ND ag producers encouraged to share information

Last weekend's winter storm made a bad situation worse for many North Dakota agricultural producers.

"Though the best relief obviously would be warm, dry weather, NDSU Extension and the North Dakota Department of Agriculture want to help producers however we can," said Charlie Stoltenow, North Dakota State University Extension assistant director for agriculture and natural resources.

"County-based NDSU Extension agents have information about drying

grains that have to be combined at high moisture, setting equipment for best efficiency in wet situations, feeding cattle

in poor conditions and more," Stoltenow said.

In addition, producers are encouraged to contact their

county Extension agents to share their situations. This week, agents are completing a survey to provide a snapshot of the current situation. The results will help NDSU Extension and the Department of Agriculture better target information and search for potential assistance.

"We realize this is a stressful time, so we encourage farmers to take care of themselves as much as possible," Stoltenow said. "Talk to someone about your situation to get it off your chest. That may be a family member, friend, faith leader or the state 2-1-1 help line."

North Dakota Commissioner of Agriculture Doug Goehring said, "The Department of Agriculture is pleased to partner with NDSU Extension to provide resources that assist

berries spread east to the Arabian Peninsula, Europe and the U.S.

Coffee and health

Although too much coffee may leave you feeling "jittery," a moderate amount (about 3 cups daily) has a neutral or positive effect on health. However, overconsumption of caffeine may result in headaches, nausea, anxiety and restlessness. Be aware of how caffeine affects you to determine a personal tolerance level.

• **Blood pressure:** Drinking coffee has led to a short-term increase in blood pressure in individuals with high blood pressure. However, research suggests no long-term increase in blood pressure in individuals with or without high blood pressure. Also of note is that individuals with uncontrolled high blood pressure should avoid large amounts of coffee because this can have a negative effect on blood pressure.

• **Metabolic syndrome:** Metabolic syndrome is a general term for a combination of conditions. These conditions include abdominal obesity, high cholesterol, high blood pressure and high blood sugar. Individuals with metabolic syndrome are at an increased risk of developing diabetes and cardiovascular disease. Coffee contains a complex protein and various compounds that have been shown to improve blood sugar control and decrease the risk of heart attacks, strokes and other heart-related conditions.

• **Diabetes:** Coffee has been shown to lower the risk of Type 2 diabetes for men and women. Surprisingly, decaf coffee has the same effects on blood sugar as regular coffee: Both have been shown to improve blood glucose control in individuals.

• **Parkinson's disease:** The caffeine in coffee consumption has been shown to reduce or delay Parkinson's disease development. Specifically, individuals who consumed about 3 to 4 cups of coffee per day maximized the benefits from coffee.

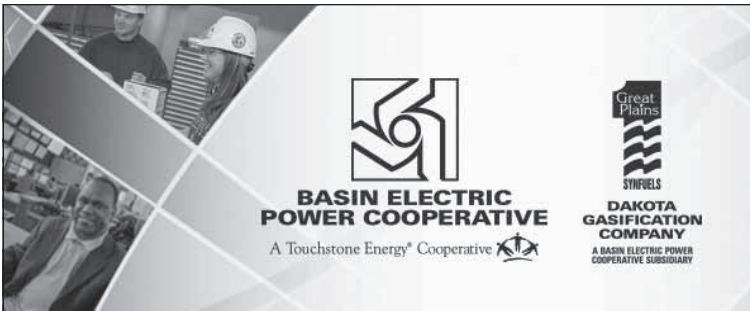

Chicken Alfredo lasagna

- 15 lasagna noodles
- 2 cups chopped fresh spinach
- 3 cooked and seasoned chicken breasts, diced
- 2 (16 ounce) jars Bertolli Alfredo sauce
- 4 cups shredded mozzarella
- 1 pint ricotta cheese
- Salt and pepper to taste

Add pasta to lightly salted boiling water. Cook for 8 minutes. Drain. In medium bowl, combine diced chicken and one jar of sauce. In separate bowl combine ricotta with spinach. Spray 9x13 pan with Pam. Pour a small amount of the other jar of sauce to lightly cover bottom of pan. Place 5 noodles over sauce, overlapping some. Spread chicken/Alfredo mixture over noodles. Sprinkle 1 C mozzarella over chicken. Top with another layer of noodles. Spread spinach/ricotta mixture over noodles. Pour about 1/2 of remaining jar of Alfredo sauce over spinach mixture. Sprinkle another C of mozzarella over sauce. Lay 5 more noodles on top. Then pour remaining Alfredo sauce, salt and pepper to taste, and the last 2 cups of mozzarella. Bake 50-60 minutes or until top is brown and bubbly.

Summer salad

- Mix together:**
- 1 Bag prepared Romaine lettuce
 - 1 Can Mandarine Oranges
 - 1/2 Purple Onion; sliced
 - 1 Pkg Raman Noodles - Discard Seasoning
 - 1 Pkg Sliced Almonds
 - Poppy Seed Dressing

- Mix dressing:**
- 1/3 Cup Sugar
 - 1/2 Cup White Vinegar
 - 1 tsp Salt
 - 1 tsp Dry Mustard
 - 1 Cup Olive Oil (No Substitutes)
 - 1 Tbsp Poppy Seeds

Toss salad and dressing together and let stand for an hour to mix flavors.

Italian tomato sandwiches

- 8 ounces cream cheese softened
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- 1/4 cup sour cream
- 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup Italian shredded cheese or mozzarella cheese
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 1 loaf French baguette (sliced about 1/2 inch thick)
- 3 Roma tomatoes diced
- Curly parsley finely chopped

In a small bowl, mix the cream cheese until it is smooth. Add the garlic, sour cream, cheeses and Italian seasoning. Mix until well combined. Refrigerate for 1-2 hours. Spread a layer of garlic cheese spread on each slice of bread. Top with the diced tomatoes and the chopped parsley. Refrigerate until serving.

Antipasto skewers

- 10 oz. cheese tortellini
- 1/2 cup Kraft Zesty Italian salad dressing
- 1/2 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 50 kalamata olives
- 25 green olives
- 50 grape tomatoes
- 50 thinly slices of salami - I used Calabrese
- 25 marinated baby mozzarella balls
- 100 spinach leaves can substitute basil
- 25 12-inch wooden skewers

Cook tortellini according to package directions. Drain and rinse with cold water. In a sealable container, combine the tortellini, dressing, and seasoning. Refrigerate for 1-4 hours, stirring the contents a few times. Gather remaining ingredients when ready to assemble skewers. There will most likely be leftover tortellini so grab tortellini directly from the container and put it on the skewer. Fold the salami slices into fourths. Fold the spinach leaves in half. Thread the wooden skewer the following way: kalamata olive, tomato, spinach, tortellini, spinach, salami, cheese, tortellini, spinach, salami, green olive, spinach, tomato, kalamata olive.
