEESE 1/4 CUP SOUR CREAM 1/2 LB BACON, SLICED 4 TBSP CHOPPED GREEN ONION 1 CUP SHREDDED CHEDDAR CHEESE 1 TSP GARLIC POWDER SALT, TO TASTE

When ready to cook, set temperature to 180° and preheat, lid closed for 15 minutes

Place the cream cheese and sour cream in a medium baking dish and transfer to the grill.

Smoke for 20 minutes or until desired level of smoke is reached.

Remove from heat and increase the grill temperature to 350°

While the bacon is cooling, place smoked cream cheese, sour cream, green onion, cheddar cheese, garlic powder and salt in the bowl of a

Pulse until combined then turn out onto a piece of plastic wrap. Form the cheese mixture into a ball and wrap tightly. Place in the fridge until

Chop the bacon into small pieces and place on a plate with the chopped chives. Remove the cheese ball from the fridge, unwrap and

Place the cheese ball on a plate and serve with your choice of

The nation's symbol of strength, grandeur, grace, and power since 1782 – the bald eagle – was once teetering on the brink of extinction across the Lower 48 United States.

In 1963 only 417 breeding bald eagle pairs were believed to exist in the Lower 48. Their population began rebounding after being placed on the Endangered Species Act in 1978 coupled with an Environmental Protection Agency ban on the synthetic insecticide DDT, which impacted aquatic waterways and contaminated the bird's food source.

It rebounded so well that by 2007 the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service delisted the bald eagle.

North Dakota historically was home to some nesting bald eagles as they took advantage of wooded river bottoms such as the towering cottonwoods of the Missouri River. But given the limited amount of forested areas in the state, their numbers weren't overly abundant and sightings were special — even along the "Mighty Mo".

But nowadays the eagle soars across many areas of North Dakota, perhaps a testament to its perseverance as well as what might be considered the symbol of success for the Endangered Species Act.

Bald eagles nest in North Dakota in March. Soon little eaglets will be hatching into their brave, new world. Like an eagle sighting, their nests were historically limited to areas with those massive, old cottonwoods. But the grand bird has since expanded its historic range and nesting opportunities.

This year N.D. Game and Fish Department biologists estimate there could be approximately 350 active bald eagle nests spread across 47 of the state's 53 counties.

The ticket to finding an optimum nesting site seems to be someplace near an adequate food source, not necessarily those grand cottonwoods along a river corridor. The nest will likely be relatively close to water, such as a lake, river, or large wetland, lined with tall

Bald eagles will nest in dead trees but they prefer live mature ones with a canopy of open space along treed

Eagle nests aren't hard to miss. They're wide — like 5 to 6 feet in diameter. And they can be tall – like 2 to 4 feet

in height.

The size is attributed to the fact that they may re-use the same nest in following years, building upon previous

The Game and Fish Department tracks eagle nests sites and would appreciate people report a nest via their link on the agency website, "gf.nd.gov".

Just the reporting of nest sites are requested, not sightings of individual birds, however, in part because this is the time of year bald eagles generally migrate across the state – seeing a bald eagle doesn't mean it's an adult with a nearby nest.

Some cautions, though, about being near bald eagles nests: People are asked to stay away from the nest and don't disturb it. Don't walk around or anywhere near it like many species, bald eagles don't like disturbance and nearby human activity could prompt the birds to leave the nest or not attend the young eaglets.

And one other note when it gets later in the summer: Never, ever approach a young bald eagle should it be on the ground. Like other young wildlife, such as a fawn, the odds are great that mama is nearby watching and wanting the disturbing human to leave her baby alone.

It's almost mid-April and soon anywhere from one to three eggs will hatching. Rarely does a bald eagle lay four eggs and two are the most common.

The birds began either building a new nest or extending a previous one in January and February. By late February into mid-March egg laying was underway with incubation lasting about 35 days.

Parents spend about eight to 12 weeks rearing and feeding the eaglets and by July the little ones have grown to almost adult size. They will bravely venture out onto tree branches and begin their initial wobbly, short flights. By the end of July and early August they usually have fledged and will leave the nest, often lingering nearby while still under the tutelage and feeding of their

Come fall, they're ready to either migrate or stay along the open waters of the Missouri River tailrace, allowing people to catch glimpses of the national symbol yeararound..
