Gardening Tips

Everybody loves daisies

There is a flower bed just down the block from Bunkey's house. Petunia noticed it for the first-time last week. It was full of daisies in several colors. She was enthralled. "Why don't we have daisies in our flowerbeds? "No reason I guess. I'll stop in at the Pretty Good Nursery tomorrow and see if they have any daisies." The next day, Marie explained that daisy is usually the term used to describe a composite flower made of one or two rows of outer petals called ray florets and a puffy center composed of disc florets. That being said, what color are you thinking of? We have daisy-like flowers in lilac, purple, pink, rose, yellow, gold, orange, mahogany and combinations of those colors. She showed him some that were in stock.

Leopard's bane is a clear yellow blossom and blooms with the tulips. It is between 1 and 2 1/2 feet tall, has 2 to 3-inch flowers, likes light shade and peaty soil. Oxeye daisies are the white ones blooming in the ditch right now. These are thugs. Never plant them in a flowerbed as they will take it over. They are hard to get rid of too. Coreopsis form mounds of dainty daisy shaped flowers. They can be light yellow, pink or yellow gold. They are a perennial that needs a bit of winter TLC.

Painted daisies are red, pink, or rose colored borne on tall wiry stems. Perfect for cutting. For mid to late summer, look to the Shastas, the royalty of the daisy world. They have huge white shaggy flowers. They too need extra winter protection. Alaska and Silver Princess do the best here. They need full sun and, as they tend to be top heavy, a bit of support. A large tomato cage does quite well although, they do grow out of it in a summer or two. Not a bad thing. Of course now we have coneflowers in multiple colors and shapes, some more hardy than others. Cape daisies, another annual, is white with a purple "eye". Some single Dahlias are daisy like. Even some marigolds can look sorta like daisies. Then we have the rubeckia. She comes in every shade of yellow known to man. She also can be green, mahogany, red or any combination of those colors. They are sold as annuals but do reseed and some are even winter hardy. Sun flowers are no longer 10 feet tall and yellow. They can be 2 feet tall, 6 feet tall and several heights in between. Again, they can be any shade of yellow, almost brown or a combination of the two. For a butterfly magnet, plant tithonia. This is a tall orange daisy type with a puffy yellow middle. If you like the flower, it also comes in a double form.

Now that Bunkey is totally confused, he plans to take Petunia to the nursery and turn her loose. Let her decide what color, shape, height and form

daisy or daisy type flower she wants.

Narcan for bees?

If you have ever had a child swallow a poison, you know what happens next. The E.R. Doc puts a tube down his throat to suck out as much of the stuff he can, then makes the kid drink a slurry of water and activated charcoal to absorb any nasties left. You just can't do that with a bee.

Bees are in a constant struggle against the effects of insecticides and fungicides and the approximately 1 billion pounds of pesticides that are applied each year on crops, gardens, and even directly inside hives to combat parasitic varroa mites. It is no wonder that bees pick up toxins that either kill them outright or kill them more slowly.

According to Brandon Hopkins, manager of the Washington State University Bee Program, these chemicals have sub-lethal effects on bees. Queens lay fewer eggs, bees make less honey, they don't put on weight, (do bees get fat?), so you need to feed them. Their memory is worse, they have

trouble finding their way back to the hive, and they are slower to learn. All this means less honey.

Enter Waled Suliman, a post doc researcher, and an expert in surface chemistry in WSU's biological and systems engineering department. He had been a beekeeper in his native Libya. He had been researching biofuels and, in the process, produced a highly specialized charcoal. He realized that by fine tuning the combination process he could create particles that would absorb or bind specific molecules. That meant he could target insecticides, fungicides and growth regulators that threaten bees. These particles act as a sponge and attract and bind pesticide molecules. These micro particles and the poisons together pass through the digestive system removing all the bad stuff. His vision for this product was that one gram of it would have particles for each group of pesticides. He used bee pollen for the feedstock prototypes. This was created in a four-stage process of combustion in carefully controlled conditions. Bee keepers have been feeding pollen to their bees as a source of supplemental nutrition for years so the bees would eat the stuff.

It takes 15 nanograms of insecticide to kill a bee. One of Suliman's pollen sized microparticles can absorb 300 nanograms. However, the particles must specialize in capturing the toxins without binding up nutrients or beneficial bacteria in the bee's gut as that would starve the bee.

