# OUR OUTDOORS

Progress Toward a Mess

By this point in the ice season, what was once a well organized ice house is now a disaster. Okay, well, not a complete disaster, but definitely showing the signs of use to a point where it needs a mid-season clean up.

Where at the end of December the well-worn unit was folded nicely, cleaned out and loaded into the bed of my pickup truck, containing the essentials — paper towels, hand-warmers, nonperishable field snacks and the like — now my flipover sled is uncovered and stashed haphazardly. Poles all akimbo and smelling slightly of the dehydrated minnow bodies and pieces of frozen herring scattered in the black base.

In the cold of evening, or the rush to a new spot, rarely is there time to organize the two-seat thermal unit. It's a sign of the seasonal progression that, while it may hint at my sometimes-unorganized nature, it also suggests use and therefore enjoyment of the outdoors.

There's a certain level of clutter, disorganization, and disorder that every season in the field or on the water brings, where I know where everything is, but not exactly where everything is. In those autumns, where repeat runs for grouse or pheasants are common, the back seat of the truck begins to not only smell like my oversized lab, but look like him as well with the coating of shed summer hair bringing on a slightly blond tint to the floor mats.

The kennel is merely there in case our last walk finds a swampy funk, or heaven forbid, a skunk somewhere along the way. I think we used it only on those weekday walks where my boys were in their car seats and things would have been a little cramped adding a 100 pound lab to the seating arrangement.

In the mix is a bag full of shells, a field collar, a water bottle and other items.

They're all usually back there somewhere from September to December, at times requiring a little searching.

Like the scattering of jigs, baits and other seasonal items in my ice shack, my fly-tying desk is mounting with materials as flash, feathers, fur and tools pile up as pattern after pattern is completed, adjusted, tweaked, then finalized and stashed in a fly box. Even the secondary desk is beginning to pile up with ingredients for recipes as I jump from one to the other, sneaking in some lure work as I join a Zoom conference on my computer.

Some areas of the surface space are so cluttered, I can set my scissors or whip finisher down after a fly or jig and then spend three minutes looking for the tool before starting up the next one. By the end of this month, I'll have piles six inches deep. That is, unless I break down and take an hour to reset and reorganize, which is typically a task best reserved for a rainy day in April.

While squeezing under the tarp of my boat and searching for a tool stored in the side compartment of the craft winterized and covered alongside the garage, I swept over the floor with the flashlight on my phone.

Relishing in the cleaning efforts undertaken late last summer, I was slightly amazed at how open and organized everything was. Tools were stashed in the elastic belt along the stern, wrenches, tackle boxes and other essentials were stored securely in their designated spaces on either side of the hull. The cleanliness of the craft had a calming effect, but also produced the desire for spring to hurry up and arrive so I could get back to the business of messing things up.

I knew that while I'd try to keep things clean, the fast-paced action in spring for crappies, walleyes, bass, and pike would quickly make the boat look more lived-in as opposed to the wintry state of sterile suspended animation which I found it in.

In the meantime, there was work to be done in tightening the bolts on the old sled shack in furtherance of making a mess which served the purpose of proverbially cleaning up on the next ice fishing adventure and continuing the progression ... in our outdoors.

I threw a can out of the cab and pointed to the tack room where my two mousers sleep on a heated pad. They lie in wait for a mouse that may or may not come along. There hasn't been a mouse in there for years. But there is dry cat food, a can of moist food in the morning, and a heated pad. It's a cat's life.

People talk about the good old days. They yearn for yesterday. And some people talk about how pretty winter days can be. They talk of how the prairies can look like an ocean! With waves! And how the sundogs can look so beautiful as they accompany the frozen sun on the eastern horizon! Poppycock.

What looks beautiful to me is a woman with insulated boots, carhart coveralls, a facemask, a rabbit lined cap, and mittens on opening the gate and chopping ice. I mean it even beats the Victoria's Secret catalog, or the Sports Illustrated swimsuit edition!

