

Lessons learned from showing livestock

In honor of the conclusion of the McLean County Fair, let's talk about the lessons our youth learn during the show season. While our 4-H members pack up their projects for the year and reflect upon their successes and failures from the past year it is important to consider the lessons that they have learned. Often, after I tell people what I do, I get asked "What is the value of those projects they make or what do they learn by showing livestock?" and I can understand the questions. Often the projects end up sitting in a box in the garage never to be used or they sit on a shelf collecting dust. I find myself struggling to come up with an answer to their question because it isn't one that is easy to answer in a short two minute speech. The best answer I can come up with, unless they are willing to stay for a 30 minute discussion, is that the value of the projects or the livestock shown is not in the outcome but in the lessons learned along the way. Let's take a look at a few of the valuable lessons youth

Ever since the fiasco that was last year's horse show Emily had put in thousands of hours riding and practicing with her horse Max. Everything was finally clicking and they were finally ready for the show this year. The day of the show Emily went to the barn to discover that Max had cut his leg badly and she wouldn't be able to show this year. Despite her disappointment Emily made sure Max's wound was clean, bandaged and that he was comfortable before she and her parents headed to the horse show to cheer on all of her friends. There will always be obstacles that you have to learn to deal with and many 4-H members could tell you some version of the story you just read from an injury before the fair to an animal not behaving in the ring to not getting that ribbon you were hoping for in the class you entered. Learning how to deal with disappointment and turning those obstacles into lessons you helps competitors grow. When your animal doesn't behave in the ring getting mad or crying isn't going to fix things, but turning on a



smile and trying your hardest wins brownie points with even the hardest hearted judges. Showing livestock teaches you to take the good with the bad, that sometimes you just aren't meant to win, but that's ok and smiling through the pain of a 1,000+ pound steer dancing on your foot means you can handle anything life outside the arena throws at you.

Every morning Dave wakes up at 5:00 am so he can work with his steer before he has to help his father feed all the other livestock and head to work for a local farmer. He may only get to practice for 30 minutes to an hour but he puts in the time because he knows that the time spent now will be worth it. Dave has learned that hard work pays off in the long run, especially when working with livestock. It takes time to train a steer to lead or a market lamb to stand braced properly. Clippers are not normal in a livestock animal's life and it takes time to get them comfortable with them. Those competitors that put in the extra time stand out in the ring. As someone once told me "it takes hard work to be a star" and those who excel in the show ring exemplify

The day of the county fair has arrived and livestock from all over the county have started pouring in for the annual livestock show. Throughout the afternoon the livestock kids spread hay or wood chips, fill water buckets and provide hay or pellets to feed their animals. This year looks to be especially hot and portable fans are set up everywhere to help keep the livestock cool during the hot afternoons. These kids know that it is their responsibility to make sure their animals are comfortable and ready for the upcoming events. This responsibility started well before the day of the show and these animals have been being cared for by their owners for months. All livestock, but especially show animals are dependent on their owners for their care and kids that show livestock know this more than most. Every day they make sure their animals are fed and have adequate water because they know to skip a day is one of the worst forms of torture they could give. These kids take the time to teach their animals to lead, get them comfortable with the grooming equipment and work with them on setting up for a judge because they know the more time they take out

of the ring, the better their animals will do in the ring. Responsibility is a part of their everyday lives and they take it with them into their other pursuits.

It seemed like everything had gone wrong this year for Jenny's market swine project. One pig had been sick in May and hadn't gained weight and the other had gone lame the day before the fair. Even though she knew her pig wasn't going to win the market swine show because it was light weight she still worked hard making sure it was well trained and looked its best on the day of the show. She took pride in the fact that she had the best mannered and cleanest pig in the ring. She smiled at the judge and did her best. Jenny's confidence in her skills were rewarded when she was named the Grand Champion Swine Showman and won the

Round Robin competition in her age division. Confidence in yourself is one trait that livestock showman must learn in order to be successful in the ring. Not only are you showing off your animal but you are also showing off your skills. A confident showman is one who will be more successful in the ring. Be proud of yourself and the hard work you have put in with your animal.

In the end winning isn't everything. That is the hardest lesson for any person to learn. Once the fairs or shows are over and all the supplies have been put away often those ribbons or buckles that were so important to win will sit and collect dust in a box hidden from the world. Twenty years from now it won't matter that you had the Grand Champion Market Steer at the North

Frontier Military Days and Visitor Appreciation Day

Have you ever wondered what life was like during another time? Don't miss your chance to find out! Fort Stevenson State Park will be hosting the 27th Annual Frontier Military Days event on June 22 and 23. Activities will take place from noon to 4 p.m. each day.

Visitors will have a chance to experience what life was like at an 1870's military fort. Military encampment will feature authentic tents and gear, living history demonstrations of tomahawk throwing, a trader tent and black powder gun demonstrations. Skills and

crafts of the Indian Wars period will be on display. Come watch a cannon firing at noon and 3:30 p.m. each day. There will be a free root beer float social on Saturday and free pie and ice cream on Sunday, following the entertainment presentations on both days. Make sure to visit the Guardhouse Interpretive Center, as well.

Fort Stevenson Frontier Military days is sponsored by the Fort Stevenson Foundation, a local volunteer organization that sponsored reconstruction of the original fort's guardhouse. The Guardhouse Interpretive

Center houses displays and artifacts about military life in the Dakota Territory.

4-H YOUTH EXTENSION AGENT


A big part of 4-H is helping youth grow into caring, capable adults. In order for this to happen, youth need positive relationships in their lives and opportunities to learn and help others. 4-H does this with four essential elements as part of the program.

We call these elements the BIGM – which stands for belonging, independence, generosity and mastery.

Belonging – When youth join 4-H they go to club meetings. The meetings are structured learning environments where caring adults listen to their ideas. Meetings have fun activities where youth learn and interact with other youth. It is important that all youth feel included and safe at these meetings or at any 4-H event.

Independence – as youth

get older in 4-H they take on more responsibilities. It might mean that they become an officer in the club and help run the meetings. It may also mean that they decide to show livestock and have an increased responsibility of caring for that animal. Each year 4-Her's are encouraged to take on new projects and challenge themselves to make exhibits of increasing difficulty. Eventually many of our older youth become ambassadors for 4-H and help teach younger members.

Generosity - 4-H club members are great at giving back to their communities with various service projects. Youth learn that by helping others their lives have more meaning and purpose.

Mastery – 4-H youth develop skills by learning and doing. Making an exhibit for the fair helps build mastery. Overtime many 4-H members develop talents they can apply to future


