DAKOTA DATEBOOK: Sibley Historic Sites

DAKOTA DATEBOOK WRITTEN BY MERRY HELM

July 15, 2019 — The State Historical Society administers a good number of historic military sites throughout the state, many of which are small out-of-the-way spots that come with small brown road signs that point the way.

Recently, our Dakota Datebook writer came upon one of these beside ND Hwy 1 near Binford. "I spotted it and asked my husband to pull over!" she said. A marker explained that it was the site of Camp Atchison, a field-base used for more than a month in 1863 by the Sibley Expedition

1863 by the Sibley Expedition.
"It was so quiet," Helm
said. "It was like discovering
a nesting pheasant, because
beside the marker stood the
grave of a soldier who had
died there. His headstone was
of white marble that looked
like it had just been carved. It
was unsettling."

A string of historic markers identify the 1863 route through North Dakota. Along with one led by General Sully, General Sibley's expedition was here for one specific purpose – to find and kill Little Crow and his men, who they'd been fighting in Minnesota for almost a year. While Sully's men were the worst offenders, neither expedition discriminated; if Native Ameri-

cans were spotted, they were considered enemies and fired upon – men, women or children, it didn't matter.

Termed the Sioux Uprising, a long progression of bloody battles had begun with a relatively innocent event the previous summer. On a Sunday morning in August, four young braves were passing the farm of Robinson Jones, when one of them took some eggs from one of the farmer's hens. One of the boys said it was a bad idea and was quickly branded a coward, which he claimed wasn't true. One thing led to the next, ending with the murder of five white settlers. The back and forth reprisals that were set off by that event didn't end until 28 years later when revenge for the Little Bighorn culminated in the Massacre at Wounded

Sibley and Sully had followed Little Crow into Dakota Territory, with Sibley entering near Big Stone Lake on June 24. The first major camp established by Sibley's expedition was at Fort Atchison, where about 1,000 of the 3,330 soldiers were left, including many who had become ill. Other sites used by Sibley's men in July include Camp Weiser near Kathryn, Camp Buell near Milnor, Camp Corning near Dazey, Camp Hayes near Lisbon, Camp Grant near Woodworth,

Camp Kimball southwest of Carrington and Camp Sheardown southeast of Valley City.

On July 26, Sibley and his men engaged in their first major exchange with the Dakotas. That site is called the Big Mound Battlefield, which is near Tappen.

Nine miles north of Tappen is the approximate location of the Camp Whitney, the campsite used by the expedition following the battle. There is a grave marker at Camp Whitney.

Sites used in August include Camp Banks near
Driscoll and Camp Arnold four miles north of Oriska.
Two headstones honor the memory of two soldiers buried at the Pickett Lake campsite, and a site at Lake Johnson honors George T.
Johnson, who drowned there.

Many of these sites are neglected now. A chokecherry bush drapes over the stone marker at Camp Atchison, and tall grass has grown up around everything. A flagpole stands with no flag. Helm said, "The expedition was far from noble; it was about revenge, and innocent people died. Still, I felt sad for the soldier buried there — he died because he got sick, and he was left behind in the middle of nowhere. I couldn't help but wonder what that was like for his family."



l been workin' all the livelong day!

Can it be true/ Do mothers really hate to see schools have summer vacation and send the kids home?

MATERNAL CORRECTNESS PROBABLY DICTATES THAT MOTHERS SAY, "oH, no! We can't wait to embrace their summer sloth." What they are likely thinking is, "Hand me that 'help wanted' section. Someone must want them besides me!"

I can't speak for all mothers of that season in life but I feel safe in stepping up for mine. Summer vacation was akin to having the local sheriff show up and hand her the reins to her very own chain gang with a three month sentence to hard labor hanging over them. Might I add, that since Mom had but one prisoner to look after, not much in the way of goofing off got past her.

I'm reminded of the scene from the movie "Cool Hand Luke" where the guards break Ol' Luke by making him dig a hole and fill it in over and over. Mom would take me by the arm or ear, whichever was more readily available to be grabbed, march me over to the garden and demand, "What are those weeds doing in my garden?" You have by now recognized how awful my life was.

I often threatened to escape but my threats were always met with the same response. "You got to be kidding. No one wants you but me." I once almost escaped to go working for a custom combiner but she shut that down. Instead, she marched me out to about half a mile of berries that needed picking, ripped the sleeves off my shirt and declared, "There. Now you're a custom combiner. Get busy!"

