Plant a condiment this spring

Spring will be pushing its way wholeheartedly into our lives once this cold snap is history. That means my evergrowing list of things to prepare for planting season will be forefront in my mind.


We have our transplants moved to the greenhouse. That entailed repotting them to larger pots with good soil. Hopefully this will be the last time before planting.

And, speaking of planting, once we add beneficial nematodes to our outdoor garden to hopefully cut down on those nasty white grubs, apply a bit of well-rotted manure and harrow it up, the potatoes, onions and cabbage will be set out. They like the cooler weather.

I'm still hand carrying water to the lettuce and peas currently greening up my large high tunnel. I decided I had little to lose, and much to gain, if I could get an early crop going.

The rhubarb is beginning to peek over the edge of the mulch, and I have some horseradish root to plant. The biggest dilemma is where to plant it so it doesn't over take anything and everything.

If you are a fan of horserad-



ish, you understand. This root vegetable is part of my family food culture and I recall digging it out of the ditches when I was young. It grew everywhere. I'm thinking nowadays they spray it down and it has long since died. I decided to change that by planting my

Horseradish is a root vegetable with a pungent taste and odor. Someone said that wasabi is so expensive you are probably eating colored horseradish with your weekly sushi. True wasabi (Wasabia japonica) comes from an entirely different plant and is said to have an earthy taste. Additionally, it's green in color instead of white.

But we cant discount horseradish yet. Horseradish root contains multiple compounds that may provide health benefits, including antibacterial


and anticancer effects.

In addition to clearing your sinuses, horseradish has topical uses also. In fact, that is why my mother had a mason jar of ground root in her kitchen. It was used for poultices and such. You had to be very careful as it could easily burn your skin if not applied care-

I decided to give that jar a good sniff when I was about 8 or 9 years old. whoa. I almost choked to death from the fumes.

Why? When the root is cut, an enzyme breaks down a compound called sinigrin into a mustard oil. This oil, known as allyl isothiocyanate, gives horseradish its telltale odor and taste and may irritate



ND acts to support military and first responder families

In a Capitol ceremony last week, Gov. Doug Burgum signed into law HB 1435, which ensures the families of first responders who die in the line of duty will have their health insurance cov-

"House Bill 1435 acknowledges the incredible sacrifices made by the family members of our courageous law enforcement officers, firefighters and other emergency responders every time their loved one walks out the door to go work," he said after signing the bill.

Burgum said this is a way for the state to show its gratitude with actions and not just words to first responders.

The signing was attended by bill sponsors and first responders. Rep. Zachary Ista, D-Grand Forks, was the prime sponsor, and when he introduced the bill to the Senate Appropriations Committee, he said the measure was partly in response to the death last year of Grand Forks police officer Cody Holte.

There are no laws we can pass to eliminate entirely the risk these heroes face on the job,

Ista said. "But what we can do is to make sure we take care of surviving spouses and children of our fallen heroes when tragedy does strike."

The law allows for continued health coverage to the surviving spouse and dependent children of any fire-fighter, police officer, corrections officer or emergency medical personnel killed in the line of duty.

Ista said North Dakota follows 17 other states ranging from Alabama to California to adopt similar policies.

We owe our fallen heroes this debt of gratitude and also tangible protections to what surely must be the darkest time imaginable for any family," he said.

A fiscal note states the bill will cost the state an additional \$210,000 per biennium, with premium costs spread through the North Dakota Public Employees Retirement System.

Scott Miller, the executive director of the NDPERS program, provided neutral testimony to the committee. "We have information on five line-of-duty deaths since Jan. 1, 2010," Miller said. The assistance will be retroactive to that date.

Miller said the cost to the

state would depend on whether all five families choose to participate in the program.

Despite passing by a vote of 43-4 in the Senate, the bill faced some opposition on the floor.

"The idea is good, but the problem with these good ideas is that sometimes the backend of it isn't such a good idea," Sen. Oley Larsen, R-Minot, said.

Larsen said the state and the taxpayers would have to pay the full policy when the families could get a better deal out on the marketplace.

HB 1435 is not the only bipartisan bill seeking to expand family benefits. HB 1278, signed by the governor last month, will provide unemployment insurance to military spouses who are relocating.

Rep. Corey Mock, D-Grand Forks, introduced the legislation and said it is supported by the J.S. Defense Department.

"North Dakota is one of only two states in the coun-

try that does not allow military spouses to qualify for unemployment insurance when they are relocating to a permanent change of station," Mock said.

Prior to this bill. North Dakota law said voluntary separation between employer and employee would not qualify the employee for unemployment, despite the military spouse not having a choice.

"HB 1278 would close that gap, by allowing military spouses transferring away from a North Dakota military establishment to qualify for unemployment benefits," Mock said.

Mock said the change would place North Dakota on the same playing field as other states.

