# Paddlefish season opens on May 1

North Dakota's 2021 paddlefish season will be held May 1 and is scheduled through May 21. Depending on the overall harvest, an early in-season closure may occur with a 24-hour notice by the state Game and Fish Department.

Legal snagging hours are from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Central Time daily. One tag per snagger will be issued. Snagging

is legal in all areas of the Yellowstone River in North Dakota and in the area of the Missouri River lying west of the U.S. Highway 85 bridge to the Montana border, excluding that portion from the pipeline crossing downstream to the upper end of the Lewis and Clark Wildlife Management Area.

Mandatory harvest of all

snagged paddlefish is required on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays. On these days, all paddlefish caught must be kept and tagged immediately.

Snag-and-release of all paddlefish is required on Sundays, Mondays and Thursdays.

If the paddlefish season closes early because the harvest cap is reached, an ex-

tended snag-and-release-only period will be allowed for up to seven days immediately following the early closure, but not to extend beyond May 21. Only snaggers with a current season, unused paddlefish snagging tag are eligible to participate. Only a limited area at the confluence of the Missouri and Yellowstone rivers downstream to the pipeline

crossing is open to this extended season. Hours are from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Use or possession of gaffs is prohibited on snag-and-release-only days and during the extension period.

Cost of a paddlefish tag is \$10 for residents and \$25.50 for non-residents. Lost or destroyed tags will not be replaced.

# STAGE 2 BURN BAN MERCER & OLIVER COUNTY

As of March 19, 2021 Mercer & Oliver County will be under a Stage 2 Burn Ban until further notice.

**RESTRICTIONS:**

- The following acts are prohibited until further notice:
- Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire of any type, to include pit, burn barrel and/or a campfire. "Note, this change makes it so no fires at all are allowed in the County. Cities & State Parks will set restrictions in their jurisdictions as noted in Exemptions below."
  - Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site or while stopped in an area at least three (3) feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.
    - Welding or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame.
    - Using an explosive.
  - Operating motorized vehicles off designated roads and trails.

**EXEMPTIONS:**

Persons with a written permit that specifically authorizes the otherwise prohibited act.  
Persons using a device fueled solely by liquid petroleum or LPG fuels that can be turned on and off.  
Emergency repair of public utilities and railroads.  
Persons conducting activities in those designated areas where the activity is specifically authorized by written posted notice.  
Any Federal, State or local officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.  
All land within a city boundary is exempted. "Note: All Cities will set their own Fire Ban Rules as they see appropriate."  
Welding or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame, with extinguishment capabilities immediately accessible.  
Other exceptions unique to each agency/tribe.

**AND REMEMBER...**

ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN BAN IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10.1) PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF UP TO \$1500 AND 30 DAYS IN JAIL. THE MERCER & OLIVER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS ARE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS. When the Burn Ban is lifted, we are asking that all controlled burns be reported to the Sheriff's office, 745-3333 (Mercer) 794-3450 (Oliver), when the fire starts and then another call when the fire has been extinguished, Thank You!





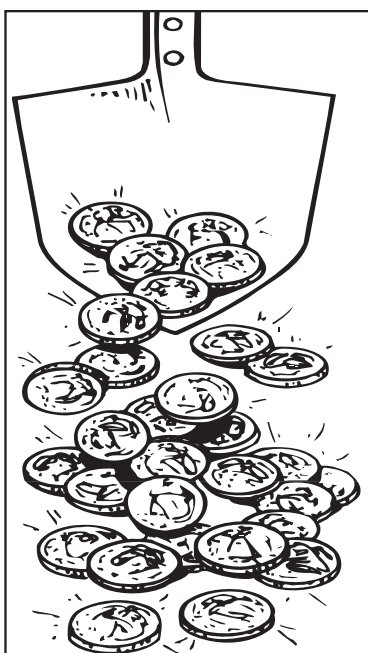

# Habitat: The Key to Your Hunting Season

Each year sportsmen and sportswomen look forward with anticipation to hunting season. Even in spring we wait with hope for the email from Game and Fish notifying that we were drawn for one of the "big three:" once-in-a-lifetime tags for moose, elk, and bighorn sheep. Later we hope that our number gets called for the deer tag in our favorite unit. For most, that excitement drops when they read "your application was not drawn." It's easy to gripe at Game and Fish when our name in the hat doesn't get drawn, but what are we as hunters doing to increase our draw odds?

The Game and Fish Department uses habitat conditions and scientific surveys to measure trends in game populations. That scientific data establishes the number of animals that can be taken each season while sustaining the population as a whole. Using this information, the Department sets the season, bag limits, and license restrictions.

The critical factor that ensures sustainable populations and open-hunting seasons from year to year is adequate habitat for each species. It isn't hard to connect the dots between insufficient habitat conditions, which result in reduced game populations, which in turn causes limited or poorer odds for hunting opportunities in the state's licensing system.

The habitat for many of our game species has been declining for several years. North Dakota has significantly fewer acres in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) than a decade or two ago. Changes in cropping patterns have also reduced traditional, available habitats.

Urban sprawl encroaches on areas formerly available as habitat. And while there are federal and state dollars available for use in maintain-

ing and establishing habitat, it is a slow process getting that money into habitat on the ground.

It's not all doom and gloom. In the short term, we will still draw tags, (although not as often as we would like, and we'll still find success in the field.