Extensive testing proved that the particles functioned at the PH and temperature of a gut full of nectar. Not only that, the vibration of flight enhanced the activity of the particles. Hopkins and Suliman conducted feeding studies to be sure the bees would eat the stuff and that it would stay in the bee's gut for at least the 5 minutes it took for the particles to bind toxins and that they would be excreted with other waste. It works!!

Suliman is looking for feedstock that is less expensive than pollen. He is experimenting with almond hulls. Last year a group of undergrad marketing students branded the particles BeeToxx and won two \$10,000 awards, the Alaska Airlines Award and the Honey Bee Health Coalition Bee Nutrition Challenge. These prizes and a company Suliman established, Eco Carbon Technologies, have proven to be a big boost for the particles. If this stuff becomes available on the open market, you will see beekeepers dancing in the streets. They won't be afraid that if they open a hive, all the bees would be dead or dying from farm chemicals.

Chili Cheese Dog Boats

Ingredients

- 8 hot dog buns
- 4 tablespoons butter, melted
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons fresh parsley, finely chopped
- 8 slices cheddar cheese
- 15 oz chili, with or without beans
- 8 hot dogs

Directions

1. Preheat the oven to 350°F
2. Leaving them attached, place the 8 hot dog buns in a 9" x 13" baking dish. Cut a rectangle in each hot dog bun, making sure to stay 1 cm from the edges. Push down on the bread cut-out to compact it tightly into the bottom of each bun, making sure to press down on the bottom edges as well. This will help create a larger space for the fillings and reduce mess.
3. Mix the butter, garlic, and parsley in a small bowl, then brush the buns and their hollowed insides with the garlic butter. Bake for 5 minutes to toast the buns as well as help the sides of the buns firm up so they don't collapse under the weight of the fillings.
4. Place a slice of cheddar cheese inside each bun, then spoon a bit of chili inside each one. Slide a hot dog snugly on top of the chili in each bun, then top with more chili.
5. Bake for 20-25 min, until the cheese is golden brown and the chili has started to brown. Top with fresh parsley, then slice the hot dog boats along their connected seams to serve.

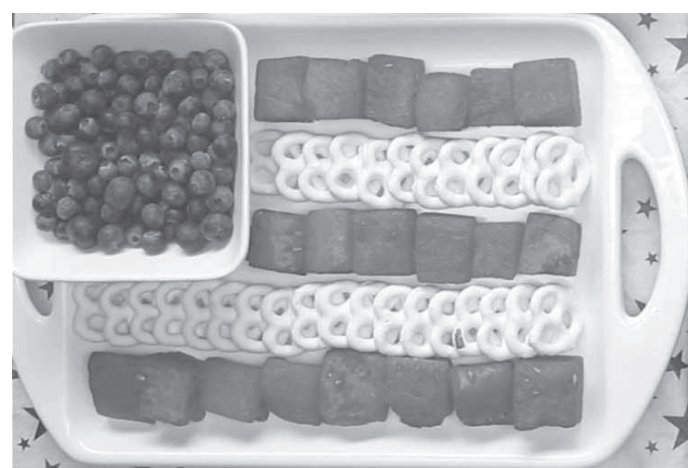

2. Place watermelon in a row, and then the pretzels until you fill up the platter, alternating red and white.
3. Bring to your party, serve and, enjoy!

You can order prints in any size from 4x6 inches to poster sized. But the most exciting part may be the special prints for display that can be on canvas like fine artwork, or printed on metal, acrylic or wood backing. Photos can be printed on magnets, mugs, keepsake boxes, or even turned into a 250 piece jigsaw puzzle. That's only a small part of the options you will have (for example, once the sports season rolls around you will be able to put your favorite player on a cellphone case) so you will be wanting to check the site often for new photos and

products.

Don't have a paper subscription? Well you can still purchase an online subscription for a great low price. Call us or drop in at the office for more details.

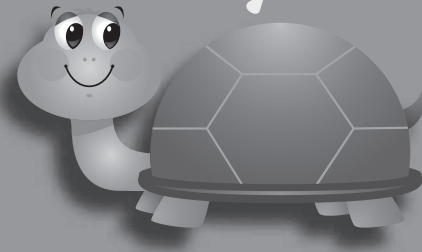
