



New leaders revitalize jam sessions

Over the last few years, there have been questions about whether Hazen's monthly jam sessions would continue into the future. Smaller attendance at some of the sessions, as well as the decision by Ron Crowley to step down from the leadership role after 2018, made these questions grow.

However, for many performers and local residents, the jam sessions have filled a special and significant role in the community for 18 years. As a result, one family decided to take up the charge, keeping the sessions going and leading the event into the future.

The Ost family have been longtime performers in and supporters of the jam session. Gilbert Ost has been performing throughout the jam sessions' history, and that enthusiasm passed on to his children as well.

Siblings Cary Ost and Linda Eslinger, together with their spouses Ava Ost and Mike Eslinger, and with support from their parents Gilbert and Violet, will now work together to ensure the jam session remains a success into the future. "It's going to be a family thing," Cary said. "We were told last year was its 18th year, and they were looking for someone to host it for 2019. We felt it was important for the community, and we thought we could do it."

The jam sessions bring in talent from Hazen, Beulah and around the area, and from as far away as Bismarck and Dickinson, to perform a variety of musical pieces for the community and region. There isn't a specific list of who shows up; instead, musicians who are available come out to Hazen City Hall the first Sunday of each month May-October and perform together.

"We want to invite any singers and musicians that have performed in the past to come and be part of it," Cary said, adding his hope that the jam session can continue to demonstrate the talents and abilities of performers who have been dedicated to the event throughout the years.


Cary also invited anyone interested in doing a fundraiser or feed to partner with the jam sessions, offering food in conjunction with the performances. The Ost family plans to lead the event into the future as long as support remains for the sessions to continue. The concerts will continue to be held at Hazen City Hall, starting at 6 p.m.

Cary said the plan is for all the performances to be on the first Sunday of each month, saying that among the family they are sure someone can be available for each performance even if the others have conflicts. In the past, the concerts were occasionally rescheduled to other dates, but Cary said he wants to give the performers consistency in knowing the date, time and location won't change.

The first jam session of 2019 will be held May 5 at 6 p.m. The event will last about two hours, with a break in the middle and with cookies and coffee available.

Cary praised Crowley for his role in leading the jam session over the last few years, and said he hopes the community will continue to come out and enjoy the event.

"We've always enjoyed being part of it and we just felt it was important to this community to keep it going," he said.