When she ran low on work, it was no problem. She just farmed me out and the nearest projects always belonged to my dad, who, along with my mom, made a perfect union during the times they could stand to be around one another. That was normally about the time it took to rake a 20 acre yard or dig a new hole for the outhouse.

I once made the mistake of speaking back to my father about one of his projects. He handed me a pick and shovel and said there, "Now you can do man's work". Never one to just let it go, I said, "Well, then, shouldn't you be doin' it. I'm just a kid.! Oh, stop it! It wasn't thought of as child abuse unless they hit you with the iron end of a handy tool. When the drill instructors in the Army would lay into me, I'd just smile and think warm thoughts about my dad, whose favorite encouragement was, "Learn to take the pain!" I learned an awful lot from my dad.

Mom's penal system wasn't all bad. She did feed really good. I learned a lot from my mom, too. Things like when looking for a wife,

Upon be coming a soldier, the first hing I realized the need to do, was to cast off all the advice I had gotten from my mother, which lead to falling back on a lot of the advice from my father. Yes, learn to take the pain". Well, I figured you only get one bite at the California girl apple. Or that divorced women are so bitter cannibals shy a way from eating them. Or that after eating Army food you have no taste left with which to judge any food, cooked, cold or past expiration. I did learn that Jack Daniels is good with anything.

I'll never forget walking up to the front door when I arrived home from the Army. I propped my drunk self against the wall and when Mom opened the door, I said, :"You're right! No one wants

me but you".

When she shut the door I suspected some doubt since she was on one side of the door and I on the other. What a kidder! If it had been the June gardening season and not mid-November, I bet she'd have jumped at the possibility of all that free help. In those days, I could pull weeds drunk! You might have to point them out to me, but I'd get 'em!

When I see a kid who apparently has no summer work, I have to remind myself that Jesus loves them and their mothers must, too. The difference might be that Jesus would command them to "stand up" when they'd been lying in bed for weeks, leading to months. I don't know, I'm just guessing.

Sometimes, people say I should hire a kid to do some of the try trying work at my house, the House of Misery. I remind them that is "man's work". They say, "Yes, but not 'old man's work', to which they may have a point, after I can no longer take the pain.

Knowing my mom, if she were still alive, she would come out, take my gas weed whacker away, give me a hand sickle and say, "There. Now you're a man!" You'd have had to know her to love her like I do.



Beware of bogus offers to lower your interest rate

Fraud Watch

Network

One call after another rings on your phone, each promising to lower your credit card interest rate. But many of these calls are scams.

The callers claim they have a special relationship with your credit card company and can negotiate a lower inter-

est rate for you. Typically, they will request an upfront fee before they will negotiate on your behalf. Only, you pay the fee and never hear from them again.

If there's a fee, it's a scam. The Federal Trade Commission prohibits companies who sell these services from charging an upfront fee.

As the cardholder, you have as much or more influence when negotiating with the issuer as a third party, so make the calls yourself.

Scammers may also seek your credit card information to make their own purchases on it, or sell it to other scammers.

If you are registered on the National Do Not Call Registry, telemarketers may only call you if you have agreed to accept calls from that company, have bought something from that company over the past 18 months, or have recently asked the company for information.

Be leery of any unsolicited, pre-recorded sales calls, especially if you registered your phone numbers on the

National Do Not Call Registry.

If your phone numbers are not on the National Do Not Call Registry,

register them at DoNotCall. gov. Registering your number will not stop fraudulent calls, but it will make them easier to recognize since most legitimate telemarketers do not call numbers on the registry.

And remember to never give your credit card or bank account information, Social Security number, or any other personal information to anyone who calls you unsolicited. Just hang up!



Send them your tick pics

Here's how the Department of Health tracks a common menace

In 2010, a lone star tick was found in a northeastern county in North Dakota. Lone star ticks were not thought to live in this part of the country at all and researchers wrote it off as a fluke.

"We thought 'Oh, it's a random lone star tick. That shouldn't be up here," Michelle Dethloff, manager of Health Department's Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity Program, said. "Maybe it fell off someone's dog who was visiting from the South. But we hear more anecdotal reports of finding this tick, we see more Facebook posts about finding this strange tick."