In the long term though, we have time to increase the quality of habitat across the state. A little bit of habitat in the right area can have a large impact. Small acre projects like food plots, native grass plantings, CRP and nesting cover don't break the bank and can be easily implemented across the state with willing landowners, conservation organizations, and our state and federal agencies.

The results will be a patchwork of quality habitat across the state, connecting cover for game, and providing better opportunities for sportsmen and women.

Conservationists often bring up the economic value of hunting, fishing and the variety of outdoor recreational opportunities tied to abundant habitat it's one of my favorite talking points, especially when talking with legislators. The influx of money each fall from our resident and non-resident hunters is important for North Dakota's small-town economies. Our State leadership needs to be strong advocates for programs that keep existing habitat on the land and need to do a better job of promoting the creation of new habitat in support of our hunting traditions. Likewise, hunters need to double down on their conservation activities. Hunters can use either their checkbook or their time, but they need to help put more habitat on the ground. After all, habitat is the key that unlocks our hunting seasons!

**Hazen is the No. 1 safest city in N.D.**

Researchers from SafeWise, a national independent review website, have ranked Hazen as the No. 1 safest city in North Dakota.

Using a variety of criteria from the FBI, the U.S. Census Bureau and online surveys, SafeWise published the results of its findings for all 50 states in a report March 10.

It is the second year in a row that Hazen was named to this top position. Other nearby towns to make the list were New Town in third place (the only town in the top 10 in North Dakota with no violent crimes reported) and Beulah in seventh place (down from second place last year).

As a whole, the state of North Dakota ranked third in terms of least concern among residents when it comes to crime and safety. The only two states with less concern about crime are Vermont and Wyoming. In total, only 30 percent of people in North Dakota expressed a regular worry about their safety, with 47 percent being the national average.

North Dakota also comes in below the national average for both violent and property crime rates. Fewer people have reported personal experiences with property crime compared to last year, while 19 percent of respondents reported experiencing package theft, just below the national av-

erage. Package theft is the most worrisome crime issue for Americans, according to SafeWise.

SafeWise employed a State of Safety online survey, with over 5,000 respondents in total across the United States, and with at least 100 from each state. Responses could be marked from one to seven on each question or category, with one indicating least concern and seven indicating highest concern.

The neighboring states of Montana and Minnesota ranked fourth and fifth for least concerns related to safety in the U.S. The state with the highest concern about safety is New York at 70 percent, followed by Illinois and Maryland.

# CITYWIDE CLEANUP

## Let's Keep Hazen Clean & Green May 3-7

**City clean-up week is the perfect opportunity to bring your property into compliance with City Ordinances relating to Public Nuisances.**

**City Ordinance Chapter XII states:**

**Nuisance Definition - A nuisance consists in unlawfully doing an act or omitting to perform a duty, which act or omission:**

1. Annoys, injures, or endangers the comfort, repose, health, or safety of others;
2. Offends decency;
3. Unlawfully interferes with, obstructs or tends to obstruct, or renders dangerous for passage, any public park, street, or highway; or
4. In any way renders other person insecure in life or in the use of property.

**Public Nuisance - A Public Nuisance is a nuisance which at the same time affects the entire community of Hazen or a neighborhood or any considerable number of person, although the extend of the annoyance or damage inflicted upon individuals may be unequal.**

**Remedies - The remedies against a public nuisance are:**

1. Bringing a criminal action before a district judge;
2. A civil action; or
3. Abatement

**Example of Nuisances - 11 - Unsheltered storage of old, used, stripped, junked and other automobiles not in good, safe operating condition, and of any other vehicles, machinery, implements and/or equipment and personal property of any kinds which is no longer safely usable for the purpose for which it was manufactured for a period of thirty (30) days or more (except in a licensed junk yard) within the city, and any motor vehicle, animal and article of personal property which constitutes an obstruction to, hazard or detriment to public traffic, snow removal operations, public safety and public health and morals or which may be abandoned or unclaimed within this City is hereby declared to be a nuisance and dangerous to public safety and must be abated in the manner prescribed in this article. For purposes of this provision, "abandoned" means a motor vehicle that has remained for a period of more than ten (10) days on public property illegally or lacking vital component parts or has remained for a period of more than ten (10) days on private property without consent of the person in control of such property or in an inoperable condition such that it has no potential for further use consistent with its useful functions unless it is kept in an enclosed garage or storage building.**

### LANDFILL HOURS

Mon. thru Fri. ....8 a.m. - 3:45 p.m.

• Loads are required to be covered when hauling to landfill. Loads should also be sorted for your own convenience.

• For Hazen residents only. ID may be required.

### **Garbage routes will run as usual**

Have clean-up items and regular trash out by 6 a.m. the **day before** your regular day.

**• NO Call Necessary to City Hall**

• Have items sorted at curb.

• Household, wood, steel and inert items need to be sorted at your regular garbage pickup areas. **If not sorted, it will not get picked up.**

### TREE AND GRASS DISPOSAL

Site located north of Cenex  
Discarding any other items at this site is a **VIOLATION** of City Ordinance and subject up to a \$1,000 fine.  
**VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED**

### EXAMPLES OF FREE PICKUP:

- Normal household items
- Wood products ~ sorted and separated from regular garbage
- Discarded furniture • Carpet
- White Wear (Washers, dryers, stoves, dishwashers, water heaters)

**Residents are encouraged to clean up their nuisance/junk vehicles. The city will be willing to assist with this process during clean-up week. After clean-up, the city will be enforcing ordinances and issuing citations.**
