County weighing intersection upgrade

Answering a call for increased safety at one local intersection, the McLean County Commission is examining options for a roadway upgrade.

Highway Superintendent Jim Grey told commissioners on Tuesday morning that he had been contacted about the intersection of N.D. Highway 200A and County Road 29, with requests for a turning lane to be added.

Commissioner Steve Lee said

the intersection, south of Turtle Lake, sees significant truck traffic and high speeds, which concern some residents.

The commissioners asked Grey to contact Wald Engineering and ask for an estimate on what the project would cost.

"See if they can give us a ballpark," Lee said. "\$300,000 or \$1.3 million."

Lee said that because federal funds were used to pay for parts of Highway 200A, the county has to abide by federal standards in any upgrades, meaning the cost can increase dramatically.

"When we start to get into seven digits, it's kind of uncomfortable. We can't do it," Lee said.

County Auditor Les Korgel said the intersection was one of many in the county that would benefit from a turning lane and a wider intersection, but the county has to evaluate priorities and mind the budget.

Grey said he would contact Wald and report back to the commission.

Broken hearts at Christmas

Holiday brings memories of lost loved ones

When Becca Holtan and her family gather in Almont this Christmas, there will be an empty chair at the table.

Her brother, Andy, the youngest of a family of five, took his life nearly eight years ago. Since then Becca, who lives in Turtle Lake with her husband Dustin and two children, is making it her life's work to educate the public about suicide. She recently spoke to church congregations in Max and Benedict and, with her siblings and father, they participate in a remembrance walk in Bismarck

Andy was five years out of New Salem High School and had just completed two degrees at North Dakota State College of Science. He went on to start a computer business in Wahpeton and from a distance it appeared that all was going well for him.

He discovered his mother's love of music, joined a bowling league and even sang a little

"Stuff we never expected," Becca said about her usually reserved brother. "He had an awesome life and he would have done so many wonderful things."

None of his friends knew he was struggling. They didn't realize he was suffering from a painful breakup and that he called his girlfriend dozens of times to try to get her back. They didn't know he was in the depths of despair.

"The people who saw him every day, no one was the wiser," Becca, 33, said.

He was planning on making the

trip to Almont for Easter to be with the entire family.

"He called mom and he was coming home for Easter," he said. But he didn't show up for work and by noon his friends went looking

A New Salem sheriff's officer and friend drove to Almont to tell her mom and dad that their son had shot himself.

Becca's mom arranged for Dustin to be the one to tell Becca. He surprised her at work and she said, "What are you doing here? Is it an impromptu date night?' Instead he brought her to a back room and said, 'Andy shot himself.' My first reaction was, 'Is he OK?"


Then they drove to her parents' home to gather with the rest of the family.

She said, "I just remember pulling up to the house and not wanting to go in. I didn't want to see my mom," a mother she described as being the glue in the

Becca said she went through a variety of emotions. "I remember being so angry. Why? Why didn't he call me? He always called me when he had troubles.'

Her parents quickly told the family they didn't want to remain silent about the suicide. She explained that an aunt and uncle lost a child to suicide and that family didn't speak of the cause of death.

"They wanted suicide to be talked about. That's how we get into this whole thing of mental illness because we don't talk about it," she said. She shared to the church congregations that suicide is among the top 10 causes of death



in the U.S. and higher in North Dakota. "He was a statistic, he became part of that," she said.

Since his death, Becca still grieves the loss but has come to terms with it.

"I don't think suicide was on his mind," she said. "I think he thought someone was going to stop him. It was to prove a point, because that's how he was."

She has grown from sharing stories with others at the "Out of the Darkness" walk in Bismarck

"Families put the blame on themselves. What could we have done differently, that's always with vou," she said.

After the first year at the walk her dad said, "If we can save one life going to this walk, we'll do it every year," she said. Brothers and their wives and her father join in the walk. Her mother died two years ago. One brother is a DJ. Becca read two of the nine stories shared over the public address


depression and suicide.

system to the 900 people in the audience.

Speaking to an audience doesn't come easily, but Becca said she wants to continue to tell the story to help others who are struggling.

But her listening skills have been fine tuned in the experience, too. She said listening is the best medicine for someone who is struggling and she hopes to be able to lend an ear to others in





Could Your Cellphone or Tablet Be a Germ Catcher?