# ND Gives Town to MT DAKOTA DATEBOOK

Dakota Datebook written by Merry Helm

February 9, 2020 — On this date in 1966, word came from Bismarck that a North Dakota town was going to be given back to Montana.

At that time, Westby was a town of about 300 people on the northern North Dakota/Montana border. Residents had been used to thinking that they were from Montana, but between 1963 and 1966, the official state map of North Dakota showed it as belonging to North Dakota. Montana, however, maintained that Westby folks were still part of big sky country, and no emergency meetings were held.

The problem stemmed from out east – Minneapolis to be exact. An official state "base map" is made for North Dakota about every 4 years. The firm that held the map-making contract was out of Valley City, but they made the mistake of subletting the contract to a firm in you-know-where.

Douglas Walby, who was the chief draftsman for the North Dakota Highway Department admitted that he knew about the land grab, but said that Westby wouldn't be given back to Montana until 1967 when a

new base map would be made.

"We know about it and intend to correct it," he said. "We try to check the maps carefully each year, but in some instances, we're pressed for time and miss some errors."

When State Travel Director, James Hawley, was asked about the seizure of the poor little town, he said, "We think Montana people are fine individuals. We'd like to add them to our population since we're such a sparsely settled state, but we intend to give the town back to Montana next year."

To be fair, there is some honest confusion about who is what and what is whose. The town was only fifty years old at that point, and it honestly did begin as a North Dakota town – on July 1st, 1910, to be precise. But then the railroad – also from out east – came along in 1913 and built their rails two miles outside of town.

That didn't make sense, so almost everybody moved closer to the tracks, and suddenly Westby was in Montana. Now, one needs to remember that the town was named Westby... West because it was so far west in the state, and by, which is Danish for town. By all rights,

if Montana intended to keep the town, they should have done the proper thing and renamed it Eastby. But instead, Westby kept its name, and the old townsite became known as Old Westby.

With that kind of oversight, there was bound to be trouble. But when all is said and done, the town actually belongs to both states. Some folks built their homes on the right side of the tracks – that would be the North Dakota side – and those residents are actually North Dakotans. BUT... the post office is on the wrong side of the tracks, so everybody's official address is Montana.

Whichever, it's gotta be a nightmare for the IRS, which, come to think of it, also had its roots out east...

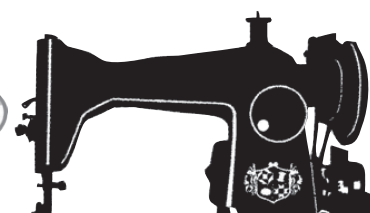

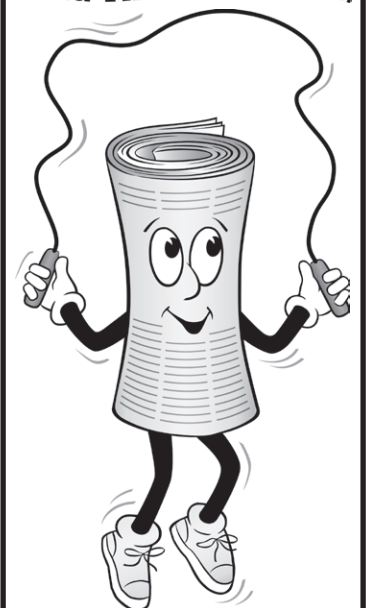

## Are You a Coffee Drinker?

"I have had the worst headache!" my friend said.

"I was so tired, too," she continued.

You can guess where my brain went. I began calculating the amount of time we had been in contact

and how close we had been sitting to each other.

"Can you smell and taste?" I asked.

"Yes," she replied.

"I went from having at least five cups of coffee to five cups of decaffeinated coffee," she responded. "I

didn't know my daughter only had decaffeinated coffee when I visited."

I was relieved she was just having caffeine withdrawal and not COVID-19. After going back to her daily

dose of caffeine, she was fine.

