

Staking out spring spaces

As a weather junkie, I know that any forecast longer five days out is not to be trusted. As an angler though, especially the glass-half-full kind who relishes the thought of the season's first cast over running water, I know that even a 16-day experimental forecast which shows a hint at extended temperatures above freezing needs to be taken seriously.

With just such a half-promise of an early-spring melt beginning to register on the U.S. Our Outdoors' long-range scanners, I'm already charting a course for all those places spring fish hang out. While it differs from lake to lake and stream to stream, there are classic spots for popular gamefish to scout out now for early season efforts.

PIKE PLACES

One of the first fish to be on the move each spring is the northern pike, and in those states with no closed season such as North Dakota, some of the fastest fishing action can be just a couple of weeks down the road when feeder creeks begin to flow with the water of melting snow which draws prespawn fish up seasonal waterways.

Basically, wherever there are streams with moving water attached to a larger river or lake is where you'll find prespawn pike.

As sight feeders, be certain to target them with something that will get their attention, whether it's brightly colored jigs and upsized plastic twisters or large flashy flies, make it big and gaudy in the dingy runoff of the season to be certain they see it. Consider coulees, creeks and even drainage ditches which connect to

primary flows for targeting early-season pike, where the option is available.

Go North for **CRAPPIES**



Crappies are one of the first species to make a move toward their spring spawning grounds. Look for them in the shallows around old reed beds and turn them with a well placed tube.

One of the first fish to make its spawning moves as the ice goes out on area lakes is the crappie.

Both black and white varieties of the fish will find warming waters in favorite bays and coves which often fill with reeds, cattails and other shallow vegetation each spring. In those places where last year's brown stalks remain and new green ones are emerging, they'll stake their claim and beget the next generation of speckled panfish. Make note that those most promising areas are often bays on the north side of lakes which receive the most sunlight early in the season and warm just a touch faster than the rest of the main

When scouting new waters for springtime adventures, put a pin in those likely places or simply return to those you've identified over the



past few seasons as successful spring spots for slabs. Cast and dabble small jigs dressed with plastic tubes on a long rod or even a cane pole in the emergent vegetation to find fish, keeping enough distance to avoid spooking them.

Walleye Run

Give me a gravel stretch under a pinch point and a population of walleyes in any flow and I'll be happy.

Bouncing a jig along the shoal feeling for the ticks and bumps of the strata below and the occasional deadweight sensation of a walleye on the line is a rite of spring.

Those stretches of running water with shallow points, sandy substrates, and places where walleyes can hold out of the current, such as behind a break, boulder or

submerged timber are classic spring haunts that create fast action as evening approaches and hungry fish start to feed in the warming water.

Stock up on favorite jigs and plastics now to be ready to do some exploring of these areas which may have shifted some over the past year due to current flow, obstructions and other subtle changes in the aquatic environment.

Bronzeback Abodes

Smallmouth bass are my absolute favorite spring fish. Whether in the shallows of a lake or river, finding prespawn smallies on the bite can produce some of the season's best fishing.

As water warms and cools with shifting spring weather, identify notable spawning areas such as rip-rapped

shorelines, gravel breaks and catch fish as they move up into those places during stable weather and a warming trend. Fish will be around them from the start of the

season well into summer. Don't forget to identify docks, downed trees and other obstructions and offer up a few plastic tubes, jigs, stickbaits and other favorite bass lures in those spaces of cover for the gamest fish that swims. When the inevitable spring cold front dives through the region, simply back off the shallow spots into deeper water nearby to find fish.

They may be a bit lethargic from the temperature and pressure swing, so downsize to smaller jigs dressed with materials such as bucktail, krystal flash and marabou

which can be worked slowly and provide subtle movement which will still trigger a spring bite.

Planning out a rolling spring adventure plan, keying in on the seasonal movements of fish which will begin as soon as the ice comes off, is a smart move to increase success on the water.

Knowing where fish go and where they can be found as waters start to warm will help set the wheels in motion for a successful season.

