Bismarck Larks names teacher of the year

Remembering their sacrifice

As Memorial Day approaches, two local communities are preparing to honor the occasion with special events.

At 10 a.m., veterans, their families and their communities will gather at the Hazen High School Theater and the Stanton Civic Center for solemn ceremonies of remembrance. Unlike Veterans Day, which honors all veterans past or present, Memorial Day is a special occasion for remembering those who made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our freedom.

Adjutant for the American Legion Department of North Dakota Ron Matthews will be the guest speaker at Hazen's Memorial Day service. Born and raised in Garrison, he

enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1977 after graduating from high school, and served during the Grenada/Lebanon era until 1984. He was stationed in West Berlin, Germany, and Fort Benning, Georgia.

Matthew's served in the communications field with the Signal Corp. and was honorable discharged with a rank of Sgt E-5. After military service and college, he moved to Fargo and became active in numerous offices in the American Legion. He became state adjutant in the fall of 2017.

The Hazen service will also feature musical selections from Hazen High School students Kaylee Lesmann and John Retterath, as

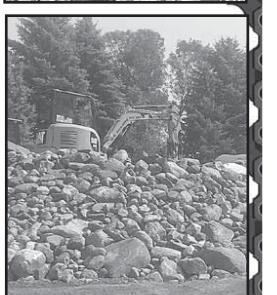
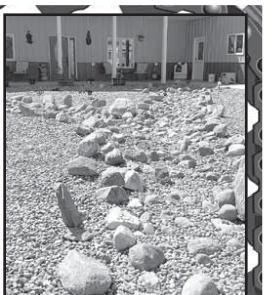

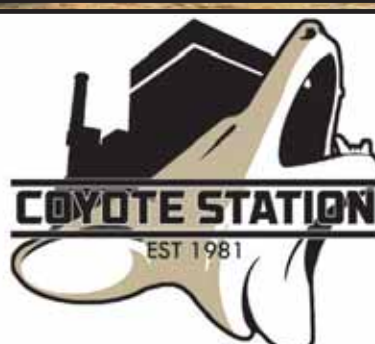

No Special burning permission will be given for any reason.

BUT,

You can have a Campfire in a developed recreational site or improved site, while always keeping an eye on it.
You can use grills and units that have an on/off switch in an area that you can safely operate without starting a fire.

Remember even though you are allowed some options to burn this doesn't absolve an individual or organization from liability or responsibility for any fire started by the allowed activity.

AND REMEMBER...

ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN BAN IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10.1) PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF UP TO \$1500 AND 30 DAYS IN JAIL. THE MERCER & OLIVER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS ARE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS.

When the Burn Ban is lifted, we are asking that all controlled burns be reported to the Sheriff's office, 745-3333, when the fire starts and then another call when the fire has been extinguished, Thank You!

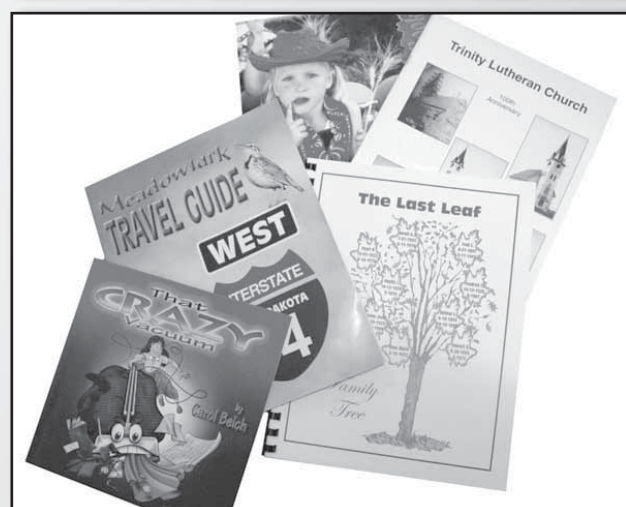

Relatable: From being an addict to becoming the counselor

CCCHC GAINS LAC
TYLER MCKAY

Relating to someone suffering from addiction isn't something all addiction counselors can do. However, it is something Licensed Addiction Counselor Tyler McKay can.

Tyler grew up in Stanton and graduated from Hazen High School in 2004. After high school, his life was full of big ups and hard downs. He experienced addiction, depression and fought to get where he is today - an LAC with Coal Country Community Health Center.

Tyler was first introduced to alcohol in high school. He said when transferring to Hazen as a freshman, he did what he thought he had to do to fit in. This led to indulging in alcohol and marijuana.

By the time he was a senior, Tyler referred to his addiction as bad - but everyone was doing it. After graduating high school and moving to Bismarck, Tyler said things only escalated in the addiction world. The people he surrounded himself with continued to fuel the addiction and for several years his life consisted of partying.

