STAGE 1 BURN BAN FOR OLIVER & MERCER COUNTIES

As of April 23, 2019 Mercer & Oliver Counties, which includes all Cities within the counties, will be under a Stage I Burn Ban ONLY WHEN the ND Fire Danger Ratings Map shows high, very high, extreme and/or a Reg Flag warning has been issued for Mercer County and/or Oliver County. You can see ND Fire Danger Rating Map if you go to the following website and scroll down to the middle: <https://www.ndresponse.gov/burn-ban-restrictions-fire-danger-maps>

A STAGE I BURN BAN MEANS:

No controlled burns, no large pit fires and no burning garbage of any kind.
No throwing cigarette butts or anything out in a grassy area or any area that may start to burn.
No Special burning permission will be given for any reason.

BUT,

You can have a Campfire in a developed recreational site or improved site, while always keeping an eye on it. You can use grills and units that have an on/off switch in an area that you can safely operate without starting a fire.

Remember even though you are allowed some options to burn this doesn't absolve an individual or organization from liability or responsibility for any fire started by the allowed activity.

AND REMEMBER...

ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN BAN IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10.1) PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF UP TO \$1500 AND 30 DAYS IN JAIL. THE MERCER & OLIVER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS ARE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS.

When the Burn Ban is lifted, we are asking that all controlled burns be reported to the Sheriff's office, 745-3333, when the fire starts and then another call when the fire has been extinguished, Thank You!





City clean-up week is the perfect opportunity to bring your property into compliance with City Ordinances relating to Public Nuisances.

City Ordinance Chapter XII states:

Nuisance Definition - A nuisance consists in unlawfully doing an act or omitting to perform a duty, which act or omission:

1. Annoys, injures, or endangers the comfort, repose, health, or safety of others;
2. Offends decency;
3. Unlawfully interferes with, obstructs or tends to obstruct, or renders dangerous for passage, any public park, street, or highway; or
4. In any way renders other person insecure in life or in the use of property.

Public Nuisance - A Public Nuisance is a nuisance which at the same time affects the entire community of Hazen or a neighborhood or any considerable number of person, although the extend of the annoyance or damage inflicted upon individuals may be unequal.

Remedies - The remedies against a public nuisance are:

1. Bringing a criminal action before a district judge;
2. A civil action; or
3. Abatement

Example of Nuisances - 11 - Unsheltered storage of old, used, stripped, junked and other automobiles not in good, safe operating condition, and of any other vehicles, machinery, implements and/or equipment and personal property of any kinds which is no longer safely usable for the purpose for which it was manufactured for a period of thirty (30) days or more (except in a licensed junk yard) within the city, and any motor vehicle, animal and article of personal property which constitutes an obstruction to, hazard or detriment to public traffic, snow removal operations, public safety and public health and morals or which may be abandoned or unclaimed within this City is hereby declared to be a nuisance and dangerous to public safety and must be abated in the manner prescribed in this article. For purposes of this provision, "abandoned" means a motor vehicle that has remained for a period of more than ten (10) days on public property illegally or lacking vital component parts or has remained for a period of more than ten (10) days on private property without consent of the person in control of such property or in an inoperable condition such that it has no potential for further use consistent with its useful functions unless it is kept in an enclosed garage or storage building.

Counselor awarded for life of dedication

For over 40 years, one Hazen woman has dedicated herself to helping others who are dealing with addiction in all its various forms.

Others took notice, and this year, Darlene White was recognized for her valuable work, receiving the North Dakota Outstanding Addiction Professional of the Year Award from the North Dakota Addiction Counselors Association.

White, who works at Coal Country Community Health Center (CCCHC) in Beulah as a part time licensed addiction counselor, was presented the award March 29 at the spring conference of the addiction counselors association. Her husband Sharold Oster is also an ad-

diction counselor, and previously received the award in 2011.

"I worked for the state hospital for 32 years," White recalled, saying she moved to Hazen shortly after officially retiring in 2005. "When we first came there, meth was kind of the big issue out there. Now it's switched over to opioids, which is kind of the opposite of meth as meth is a stimulant, while opioids are depressants."

White said she still see methamphetamine addiction as a major issue in the area.

Over the years, White has worked with helping a wide variety of addicts, including alcoholics. Her dedicated work includes alcohol and drug evaluations, as well as

individual, group and family addiction counseling at CCCHC.

