

# The Knighthawks Winning Is Awesome

# Commander of 69th Bomb Squadron Talks About Their Award

It was a fitting end to what was a year of change and adaptation for the 69th Bomb Squadron. It also seemed to come at the perfect time as the Knighthawks returned from their 6 week Bomber Task Force deployment to RAF Fairford, BTF 25-2.

Lt. Col Joseph Cangealose commands the 69th and was able to take a few minutes to talk about what factors contributed to the presentation of the 2024 Brig. Gen. Kenneth N. Walker Award for the Best Overall Bomber Squadron in Air Force Global Strike Command.

Let's talk about the 2024 Brigadier General Kenneth N. Walker Award for Best Overall Bomber Squadron. What do they look for when they choose a squadron for this award, and what does winning the award mean to the Airmen of the 69th?

Lt Col Cangealose: The Walker award is the award for best overall performance over the last year. For the Knighthawks, winning it is awesome. The men and women have worked tirelessly over the past year, starting out last May when they went on a Bomber Task Force in Europe. The came home back from that and we immediately went on an agile combat deployment exercise for a few weeks in July, a nuclear exercise, and a no notice deployment to U.S. Central Command to cap off the year, so they have been super busy and they have absolutely crushed the mission on all of those. I couldn't be more happy to see them win the best bomb squadron in the Air Force.

The 69th Bomb Squadron, according to Lt. Col Cangealose has about 89 flyers right now. Lt Col Cangealose has been in Minot for about 2 ½ years "and I was stationed here previously for about 4 ½ years as well between 2013 and 2017."

I know you just returned from (Fairford) England. Maybe you could review some of the highlights of the BTF and fill us in on what happened during this deployment?

Lt Col Cangealose: During this Bomber Task Force especially we really demonstrated the power of the strategic bomber deployment. It's all about power projection and long range strike capability for us. Deploying to another theater and putting jets on the ground there allows us to strengthen not only our relationships but the tactics with those allies and partners as well. We flew hundreds of flight hours while we were there, we supported 4 geographic combatant commands and showcased the global reach and responsiveness of the BTF's.

We integrated with 13 partner nations; we flew sorties down into the U.S. Central Command area of responsibility as well. We integrated with our partners in the Middle East, and we integrated with our European partners and allies.

We dropped both high explosive and inert munitions throughout Europe. We executed the first ever flyover of Oslo, Norway. We also improved dynamic targeting tactics significantly.

It was really a great experience for the air crew to fly a low pass over the capital of another country. It was a pretty incredible signal of allies and partnerships.

It appears that the Bomber Task Force model of

It appears that the Bomber Task Force model of deployment will be standard procedure for the 69th in the foreseeable future. Could you review what it takes for Team Minot to support this type of mission.

Lt Col Cangealose: This type of deployment takes seamless integration from all of Team Minot. It's about getting the bombers, the flyers, the maintainers over there. It doesn't happen without all of the rest of the supporting team here, specifically the LRS (Logistics Readiness Squadron) plays a huge hand to make sure all of our cargo gets out there and all of our personnel are cleared for the deployment. It truly is a Team Minot effort to get this large footprint out the door in time and the seamless re-integration so we can get everything back here so we can get back up and running and flying global missions again the following week.

Cangealose shared that there were 224 total Airmen that were part of this BTF, and he becomes the command of the expeditionary bomb squadron. This particular BTF was a bit more challenging as the 69th deployed while planning the BTF deployment.

The mission of the 69th Bomb Squadron is certainly vital to the United States and of course our allies. What has changed in the preparation of Airmen assigned to the 69th as they work to support this mission.

Lt Col Cangealose: I wouldn't say that anything in our mission has really changed, we've always been responsible for power projection and long range strikes. These missions are great training opportunities for us to fly in non-U.S. airspace. The Knighthawks

are the best in the business, I can promise you that. We don't really have to do significant preparation on the tactics, it's really the flying in that airspace.

On the short end we flew some sorties that we flew over there would be 8 to 9 hours and we flew some sorties that were over 24 hours. A BTF shows us that we can pick up with a large bomber package and put it in another theater rapidly, and almost immediately be able to execute missions. If the airfield supports us we can probably get in there and operate. The evidence that what we do, we do well. There is no better evidence than an award that says Minot has the best bomb squadron in the Air Force.

