PRAIRIE FARE

"How scientific do you want to be?" my husband asked.

I set the tray at the fast-food restaurant in front of him.

"I just want to be objective," I replied.

I didn't have a sensory evaluation booth handy, where we could change the lights to

disguise the sandwiches. I had seen an ad for the plantbased "burger" on TV and I wanted to try it. The sandwiches were heavily promoted in 2019, and the "buzz" has settled a bit.

I purchased one sandwich with a plant-based patty. The other sandwich had a beef patty.

I unwrapped the two sandwiches and we studied them. They looked almost identical. However, the plantbased patty didn't look quite as succulent and glistening as the one on TV.

Actually, neither of the

sandwiches looked as good as the ones on TV or on the posters in the restaurant.

Both sandwiches were the same size, with the same sesame seed-studded buns. When I lifted the upper bun, I noted the sliced tomatoes, onions, lettuce and the layer of mayonnaise on each.

I cut the sandwiches in half so each of us could taste and compare them.

If anyone was watching us study our food, they probably thought we were a peculiar

I guess we are kind of eccentric now and then.

Most people have heard of plant-based "meat alternatives," also known as meat analogues, meat substitutes, mock meat, imitation meat, fake meat or other terms.

In full disclosure, my husband and I are "omnivores." We eat almost any food, whether it is plant- or animal-based. Neither of us would be considered a "picky" eater.

I sniffed both sandwiches, and each had a distinctive charbroiled aroma. My husband took the first bite and I watched his

"It's not offensive," he noted after tasting the plant-based sandwich.

I chuckled at his comment, which would make food scientists cringe. I'm sure they were going for "delicious." I glanced at him, so he clarified his remark.

"It's actually not bad," he added.

That was a true Midwestern comment. Does "not bad" mean "pretty good"?

I cut a piece of the plant patty away from all the toppings and slowly chewed it. I found the plant patty to be chewier and drier than the beef patty.

We agreed that the plant patty had a more charred flavor. The char-broiled stripes looked to have been applied in some way. The plant patty also seemed saltier to my taste buds.

In all fairness, the restaurant's beef patty wasn't as flavorful or juicy as the burgers we cook on our backyard grill,

The plant-based sandwich was more expensive by about

Here was the real test for the purpose of this column. Was one sandwich more healthful than the other?

Not really.

The plant-based sandwich had about 630 calories, with 34 grams of fat and 25 grams of protein, while the beef-based sandwich had 660 calories, 40 grams of fat and 25 grams of protein. In other words, nutritionally they were similar.

We were correct that the meatless sandwich had more sodium per serving, with about 300 milligrams more than the beef-based sandwich.

In other words, you are not going to lose weight by making this swap, and you are not going to do your blood pressure any good with the extra sodium. Compare the nutrition facts on your food choices, and check out the ingredient list.

Almost every week in this column, I promote eating more vegetables as part of the current nutrition recommendations.

We should fill half of our plates with fruits and vegetables, with the goal of at least $4 \frac{1}{2}$ cups of produce daily.

I'm not going to change that recommendation this week. Only about one in 10 adults meets the daily recommendation for plant foods. However, is swapping in plant-based "burgers" the answer to a more healthful diet?

I don't think so.

The plant-based "burgers" contain many ingredients, compared with the animalbased counterparts.

The ingredient statements on meat alternatives (depending on the brand) usually list a combination of soy protein, pea protein and/or rice protein, various vegetable oils, cornstarch, binding agents (so the ingredients stay together), salt, spices, natural and artificial flavorings, colorants, and added vitamins and minerals.

The ingredient statement on a package of beef at the butcher counter would state

"beef." The protein, vitamins, minerals, flavor and color are naturally present.

If you want more plant protein in your diet, enjoy some soy-based tofu in a

vegetable stir-fry, fiber-rich split pea soup, savory hummus dip (from

chickpeas) and beans of all types in soups, salads and casseroles. Visit

information with accompanying recipes, including the mentioned ones.

Think about your eating pattern. Do you include foods from all the food groups?

Consider setting a goal for yourself. If you want to try something different,

here's a fiber-rich recipe my student interns made using canned black beans.

