OUR OUTDOORS

The Shed

My four-year-old son calls it an "adventure." Being of much slighter stature, and not as familiar with the rise and fall of the hillsides in the small drainage just outside of our housing development, the thirty-minute hike we take from time-to-time probably is a grand trek when perceived from his vantage point. With the top of the hills hayed in late summer, the open area above the brome-and-milkweed covered slopes with the public trail winding through the last stretch of undeveloped land gives him a chance to run around in the open, and with a little boost, he balances at the top of some of the bales along the fence line before jumping down to me.

Over the past three years, the houses have sprung up around the steep draws loaded with buffalo berry, elm, boxelder and oak trees and more and more people bike, hike and wander along the unposted draws from the time the snow melts in spring until it returns in winter. With the increased development, the number of pheasants, coyotes, whitetail and mule deer have also decreased in the same areas, which a decade ago, according to a friend, were often bow hunted by those sportsmen that knew of the close-by opportunity.

While it's likely that the steep hillsides will continue to serve as a series of nature trails for the public and eventually join those officially designated multi-use paths further down the valley, the amount of nature in them will continue decreasing with the development going on around them, up to the last usable edge.

The larger fauna — deer, coyotes, fox and the like have already made much of their move to the next draw up the new blacktop road, where only a plat of a future development exists at this time. The smaller stuff remains: squirrels, songbirds and the occasional owl that comes up and sits on the neighbor's house at three in the morning and hoots until dawn, before flying back down into the valley when I walk the dogs around the block.

It still remains a pleasant hike, particularly this time of year when the trees turn color and from a point at the far side of the walking path, the bottoms below begin to look like a river of yellow, gold, brown and red, and it provides entertainment and excitement for a preschooler as grasshoppers jump out of his way and the wind carries off

the payload from a well-shaken milkweed pod.

Sometimes though, it even holds a surprise, as it was the case for the both of us as I loaded my boy up on my shoulders to begin the walk through a stretch of Canadian thistle on the hillside between the terminus of the hiking trail and the beginning of the paved road that leads home. Coming up a rise along the barbed wire fence that hems in an old stock pond, I glanced down into the narrow trail used more now by neighborhood kids and less by deer and caught the glint of two white points sticking out from the grass at its edge. Setting my son down next to it, I asked him

what it was.
"Spikes!" he shouted as he quickly picked the shed fork antler up and parried off an invisible pirate or zombie, or perhaps a pirate-zombie.

So excited he was to have found the small fork he held it aloft and led the charge into battle as he again took his seat on my shoulders, shouting and whooping as we made our way toward home in the warm late afternoon sun. While he commanded his army from atop his steed, my mind turned to the antler, which at times dipped dangerously fast and close to my eyeballs. While I had seen deer in

the draw last spring and fall, I had never seen a buck, only a set of four mule deer does and the occasional whitetail doe and her fawn. Once in a while, I'd bump them from a resting place on the far side of the Y-shaped path, where they would tuck into the cattails in cold weather, but the only antlered deer I could recall in the area was a nice four-byfour muley that had wandered into the neighborhood a couple of firearms seasons back, likely seeking respite from the throngs of hunters to the north, and possibly an opportunity to continue his lineage during the annual rigors of the rut.

thought perhaps another outdoor-oriented father like myself may have stashed the antler there, along with a series of sheds for his kids to find. However, as I sharpened my view on the grass of the hillside to see if I could find its match, while my son transitioned from zombies to aliens as our enemyof-the-moment, we could not find its mate or any others. I then presumed the fork was what it was: a treasure left by one of the developing area's last residents on the move during a cold day in January or February.

It was a fortunate find, something tangible to tie my son to the outdoor experience which also provided me a moment to explain how it most likely got there. It connected him to the small slice of nature that remained in the valley, and gave me the hopeful idea that from time to time, antlered visitors to the suburban neighborhood and the wooded draws nearby would continue to be a part of our adventures to come...in our outdoors.

PRAIRIE FARE

"Mom, we forgot to bring the apple picker," my older daughter said as we stood on tiptoe next to the tree on a sunny autumn day.

An apple narrowly missed bouncing off my head as it dropped out of the tree. Yes, the apple picker would have come in handy.

We were trying to reach plump red apples from a heavily laden tree to donate to a local food pantry.

My daughter's comment reminded me of when my children were younger, giggling among the colorful leaves as they harvested apples. Sometimes they squabbled about who was in control of the apple picker.

Back then, my daughter added padding to the inside of the apple picker basket to pluck the apples without injuring their delicate flesh.

I recall the scent of cinnamon and sweet apples cooking in the kitchen after the harvest. We used fresh apples in delicious recipes, ranging from dried apple snacks and fruit leather to desserts.

Apples are a healthful and colorful option as a snack or dessert. On average, one medium apple with skin (3 inches in diameter) is a good source of fiber, vitamins and minerals for fewer than 100 calories.

Worldwide, about 7,500 varieties exist and 2,500 can be grown in the U.S.

Apples are widely available, t are they really good for us? Many times, apples are used as the symbol of nutrition.