My final question is about the future of the 69th Bomb Squadron. What are the future challenges as the 69th transitions to what will be the B-52 J model? Also, as the B 52 J model comes online, will there be an expanded mission for the 69th?

Lt Col Cangealose: Our biggest challenge with the B 52 J is going to be adapting to our new tactics with some increased capabilities. As far as the mission set goes, I don't see it changing. Our mission will still center around long range strike and nuclear capabilities. The biggest capability that we are looking forward to getting is the increased data link capability.

We'll take the challenges in stride.

For Lt Col Joseph Cangealose, he is in "the best job in the Air Force. I've got such a phenomenal team here. They continue to impress me every time. The fact that they won, I am not shocked. They deserved it. They are true professionals in everything they do. I don't want to leave this job because I get to lead a group of professional and highly motivated Airmen."

There's no question those of us who live in North Dakota, like parades. We see them everywhere when the weather co-operates. And, we sometimes see them leading up to Christmas when it can get quite cold.

We have community parades, high school parades, college parades, kiddie parades and even parades for special events, like a big cookout or something.

And it all seems to lead up to the biggest parade of all, the North Dakota State Fair in Minot in late July.

That parade has always been quite an event, but in recent years has grown and has seen some interesting and unusual entries.

One of the earliest "summer" parades, however, that we will see is Williston Band Day on May 11.

Much like the State Fair parade, Band Day has grown recently and just about every kid in western North Dakota who is in a school band, looks forward to spending that day on the streets of Williston.

That's only the beginning. There are numerous others that sometimes include car shows, craft shows, livestock shows and beer fests.

In reality, the parade season has already kicked off with the St. Patrick's Day parade in Fargo on March 15. Not a terribly large parade for the city of Fargo mind you, but it's been consistent for a number of years and those who are Irish, or claim to be Irish, show up to enjoy it.

Following are just a few of other seasonal excitement that will be coming this summer across the state of North Dakota. They include:

Devils Run Parade and Car Show in Devils Lake, May 30-June1; Buggies and Blues in Mandan, June 7 and 8; Rhubarb Festival in Rugby, June 8; Irrigation Days in Oakes, June 12-15; Rods and Hogs car show in Jamestown, June 14; Rally in the Valley in Valley City, June 14; the Hazelton Community Day parade, June 21; the Pembina Hills Show and Shine in Walhalla, TBA; the Independence Day

parade in Mandan, July 4; the 4th of July parade in Berthold; 4th of July parade in Carrington; Elgin Days, July 10-13; Makoti Threshing Show, July 13 and 14; the State Fair parade July 19; Langdon Days, July 18-20; Rock the Block Dakota Territory Car Show in Bowman, July 27; the Deuce of August parade in Mountain (Pembina County) Aug 2; the Chokecherry Festival in Williston, Aug. 8; and the Rods and Rock Car Show in Carson Aug. 16.

There are undoubtedly others I'm sure I missed, and if I did, I apologize to those communities and/or organizations that may have been overlooked. Those listed have already been advertised or placed on social media calendars so interested people can begin setting their schedules for the parade or festival of their choosing.

In reality, all you have to do is an internet search for parades and festivals in any community in North Dakota, and you'll find something.

As an example, not many of us outside of southeastern North Dakota know about Kathryn, a small community south of Valley City. As it turns out, Kathryn, population 64, is having its 125th celebration on June 6, starting at

7 p.m. It appears there's going to be a big party in Kathryn the first Friday in June.

For a number of years, we've all experienced the centennial parties across the state. Those were huge and had special meaning if you grew up in one of the communities celebrating its centennial. There doesn't appear to be any centennial celebrations this year, but numerous other festivals could rise to the occasion.

And when we look at all the parades, car shows and festivals in North Dakota, it is suggested that the Deuce of August is the most unusual for a variety of reasons.

It celebrates Icelandic culture because many immigrants to Pembina County came from Iceland. Gimli, Manitoba, Spanish Fork, Utah and Minneota, Minn., are among only a handful of communities like it in North America.

And because of its heritage, the festival includes Icelandic dignitaries in the parade, Icelandic food and an official contingent from the Icelandic government. It's actually bigger and better than some festivals in Iceland and anyone with Icelandic heritage will tell you that.


For nearly five years, Lisa Hermosillo and her family embraced springtime tradition on Minot AFB, celebrating the rain and the puddles that come with it.





