# Measles outbreak has not yet reached ND, but vaccine rates are worrying

Over the past week, measles outbreaks in the United States have continued to worsen. The CDC's most recent numbers, published on May 24, say there have been 940 cases of measles in 26 different

states in 2019. The nearest states to North Dakota to have confirmed cases are lowa and Colorado.

According to the CDC, this is the largest measles outbreak since 1994. Measles was officially declared eliminated in 2000. Robyn Wieland, a respiratory therapist that oversees infection control at Sakakawea Medical Center, said that to think of diseases like measles as "eliminated" is misleading and lulls people into a false sense of security.

"We have organisms that are trying to defeat us and become stronger than we are so we need to be healthy and we need to take those vaccines very seriously," Wieland said. "When we say measles were gone, they weren't gone. They were dormant. So, when we give everyone a vaccine it doesn't do anything. When we decide not to vaccinate you, it has golden opportunity to come back."

Molly Howell, the immunization program manager for the ND Department of Health, said that while there have not been any reported cases of measles in North Dakota, the state rate of immunization is below recommended levels to keep the disease from spreading in a community. The recommended level for public safety is 95 percent, Howell said, but in the past school year North Dakota had an immunization rate of only 93.7 per-

"We are at risk for measles and I think the bigger thing isn't just the statewide vaccination rate," Howell said. "You kind of have to look at, are there pockets of un or under immunized individuals?"

According to Howell, the lowest county immunization rate in the state is 71 percent. The kindergarten measles vaccination rates in Mercer, McLean and Oliver counties are 93.46

percent, 94.12 percent and 84.62 percent respectively.

A 2016 NDSU study of immunization rates classified North Dakota as "one of the easiest states to obtain an immunization exemption." Guardians of students attending public school can claim medical exemption with a physician's signature, but they can also claim religious or personal belief exemption with their own signature.

The study found that North Dakota immunization rates have been declining for more than a decade, and during the 2014-2015 school year, North Dakota ranked as one of the five lowest states for kindergarten immunization rates.

According to Travis Jordan, the Beulah schools superintendent, area schools would follow directions from the Department of Public Instruction and the Department of Health in the event there is a confirmed measles case in North Dakota. These guidelines include instructing students about the spread of contagious diseases and giving administrators the ability to determine if an infected student or employee must be kept quarantined from the campus.

According to Howell, adults who are not health-care workers, college students or traveling internationally likely do not need to be vaccinated. Those who are in those highrisk categories, as well as children in kindergarten through twelfth grade should have two does of the vaccine. Children older than 12 months old but not yet in kindergarten should have one dose.

People who have had measles are immune to the disease and do not need to be vaccinated. The Department of Health recommends that if you are going to be traveling to an area with a measles

Remember even though you are allowed some options to burn this doesn't absolve an individual or organization from liability or responsibility for any fire started by the allowed activity.

#### AND REMEMBER...

ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN BAN IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10.1) PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF UP TO \$1500 AND 30 DAYS IN JAIL. THE MERCER & OLIVER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS ARE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS.

When the Burn Ban is lifted, we are asking that all controlled burns be reported to the Sheriff's office, 745-3333, when the fire starts and then another call when the fire has been extinguished, Thank You!

# Black Lung Screening at Energy Wellness Center

Screenings are free and confidential and open to all current and former miners.

Area miners who may be affected by black lung disease, a respiratory disease caused by inhaling coal mine dust, are invited to participate in a free, confidential health screening, which will take place May 31 at Energy Wellness Center in Beulah. All current and former miners are encouraged to participate. The screenings are offered by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health, part of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Screenings location: Energy Wellness Center, 1900 Central Avenue, North, Beulah, 7 a.m. – 7 p.m.

Appointments are suggested and can be made by calling 1-888-480-4042; walkins are also welcome.

"If black lung is caught early, steps can be taken to help prevent it from progressing to the most serious forms of the disease," said NIOSH Director John Howard, M.D. "The NIOSH surveillance program provides both underground and surface miners with confidential screenings that can enable and motivate ac-

tion towards reducing their exposure to coal dust."

Screenings will include a work history questionnaire, a chest radiograph, a respiratory assessment questionnaire, lung function (spirometry) testing, and blood pressure screening. The screenings typically take about 30 minutes and each individual miner is provided with their results. By law, each miner's results are confidential. No individual information is publicly disclosed.

Participation in this program gives the coal miner: An easy way of checking on their health;

A confidential report regarding whether or not they have radiographic evidence of black lung;

A confidential report about their lung function.



My old friend, Larry Beck stopped by awhile back. Larry's battling some illness, but given he's as tough as an ash fence post, he'll do as best he can with his circumstances. Larry's the kind of person who will pick his so called "hill to die on," plant his feet and battle. There were a number of those folks back in the days when coal mine strikes were far more common than they are these days. And around here, the center of attention was the Indian Head Mine at Zap, which was owned and operated by North American Coal Corporation, and the miners were members of the United Mine Workers Union of America.