Apples may help protect us from heart disease and cancer, but that is true of most fruits and vegetables.

Apples are naturally cholesterol-free and low in fat and sodium. Along with several vitamins and minerals, apples provide pectin, a soluble fiber that may help reduce or maintain blood cholesterol levels. Apples also provide health-promoting antioxidant compounds, especially in the

Try Some Colorful Peppers This Season

Several researchers have conducted studies to determine if apple extracts can reduce the risk of heart disease and cancer. The results have been promising as these two research highlights show.

Researchers analyzed the diets of 34,489 women between the ages of 55 and 69 recruited from the Iowa Women's Health Study. Amounts of flavonoids in foods were analyzed using the U.S. Department of Agriculture database because flavonoids are believed to have anti-inflammatory properties.

The researchers reported that consumption of apples, pears and several other plantbased foods was associated with a reduced risk of coronary heart disease and total cardiovascular disease mortality.

Another group of researchers studied the capacity of apple extract to reduce breast cancer using rats as an animal model. The dosage of apple extract was equal to one, three or six apples per day. They found that the number of tumors decreased with an increasing amount of the extract.

Apples are not only healthful but they are versatile ingredients. Grab a crunchy apple, rinse it well and enjoy it fresh.

Here are some other ways to make use of apples:

Eat more whole apples than juice. When apples are processed into juice, many of the health-promoting phytochemicals decrease; therefore, nutritionists advise eating more whole fruit than

Try making applesauce. Simply chop apples and cook in water for 10 minutes. Drain water, then make applesauce or mix with honey, cinnamon and butter for a sweet side dish

Add apple slices to your grill. Slice apples into 1/4-inch slices and brush with butter. Place on a grill and cook until grill marks appear. Remove and top with cinnamon or

Consider drying apples. Slice apples horizontally into 1/4-inch-thick rounds. Soak apples in lemon water for 30 minutes, then pat dry. Arrange apples in a single layer on baking sheets. Add a sprinkle of cinnamon if desired. Bake for two hours at 200 F. Turn off the oven and let apples sit in the oven for one to two hours as they cool further, until desired crispiness. Or use a food dehydrator according to the manufacturer's directions.

This recipe was adapted from "Alma's Favorite Recipes: Cooking and Memories from a German-Russian Farm Kitchen" in the Germans from Russia Heritage Collection at the NDSU Library.

Apple Kuchen Bars 7/8 c. canola oil (1 c. minus 2 Tbsp.)

1 c. sugar 2 eggs 2 c. flour

1 tsp. baking powder 1/4 tsp. salt

5 fresh apples, peeled and thinly sliced

Beat well with mixer. Put in greased jelly roll pan. Put a layer of fresh thinly sliced apples on the dough layer and then the filling.

Filling: 1 1/2 c. half and half

1 c. sugar

Cinnamon (sprinkle on top after baking, optional)
Bake at 350 degrees for

approximately 45 minutes until custard is set and crust is lightly browned. Allow time to cool before serving. Store leftovers in the refrigerator. Makes 28 servings. Each

serving has 190 calories, 8 grams (g) fat, 2 g protein, 26 g carbohydrate, 1 g fiber and 40 milligrams sodium.

Growing Garlic in North Dakota

Frost came early this year much too early for most of us. After a hard frost, our natural tendency may be to

put our gardens to bed.

But wait a second. We still have a few things we can plant now, including garlic. A little effort now canlead to amazing flavors in your meals next summer.

Fall is the season to plant garlic. Garlic is easy to grow, and home-grown garlic is crisp and zesty. Getyour bulbs now before they are all gone. Demand for bulbs is high this fall, and shipping delays mayoccur due to the COVID

Garlic types include hardneck, softneck and elephant. Hardneck types are hardiest and most suitablefor us in North Dakota.

'Music' is the most popular variety in the north. This selection from Canada is hardy and veryproductive. 'Music'

cloves are huge and flavorful, and store very well.

Garlic is cherished around the world, and many cultures have developed their own favorite varieties. Go online and you can find hardneck varieties from countries throughout northern Europe and Asia. Your local garden center is another good place to find bulbs.

Some varieties taste mild while others have bold flavors. Some varieties are prized for baking, whileothers are famous for roasting or frying. The cloves come in shades of white and purple, many withbright

Garlic is planted soon after the first hard frost, which is usually in late September or early October.

The cloves grow best in a rich, well-drained soil. Add an inch of compost to the site and 2 to 3 poundsof 10-10-10 fertilizer per 100 square feet. Work this into the soil.

Separate cloves from the bulbs a day before planting. Set cloves upright in the furrow, pointed end up,4 to 6 inches apart and 2 inches deep. Space rows 18 to 30 inches apart.

Irrigate deeply to activate the cloves. The cloves will push out roots and shoots this fall. Mulch with 4inches of straw or hay. This mulch will insulate the soil and protect the sprouted bulbs during the winter.

The sprouts will grow vigorously next spring and grow up to 3 feet tall. Harvest the flower buds (scapes)when they curl in June. Scapes are mild in flavor and taste great in stir fries. Harvest the bulbs in Julywhen the lower leaves turn brown.






