Christmas plants



McLean Co. Extension Agent Thanksgiving is officially over, and I hope that everyone has recovered from the food coma that always seems to follow. Christmas is right around the corner, and with the change in the season Christmas plants are becoming common at stores everywhere you look. Around the area cut Christmas trees are for sale, and while they smell wonderful and look even better, there are some dangers with using cut trees in your house. I have a few tips and ideas that can keep your Christmas plants beautiful throughout this holiday season and ways to keep your Christmas tree looking great all through the month of December.

Nothing says Christmas like a fresh cut Christmas tree, and picking the right one is a major key to success. As you look for your tree, not only should you be looking at the shape, but you should also be checking to see how freshly cut the tree is. If the tree isn't frozen, run your finger up and down the branches, or in the cases of a small tree, pick it up and shake it. The needles on a fresh tree shouldn't fall off, and if a large number of needles fall off, that is a sign the tree is starting to dry out, which can be a major hazard inside your house. Store your tree outside or in a cool spot till you are ready to bring it inside. Before you bring the tree in, cut the bottom of the tree off at a diagonal about 1" above the original cut. This allows the tree to draw water up and keep it hydrated throughout the season. Keep your tree away from drafts or hot areas as they dry trees out faster and always keep water in the reservoir. Dry Christmas trees are a fire hazard so keep your tree hydrated and always check your lights before putting them on. A recent trend is to use a Christmas tree in a pot. This is an excellent way to have a live tree that you can enjoy for years to come. Caring for these trees when they are inside is easy; simply keep the plant watered. However, vou will have to transition the tree to the outdoors once you are done with it for the holidays. Place the tree in a cooler location so it can go dormant and be sure when you move it outside you water it well and surround the truck with mulch or plant material to insulate it from the cold temperatures. With proper care these trees can provide enjoyment for years to

Poinsettias are another popular Christmas plant, and despite what is commonly thought, they are not poisonous, but I wouldn't recommend eating them since they do cause upset stomach and in pets can cause vomiting, drooling and diarrhea. Poinsettias are fairly easy to take care of; they prefer bright direct light, so a sunny window is ideal, but be sure to keep them away from drafts and temperature fluctuations. Remember that the temperature close to a window will be cooler than in other parts of the room. Be sure to water thoroughly and don't let the poinsettias dry completely out as that will shorten their flowering time. If you would like you can keep your poinsettias and try to get them to bloom next year. Once they have stopped flowering cut the plant back to 4-6 inches tall and water sparingly. Treat

your poinsettia like a houseplant till late September. Since Poinsettias bloom in response to long nights after Oct. 1, provide your poinsettia with 14 hours of uninterrupted darkness; even a few minutes of light can mess up

their flowering schedule.
One final thought when bringing Christmas Trees and other blooming plants into a house is that often these plants bring in tiny visitors which can spread to your houseplants. Try to keep your new plants and tree separated from your current houseplants to prevent bugs from spreading. Live Christmas trees are notorious for having a few bugs hidden inside so be aware before you put them near your houseplants. With a few simple tips your Christmas plants can bring you cheer throughout the Christmas season and all year long. Dealing with the stress from minor hassles

The greatest toll in our daily lives comes not from traumatic events such as a divorce, a serious illness or the loss of a job. It's the minor problems that get us down—like getting into an argument with a coworker or friend, being stuck in traffic, or hearing a neighbor's noise, according to a study in the journal Psychosomatic Medicine.

Penn State and Columbia University researchers have reported that the cumulative impact of relatively unimportant

day-to-day hassles can be harmful to our health—increasing the risk of high blood pressure, chest pain and asthma attacks. They say it depends a lot on how we perceive and cope with the unavoidable little problems that arise. The study focused on the impact of daily events on heart rate variability (HRV). A higher HRV is a sign of the heart's ability to respond to challenges, and more generally, of a healthy nervous system. A lower HRV is associated with depression, negative emotional states and increased cardiovascular risk.

For their study, researchers used electrocardiograms to measure the resting HRV levels of 909 people from ages 35 to 85. Then, for eight days, they interviewed the participants about any stressful events they had experienced. They were asked to rate how stressful they perceived each event and also to rate the negative emotions such as anger or sadness they had felt each day. The key finding was that the study participants who perceived daily annoyances as more severeand who reported more negative reactions—had a lower HRV on average than those who were better equipped to handle day-today challenges.

Yet again, we're hearing that it's not the common everyday annoyances and disruptions that cause us the most trouble, it's how we respond to them. In terms of cardiovascular health, the bottom line is that stress is very subjective. What one person sees as a huge crisis can be a nonevent for someone else. The report suggests that our perceptions are based on our background, personality and what the rest of the day was like. The good news, the researchers say, is that while we can't avoid daily hassles, we can do something about how we react to them and the effect those hassles have on our lives. The way to lighten the burden of inevitable daily annoyances is to strengthen our coping mechanisms through anger management or techniques such as meditation, progressive muscle relaxation and breathing techniques.



Darkhouse spearfishing opens

North Dakota's darkhouse spearfishing season opens on most state waters whenever ice-up occurs. Legal fish are northern pike and nongame species.

Prior to this year, the darkhouse spearfishing season had opened on Dec. 1.

All individuals who participate in darkhouse spearfishing must first register online at the North Dakota Game and Fish Department website. In addition, anglers age 16 and older must possess a valid fishing license.

Spearers and anglers are reminded that materials used to mark holes must be in possession as soon as a hole greater than 10 inches in diameter is made in the ice.

North Dakota residents who do not have a fishing license may spear during the winter free fishing weekend Dec. 29-30, but they still need to register to spear.

All waters open to hook and line fishing are open to darkhouse spearing except:

- East Park Lake, West Park Lake, Lake Audubon - McLean
- Heckers Lake Sheridan County • Larimore Dam - Grand
- Forks County McClusky Canal
