

TRACKS IN THE SAND KEN BEAUCHAMP

Establishing memorable family moments

Editor's note: This column is reprinted from a previous edition

Some days ago, two of my grandsons decided it was a good idea to do some things, probably not intending or knowing they were establishing a memorable family moment. That would be one of those events, known in the Beauchamp and Murray family circles simply as a "strange deal." Quite common in families where numbers of boys are raised.

It involved some damage to the shop of one dad, and later, in a possibly related event, a windshield in a truck. There is still some question as to whether there were really two villains or just one, and whether one might have been an innocent bystander.

Okay, okay, sometimes there really is an innocent bystander, maybe just not this time.

Anyway, I understand it is still under investigation, and few details are being released at this time.

All participants are believed innocent until proven guilty. It is worth noting that, in the case of "strange deals," it often takes years, decades even, to prove these things.

That would be why, in the matter of these "strange deals," that a parent must sometimes act on a reasonable belief rather than waiting for absolute proof. If a father didn't, it would be very embarrassing to have one older grown man ordering another grown younger man to drop his britches and bend over the couch for a good whipping 30 years in the making.

I am given to understand that we now live in a Sesame Street world and we no longer old-school discipline, and have instead decided to rely on reason to steer children down the right path. One of my most often-muttered responses to that is, "How's that workin' for ya?" I recently heard a local pastor refer to America as an "uncorrectable society." Now that stands to reason.

Now my three sons, who all have sons of their own, would tell you I was often unreasonable as a father. They would cry and beg and plead to no avail. They were going to get it and get it good, and there was no changing my mind. At some point, they had simply pushed beyond all limits and forgotten that it would hurt me way more than it hurt them. I had to insist and stand my ground.

Yep. They were going to stay home and help their mother clean the house, and no way could they buy their way out of trouble by promising anything if I'd just give them a good whipping instead. When you run out of appeals, you're out

of appeals. Sorry.

I would have suggested my sons send these two latest cases of bad behavior to Grandma's house to learn about housekeeping as a punishment. However, knowing my grandsons, as I do, I fear they are too tender for such harsh punishment. Two guys who are afraid of the dark and being left alone could never weather a weekend of endless scrubbing and cleaning. Then being told it wasn't good enough and had to be done all over again.

So, I say to kids, "You wanna be beaten or become an obsessive compulsive with anal retentive tendencies?"

Being honest, I have to say that I have no problems with my grandchildren and behavior issues when we're together. On occasion, I have been heard to suggest that, if they didn't shape up, they were about to get some of what their fathers used to get. Believing their fathers still cry themselves to sleep thinking about how poorly they were treated, I suspect the little ones have some idea, mostly fantasy, about what that might look like in real life.

Hey, it's working so far. And their dads still cringe when I suggest they aren't too darn big to be hauled off to their mother's house for a weekend of deep-cleaning. That would knock the rough edges off 'em.

In the reasoning and understanding arena, it appears one method is to hit an errant kid in his pocketbook and make them pay for things they break or damage. That's what my youngest son told me when we were discussing this latest memorable moment in family history.

I asked if that was the acceptable way of doing things these days, a bit surprised that it would be okay to plunge a kid into debt for years and years.

He assured me it was. So, I grabbed the moment to suggest there was still a matter of a nicely restored pickup truck and him that remained unresolved, although I believe his standing in my bedroom door and telling me my pickup "was toast" would be considered a confession in most civilized societies.

I think it was his mother's concern for his being injured that saved him from a good whipping at the time. From there it just slipped into the oblivion where strange deals come and go from, and became an unresolved issue and a memorable family moment like a great many others. One which I should not bring up because the statute of limitations has run out and it isn't helpful when correcting one's own children in the here and now.

That's what I was told. Talk about your strange deals!







Sakakawea Medical Center and Coal Country Community Health Center to Launch Epic Electronic Medical Record

HAZEN, N.D. – On April 1st, Sakakawea Medical Center (SMC) and Coal **Country Community** Health Center (CCCHC) will launch Epic in the medical center and primary care clinic location sites. Epic is the most widely-used and comprehensive electronic health records system and provides a platform for integrated care to ensure patients have convenient digital access to their health information.

"Epic will make it easier for our providers and staff to communicate and access the information they need to care for our patients," says Darrold Bertsch, CEO of SMC and CCCHC. "Having an integrated system builds on our core mission of putting the needs of patients first and Epic allows us to consolidate onto a single, shared platform for patient care."

Epic is used by a majority of North Dakota tertiary hospitals and specialized treatment sites and with the implementation of Epic, not only will providers be able to provide better care locally, but when a transfer to a higher level of care is necessary, providers will have the capability to deliver efficient, meaningful data with transfers closing care gaps, and reducing duplication. Medical records will be immediately available upon transfer and again when the patient returns home to the care of their primary provider. All organizations using Epic interoperate, which means they can easily exchange patient data to improve patient care.

SMC and CCCHC serves the communities of Dunn, Mercer and Oliver Counties in North Dakota. On the provider side, the switch to Epic will streamline services, such as scheduling, clinical applications, billing and population health initiatives.

Patients benefit from the use of MyChart, a digital portal that allows patients and their designated caregivers to access health information, communicate with providers, request an appointment and check test results within days using a smartphone or computer.

"Epic allows us to adopt some of the standards in place at the best healthcare organizations in the country, but still be flexible and adjust for the needs of SMC and CCCHC locations and patients," says Marcie Schulz, Director of Patient Care, Sakakawea Medical Center.

During the initial conversion to Epic, the registration process and patient visits may take longer than normally expected. Please come to your appointments early to allow additional time for the registration process. In addition, patients could receive multiple billing statements; some through the current systems at both SMC and CCCHC and the additional statements for services provided after April 1st. Please be patient with us as we work through the initial glitches that may be encountered during the implementation of Epic.

About Sakakawea **Medical Center And Coal Country Community Health Center**

Sakakawea Medical Center (SMC), a Critical Access Hospital located in Hazen, and Coal Country Community Health Center (CCCHC), a Federally **Qualified Health Center** (FQHC), with clinic sites in Hazen, Beulah, Center and Killdeer, primarily serve an area that includes three counties in North Dakota: Dunn, Mercer, and Oliver. This service area is defined based on the location of the medical facilities, the geographic distance to other hospitals, and the history of usage by consumers. Located in the hospital's service are the communities of Beulah, Center, Dodge, Dunn, Center, Golden Valley, Halliday, Hazen, Killdeer, Pick City, Stanton, and Zap.

CCCHC is funding the conversion of their electronic medical record system to Epic in part with Federal grant funds. The total cost of the project is estimated at \$461K with 39% paid with Federal grant funds and 61% paid from non-governmental sources.
