





Troy Sailer of Golden Valley was reelected to the board of directors of the North Dakota Beef Cattle Improvement Association at the group's annual meeting. Sailer is one of three beef producers from the southwest region of North Dakota on the board of directors. Sailer and his family run a cow-calf operation near Golden Valley.

Kim Entze of Golden Valley was reelected to the position of vice president of the organi-

Other individuals reelected to the board included Jon DeKrey of Tappen and Aaron Bryn of Rugby. All board positions are three-year terms.

The NDBCIA is an organization of beef producers dedicated to promoting data collection and record keeping to advance the beef business. The NDBCIA, the NDSU Extension Service and the NDSU Computer Science department

are collaborating on an update to the Cow Herd Appraisal Performance System.

Dubbed CHAPS 2020, NDSU computer science lecturer Joseph Latimer coordinated the programming facelift to help the beef industry more completely utilize the program from conception to consumption. The goal is to give the program and more modern look.

Hanna will be spearheading efforts to include genetic monitoring through a flexible database structure, which will allow for evaluation and investigation of genomic traits. The change would be used to analyze the frequency of a simply inherited trait or allow selection of complex traits

The research and implementation of these tools will be accomplished by working with historical data submitted to CHAPS along with more current data volunteered by producers.

The NDBCIA board meets quarterly. The focus of the next meetings will be completion of the CHAPS 2020 rollout, which Latimer noted at the meeting is targeted for April 1.

Other members of the NDB-CIA board include Mark Rockeman of Donnybrook and TJ Alme of Balfor from the northwest region; Kellen Unruh of Hebron and Entze from the southwest region; and Bruce Speich of Milnor and Mark Wagner of Monango from the east region.

# Wolff named reserve champion

puts their heart and soul

into something, eventually

something good will come

Shane Wolff, Golden Vallev, has been attending auctions and sale events since before he can remember. Wolff was recently named reserve champion at the **Greater Midwest Livestock** Auctioneering Champion-

Wolff works for the Stockmen's Livestock out of Dickinson and has his own family business, Wolff Auctioneers. Wolff is a second generation auctioneer and grew up watching his father, Armon Wolff, set the auctioneer bar fairly high.

Armon was a runner-up at the World Livestock Auctioneering Championship in 1979 and it was he who started Wolff Auctioneers – the family business in 1964.

The business continues to be family operated with Wolff's wife, Marsha and daughter, Paula Jo Wanner both invested in the busi-

Competing as an auctioneer is something Wolff does because of his passion for it. He has dedicated a lifetime to learning the craft of auctioning — working on his rhythm and clarity. Wolff has competed in several competitions prior to his recent win; a 6th place being his highest finish in 2014 and qualified for World Livestock Auctioneer Championship in 2011 and 2012.

The Greater Midwest Livestock Auctioneering Championship is set at a real auction. During the auction the auctioneers are judged by five judges and scored in five different categories.

The categories are: voice (bid calling), salesmanship, knowledge of the livestock, bid catching ability, and whether or not they would hire the auctioneer.

While the family business is centered around land and machinery auctions, this competition is focused on livestock.

Wolff said that he thought

he may have a chance at placing top five — which was his goal — and nothing can ever be won if you don't give it a try. With a laugh Wolff said he might have been the oldest auctioneer in the competition but he felt it was his experience that pushed him to finish top three.

'It was an honor to be in the top three," said Wolff.

The championship is open for anyone to enter. Tim Yoder from Georgia was named champion of the competition and Nick Caspers, Bismarck, who also works for Wolff Auctioneers also placed top three in the competition.

Although this year's group of competitors was smaller than other years because of the weather. Wolff said the 17 auctioneers competing were tough, talented competitors.

Wolff said he had to thank Stockmens, "I credit a lot to Stockmens Livestock and the experience they've given me," said Wolff.

Being an auctioneer your job is to make the best sale for the seller. "You got to focus on doing your best job for the seller — at all times — and never forget why you're up there; you have to represent the cattle as best you can...and without wast-

ing time," said Wolff. Even though all preparations have been studied and made prior to the competition, Wolff said the podium is still nerve racking and what you practiced shoots out the window.

From sitting at auctions as a five year-old and entering into auctioneer school as a young 19 year-old Wolff said the most important thing an auctioneer can do is be themselves. "Always be yourself up there and do your

own thing," said Wolff.
His goal was to make it to top five at the Greater Midwest competition. Wolff said he about hit the floor when they announced he was reserve champion.

He earned a belt buckle