I can tell when I have too much or too little coffee, too. Two cups of coffee before noon is the sweet

spot for me. If I have caffeine after lunch, it interferes with my sleep and makes me jittery.

Some people can consume coffee all day without any effect. Do you know anyone who can fall asleep

with an empty coffee cup nearby?

Coffee has an interesting history. Humans were introduced to the effects of coffee by noticing animal

behavior. According to legend, early herders noticed that goats became very peppy

after consuming berries from certain bushes.

The herders brought the berries to a local monastery. Someone dared to taste them or, perhaps,

soaked the berries in hot water.

They found that consuming the berries kept people awake during evening prayers.

Perhaps the energizing effect of coffee beans launched early "coffee hours" in between religious

services in many denominations.

Coffee, in moderation, has some potential health benefits. In fact, some research studies have shown

that having three to five (8-ounce) cups of coffee is associated with a longer life.

Coffee drinkers may maintain their brain function and lower their risk of depression, certain types of cancer, Type 2 diabetes

and Parkinson's disease.

While some people worry that coffee increases their risk for the bone-weakening disease osteoporosis,

researchers have shown that moderate consumption of coffee will not harm your bones. In fact, you

can offset the risk by adding a couple of tablespoons of milk to your cup of coffee.

Be sure that you are consuming adequate calcium from foods and beverages, though. Check out the

Nutrition Facts labels to see the percent of the daily value for calcium that is contained

in the foods and beverages you choose.

Keep in mind, though, that coffee is not a magic elixir. You need an overall healthful diet and moderate

exercise for overall good health.

If you are a coffee drinker, what type of coffee do you enjoy? Do you prefer filtered, instant, light or dark

roast?

For example, using coffee filters when brewing coffee is a good practice. The filters actually remove

some components in coffee that could affect your blood cholesterol and triglycerides.

If you like instant coffee, be aware that this type of coffee does not raise blood cholesterol or

triglyceride levels.

Did you know that "light roast" coffee is not "lighter" in caffeine? It actually has more caffeine than dark

roast coffee.

Keep in mind that your 5-calorie cup of coffee can drastically jump in calories to 500, depending on

what you add to it. Cream, sugar, chocolate and whipped cream taste good but add calories.

Indulging regularly in high-calorie beverages could add weight to your frame. Just 100 extra calories a

day without counteracting physical activity can add 10 pounds a year.

The method of preparation and type of coffee determine the caffeine content. A typical 8-ounce cup of

"regular" coffee has about 100 milligrams of caffeine while a 1-ounce shot of espresso

contributes about 65 milligrams of caffeine.

Enjoy a moderate amount of coffee. After water, coffee is the world's most consumed beverage. The

Netherlands, Finland and Canada are among the top coffee-consuming countries in the world, while the

U.S. typically ranks in the top 10.

If you are looking for a pick-me-up to go with a cup of coffee, try an energy bite.

Energy Bites

1 c. oats

1/2 c. nut butter

1/4 c. honey or maple syrup

1/4 c. dried fruit

1/4 c. nuts

2 Tbsp. flaxseed

2 Tbsp. mini chocolate chips

Combine all ingredients in a bowl and stir to combine. Chill for 30 minutes to firm. Roll into tablespoonsize

bites or use a small cookie scoop to portion the ingredients.

Makes 24 servings. Each serving has 70 calories, 3.5 grams (g) fat, 2 g protein, 9 g carbohydrate, 1 g

fiber and 35 milligrams sodium.

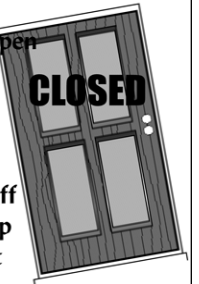

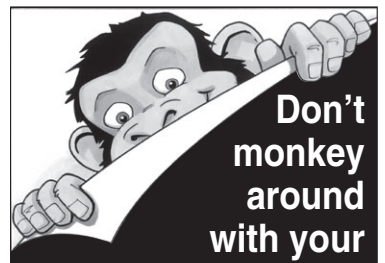