After losing a track scholarship at the University of Mary because of marijuana, Tyler attended Bismarck State College and earned his associates in graphic design.

A job he took placed him in Fargo, but his habits continued to spiral. "For me, it was a problem but I couldn't accept it was a problem because everyone around me was doing the same things as me - I got super depressed and nothing could make me happy," said Tyler.

His low took him through the doors of a psych ward for one night. While there he came in contact with his first addictions counselor. At the time Tyler was 26, and this was the first time someone was asking him if he wanted help with his addictions.

"I wasn't doing anything with my life and I needed purpose in my life," said Tyler.

He enrolled into a partial hospitalization program through St. Alexius Hospital. It was six hours a week for three days a week. Tyler stayed sober for four months.

During a vacation he relapsed and, according to Tyler, during this relapse he fell hard. He reached out to his parents for help and they answered. From there Tyler got on a bus and went straight to Hazen Treatment Center

- which is one of the best treatment facilities.

"At this treatment I found what I now know as Jesus; it was hope, a higher power. I could no longer deny there was something bigger than me out there running the show," said Tyler.

From the treatment facility, Tyler moved to Arizona and enrolled into a lower intensive treatment program. He was headed to live with a friend from high school and get reacquainted with the outside world.

"I went to 120 meetings the first two months I was down there," said Tyler.

Tyler said the meetings kept him accountable, and not knowing anyone helped also. He said he looked for jobs and went to meetings - that was his life. However, going to meetings and being sober wasn't enough for Tyler.

He constantly searched for the purpose, doing something more with himself and his life.

Tyler said getting sober was segregating himself from the people that fed that addiction. While away in treatment and in Arizona, he spent time on himself, building up his strength and willpower to beat the addiction.

"I have been in recovery since I was 25, but I haven't been sober the whole time," said Tyler. During his recovery, Tyler has had slips, pieces of time where he has fallen back into his addiction.

However, Tyler recognizes it and checks himself into treatment. He under-

went his final treatment in California and once completed, he came out of it with his purpose.

"I got home and I enrolled in Minot State University. This is what I know - I know what it does to me and I know how to get sober," said Tyler.

"I needed purpose, something fulfilling, helping people or being constructive with my time."

The stigma attached to addiction is that no one wants to come out and say they are addicted. For some reason weakness is attached to the word "addiction" or maybe, "failure" or even, "loser."

No body wants to identify as an addict.

"I blazed this trail and knew what I had to do to get sober. I'm here to show it's OK to say you're struggling and to be that example - if I can do it, anyone can do it," said Tyler.

Through recovery, there will be other addictions that kick in. Some may be healthy, others may be habits that will need to be broken as well. Having an addictive personality is something that will carry on throughout a person's life. Tyler joked that he didn't have tattoos when he got sober.

Being the new LAC with

CCCHC, Tyler said he is excited. "I'm excited to be a younger person who has gone through it. To be that

- so to have something like this that can help people stay sober. That first year is going to be a big deal,"

said Tyler.

These goals are set up around staying accountable, and attending meetings is part of that. Tyler

resource for people in the community," said Tyler.

He said although he doesn't attend meetings anymore, his sanctuary and safe place is in a church. Jesus is who he leans on to find his strength.

The first year of sobriety is the toughest. Tyler said he is excited to launch a new program at CCCHC called We Connect. The program is dedicated to helping those in recovery get through their first year - thanks to a federally funded opioid grant program CCCHC received.

The program is set up through Tyler and the client and they have to agree to goals. Hitting those goals will earn them incentives. Clients that make it through their first year could earn up to \$800.

"The first year of recovery is the most important. They say incentive based things are 50 percent more effective and 80 percent of people fail in the first year

ler said the crucial point to be successful in the recovery journey is finding that accountability.

"The biggest thing that's missing is a support network; it's so important," said Tyler. "We think that we can do it ourselves, but we are not meant to do it ourselves."

It's not a weakness to say I need help; my personal belief is we are made to be in relationships with people - not to isolate, not to avoid - to be around people; that's how I got sober."

The interaction had through the meetings and sessions is where an addict realizes they aren't alone. What they are feeling is felt by others recovering as well. Their struggles are understood - whether that be financially, emotionally, physically, etc.

"I know your cravings; I know what you're talking about. I know how to get through it," said Tyler.

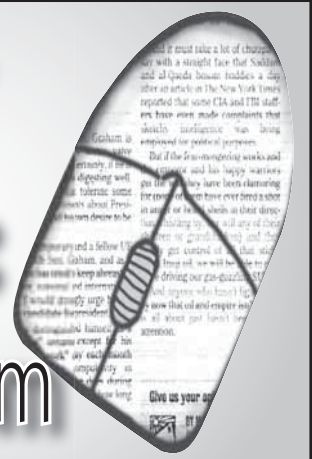
