

SCR 4001 will change Section 9 of Article III "Powers Reserved by the People" in the North Dakota Constitution. The Framework for North Dakota citizens to have the power reserved to initiate a petition to amend the century code, the constitution, referendum of a legislative bill, or recall certain elected officials.

When an initiative constitutional amendment has been approved by the voters it will no longer be considered enacted. The next legislative assembly will be required to hold Senate and House committee hearings on it before a vote on the final passage by the Senate and House.

My biggest concern is there is nothing in SCR 4001 to prevent the legislative assembly from changing the intent of the initiative constitutional amendment. It grants more power to legislators if the majority of them don't like the initiative constitutional amendment approved by citizens of North Dakota.

The bottom line is the super majority of legislators have been upset with the citizens of North Dakota for passing Marcy's Law, Medical Marijuana, and Ethics measures that were on the ballot measures in past elections.

The legislators do not like the citizens of North Dakota directing them what to legislate. They are going to be telling you about the amount of out-of-state money and out-of-state organizations influencing the process of the initiative petition.

The citizens of North Dakota need to ask the legislators why it's okay for them to accept out-of-state PAC money from corporations or organizations for their campaigns. Doesn't it influence how they vote on a Senate or House Bill?

Clay target league growth surges during pandemic

While many other fall sports saw participation decline or be cancelled outright due to concerns over the resurgent pandemic, the activities of trap and skeet shooting have grown by more than 25 percent in this unique time of returning to school in a hybrid or completely online setting. Able to conduct regular league shoots in a socially distanced and safe manner, the USA Clay Target League (USA CTL) has seen its participation jump to more than 10,700 shooters nationwide this autumn as a coming together of situational elements and the organization's growth-focused directives spurred more interest in shooting sports and a oneof-a-kind extracurricular activity to match the times. On top of the established trap and skeet leagues, USA CTL has also extended its offerings into five stand and sporting clays to provide more safe, outdoor extracurricular options to student athletes this fall.

"With the cancelation of many fall sports or even the uncertainty of fall sports, with clay target shooting it allows a risk free environment for kids to participate in," Nelson relates, citing the naturally social-distanced nature of a trap range and its outdoor setting.

Being flexible to the conditions and the times has helped the USA CTL increase the participation in its high school leagues this season, adding to the record-high autumn registration rate. Where high schools were once only allowed to join the competition in the spring, dozens of new high school teams were okayed to start their USA High School Clay Target League (HS CTL) programs in the fall. On top of that, to facilitate the everchanging societal conditions, USA CTL moved score submission and fee payment to the end of the season, just in case state and local restrictions changed and prevented competition for any team during the season.

"We offered a worry-free registration period, know-

ing the uncertainty of the schools and their decisions to offer clay target as a sport, we allowed kids to participate without any financial condition until the end of the year," Nelson explains, "we actually added some additional states and new teams to the fall league; previously we didn't allow new teams to join our fall league, but this year we allowed that simply because there were a lot of teams that weren't able to participate in spring," he concludes.

Similarly, the number of tech schools and universities taking part in the USA Clay Target League's college level competition, the USA

College Clay Target League (CCTL), has increased. This fall, Bismarck State College joined the post-secondary programs competing with nearly 40 junior colleges, tech schools, colleges and universities in the CCTL's fall league, nationwide. Currently, CCTL programs at the North Dakota State College of Science in Wahpeton, Lake Region State College in Devils Lake and the University of Jamestown are competing in the fall league. Nelson recognizes that many of those high schoolers are looking to see if their tech school or college selections offer a shooting sports program in which they can

Despite a virtual meeting, membership made an annual meeting possible

Mail-in ballots provided a quorum, allowing business to be held during a virtual meeting for Roughrider Electric Cooperative.

More than 880 ballots cast by the cooperative membership, who voted by mail-in ballot for the board of director elections, made this year's annual meeting possible. In a historic change about one week before the meeting, the Roughrider Electric board of directors voted during a regular board meeting to change the annual meeting from in-person to virtual, due to the elevated number of COVID-19 infections in Roughrider's service area.

Members could watch it live on Roughrider Electric's website www.roughriderelectric.com, thanks to broadcasting by cooperative friend Consolidated Telcom.

Chairman Roger Kudrna opened the meeting. "This year, the way we are uniting our members is different, but the goal remains the same: To give our members a voice, information about your cooperative, and multiple options for participating in your annual meeting in a way that is as safe as possible, given our current circumstances," he said.

During the business meeting, three directors were reelected to the board in each of the cooperative's districts. With no nominations received through the petition process, the following incumbents were reelected for another three-year term: Arnold Kainz in the West District, Greg Steckler in

the Central District and Dan Price in the East District.

Members also voted through mail-in ballot to approve the 2019 annual meeting minutes and 2019 financial report, which were presented in the annual report mailed to members in September.