Nearly 30 units of donated blood helped save Marci's life after experiencing an amniotic fluid embolism in the minutes following her son Noah's birth.


"I had a new lease on life, a second chance to be these boys" mom, and be a doctor," Marci said.

- You can find many different "doggy TV" shows on the internet. Put one on while you're busy and let your dog watch and listen for a variety of dog-favorite sights and sounds.
- Bring your dog along for a windows-down car ride to expose them to new sights, sounds, and

## From Veteran to Ambassador: George Masters Champions Honor Flight in Minot

Entrepreneur, classic car enthusiast, and Honored Veteran, George Masters, began his military career at Minot Air Force Base in 1972, and had "the privilege" of being an invited guest on the acclaimed Honor Flight in 2023 that flew out of Bismarck. In 2025 the Honor Flight will depart from Minot International Airport on April 27th.

This time George's role is one of 40 volunteers. Honored Veterans, numbering 105 plus 25 requested Guardians, will be joined by a medical staff, counselors, logistics personnel, and 44 wheelchairs (just in case.) Each volunteer has a specific assignment providing safety and companionship to the Guests of Honor.

The 6:30 a.m. flight out of Minot will carry the precious cargo to DC where luxury motor coaches will be waiting to transport them in style as they visit several

war memorials dedicated to all branches of service including the Vietnam/Korean, Iwo Jima, Air Force and Pentagon 9/11 Memorials. Each destination will include a step-on guide to provide some history at each stop. Opportunities will include disembarking for closer looks, photos and heartfelt memories. Veterans will also witness the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier that leaves them moved with shared pride and a deep sense of meaning. The busy day ends with a banquet honoring the guests and a key-note speaker, Lt. General Bruce "Orville" Wright, an Arlington VA guest.

Every part of this event is 100% sponsored by corporate and private donations of \$200,000 that must be met even before the flight can be scheduled. Ever-increasing costs are the charter flight of

\$125,000, hotel/banquet/meals \$40,000, ground transportation/incidentals \$10,000, plus Honor Flight clothing \$25,000...veterans need never reach for their wallets for anything other than memorabilia.

The return flight to Minot will arrive back in Minot the evening of April 28th .

The Honor Flight network was founded in 2005 so that veterans can visit, without cost to them, to visit and reflect on the memorials dedicated to their service.






welcome Airmen to Minot and let them know they are part of a community that cares.

## Air Force personnel involuntarily discharged over vaccine mandate offered reinstatement

SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE PUBLIC AFFAIRS

ARLINGTON, Va. (AFNS) --The Department of Defense is offering a pathway for reinstatement for service members involuntarily discharged for refusing the COVID-19 vaccine. The military departments will review discharge records, using standardized criteria, to identify those separated solely due to the vaccine mandate. Those whose records don't clearly indicate a sole-cause separation will be contacted directly.

Each eligible former service member will be contacted by mail, email (if possible) and phone by a uniformed representative and invited to apply for reinstatement. The outreach will explain the streamlined application process, potential financial benefits (including required offsets) and the requirement for a fouryear service commitment upon reinstatement.

Interested individuals will pre-screening undergo assess their physical and medical eligibility, utilizing Military Entrance Processing (MEPS). Stations While screened according to accession standards, they'll be adjudicated against retention standards, with waivers liberally applied. Only presidentially appointed,

Senate-confirmed civilians can disapprove waivers.

The Boards for Correction of Military/Naval Records (BCM/ NRs) will prioritize these reinstatement cases, subject to existing statutory priorities. The BCM/NRs will review records for errors or injustices and may order corrections, including reinstatement without a break in service, restoration of rank and credit for lost service time. The service secretaries retain final disapproval authority for reinstatement of eligible service

Pre-reinstatement assistance will include expedited pay and benefits estimates. The gap in service will count as active service for retirement pay calculations

for those previously in full-time status. Ready Reserve members will receive retirement points as outlined in 10 U.S.C. § 12732(a) (2), with a minimum of 50 points annually.

After receiving a compensation estimate, former service members will have 60 days to accept reinstatement in writing, acknowledging the four-year service commitment (a two-year option exists for those within two years of retirement eligibility at their separation date). Those declining reinstatement may still apply to the BCM/NR for other relief. This policy does not apply to those separated for misconduct unrelated to the vaccine mandate.







