GARDENING TIPS Spring lawn care BY BEV JOHNSON M.G.

Now that the snow is gone, vou are able to see all the grass problems you ignored last summer. Dead patches smaller than a dinner plate will fill in by themselves. If the patches are bigger, it depends on the soil. if it is very sandy or heavy clay, get thee to the nearest place that sells garden supplies and invest in one or more bags of garden soil, not potting soil. Dig up several inches of bad soil and add the garden soil. Now plant your seeds and mulch with a light layer of straw or grass clippings. Keep the area well watered and resist mowing until it is so high and unruly that you just must cut it, about 4 inches. A good mix for this area is blue grass, red fescue and chewing fescue. (No, it doesn't chew anything. Perhaps someone had indigestion when they named it. I don't really know.)

If the whole lawn is thinner than your hubby's thinning hair, spread about an inch of good compost all over it then over seed. Planting white clover in with the grass will add nitrogen to your soil and as an added benefit, it feeds the pollinators. Much of the honey sold is clover honey, for a good reason. It is very light colored and mild flavored. If you like a little more kick to your honey, try basswood honey. It's dark and lets you know its honey.

If you didn't have problems with grubs the last 2 years, you may have them this year. They are on a 3 year cycle. You will know its grubs if you see a dead patch and you can pull the whole patch up with little effort. The grubs have eaten all the grass roots off. If you don't notice this problem, you will probably notice what follows—skunks. They love grubs and will happily dig up your grass to get to them. Crows seem to smell grubs too as they have a great time scratching up grass to get to them. The end result is a well tilled up lawn.

Before you start mowing, be sure the mower blades are sharp. Dull blades just tear the grass blades leaving the grass looking gray and open to diseases. Cut high!! At least 3 inches. it looks better and is much better for the grass. Taller grass shades out some of the weed seeds too. Leave the clippings on the grass. It is good for your lawn. The cut grass has a lot of food value. Of course, if the layer is too thick it needs to be picked up to prevent killing the lawn you have babied.

Don't panic about a few weeds. You aren't a golf course. A mix of plants is much healthier than a monoculture of just one type of plant, including grass.

If you are attempting to get a good stand of grass in the shade-forget about it! It just is not going to happen. Either encourage moss, plant a ground cover or mulch the whole area. Native blue violets will do nicely in most shaded area, and once you get them growing, they reseed readily. Free plants. What could be better.

Don't agonize over your lawn. After all, its just ground cover.

DAKOTA GARDENER-Trees in the Spring - What to Expect

Trees may have suffered from winter injury or damage from rabbits, voles and deer.

North Dakota is a big state. In some places, trees are just beginning to bud out, while in other locations, they're already done flowering and leaves have nearly fully expanded. Winter has barely left the northeast while spring arrived in the southwest awhile ago.

What can we expect to see in our trees this spring?

A lot can happen to trees during the winter. Conifers often suffer from "winter injury," a general term that encompasses symptoms from a number of causes. Sometimes, winter temperatures were simply too cold, or perhaps

we had a warm, sunny, windy day that dried out conifer needles, or maybe we had a three-day warm spell that was followed by temperatures quickly plummeting back to negative numbers.

Any one of these scenarios can cause branches, needles or parts of needles to die. You can do very little about this damage after the fact. Fortunately, the damage is usually minimal and the trees will recover on their own.

Trees can lose up to a fourth of their leaves (or needles) without suffering any stress at all. That's an incredible biological feature of trees that just blows me away whenever I think about it.

Another thing that emerges as the snow melts away are signs of damage from rabbits, voles and deer that were trying to survive the cold. Branches or entire stems can be girdled

when these hungry critters peel the bark back to get at the sugar-rich tissue underneath.

This often spells doom for the tree. The leaves might flush out in the spring, but growth is short-lived as the root systems quickly starve because they can get no food from the leaves. As a last resort, the tree might send up new sprouts from the base, trying to survive. These sprouts might be trained into new stems, but the tree will have to start almost from scratch.

Unfortunately, you can do very little about this type of damage as well. Pruning paints and wound sealants do not help the trees recover more quickly, nor do they keep out insects or diseases. Even if a tree is only partially girdled, your best option is to sit back and wait, and let the

tree recover on its own.

Once warmer temperatures arrive - and stay - we're expecting a third year of an outbreak of cankerworms. Caterpillars of spring cankerworm (Paleacrita vernata) and fall cankerworm (Alsophila pometaria) defoliated trees throughout those GDD vary widely across North Dakota during 2018 and 2019.

Many common insecticides can be effective against cankerworms, but timing is critical. These chemicals are useful when the caterpillars are still young; unfortunately, we usually don't notice the damage until it's too late.

However, we can use growing degree days (GDD) to predict roughly when these pests will

begin their feeding. Using a base temperature of 50 F, the same as that used to predict corn growth, cankerworms will begin feeding at about 148 GDD and can be controlled with insecticides from then until about 290 GDD.

The dates when we reach the state, so check out the North Dakota Agricultural Weather Network (NDAWN, https://ndawn.ndsu.nodak. edu) and utilize its Corn GDD app to track degree days in your locality. In fact, cankerworms likely already are feeding on trees in the southwest, so get out and scout for them if you live in this area.
