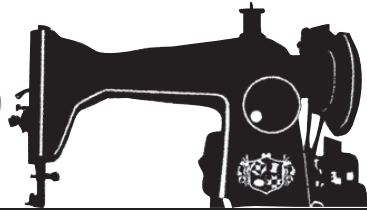

DAKOTA GARDENER

The right way to water your lawn

Can you enjoy a green lawn in summer without an expensive water bill?

This is a hot topic across much of North Dakota today. Let's discuss how you can make every drop of water count.

To keep your lawn green and growing, it needs about 1 inch of water per week from you, rainfall or a combination of both.

To measure how much is 1 inch of water, set a group of flat-bottomed cups at 5-to 10-foot intervals from the base of your sprinkler to the edge of its reach.

Measure the time an inch of water takes to fall in the cups. Use this as your base time.

• Water deeply. Giving your lawn a big gulp of water is better than giving it a series of sips. Roots grow where the water is. If you water deeply, you will develop a deep root system. On the other hand, if you only sprinkle the surface of the soil, you will create a shallow root system.

If you have a clay soil, irrigate only once or twice a week. Sandy soils can't hold a full inch of water, so we will need to split the application to two or three times a week.

Split applications are also a good idea if you see water running off from the lawn (for example, on a sloped landscape). We want the water to be absorbed and not run off.

• Water in the early morning. The grass plants will be active and will absorb the water they need. Any extra water will evaporate, keeping the grass blades dry and preventing diseases. Watering during the middle of the day is not recommended because

much of the water you apply will evaporate before the plants absorb it. Watering in the evening is not recommended because the lawn will stay wet all night, leading to diseases.

• Mow properly. This makes a big difference. Mow tall and let the grass clippings fall. Tall turf naturally develops a deeper root system. The tall grass blades and the grass clippings will shade the soil, keeping it cooler and conserving moisture. The first lawns that turn yellow in a neighborhood are lawns that are cut short and where clippings are collected.

• Monitor your automatic timer. These "set it and forget it" systems are convenient, but they sometimes irrigate the lawn when it's not needed. Only irrigate when the lawn is dry. Don't irrigate when rain is falling or when rain is expected. Rain sensors and soil moisture sensors are available that prevent irrigation systems from running when rain is falling or when the soil is moist.

• Improve your soil. Adding organic matter can help. The next time you aerate the lawn, fill in the holes with some compost or peat moss. In clay soils, this organic matter will open the soil, helping water infiltrate rather than run off.

In sandy soils, this organic matter will help the soil hold onto the water before it drains away.

• Use the natural alternative. You have the option of not watering your lawn at all. Your lawn will turn yellow gradually and go dormant. Going dormant under intense heat is natural for lawns. Lawns will turn green again in the fall when temperatures cool.

Whether you irrigate your lawn or not, you can have a healthy lawn without breaking your bank account. Irrigate only when needed and make every drop count.

Isaak trial denied relocation

The jury trial over a quadruple homicide in Mandan last April will not change venues, as the judge presiding over the case denied a request by the defendant this week.

Judge David Reich denied a motion on July 1 to change the venue of Chad Isaak's trial. Isaak faces four counts of Class AA murder in the deaths of RJR Maintenance and Management employees.

The motion to change venue, citing publicity regarding the murders, was paired with a motion to suppress evidence.

Reich denied the motion to change venue, meaning the trial set to start Nov. 30 will take place in Morton County.

Isaak owned Isaak Chiropractic in Washburn prior to his arrest on April 4, three days after RJR owner Robert Fakler, and employees Adam Fuehrer, William Cobb and Lois Cobb were found dead at the RJR office in Mandan.