## A LOOK BACK

THIS WEEK IN USAF HISTORY

LT. JAMES OBENAUF LANDS A BURNING **B-47 AND SAVES CREW MEMBER** 

APRIL 28, 1958

On April 28, 1958, a 341st Bombardment Wing B-47 performed a routine flight out of Dyess AFB, Texas. After about 3 hours and at an altitude of 34,000 feet, one of the engines exploded and the crew proceeded to bail out. As he was about to crawl out the navigator's escape hatch following the pilot, 1st Lt. James E. Obenauf noticed intructor-navigator, Major Joseph Maxwell, unconscious and missing his

helmet. Obenauf was unable to revive him and made the brave decision to risk death and remain in the burning aircraft in an attempt to save his fellow officer. He flew the plane to a lower altitude from the backseat position and at 450 mph in freezing temperatures, he set a course back to Dyess. Due to the elements, Lt. Obenauf's vision faltered while navigating the aircraft. He was able to perform a safe landing with the support of air traffic control and his own skill. Obenauf and Maxwell made full recoveries, and for his heroism and bravery, Lt. Obenauf received the Cheney Award, Aviator's Valor Award, Koren Kolligan Trophy, and a Distinguished Flying Cross.





### **NOTES ON BEING SAFE**

### Basic principals for safe lifting

You would never use a jack without also using a jack stand right!

The vehicle lifts that are supporting a vehicle you are working or being stored can represent one of the most productive tools in your shop, or one of the most dangerous pieces of equipment for you if not used and maintained properly. You'd never drive a vehicle that hadn't had the brakes inspected in years. Here are some basic and common sense principles apply to vehicle lifts in your shop and daily inspections are part of your job.

Whether you're using twopost lifts, parallelograms, mobile column lifts, drive-on lifts or inground lifts for servicing vehicles, you should follow these basic safety rules.

### 1. BUY CERTIFIED **LIFTS**

There's only one nationally recognized safety standard vehicle lifts: ANSI-ALI/ ALCTV/CE, administered by the Automotive Lift Institute (ALI/ ETL). ETL testing labs verify that a manufacturer's lifts meet the national safety standard for vehicles lift. The Automotive Lift Institute working through ETL testing procedures involves rigorous third-party testing verifying lift manufacturers comply with current ANSI requirements for lifts as defined by the International Building Code, which mandates that lifts be third party tested to meet these safety requirements. To verify equipment status, look for the gold ALI/ETL verification tag next to the lift's controls.

### 2. BUY CERTIFIED LIFT **OPTIONS**

A commonly overlooked mistake is using an uncertified option or accessory on a certified lift. Doing so will void the lift's certification. It's simple: If the optional accessory isn't certified then the lift isn't certified. ALI/ETL standards (&ANSI standards & building code standards), require all accessories, such as drive-on lifts, rolling jacks and truck adaptors, to be certified. Although certification is good for the life of the lift, older models may not meet the most current standards. Complying with American National Standards Institute (ANSI), Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and Public Employees Occupational Safety and Health (PEOSH) requirements is the key to keeping vehicle lifts at the highest possible safety level.

### 3. NO LOCKS ARE LIABILITY

Always raise the vehicle and then lower it onto the lift's mechanical locks as required by ANSI. Refer to ALI safety manual lifting it Right or the manufacturer's operating instructions for detailed information. An easy way to visually verify the locks are being used is to include a weight gauge (a pressure gauge calibrated to the lift's lifting capacity) on your lift. A weight gauge can also be a great diagnostic tool. If using an old inground lift that doesn't have locks, it's time for a new lift. While some in-ground lifts can be retrofitted with an aftermarket lock, it's not the most cost-effective option, and your lift will still not be ALI/ETL certified to be compliant with ANSI rules and building code laws.

### 4. IT'S EASY TO **OVERLOAD**

Manufacturers of the most common two-post side by side lifts mandate that none of the four swing arms be overloaded. As an example: Some may think that a 15,000 pound rated lift that's loaded with a 14,200 pound


ambulance isn't near capacity. They're wrong! It's easy to see why two-post side-by-side lifts are often overloaded, even though the total lift capacity hasn't been exceeded.

