The state's whitetail deer are finding easy conditions statewide at the halfway point of winter with limited snow and mild temperatures helping buoy hopes of strong over-winter survival.

Deer herds strong at midseason

Happy Valentines day from the bunnies that will become part of a Valentine's Day basket. If it's not below zero on Sunday, the grandkids will find these on their doorstep with a few other goodies like a smaller version of an Easter Basket.

With warmer-than-average temperatures and little snow cover to impede their travel and foraging, North Dakota's deer herds are doing well, according to Jason Smith, Big Game Biologist with the North Dakota Game & Fish Department (NDG&F).

Last year's conditions, particularly in the southeastern corner of the state and the region surrounding Smith's Jamestown office, were much colder and quite snowy in comparison to the rest of the Peace Garden State, inhibiting movement and feeding and impacting survival of deer over the winter of 2019-20. Of the four corners of the state, the units in the southeast received the most limited amounts of increases in firearm deer tags for hunters in the fall of 2020, the end result of those challenging conditions.

'By all accounts it appears that wildlife in general are doing well, especially deer," Smith states of conditions headed into the back half of winter, "obviously it's quite the contrast from last year, then again, with all things considered we have to realize that we are still on the northern great plains and anything can happen, so I guess I re-main cautiously optimistic,"

"probably more than anything, the number of fawns on the landscape in spring is a good index, but the main driver for the population is recruitment, or that number of fawns that make it to adulthood and then to the breeding population.'

One of the limited drawbacks to the mild winter conditions is the lack of snow necessary for NDG&F personnel to conduct their aerial surveys of whitetail deer populations. Especially in woody riparian areas and those places where deer normally herd up, the agency requires a foot of snow on the ground to help cover the natural brown of harvested fields, grasslands and tree claims, and make deer stand out for easy identification against the white background. With more than three-quarters of the state having less than an inch on the ground and more than 90 percent under the required 12-inch level, standardized surveys can't be run, and other methods - such as utilizing hunter reports from last fall, and anec-

dotal observations by biologists - will have to be used to gain a greater picture of deer herd size in the region. While the easier winter

means more movement options to evade predators, the conditons likely don't have much impact on the predator-prey relationship as coyotes focus on the weaker members of the herd. That trend doesn't change a whole lot from season to season, unless the winter is severe and more deer die off from exposure. Instead, it's business as usual as the opportunistic predators find some deer to be culled. "Predation for the most part is relative to the number of predators out there," Smith states, suggesting a stable number of covotes on the landscape, "I'm sure we still lose a number of deer to coyotes during the winter, but a lot of that is probably them picking off animals that have been wounded during the prior hunting season, especially rut-related injuries for males, old age, and so on," he concludes.

The limited cold conditions bode well not only for deer surviving the winter, but also for reproduction and recruitment of more fawns in the spring. While not the only factor which helps increase the population, which has been slowly climbing since the difficult winters of 2010 and 2011, mild conditions when coupled with other items can help with more successful fawning and recruitment in spring.

"If you tie it to the interactions between what's available for habitat, quality of forage on the landscape and also deer density, the number of fawns are determined in the breeding season in the previous fall and that's relative to the body condition and age of that adult female," Smith explains, adding,

Directions Step 1

 Coffee can or other empty and clean food can

• 1 candle 2" diameter (place on lid under suspended can for melting snow). Canned Sterno will also work to heat water.

 1 pocket knife, reasonably sharp (or substitute with scissors)

- 3 pieces of bright cloth 2" wide x 36" long (tie to antenna or door handle)
- Several packets of soup, hot chocolate, tea, bouillon cubes,

etc. (mixed into melted snow to provide warmth and nutrition) Plastic spoons

 Packages of easy to eat, high energy foods like peanuts and candy or canned, ready-to-eat soups or fruit

• 1 pair of socks and 1 pair of gloves or glove liners; cotton is not recommended because it provides no insulation when wet).

- 1 sun shield blanket or 2 large green or black plastic leaf bags
- (to reflect body heat)
- 1 flash light and batteries (keep separate)

- You may want to keep the survival kit in the passenger compartment in case you go into a ditch and can't get to or open the trunk.

The recent warm temperatures and sunny skies have been nice - but the cold and snowy season is here and the question is - are you ready for it? You should ... Get a Kit ... Make a Plan ... and Be Informed. Keep a high level of situational awareness by listening to the forecast every day. When snow, sleet, or freezing rain is in the forecast expect that it will impact your day to day routine, and be ready when it does!

Mercer County Sheriff's Dept. Travel Advisories What they mean –

Use caution advisory – is issued by this office when visibility is reduced and driving conditions require that people reduce speed.

No travel advised - means that law enforcement and the highway department have determined that near zero visibility is occurring and/or that the driving surface of the road is blocked or covered with ice and driving is a determent

Road closed no travel allowed – (extreme conditions are present) is issued when roads are blocked and vehicles are stuck on the roadway. No travel will be allowed by any vehicle regardless of the situation. Barricades or officers will be blocking the roads leaving and entering the closed area. Drivers going around barricades will receive complaint and summons to district court. Schools, mines and power plants will be notified by phone.