You could site any number of reasons for conflict between labor and management that leads to a breakdown and strikes and picket lines and all the things that go with that some of it not so nice. But, maybe, instead of calling those actions strikes, we should say the two sides of the coal and energy industry of the day were seeking understanding. The company knew what it wanted. The workers knew what they needed.

We could go on and on and discuss and argue the various points of that journey through time and history. What we should applaud and remember are those participants, in labor and management for the outcome that arrived years later. It may not be all sunshine, roses and harmony in the energy industry, but there has been that understanding reached of what everyone wants and needs.

There were clearly lessons not only learned but accepted, and today's working and operating environment are, to most observers, far less contrary than they were in years past. It's not perfect, but much better.

Most would agree that it is good not to have that kind

of strife in our communities, where it reached into the heart, gut and soul of our lives. Over the years, I have been in places I didn't want to be. I was not alone. Often times, present at the center of strike activities, was not where I wanted to be, but it was where my work put me. It is not easy to watch your friends and neighbors protesting and fighting for their livelihoods. It is not a simple matter of professionalism to turn your back on people calling for you to come and join and support them. It would be foolhardy to believe that interactions in some of those terse moments didn't create wounds too deep to heal and exist to this day.

However, I do believe that what took place during those confrontations not only built character for those of us there, but it built that ever-valuable relationship based on the simple, but hard to achieve, principle of understanding between the various elements present and accounted for.

Some days, there are only memories. Over the years, Larry

and I became friends of sorts. We sat beside one another and watched our wives walk across the stage at Dickinson State and receive their college nursing credentials. I've watched him become not only the guy who some think would argue with a rock, but someone who is always there to help the elderly or those in need.

Perhaps, we share one thing in common, and that is we speak more to the past than the future. But, as I remind my sons, who have those good energy industry jobs, it was guys like Larry Back who came to an understanding with the bosses that made that environment much friendlier than history remembers it.

Larry wasn't alone. There are still a number of those miners from that era, along with some management folks, living among us. If you know one, or know of one, it wouldn't be a bad idea to say, "thanks for helping make America great.'

I can't see that anyone gave our coal miners here anything. They worked hard and fought hard for it, often with their families and friends beside them. On the other side, we need to remember that business is business, and like everything living and inanimate, we need to remember the necessity of understanding the nature of things we live

We may come to understand that while we may have differing interests, we have interests in common, those which identify us as human beings, and that is really what matters over the long journey.

# How It Works: Windmills

North Dakota's ability to produce tremendous amounts of energy through oil, natural gas and coal is well documented, but one of the state's most visible form of energy production – wind towers – are quietly continuing to flourish.

According to the Great Plains Energy Corridor at Bismarck State College, North Dakota "has some of the best wind resources in the nation." Over the last fifteen years, more than 3,000 megawatts of wind generation have been installed, and development is expected to continue. This is in large part to federal tax incentives, according to BSC.

Conlan Kennedy, a com-

munications specialist for NextEra Energy Resources, which developed approximately 700 of North Dakota's 1,655 wind turbines, said wind turbines are particularly good for farmers because of their convenience. Each wind turbine, Conlan said, only takes about an acre of space, meaning farmers lose less valuable agricultural space.

Most of the parts for NextEra's windmills, according to Kennedy, are built in North America. The reason the windmills must be so high - typically about 260 feet - is because the wind aloft is stronger and less turbulent than wind closer to the ground. A computer inside the wind towers is able to turn the blades to face into the wind for optimal energy output.

NextEra directs their energy to multiple clients through the electrical grid. Customers could be cities or private utility companies like Basin Electric Power Cooperative, Great River Energy, or Minnesota Power. Kennedy said there are multiple environmental benefits that come from using wind energy.

"Wind is...good for the environment," Kennedy said. "It creates no greenhouse gasses, no air pollutants, it uses absolutely no water resources to generate electricity. It creates no waste byproducts."

While the process of creating energy from wind may be clean, there are still impacts to environment, according to

Scott Larson, a North Dakotabased field supervisor for U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services.

Larson said that many grassland nesting birds and waterfowl will avoid wind turbines, so new development means further loss of their native prairie and wetlands. While this loss could be mitigated through habitat restoration, those kinds of projects are voluntary for wind energy production companies.

"To be really frank, we don't have a lot of offsets on the ground yet from wind impacts to my knowledge, but we're encouraging those wind companies to do that," Larson said.

Besides losing their homes, birds and bats can also be killed by windmills if they strike them. Larson said that many wind companies keep and report data on bird strikes for the first year or two, but do not usually continue to do so.

Bats in particular can be affected by windmills because they do not need to strike them directly to be killed by them. According to Larson, turbine blades can change the atmospheric pressure and disrupt bats' blood pressure. They can die from this side effect, known as "barotrauma."

Though U.S Fish and Wildlife cannot gauge how loss of habitat is affecting the overall health of grassland bird and waterfowl populations, Larson said that moving forward, he hopes to see wind companies be more proactive in habitat protection.