### 5. INSPECT **EQUIPMENT ANNUALLY**

ANSI/Automotive Lift Institute ALCTV Standard for Automotive Lifts-"Safety Requirements for Construction, Testing, and Validation" requires technicians to perform a daily operational safety check. The code also requires an annual inspection by a qualified individual. Failing to do so could expose your shop to liabilities that could be associated with an injury if an accident were to happen.

### 6. TRAINING AND **TESTING**

Contact the Automotive Lift Institute, your lift supplier, or a local lift inspection company for a copy of the 20-minute lifting it Right video hosted by legendary. Like any product, lifts vary in style, type, capability, longevity and warranty.





Adult rainbow smelt are about 4 to 6 inches long, a small fish that's proven to be a major player in fishing success on North Dakota's largest lake - Lake Sakakawea.

They're not native to North Dakota waters, let alone Sakakawea.

Yet they found a home in "the Big Lake" since 1971, a year after the arrival of salmon.

When salmon, another non-native, cold-water species, were introduced into Sakakawea in 1970, North Dakota's fisheries biologists knew they needed a forage species adapted to the same deep, coldwater environment, described N.D. Game and Fish Department Missouri River System Supervisor Russ Kinzler.

They also knew Great Lakes salmon fed on smelt. Following the arrival of salmon into Lake Sakakawea, a mere 7,440 adult smelt were netted from Lake Superior during their April spawning run and introduced in Sakakawea.

The largest of six Missouri River System reservoirs, Sakakawea is 100-plus feet deep in places, providing cold water habitat vital for both salmon and smelt, especially its eastern end.

Typical of what often happens when a new species finds a niche in a new habitat, Sakakawea's smelt population flourished in their new environment.

As they flourished so, too, did the number of predator fish species, especially walleye and those newly introduced salmon.

The success earned Sakakawea a multi-state reputation as a go-to walleye fishery.

Also typical of what happens when a new species finds - and settles - into a new habitat, their population leveled.

Yet smelt remain the primary source of food, Kinzler explained, especially for walleye on the lower end with its cold, deep water.

More than 50 years after the arrival of smelt, Lake Sakakawea is still a go-to walleye destination despite the state's rollercoaster ride of weather extremes of droughts and floods and resulting fluctuating lake elevations. "Without smelt we wouldn't have the number of walleye...l don't think we could maintain the population of (Sakakawea) walleye we have without smelt," Kinzler said.

Smelt spawn in early spring - April - in shallow water. "We're talking a few inches of water," he added. They need stable or slightly rising water levels, which on a reservoir primarily dependent on Rocky Mountain snow melt, varies in any given year.

Even major wind events can strand eggs high and

Spawning beds require cobbled, rocky structure, not clay or other structure.

Lake Sakakawea doesn't typically experience backto-back years of smelt reproduction that produce big vear classes due to intraspecific competition. Plus. most smelt don't live past 4 years of age, making at least some reproduction in most years critical.

Despite challenging conditions, they still find a way to spawn, Kinzler added. Smelt also venture inward into creeks when conditions allow in addition to the lake itself, especially its upper to middle portions.

Fisheries biologists estimate smelt population trends using hydro-acoustic technology scanning along standardized transects of the lake. "It's a coldwater forage survey...basically a fancy depth finder called an echo sounder," Kinzler described, sending electrical signals into the water that bounce off fish and return to the transducer. Its data is then analyzed to estimate numbers and sizes of fish.

While the "depth finder" indicates a number of fish of a particular size, biologists follow the same path as the hydro-acoustics, dropping nets to pick up sample sizes of the number of small fish in the path.

A few cisco and young white bass or walleye may also be in the nets, "but they're mostly smelt because not many other species are in that cold water portion of the lake," Kinzler explained.

Boats and biologists conducting the cold-water forage survey are on the water in the depth of the August dark moon phase when smelt are less congregated, he added.

Like population surveys for terrestrial animals such as deer or pheasants, the cold-water forage survey is used to track trends rather than specific numbers. It's a trend based on surveying a standardized area over a lengthy number of years in the same manner, Kinzer stressed.

Lake Sakakawea's smelt ride the ups and downs of life on one of the nation's largest man-made water

Throughout it all, since 1971 they've done it in amazing fashion, benefiting many fish species as well as Sakakawea's anglers.



Since rainbow smelt were introduced into Lake Sakakawea in 1971 they have become a major forage fish for predator species, including walleye and
