You can see ND Fire Danger Rating Map if you go to the following website and scroll down to the middle: https://www.ndresponse.gov/burn-ban-restrictions-fire-danger-maps

A STAGE I BURN BAN MEANS:

No controlled burns, no large pit fires and no burning garbage of any kind.

No throwing cigarette butts or anything out in a grassy area or any area that may start to burn.

No Special burning permission will be given for any reason.

BUT

You can have a Campfire in a developed recreational site or improved site, while always keeping an eye on it. You can use grills and units that have an on/off switch in an area that you can safely operate without starting a fire.

Remember even though you are allowed some options to burn this doesn't absolve an individual or organization from liability or responsibility for any fire started by the allowed activity.

AND REMEMBER...

ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN BAN IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10.1) PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF UP TO \$1500 AND 30 DAYS IN JAIL. THE MERCER & OLIVER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS ARE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS.

When the Burn Ban is lifted, we are asking that all controlled burns be reported to the Sheriff's office, 745-3333, when the fire starts and then another call when the fire has been extinguished, Thank You!

How it works: ND rual REAP Zones

Large swaths of North Dakota have been officially designated by the federal government as "REAP" zones, or "Rural Economic Area Partnership" Zones. Only North Dakota, New York and Vermont have land with this designation, and being designated as a REAP Zone has helped areas of North Dakota secure funding for various projects over the years.

In was in 1995 that two zones in North Dakota were initially designated as REAP Zones in the southwestern and north-central regions. According to the Reap Investment Fund, these two areas, as well as the subsequent areas chosen in New York and Vermont, were not only rural, but faced other unique challenges as well.

"(The zones) were created to address critical issues related to out-migration, constraints in economic activity and growth, low density settlement patterns, stagnant or declining employment and isolation that led to disconnection from markets, suppliers and centers of information and finance," the Reap Investment Fund's website reads.

The Southwest REAP zone includes Adams, Billings, Bowman, Dunn, Golden Val-

ley, Hettinger, Slope and Stark Counties as well as part of the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation. The second zone in the state. CONAC (Center of North America Coalition for Rural Development) includes Benson, Bottineau, McHenry, Pierce, Rolette and Towner counties as well as the Spirit Lake and Turtle Mountain reservations.

Over their existence, the zones have worked together, forming the Reap Investment Fund in 1999 to act as the non-profit arm of the designated zones, handling their funds on a regional

According to Sandy Shively, executive director of the North Central Planning Council, there is no longer a funding mechanism for REAP zones through the U.S. Department of Agriculture like there was when the zones were created, but when applying for funds for infrastructure projects, like the new sewer system in Dodge, there is sometimes a special set aside within grant programs for projects in REAP zones.

According to Tracey Miller, a KLJ Engineering and Planning employee working on the Dodge project, the first phase of the project is funded through a \$300,000 USDA loan and a


direct grant of \$896,507. Being a part of the REAP zone, Miller said, was important to securing the money.

"They compete with a more limited group of applications," Shively said.

However, REAP zone benefits do not just extend to government entities. In fact, according to Shively, much of the work the zones' administration does today is working with small businesses through their microloan program.

Each zone runs a microloan program where they can lend up to \$10,000 for business acquisition, development or expansion with 0 percent interest. Shively said this kind of loan can help a business owner fill in a gap in equity for a larger bank loan.

The USDA explains the REAP program as "a pilot concept for rural revitalization and community development," and over the vears, it has tackled projects ranging from a rural grocers' initiative to a task group focused on childcare concerns to helping advertise and bolster locally grown food. REAP zones are described by the USDA as being primarily "citizen led," and the citizens of rural North Dakota might have even more to contribute in the future.