The first year there was any sort of tick surveillance undertaken in North Dakota was 2010, fueled by grant money from the Center for Disease Control and a partnership with the University of North Dakota and North Dakota State University. In 2012 and 2014, there were smaller projects done through grant money in the northeastern part of the state, but researchers at the Department of Health wanted to know more.

Lone star ticks, in addition to carrying ehrlichiosis and tularemia, might also be associated with causing meat allergies, though the CDC said they needed to research this association further. Before 2010, there was no indication lone star ticks were anywhere near North Dakota. Deer ticks, which carry Lyme disease, were known to be plentiful in Minnesota, but not thought to be a prevalent species in North Dakota.

"That information is really important for physicians to have when they are assessing individuals for tick borne diseases because previously the thought was 'These ticks are not in North Dakota. If you didn't go to Minnesota or somewhere else, you can't have Lyme disease," Dethloff said.

BREAKTHROUGH

The Department of Health had an interest in monitoring tick populations but didn't have an efficient way to do so until they encountered a presentation by a team in West Virginia at a national conference. This team had enlisted veterinarians across their state to send in ticks from pets so they could gather data. According to Dethloff, animals gather ticks easily because of their fur.

In August of 2016, a pilot program began using this methodology and the North Dakota Tick Surveillance Project was born. Over the past few years, the program has grown from using only a few veterinarians during the late part of the season to utilizing more veterinarians, Game and Fish Department officials and even zoos between April and December.

"Every year the data is accumulating and steering us where we need to go," Dethloff said.

LONE STAR OF

THE SHOW

According to Kristi Bullinger, Tick Surveillance Program Coordinator, the program was seeing some lone star ticks, but not enough to establish if they had a population hold anywhere. Researchers hypothesized that by mainly gathering ticks from pets, they might be missing their target population.

"The lone star tick would not typically gravitate toward pets that would go to the vet," Bullinger said. 'They are very aggressive to humans."

So they enlisted the public's help and began to ask people to send them pictures of ticks they find around the state. They were particularly interested in lone star ticks, which have a telltale white dot on their back. So far, three lone star ticks have been submitted to them through this program, two from this year and one photo that had been taken a few years ago.

WHERE TO LOOK

This year, researchers have also started to supplement their submitted tick data with tick surveys in the wild.

'It's where you go out actually with a cloth and drag it through a tick habitat to try to identify ticks," Dethloff said.

According to Bullinger, a county is considered to have an established population of a species of tick if six or more ticks are found in a single year in a single county in a single life stage or more than one life stage of a tick is found within a

Researchers say one of the bigger surprises they have encountered is how far west deer ticks seem to be living. Recently, a deer tick was found on a dog in Morton County that had not been traveling Of course, this tick could have been acquired from an animal that did leave the state, but Dethloff said this is the type of data that makes them dive further into an area.

The project tends to focus on counties where a lot of tick activity has been reported and try to gauge accurate numbers for those communities. Bullinger said the most underserved area is the northwestern part of the state.

In 2018, one lone star tick was submitted to the project from the southeastern region of the state. So far in 2019, deer ticks have been found in Benson. Cass, Eddy, Cavalier and Grand Forks counties. A lonestar tick was submitted from Stutsman County





The storm, reported to be ten miles deep and forty miles long, was a sporadic one, too. The Ashley Tribune reported that this "freakish" hail storm "oddly ... lifted here and there, sparing numerous fields, while others nearby were almost totally destroyed." Near Kintyre in Emmons County, the storm cut a path four miles wide and twenty miles long through some fields, putting farmers at a 100 percent loss. Yet other farmers, especially in nearby Fredonia of Logan County only reported a three percent loss. Only one farmer near Fredonia reported extensive damage,

chunks the size of a man's

making this the sixth year in a row he'd been hailed out.

Heavy moisture accompanied the hail, with McIntosh County receiving one and three quarters inches of rain. High winds knocked out windows in homes in barns, and lightning started a farmhouse near Strasburg on fire. The storm continued through the night early into the next morning. The next morning, after the storm cleared, the sight many walked out to was that of broken windows, dented siding, trampled crops, and in some areas, ditches filled one foot deep with hail.

Two hundred loss claims were reported to the McIntosh County Auditor's office following the storm. It was a tragedy for many who were expecting a bumper crop, and many others who had plans to begin harvesting later that week. Kintyre postmaster Ed Ellingson commented on the destructive storm. "It's a sad sight after the finest stand that any of the old timers had ever seen."