White was nominated for the award by Melissa Herman, who leads the addiction counseling team at CCCHC. She wanted people across the state to know about and recognize White's lifetime service in the addiction field.

"I feel very grateful I get to work for a job I have loved doing all my life," White said. "A lot of people don't get that opportunity."

"I've seen a lot of miracles over the years," she added.

Herman was presented with a plaque at the March 29 ceremony by Megan Busch, president of the North Dakota Addiction Counselors Association.

Ladies workshop: Living Intentionally Free Everyday

Mary Lingelbach is dedicated to giving women a voice and igniting their power through a healthy foundation of God.

Mary grew up in Minot and graduated from Rhema Bible College in Broken Arrow, Okla. in 1988. She currently resides in Riverdale and has dedicated her mission to aiding women in the rural areas of North Dakota.

"Living intentionally free, you have to do it on purpose – it's not something that will just happen," said Mary.

When people live with intention – good or bad – they are working towards a goal. "I help ladies step out of their hidden wounds of the past; purposefully, peacefully and with hope, so that it doesn't continue to sabotage their today's and tomorrow's," said Mary.

Mary will be hosting free workshops in Beulah, Washburn and Garrison. Garrison's will be held Sunday, April 28 at the SACA Lodge from 6 – 8 p.m.; Washburn's will be held at the Washburn Public Library, Monday April 29 from 7 – 9 p.m.; and Beulah's will be held at the Beulah Civic Center, Tuesday April 30, from 7 – 9 p.m.

Mary said her workshop is focused a woman's purpose and that everyone has one. "I want to show people how valuable their purpose is," said Mary. "They have a purpose right where they are."

Mary explained how often times rural communities are forgotten about and happenings – like this – are only set up to occur in big cities. She said for her it is important to bring workshops like this to smaller communities and rural areas because there is a need here for it as well.

The purpose of the workshop is to free women of the things that hold them back from doing what God wants them to do. Her workshop is a active, hands-on event.



Mary Lingelbach, of Riverdale, will be giving three FREE workshops in Beulah, Washburn and Garrison.

Mary said that while speakers are good it is the activity and work being done with your hands and mind that are what will aid you better in the future.

"Who is going to be there with you in your midnight hours? You're going to be all by yourself and what are you doing to do?" Mary asked.

Through her workshops, Mary said she will aid those to walk out of a life of hidden wounds and into their God given purpose. She said women are welcome to bring their Bibles, however, it is not required and she will have handouts for everyone.

While this will be an interactive event, Mary said there will be times set up for questions and answers.

Mary is also a life coach and in her profession she said it is important to listen to what her clients are saying. Often womens' voices get lost in the crowd and no one is listening to them. "I want to hear what's behind what you're saying because sometimes there is dreams and desires; and some hurt. So, then I will take you step by step through that so you can achieve that purpose, no matter what we have to wade through," said Mary.

While sorting through and digging deep into your thoughts and darkest corners, Mary said it won't come easy. "When you think of people mining, they are never on the surface, they have to get down and dirty to find the gems, rubies, emeralds and even diamonds – it's hard, dirty work," she said.

Mary said because of her relationship with the Lord she has always risen above her hurt and challenges.

She has seen how others react to devastation and have no foundation to fall back on – that they would rather numb their pain than express it, heal from it and move forward.

Mary said while this workshop is for women, teens are welcome. Presently teens have to grow up fast and deal with things that older generations never dreamed of dealing with.

While attending this workshop Mary said it isn't her job to push you but to create and give a safe environment where women feel comfortable enough to express themselves, learn their purpose, and see their own value.

Mary explained that as women, they never take time to work on themselves. As children they play, as teens they focus on love interests, in their 20's they focus on their husbands, and then focus on their children.

"We feel guilty taking time for ourselves because the kids need us, our husband needs us, everything – then it's like when's my time?" said Mary. "We have to give ourselves permission, not that you deserve it but you need it."

Mary compared women to vehicles. Every so often the car will need maintenance so that it can run longer. "We need maintenance too, to run longer," said Mary.

She explained that as women, they often times mask their feelings, thoughts and needs; as women struggle they begin to wear a mask. "One of my teachings is make-up is not your foundation," said Mary.

All three of these events are completely free. Mary said that she would never want someone not being able to attend because they couldn't afford \$20. "I will give and later on it will come back to me," said Mary.

She hopes this is the start of a monthly gathering, for people to have coffee, interact and provide fellowship.