While the world may be wrapped in white for a few more days - and may see more despite what the forecast says - opportunities are just a few short weeks away to find these fish and more in the spring waters...of our outdoors.

Voigt ranch receives recognition

Casey Voigt rolled into one of his pastures in his Chevy Silverado on his 5,200-acre ranch south of Beulah.

His herd of Hereford and black Angus cross cattle recognized Voigt and came over to greet him, like a dog running toward his master, sans wagging tail. Voigt ambled toward one of his Hereford bulls, with a registered name of Point Blank, and began to scratch the critter's neck. The bull nestled in and enjoyed the extra attention, especially in sub-zero temperatures.

"Feed them when they're young and show them who's boss," Voigt said with a smile.

Voigt takes pride in his herd of about 190 head – as he should. He was recently named the commercial producer of the year by the North Dakota Hereford Association. Jake and Rollie Baumgarten, who operate Baumgarten Herefords in Belfield, were named the registered producer of the year. Voigt buys bulls from them, which tells you all you need to know about the genetics of the cattle.

Voigt ranches with his wife Julie and his two kids, Leah and Casey Lane. Together, the Voigts have made their mark in the ranching industry

"It starts with the bulls and culling the females and heifers," said Voigt, who once used to run about 425 head of cattle but has cut back on the size of his herd. "You want to get the best ones. That's one of the hardest things to do for most producers, culling through the cows and purchasing the genetics with the bulls."

Voigt ranched with his parents in 1971 when he was 8, where he learned how to ride a horse to help with the livestock

"Was I that much help? Probably not," Voigt said jokingly.

He took over the ranch in 1996. His dad primarily ran Hereford cows and bulls. When Voigt started on his

own, he had black Angus and went back to his Hereford roots in cross breeding the two in 2005.

"There are a lot of choices you can make out there, as an independent producer, but I think crossbreeding with Hereford bulls has been one of the better decisions I've made over the years. Certain Hereford genetics cross better with certain Angus genetics, but it's not clear-cut science as with a single breed."

Voigt started crossbreeding to heterosis, which is the increase in such characteristics as size, growth rate, fertility, and yield of a hybrid organism over those of its parents.

"The ultimate goal is to get the daughters to bring as much money as the steers, to increase heifer value and a lot of that comes from the F-1



cross. And then the weight gain on our steers, we've basically put on 70-75 pounds, weaning weight in 12 years. I think the Hereford sires I've been purchasing are putting a lot more muscle mass to them, a lot more depth of rib, and a lot of muscle definition and that shows up in the cows for eternity."

For Voigt, the joy has come into watching how his production has improved through the years.

"A lot of people look at trying to be better than the competition," said Voigt, a 1982 graduate of Beulah High school. "Julie and I, our philosophy has always been, and we try to teach this to our kids, is to make yourself better. You can't do anything about the competition. All you can do is work to make yourself better."

Building a successful ranch has helped Voigt live the ideal life. He doesn't need to punch a time clock and he's not chained to a desk. Each day is like a vacation because he's doing what he loves.

"You get to spend a lot of time with your family," he said. "The average person gets up in the morning and goes to work and doesn't see their family until the end of their shift. If the kids are in high school or college, they don't get to see them. We actually get to work with our family on a daily basis. During the summer when the kids don't have school, we're working together pretty much every day."

Calving season is Voigt's favorite part of the job.

"You're bringing new life into the world," he said.
"There's such a big responsibility that goes into that. You take care of the newborns to get them up and going. It's probably just a couple hours for them to get up and get

that first milk. They're pretty vulnerable at that time. If the weather is cold or the coyotes are around or mom doesn't take very good care of them, they're in danger in that small time frame. Once they've nursed and get that energy in them, man are they resilient. It's amazing how fast they go from being so vulnerable to independent and durable."

Voigt's ultimate goal would be to have both his children continue to be involved with the ranch when he can no longer do the work.

"It's too extensive for somebody to get started on their own if their parents didn't help," Voigt said. "There's a lot of overhead that goes into making a small profit. We're always trying to make things better. The hardest thing to do is stay the same. If you're not getting better, you're going backward."