They were "pretty good," as

Homemade Black Bean "Burgers'

1 (20-ounce) can black beans, drained and rinsed

3/4 tsp. minced garlic

1 1/4 tsp. chili powder

Salt and pepper to taste

1 large egg, beaten

1/3 c. plain bread crumbs

Mash beans thoroughly in a large bowl. Mix in garlic, chili powder, salt, pepper and egg. Stir in bread crumbs. Shape into four patties; you can refrigerate them if they are not very firm (up to one day ahead). Spray skillet with nonstick spray and heat on medium heat. Add the burgers and cook uncovered until hot. If storing for later, allow to cool, then freeze on a baking sheet for an hour or until frozen. Transfer to a freezer bag. When ready to use, defrost and cook in a skillet.

Makes four servings. Each serving has 180 calories, 2 grams (g) fat, 11 g protein, 30 g carbohydrate, 9 g fiber and 270 milligrams sodium.




So after the shaking hands

50 pheasant flies: Crazy Charl

The Crazy Charlie is a simple but well-known shrimp imitator that populates the fly boxes of die-hard flats anglers pursuing bonefish, permit and other saltwater species and is usually tied sparkly, light and translucent to match those warm-water crustaceans. For northern anglers, it does double duty in smaller sizes for crappies, white bass and perch and is often tied in silver or gold to mimic minnows. With a few simple pheasant-based tweaks, however, it becomes a dynamite darker pattern for connecting with spring smallmouth. The pheasant version of the fly is easily tied with the bird's marabou and rump feather fibers

and always triggers a bite, (1). Once secured, tie in a a few long-fibered rump imitate a fleeing crayfish moving something like a crayfish and always looking edible.

Supplies:

Hook: Gamakatsu SS12 (Size 6-1)

Thread: Brown 3/0

Eyes: Dumbell Eyes

Body: Wrapped Larva

Underwing: Pheasant Marabou

Overwing: Pheasant Rump Feather Fibers

Start the fly by securing the hook in the vise and laying down a base of thread and tie in the dumbbell eyes

five-inch strand of Larva Lace along the top of the hook shank and up the curl of the bend, before advancing the thread back to just behind the dumbbell eyes (2). Wrap the Larva Lace forward so each segment touches the previous one until it reaches the thread; at that point tie the ribbing off securely and trim the excess, advancing the thread in front of the dumbbell eyes (3).


Select a pinch of pheasant marabou, it can be black, brown-tipped, cream shaded or one of the variety of other dark hues found on a rooster's cape. Tie the marabou feathers in just in front of the dumbbell eyes to form the underwing, making a slight taper toward the hook eye (4). Next select

feathers - orange, green or gold, whatever is desired as an accent color - and remove the fibers from the stem of the feather. Tie them in over the pinch of marabou to form the overwing and provide a solid top line in the fly's profile, again tapering the wraps toward the hook eye, forming a thread head (5). Build the wraps up slightly, whip finish and epoxy the thread head and the fly is complete (6).

The Crazy Charlie is quick and easy to put together and fishes just as simply in the water. Use bead chain eyes for a slower fall and a lighter presentation and heavier dumbbell eyes to get the fly down in the water column faste`r. Work it with a series of lifts and pops to

and let it tumble back down to the bottom just like the real thing would. Wait for the strike and hold on tight, especially when smallies are on the feed in spring and summer.

Adjust the color of the ribbing going from bright orange to olive to deep purple to imitate a variety of shades seen on crayfish and other similar previtems in the natural world. Any hues in a favorite bass jig's skirt will help turn bronzebacks with this pattern so experiment with some go-to tints. The Crazy Charlie can cover the gamut of species from saltwater to freshwater and from north to south. Tie a few dozen up and get ready for a great season on the long rod!

Another photo we received also showed a family all together. This one showed a day at work. No one was spotless and dressed up for the photo. They were in work clothes, ankle deep in a corral, obviously taking time from their work with cattle. All four children were "suited up" ranch-hand style, some holding a "Hot Shot" for encouraging cattle to move

County getting bids for active shooter drill

McLean County is seeking bids to conduct a large-scale active shooter drill.

The drill will be funded by a grant the county received in September. The total amount of the Homeland Security grant is \$27,900.

A portion of the grant will cover the purchase of a new metal detector for the Courthouse. The metal detector, costing \$12,995, can identify even powered-off devices and is mobile.

"It can search inmate beds and everything," Commissioner Steve Lee said.

Emergency Services Director Noelle Kroll said the remaining \$16,000 will be put toward an active shooter drill.

The county commission approved a motion Tuesday to proceed in seeking bids for conducting the drill. No timeline has been set for the exercise.
