How did this Halloween tradition originate? A long and nteresting history on both ides of the AtlanticOcean underlies this tradition.
According to Irish folklore, "Stingy Jack" was a drunk with his deviousdisposition the devil sought to claim his soul. During two separate encounters, Jack managed toescape the devil's clutches hrough trickery.
In the first encounter he convinced the devil to ransform into a silver coin. He then placed the coinnext to a silver cross, thereby confining the devil. In another ncounter, he conned the evil intoclimbing a tree and crosses in the tree by drawing
asses in the tree bark.
After he died, both heaven Stingy Jack Dused to admit he darknetherworld the devil the darknetherworld, the devil to light the way. Jack then placed the ember in acarved
turnip. The lighted turnip became known as a jack-o'lantern and was used by the Irish andScottish to frighten wandering spirits during All Hallows' Eve
When the Irish and Scottish immigrated to the U.S., they tradition How-ower the tradition took on an American flavor and transitioned into the carving of large pumpkinsthat were in abundant supply

Pumpkins have an amazing history that even predates the Irish legend of Stingy Jack. They arebelieved to have originated in Central America but eventually were introduced into Mexico and thesouthern U.S.

Scientists found the remnants of ancient pumpkins in a cave in Oaxaca, Mexico. Archaeologicalevidence shows that pumpkins were cultivated approximately 7,500 to 9,000 years ago or even earlier. Therefore, this is one of the Wirstcult Nemisphere Western Hemisphere.
American Indians grew an integral part of their diet with each tribe havingunique, ways of preparing and drying the flesh. If your
If you are interested in
buying a pumpkin for your front porch, here are some tips for selecting a goodone that will last and not decay quickly:

Choose a pumpkin that has a hard rind; your fingernail will dent it but not puncture the rind.

Look for a hardened stem that is at least 4 inches long; the length of the stem helps with the curingor hardening process.

Do not carry the pumpkin by the stem.
Unfortunately, large pumpkins that are sold for that is not suitable for pie Interestingly, most canned pumpkin in the grocery store is actually Dickinson squash. Before you worry about a mislabeling controversy, you need to know that pumpkins and squash aregenetically very similar. If you are interested in growing heirloom Dickinson squash, seeds are availablefrom online specialty seed retailers.

## Upward Trends

Autumn is always a time of optimism for many hunters a opportunities for excitement abound over the top of each rise and in the shady depths of every creek bottom.
Putting the approach of winter aside, fall provides so much in the way of hopefulness in the pursuit of game that it is often hard to prioritize days go faster and faster as the ayson winds down. This year easonver there is even more to be excited about as numbers cross the board for those three things vital to the continued tradition of hunting sportsmen and their quarries are trending in an upward direction.
Habitat
With the passage of the most recent Farm Bill and the increase in acres allowed under the legislation's cap for acres in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP), 2020 saw the influx of applications for the retirement of marginal lands into set-aside programs
While helping operator better manage their acres and avoid wasted inputs like seed and spray, the uptick in land allowed under the cap wil landscape with the phased-in anrollment of up to 27 million acres in the program by 2023
Coupled with growin.
private lands initiatives and precision agricultura programs by non-government entities like Pheasants Forever and Ducks Unlimited that help producers maximize their farmable acres and find state and federal programs for thei marginal, riparian and nongrazeable lands, habitat which sustains wildlife throughout the state and the country is once again increasing. This trend helps to provide more carrying capacity for huntable game and non-game species alike, and to buffer agains the always-possible inclement a major negative influence on a major negative infuenc Access

Atcess
Adthe abund of itspopularity and the abundance of margina Dakota's Private Land Open to Sportsmen (PLOTS) program had more than 1.1 million acres available to public access in the mid-2000s. Paralleling the rise in CRP enrollments, the access program helped provide more opportunities to hunter throughout the state to get at the habitat that held the game animals they pursued. As CRP trended downward in 2010 so did the access that those enrolled in both the federal program and the state access plan.
Now, however, PLOTS has seen an increase not only in
total acres, but also in the
quality of land which is opened to hunters. Rarer now is the barren wheat field surrounded of the North Dakota Game \& Fish Department (NDG\&F) Fish Department (NDG\&F) strive to emsure a huntable contracts with landowners who grant access. With more than 800,000 acres part of PLOTS this autumn, hunters will find more opportunities and those of better quality on which to venture after pheasants, ducks, deer and other game.

Thankfully, for much of the state and the region, the winter survivable, and the spring and summer were temperate without too much rain or cold temperatures to inhibit the recruitment of young.

The NDG\&F reported upticks across the board for many game species in the state, including a 38 percent increase in pheasant numbersstatewide. Larger game like mule deer and pronghorn benefitted from an almost non-existent winter in the west, as their surveyed numbers increased seven and six percent respectively. whitetail numbers were up as of thousands more licenses for this year's firearms season to a recenthigh total of more than 69,000 firearms tags Add in a better breeding season for ducks and more grouse for ducks and more grouse seen on the landscape, and

## STRAWBERRY PRETZEL SALAD RECIPE

Ingredients
Crust Ingredients:
2 cups crushed pretzels
3/4 cup melted butter
3 tablespoon sugar
Filling Ingredients:
1 tub 8 oz, whipped topping, thawed
1 brick 8 oz, cream cheese, softened
1 cup white sugar
Strawberry Topping Ingredients:
2 packages 3.4 oz , strawberry jello
2 cups boiling water
20-24 ounces of frozen sliced strawberries thawed

Add pretzels, butter and sugar together in a mixing bowl. Mix well and press into a $9 \times 13$ pan. Bake at 350 for 10 minutes. Cool completely.
Filling Directions:
Beat cream cheese, whipped topping and sugar together in a bowl. Spread on top of crust. Refrigerate.

## Strawberry Topping Directions:

Mix jello and water in a bowl and mix until no longer grainy. Stir in strawberries and mix well. Refrigerate for about 2 hours. Pour mixture on top of cream layer and spread evenly. Refrigerate 4-6 hours or overnight.
Slice into $18-24$ slices. Store leftovers covered and in the refrigerator.

## NO BAKE ROCKY ROAD BARS

## Ingredients

3/4 cup peanut butter
1/4 cup unsalted butter cut into pieces
2 cups chocolate chips milk or semi-sweet or a combination of milk and dark chocolate
$11 / 2$ cups Rice Krispies
3 cups mini marshmallows

## Directions

Line an $8 \times 8$ or $9 \times 9$ inch square pan with parchment paper or aluminum foil and spray lightly with non-stick cooking spray. Leave an overhang around the edges.
In a large microwave safe bowl add the peanut butter, butter and chocolate chips.
Microwave for 45 -second intervals on medium power, stirring between each interval until everything is melted.
Stir until the mixture is evenly mixed together and allow to cool slightly for 5 minutes.
Stir in the Rice Krispies and marshmallows.
Pour the mixture into the prepared pan, spread into the corners of the pan.
Chill in the fridge for 3 hours or until set.
Lift the bars out of the pan using the overhang from the parchment paper or aluminum foil. Cut into squares and serve.
