You can have a Campfire in a developed recreational site or improved site, while always keeping an eye on it. You can use grills and units that have an on/off switch in an area that you can safely operate without starting a fire.


Remember even though you are allowed some options to burn this doesn't absolve an individual or organization from liability or responsibility for any fire started by the allowed activity.

AND REMEMBER...

ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN BAN IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10.1) PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF UP TO \$1500 AND 30 DAYS IN JAIL. THE MERCER & OLIVER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS ARE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS.

Volunteers answer a local call

All around the world, people are putting on masks.

Some people have been doing it for quite a long time. In fact, problems have emerged in places like New York, with shortages of masks for medical and health care providers due to COVID-19's widespread nature sapping up the N-95 respiratory masks and worried residents early stocking up on masks for their own protection.

Now, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is recommending citizens wear non-medical cloth masks if they need to go out in public. But even before this announcement, several residents throughout the county have begun making basic masks to help out those in need.

It's a groundswell of local response to this major cause here in our own small, rural area. It ranges from individuals with a knack for sewing and a heart for service, to community organizations and church groups seeing this as a way to come together (in spirit and purpose, if not actually physically) while addressing a major need.

Several members of the Common Threads Quilters Guild, which meets in Hazen, have taken up the cause of preparing masks.

"Because of personal distance, everyone has to do it at home," Peggy Cahoon, one of the guild members, said. She was contacted by Buffalo Hill Veterinary Clinic and has made some masks for them.

Another member, Joell Neumiller, a Stanton resi-

"I've made over 100 of them already," she said Friday. "They're simple ones, no wire, no filter, mine are just plain."

Neumiller said her masks are pleated, going over the nose and mouth and down below the chin, with elastic around the ears to hold it on. She said the top is cotton and the bottom a light flannel material.

Neumiller said she received a thank you from the hospital, where 35 of the masks had been delivered. She's started giving them to people in Stanton who need them.

"I think it's a changing world, we'll all be wearing them," she said. "I'll keep making them."

In the rural Zap area, sewing masks has become a kind of family enterprise. Dorothy Simenson, 93, has a passion for sewing, and she's now using that passion to help out.

"I've been making welding caps for the plants since 2000, now I switched to making face masks," she said. "Being I bought all the cotton for the welding cap, I have a whole lot of material."

Dorothy Simenson isn't working alone. Her son Richard and his wife Aloha, who also live in rural Zap, are also involved. The family is well aware of the need for masks, and found they had the material, the time and the will to help.

Richard found a pattern online, and the family has been able to work together with the supplies they have to make dozens of masks.

"She's accumulated years and years of cotton mate-

For his part, Richard has used his machine for repairing clothes for many years. Now, he's found a new use for his hobby.

"Last year I was making caps for Zip to Zap, and this year, I'm making masks," he laughed. "Who knew?"

Richard said the family is currently working on two different patterns, due to the materials they have on hand. Dorothy is doing a two-ply material, with two layers, while Richard is making his with three mate-

"We know that these things are not going to be bullet-proof for stopping the virus," he said. However, the more layers, the better chance of protection, something Richard stressed and which the CDC recommends for the non-medical cloth masks used by the public.

Richard said he's also moved from the elastic band around the ears to a modified mask with Velcro around the neck.

"As long as we have material, we'll make them," he said. "I enjoy doing it cause I think it's for a real important cause."

Richard emphasized that, while the masks can be reused, they must be properly laundered between uses.

"They should be treated as a hazardous material when you take them off, until you clean them," he said. "Put in a container of mild bleach and water, or at least a 50/50 mix of alcohol and water, then dry them." He added people should not forget to sanitize the masks

Three ladies from Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Beulah are also answering the call. Larue Schwarz, Karen Knell and Lynda Doe have worked together to sew for the church in the past. Now they decided they could work together, even from their own respective homes, to help out.

'So far we've made some for the hospital and for the

[Knife River Care Center]," Schwarz said. Like Neumiller, Schwarz said her masks are 100 percent cotton on one side and 100 percent flannel on the other.

Having run out of elastic, Schwarz got creative, cutting inch-and-a-quarter strips of material diagonally to make ties for the actual masks.

'We don't meet together, but we call each other just to break the monotony," Schwarz said, with the total number of masks made by the three ladies having exceeded 100.

Sakakawea Medical Center and Coal Country Community Health Center CEO Darrold Bertsch said the willingness of these individuals and groups to reach out to the local health care providers is encouraging.

"You hear all across the country that there is a shortage," he said. "When they offered to make some, we said, 'Certainly.'

Currently, the hospital is still able to get some of the N-95 and surgical masks that provide their direct caregivers with the most protection. However, they are using the donated cloth masks for other employees not involved in direct care, such as office personnel.

In addition, Bertsch said while health care workers will always prioritize the official FDA-approved masks, in the event of the national shortage impacting local hospitals and clinics, there would still be an option for some level of protection.

"We really appreciate people thinking outside the box," Bertsch said.

COVID - 19, JUST THE FACTS

There is still a lot of confusion about what happens in the process when a person is declared positive, and then who really is contagious.

Once a person is confirmed positive, Local public health gets a call with only the information

of County of residence (Listed on the test form), age and gender. We do not get any other information, but even if we did we could not share that...due to HIPAA. Local Public Health Units, as well as others trained to do case investigation, will then start to get close contacts.

A close contact is someone that has been within 6 ft of a person for more than 15 minutes. So a person that is a casual contact or perhaps in a building would not be considered a contact.

Only people that are considered close contacts will be notified, and asked to self-isolate for 14 days. They are followed by their case investigator every day for 14 days to



follow symptoms. They are not considered contagious until they get symptoms, at which time they would be tested. At that time, the process would start over, meaning they would be asked their close contacts, and followed for that 14 days.

A facility would not have to close, if someone was "in their facility, or a person was related to someone that worked there" etc...

At this time, unless we call you, you are not considered a close contact, and thus not exposed. The reality is that COVID is out there, and everyone needs to continue to take precautions. We will persevere!






