




Ladies Night Out

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

Spring Creek Watershed Project

The Mercer County & Dunn County Soil Conservation Districts and Water Resource Boards are pleased to have had another successful year in the Spring Creek Watershed Phase II. In July 2015, the project was awarded \$450,000 for a four and a half year grant. The funding is administered through the ND Department of Health. The four and a half years for Spring Creek are almost up. The MCSCD needs all remaining projects to be completed by the end of August 2019. If you are interested in completing a project with the watershed before then there is still time to contact us and start the process. Looking ahead to the future, the MCSCD is applying for funds for another project directed toward the Goodman Creek watershed as a short term project with priority on livestock and manure management systems. As part of this proposal, the district will be preparing for the next project in the 9 Townships Watershed. 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

Holy cow, it's cold; What to know

You start to understand why people become snowbirds when temperatures are wickedly below zero. Your eyes instantly start to tear when you open the door to go outside, and you think all your nose hairs have frozen together.

We are constantly layering and looking for ways to better protect ourselves from the cold, but what about our house? Literally, your biggest investment and what have you done to make sure it gets you and your family through winter?

Here are some things to remember, to check and maintain while us "non-snowbirds" get through winter:

This should have been done awhile before the snow but check exterior walls for holes. Even the smallest hole can create a draft – maybe where cable wires are coming into the house – grab a tube of foam insulation and get to patching. Also weather stripping the cracks around the doors may be needed.

Keep gutters clean – did you know that a full gutter can potentially cause ice to form on your roof? It can and nobody wants that.

Change out your furnace filter. It should be changed every 2 – 4 months, depending on how active your home is. Having a home that can collect a lot of dirt or has pets clogs the filters faster. Having clogged filters means your home might not be warming up to its full potential.

Keep spare batteries for you thermostat.

Keep garage doors closed or minimize the time that they are open.

Know where your shut off valve is for your water, and make sure you have access to

it – in case of a plumbing emergency.

On nights you're worried about freezing temperatures, set your facets to a slow drip. Indoor faucets are located on exterior walls that aren't necessarily adequately insulated. Having a slow drip of hot and cold hinders both lines from freezing.

Check your sewer vents and dryer vents – which are located on the roof and the side of the house. These can become frozen over or plugged. These vents are so air can leave the house – if that air can't escape it circulates back into your home, which isn't wanted.

Chimneys should be inspected and cleaned annually by professionals. A screen in front of the fireplace is needed so that ashes don't escape the chimney. Only burn dry seasoned wood.

Make sure to turn off portable heaters when no longer in the room or home – also never use an oven as a source of heat to warm your home.

Homes should have a fire alarm and a carbon monoxide detector. Carbon monoxide is poisonous, and it is important to know if those gases are being kept in your home.

As North Dakotans, this probably isn't new information to you; however, some of it may be things we overlook at times or forget about.

How cold snaps effect your home might be new to new home-owners. If you're a veteran of fighting the blustery, frigid winter, give your neighbors a hand. Maybe your neighbor is too elderly to get onto their roof, or maybe the young couple with a new-born has no idea their vent is frozen over.

Winter may get easier if we all help each other out and work together to make it through.

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
