Getting the scoop at a new Stanton restaurant

Looking for a tasty treat to go with that tasty tidbit of news? Stanton has the place for

Inside Scope, a new ice cream shop, is now open for business right along the highway, in the same location as Cafe DuMond was located in the past.

For the last couple years, Stanton residents and regular visitors have mourned the loss of that cafe, a nice restaurant to stop at right along County 37. Among those many is that restaurant's owner, Cassandra DuMond.

DuMond said the possibility of reopening a restaurant in some capacity has been something she's thought on and off about ever since she closed up the cafe. However, the possibility began to look more like a reality after Stanton Mayor Ron Boyko offered to find her a cooler used to serve ice cream.

"That's where it all started." she said.

For DuMond, an ice cream store offers her the seasonal option that is necessary for her, since she is a cook at the Center-Stanton School District.

"In the summer I need a job," she said. "This gives me something to do."

Inside Scoop will be open Tuesdays through Sundays from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m., although DuMond added they will stay open til everyone's served if there's a busy evening on a Friday or Saturday. The seasonal restaurant will continue these hours until the start of the next school year when, as summer wanes, DuMond turns her focus back to cooking at school, and will then reopen once school lets out the following spring.

DuMond said she hopes Inside Scoop will have its ordered soft serve machine this week, expanding the options the restaurant can provide. For the ice cream in the cooler, she said there will always be eight flavors on hand. Some staple flavors will be available at any time, while others will be rotated to provide a greater variety in what customers can enjoy.

'We will be able to offer cones, Sundays, some novelties, all that stuff," she said. "We'll also have some light lunches available, like hot dishes, cold

sandwiches and soups."

There will be lunch specials at low prices, allowing patrons to get their lunch along with the most important part: the dessert.

"We've gotta leave room for ice cream," she added, laughing.

DuMond plans to celebrate the opening of the restaurant with a grand opening June 29, with door prizes and \$1 soft serve cones.

In addition, DuMond is using the reopening as a means of offering more options to the community. She will have copies of the Hazen Star and Center Republican that can be purchased there, giving an additional meaning to the "Inside Scoop" name. Also, Stanton resident Jesse Krieger will have smoked meats available Fridays and Saturdays at the location

Inside Scoop officially opened June 13.

"We've brightened it up inside," DuMond said.

Cassandra DuMond is receiving lots of help from her family: her husband Dan and their daughters Katie and Aspen. Hallie Sailer is the other employee at the restaurant.

Prairie Dog and possible city infrastructure

With a plucky name and strong support from leadership in the North Dakota legislature, "Operation Prairie Dog" dominated headlines and discussion throughout this legislative session

The bill, with funding reliant upon oil prices and production, allocates up to \$115 million to cities and \$115 million to counties and townships. Distributions are based on populations and property valuations.

"Nothing is for sure yet, but it will be coming," Heather Ferebee, city auditor, said of Beulah's piece of the pie.

According to Ferebee, Beulah is projected to be getting about one million dollars, but the city won't know the exact amount until the money is awarded. The city is supposed to get part of the sum in 2020, with the rest coming in 2021.

While serious planning will not happen until the city is assured of its funds, City Engineer Charles Hankins is already in the process of assessing the Beulah's needs and creating a short list of priorities.

According to Hankins, the first thing that should always be addressed is what lies below.

"Our planning efforts will focus on primarily starting with the backbone of our water network and our sewer network," Hankins said. "So down Main Street, perhaps up Central Avenue and then we can kind of spider out from there and address areas, but there's a lot of steps that go with that."

Hankins said the "ultimate goal" is to ensure that the pipes beneath roads will not have to be replaced for a few decades "so we're not having to dig up a brand-new street." His main concern is with the water system, which has had several breaks this spring in the oldest part of town, 3rd Street South, which is fed off the water tower that serves the central part of town. The water tower and system were built in 1928.

"Now addressing that in all likelihood, just opening it up, digging up the ground and replacing it is probably the best option," Hankins said.

This would be an extensive project without visible results, but Hankins said it could save a tremendous amount of money in the future.

"It's a growing concern of mine and it should be a growing concern of the city's," Hankins said. "If we don't address it, eventually the problems are going to persist and it will become a problem of much greater magnitude down the road." Hankins also said the sewer system, while not having the obvious problems the water system does, is up to 80 or 90 years old in some areas. Hankins said the sewers will need to be surveyed to see if they have gotten brittle in some areas and there may be small improvements that could be made without digging up the entire system.

Mayor Travis Frey said the process of deciding what projects to take on will take "several years," but he doesn't yet know if there will be a dedicated committee or simply a meeting of portfolio holders in water, sewer and roads.

"Generally, if you start with a couple people to do the legwork and bring some options to the (city) council, it's a little easier," Frey said.

Any project that will be undertaken has to be approved by city council and will have to be under very specific infrastructure guidelines as outlined by the "Operation Prairie Dog" bill.

You can have a Campfire in a developed recreational site or improved site, while always keeping an eye on it. You can use grills and units that have an on/off switch in an area that you can safely operate without starting a fire.

Remember even though you are allowed some options to burn this doesn't absolve an individual or organization from liability or responsibility for any fire started by the allowed activity.

AND REMEMBER...

ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN BAN IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10.1) PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF UP TO \$1500 AND 30 DAYS IN JAIL. THE MERCER & OLIVER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS ARE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS.

When the Burn Ban is lifted, we are asking that all controlled burns be reported to the Sheriff's office, 745-3333, when the fire starts and then another call when the fire has been extinguished, Thank You!



"I just invite people to come out and take a look at the facility," Steve Frovarp, airport clerk, said. "There have been people who come and say, 'Gee we've never been out here before – didn't know it was this nice of a facility."

The event will be held from 7 a.m. to noon and the fire department will be cooking up and serving pancakes and sausage furnished by the airport. Though it's called a "flyin," one doesn't need to be a wealthy jetsetter to attend.

"We serve right around 400 people and a lot of people don't have a plane, they just come out for breakfast," Muth said.

Still, Muth said he expects anywhere from 15 to 40 planes to attend based

on previous years.

"Hopefully we get enough planes and pilots that we give free rides to the kids," Muth said, as one of the goals of the event is to get young people interested in aviation.

Frovarp said the airport has a rich history, part of which can be seen on display in the form of a Lockheed SR-71 Blackbird. The airport's field is named after Hazen native Al Joersz, who holds the flight speed record in the Blackbird.

All are invited to experience this piece of history, as well as other exciting displays of aviation (including an air ambulance and helicopter) on Saturday morning.