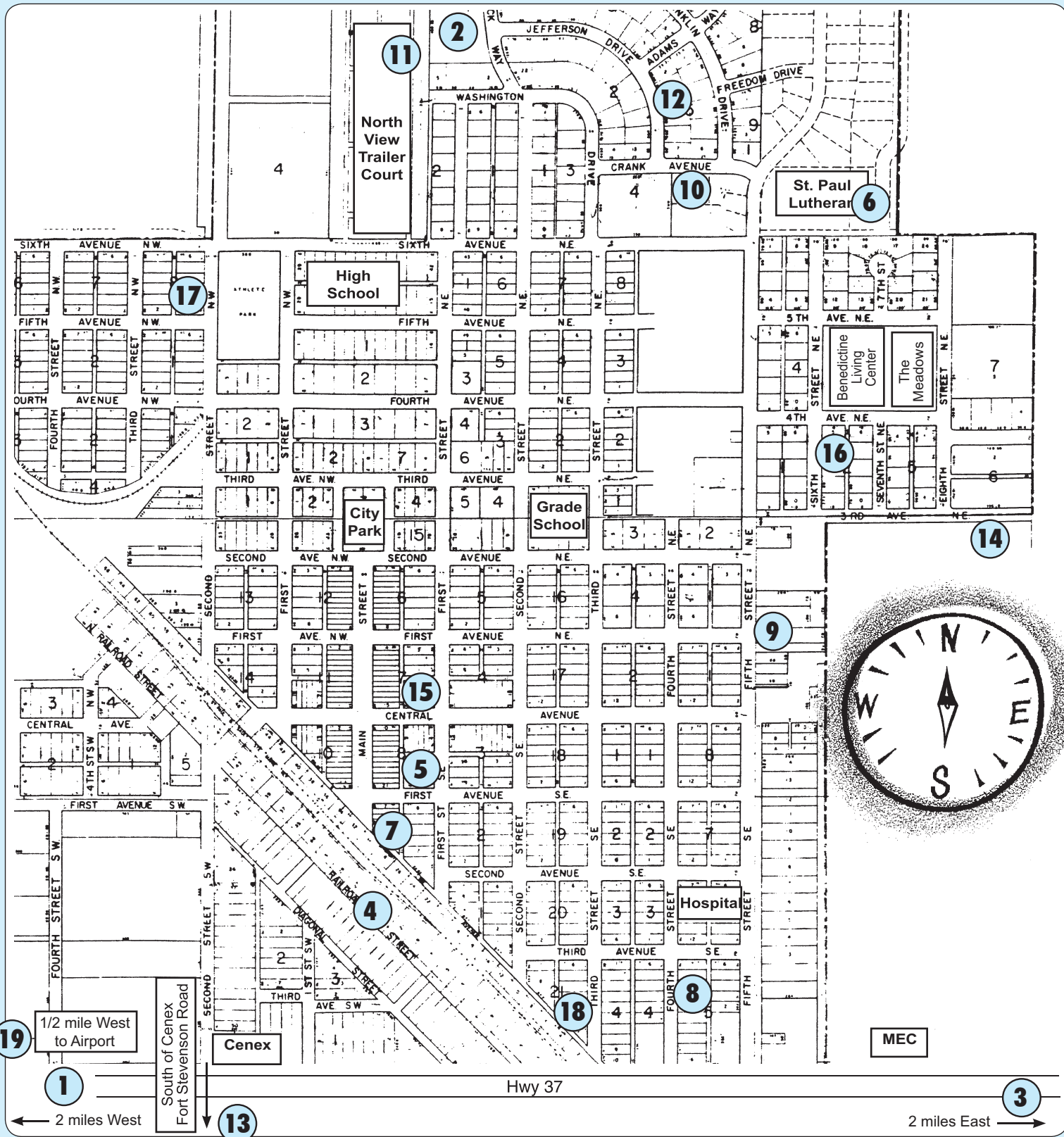

GARDENING TIPS

Brown leaves on your trees?

This is the time of year that the Extension office starts getting calls about brown spots on trees. This is a fungus disease that is most noticeable on oaks, maples and ashes, the 3 trees that are most often found in our yards.

This disease is called anthracnose. It is host specific, that is different though related fungi infect each tree. In other words, if your oak has this problem, your maple will not be affected by that fungi.

Rainy weather, moderate temps and humidity create ideal weather conditions for the spread of the anthracnose spores which spread by splashing water and wind. The young developing leaves are the most susceptible. Spring is the most common time for the homeowner to notice the brown blotches on his trees. However the trees can be affected later in the season if we get a run of rainy weather. Hot dry weather will stop further infections.

You will notice the infection first on the lower and inner canopy of the tree. If the twigs get the infection they can develop cankers and dieback. This can cause excessive twig growth below the dead buds.

Oak anthracnose will attack most oak species. You will notice brown to blackish lesions on the new leaves particularly along the veins and leaf edges. Or they may cover the whole leaf. The affected leaves curl and may fall off. The first flush of leaves may be shed. The second set will be smaller and it too can be shed. This re-leafing is hard on the tree. It takes a lot of energy to grow a tree full of leaves the first time. To grow the second set stresses the tree. If the tree is infected 3 years in a row it will probably die. Don't confuse anthracnose with oak wilt. Oak wilt symptoms start on the top of the tree late in the summer.

Leaf symptoms in Maples are a little different. The leaves will have irregularly shaped light to dark brown lesions mostly along the veins and midrib of the leaf. The lesions can cover the leaf and cause blotching or even wilting of the leaf. The tree will shed the sick leaves. Sugar and Norway maples are the most common targets.

Sick ash trees shed leaves in early spring if infected. The infection on these leaves is totally different looking from the oak and maples. The lesions are the size of pin heads

to start with, then enlarge and cause the leaves to curl along the edges. Green ash is more susceptible than other ashes. Management is the same for all these trees. The fungi that causes anthracnose overwinters in twigs, fallen leaves, bud scales and other plant parts. The disease will reoccur every spring, to some extent, once the tree has been infected. You can reduce the infection with a few simple steps. Rake all fallen leaves, twigs and tree debris as soon as it falls. Bag or burn it. Never attempt to compost diseased tree debris as it won't kill the fungus. Prune your trees only in the dormant seasons, October to March. Prune to increase air circulation in the canopy. Keep your tree well-watered. It needs at least an inch a week. Don't sprinkle with a sprinkler that gets water on the leaves. This is the only case that fertilizer is recommended for trees. Usually they only need the fertilizer you put on the grass around them.

Don't panic if you find sick leaves on your trees. It is seldom fatal. The damage is usually minor. Now I tell you after scaring your pants off.