"I found the perfect gift for you," my husband grinned and

said a few years ago. What did he find? I thought to myself. I awaited gift opening with anticipation.

When I opened the neatly wrapped package, at first I couldn't figure out what it was. It was made of wood and folded flat in a box.

"Oh, it's a photo easel," I said kind of feebly. "Well, that's nice." He looked a little disappointed

in my reaction. "I bought it at a kitchen store," he added.

He was holding my tablet computer and he set it on the wooden stand. Then he swapped a cookbook for the tablet.

Yes, this was a nifty gift that I use regularly to protect my cookbooks and tablet from recipe ingredients.

Smartphones, tablets and other gadgets are used widely. Have you noticed anyone perusing recipes in the kitchen when making dinner? Have you seen people texting while eating?

Perhaps you've used the screens at restaurants that allow you to dispense soda, play games or order food. You also may have noticed people texting while waiting in lines in public restrooms.

Think about it: Not everyone washes their hands the recommended 20 seconds. We all use the same door handles in public restrooms.

Unfortunately, phones and other electronic gadgets can be

"germ catchers."

According to research conducted at the University of Arizona, cellphones may carry 10 times the amount of bacteria as found on toilet seats

Several researchers have explored the cleanliness of phones and other devices.

In a 2017 study reported in the journal Germs, researchers performed microbiological testing on 27 phones used by students. The researchers noted bacteria, including potential disease-causing organisms such as staph. Males and females had contaminated phones.

The researchers also noted the presence of E. faecalis. Yes, that sounds like feces for a reason. This type of bacteria is associated with the human gastrointestinal tract. Its presence probably indicates failure to wash hands properly after using the restroom and before using a phone.

Cellphones can spread bacteria and viruses. Wiping down the screens you use in your kitchen or during eating can help safeguard your health, as can proper handwashing. You obviously can't dunk your phone or other device in a sanitizer because you could damage your phone seriously.

To clean your phone, many references suggest filling a small spray bottle with a 50/50 mixture of distilled water and rubbing alcohol (70 percent isopropyl alcohol). Unplug and/or turn off the phone first. Spritz with the mixture, then wipe with a microfiber cloth to avoid scratching the screen.

However, consult your manufacturer's guide to see if this is an acceptable approach for your phone or other device.

Peanut Butter Bread

1/3 c. sugar 1/3 c. brown sugar, packed 1 1/4 c. all-purpose white flour 3/4 c. whole-wheat flour 1 Tbsp. baking powder

Layer ingredients in a clean quart-sized jar. Cover the jar tightly with a lid, decorate and attach a copy of the recipe card.

To make bread, mix together: 1 container Peanut Butter Bread mix

1 c. creamy peanut butter (not natural)

2 eggs

3/4 c. nonfat milk

1/2 c. plain Greek yogurt, nonfat

1 tsp. vanilla

1/4 tsp. salt

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 9- by 5-inch loaf pan with nonstick cooking spray. In a mixing bowl, combine the sugar, brown sugar, white and wholewheat flour, baking powder and salt. Set aside. In a separate bowl, combine peanut butter, eggs, milk, Greek yogurt and vanilla. Gradually add dry ingredients to wet ingredients, gently folding ingredients together. Mix just until combined; the batter may be lumpy. Pour into the loaf pan and

School resource officer sought

McLean County is seeking applicants for a newly-approved school resource officer position

at Garrison Public School. During their November meeting, McLean County Commissioners approved the job description for a shared school resource officer, set to be stationed at Garrison Public School. Approval of the job description opened the door for county officials to start advertising to fill the position.

Advertisements for the position were printed in the Dec. 13 McLean County Independent, Leader-News and Central McLean News-Journal. According to the ad, applications will be accepted by the McLean County Auditor's office until 4 p.m. on Dec. 28.

According to the approved job description, the officer must also have a high school diploma, a minimum of three years patrol experience and a level of proficiency with firearms of at least 80 percent. The individual is also required to have training or experience as an informal counselor and law-related educator.

The officer is expected to provide law enforcement support and services to the school.

The position is being funded by a cost-share agreement between the school, McLean County and the White Shield Mandan-Hidatsa-Arikara tribe segment. The annual cost for the officer is estimated at \$81,000, or \$27,000 per partner.

Sheriff J.R. Kerzmann said he is hoping to have the spot filled by February 2019.