Winter Weather Terminology

Watch is issued when the risk of a hazardous winter weather event has increased, but its occurrence, location, and/or timing is still uncertain.

Warning or Advisory is issued when a hazardous winter weather event is occurring, is imminent, or has a high probability of occurrence. A warning is used when there is a threat to life or property. An advisory is for less serious conditions that cause inconvenience, and, if caution is not used, could lead to situations that may threaten life or property.

Snow criteria for a warning is 6 inches or more in 12 hours or less, OR, 8 inches or more in 24 hours or less. Snow criteria for an advisory is 3 to 5 inches.

Winter Storm Warnings and Winter Weather Advisories may be issued for a combination of elements like snow coupled with wind and blowing snow, or snow coupled with sleet and freezing rain.

Sleet is pellets of ice. Sleet bounces when it hits the ground.

• Freezing Rain is rain that freezes when it hits the ground or objects on the ground. It forms a sheet or glaze of ice. • Ice Storm is used to describe occasions when the ice from freezing rain is significant enough (1/4 inch thick or more) to cause damage

• Blizzard is a storm with winds of 35 mph or higher AND visibility frequently below 1/4 mile in snow and/or blowing snow AND these conditions last three (3) hours or longer. There is no set temperature requirement for a blizzard. Wind Chill is that part of the cooling of a human body caused by moving air. Moving air accelerates the rate of heat transfer away from a human body.

• Wind Chill Advisory is issued for wind chills of 25 to 39 below zero with a wind speed of at least 5 mph. • Wind Chill Warning is issued for wind chills of 40 below zero and colder with a wind speed of at least 5 mph.

All this information is given to the weather service and television and radio stations as it is occurring.

In mid-February my mind often wanders toward spring, and if allowed, into the warmth of summer and thoughts of fishing trips past under the heat of a shining sun.

One of my most formative fishing memories is that of catching bluegills off the dock on those sunny days that blur into the threemonth span that is June, July and August which frequently found me staying at my grandparents' lake cabin.

I would bait my Aberdeen hook with worms and nightcrawlers my grandfather dug up for me from the cool dirt patch in the small opening in the woods of the back lot of his lake cabin. I would cast them out for countless hours of entertainment, burning away the day as the sun scorched my skin and lightened my hair.

Sometimes I'd unclip my bobbers and cast out my offering only to pull the bait away from the fish, trying to steer clear of the smaller panfish and connect with the bigger bluegills that lurked near the bottom of the school or out toward its edges. Other times, I'd simply cast the bait out and reel it back in as fast as I could watching the bait spiral like the propeller on a boat motor as the horde of hungry sunnies would steam in a phalanx behind it, with one or two occasionally accelerating from the group nipping at the whirling worm on the golden hook.

I didn't know it at the time, but the concept was basically the modern slowdeath rig now widely employed by many in-the-know walleye anglers.

In the waters of the past, before city sewer was installed around the lake, the summer weeds grew thick and the dog days of the season were marked with a shade of green on the surface. There, on either the inside or outside edge of the underwater jungle which touched and matted up forming a ceiling between lake and sky, the occasional pike found respite from the heat due to the inflowing creek about 100 yards down the beach.

Undoubtedly, they picked off their fair share of the small panfish that tucked into the shade of the dock and boat lifts as well. Stunted as many of them were, the one-to-two-pound hammerhandles provided a certain upsizing of excitement for a young angler on summer vacation, and long before the lake was stocked with muskies, known for their tendency to follow and

Not unlike the hundreds of times I'd done it before, I cast a spiraling worm offering out into the water and buzzed it back to the dock, feeling the occasional nip and pull of the faster fish in the school of sunnies. About halfway back I could tell most of my bait had been cleaned off by the bluegills and felt the simple drag of the bare hook in the water. In the light between the puffy summer afternoon

clouds, I saw the glint of the hook and on the edge of the shade a dark form took shape under the greening surface, following the tiny golden piece of terminal tackle inch-for-inch. As my nerves took over, I sped up and the fish's pursuit did as well, as the distance closed between the flashing hook and my position on the dock.

My heart rate soared, and I kept reeling as the fish accelerated and zipped between my legs and under worn wooden platform and algae-coated metal frame of the dock, leaving me with my first adrenaline rush of an encounter with something other than a bluegill.

Since that time, I've had countless other close calls: following smallmouth bass that slash the surface as a plug is hastily retrieved for another cast, muskies in that same water which have now replaced the population of hammerhandles as the apex predators, and yes, even aggressive pike which have turned on a hooked and struggling walleye at the side of a canoe. Each of them are etched in the fishing memories in my mind, and some in the stories I've written over the last two decades.

None, however, stand out like that first one coming under the warmth of the summer sun which sent my pulse as high as the temperature on that mid-August afternoon...in our outdoors.