"It is important to ensure that North Dakota is in the best position possible to maintain our existing Air Force bases in Minot and Grand Forks," he said, "but also to put us in the driver seat should we have the interest in expanding our new missions to

be housed in North Dakota.'

Jay Sheldon, strategy and policy officer for the National Guard, testified in favor of the bill as well.

"Bills like 1278 go a long ways in checking boxes for North Dakota to continue to be (military friendly) and lead the way on military friendliness," he said.

Sheldon said that, according to the 2019 Military Economic Impact analysis, with 7,300 active duty members in North Dakota, 1,900 transfer in and out of the state annually. In addition, an estimated 7,000 people are military dependents who "bring a large economic im-pact to the state. In the last few years, that has been over \$1 billion a year."

The House approved the bill 87-4, the Senate 46-1.

Burgum said in a tweet after signing the bill "This is yet another example of how we're working with the military, veterans, legislators and others to make North Dakota more military friendly."

RESTRICTIONS:

The following acts are prohibited until further notice:

- · Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire of any type, to include pit, burn barrel and/or a campfire. "Note, this change makes it so no fires at all are allowed in the County. Cities & State Parks will set restrictions in their jurisdictions as noted in Exemptions below."
- Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site or while stopped in an area at least three (3) feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.
 - Welding or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame.
 - · Using an explosive.
 - Operating motorized vehicles off designated roads and trails.

EXEMPTIONS:

Persons with a written permit that specifically authorizes the otherwise prohibited act. Persons using a device fueled solely by liquid petroleum or LPG fuels that can be turned on and off. Emergency repair of public utilities and railroads.

Persons conducting activities in those designated areas where the activity is specifically authorized by written posted notice. Any Federal, State or local officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty. All land within a city boundary is exempted. "Note: All Cities will set their own Fire Ban Rules as they see appropriate." Welding or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame, with extinguishment capabilities immediately accessible. Other exceptions unique to each agency/tribe.

That tie comes when two isolated compounds are bruised by chopping or shredding to release those compounds creating a chemical reaction. The finer you grind, the more potent the smell and

taste.

Speaking of taste. My favorite condiment is horseradish. I love it with pork or a good German fry sausage. It's easy to make your own horseradish. You can grate the root and add some vinegar and salt and

there you have it... Some folks add sugar and when mixed with mayonnaise or sour cream the "bite" is subdued a wee bit

It's time for me to plant my horseradish cuttings which I purchased from Johnny's Seed. I may have been able to plant sooner, but they don't ship until the middle of April. How were they supposed to know that our weather has been weirdly warm in March and early April.

Once planted, you should wait to harvest it until the second year. Let it get established. Plant horseradish in full sun and away from your garden. You can bury a fivegallon bucket with both ends open to keep it from spreading horizontally.

The crazy thing is the roots are cut at a 45-degree angle on the end of the root that should slant down. Bury it about four inches deep. Allow to "dig in" and then harvest in late October or early November when the frost has killed the leaves.

Horseradish root can be stored in your root cellar, in the dark. Trim foliage to about one inch, clean the roots under running water and scrub off dirt. Allow the roots to dry before storing. Keep some in your refrigerator in a ventilated bag for up to a couple of months. Grate as needed.

To maintain the flavor, add to hot foods such as sauces right before serving. If you stop at Arby's, they have a horseradish sauce that's perfect on roast beef sandwiches.

Or, you can make one of your own with this recipe from AllRecipes.com.

Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons prepared horseradish
 - 1 tablespoon cider vinegar
 - 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- 3 tablespoons reduced-fat mayonnaise

1/8 teaspoon ground red pepper

1/2 cup nonfat sour cream DIRECTIONS: In a small bowl whisk together horseradish, vinegar, mustard, mayonnaise, ground red pepper and sour cream.









Olson family working together

Steve and Kayla Olson got a precious present on Christmas day in 2020 when their son Luke Gabriel was born.

The Beulah couple, however, have been unable to bring home their special gift. They are hoping to all be joined together sooner than later though.

Luke was born with a left-sided Congenital Diaphragmatic Hernia (CDH) that has caused his late arrival to his home. Kayla has been displaced from her home and family and has been staying in Minneapolis with Luke while Steve has been running the household and caring for their two daughters. Emma is 11 and Adeline 4.

Kayla doesn't have a return date set as of yet, but she is hoping that the Olsons will be functioning together under the same roof as soon as possible.

"I'm really tired," Kayla said.
"Not the kind of tiredness that sleep can fix. I just want to sit on my couch. I want to cook supper for my family. I want to do their laundry."

Not only does she miss her family, but she misses her dogs, her bed, her own shower, her own blanket. She missed a whole season of basketball and gymnastics from her daughters. She's missed Christmas, New Years, Easter, Valentine's Day and the dayto-day dramas of raising two girls. Instead, Kayla and her girls are reading the fourth book of Harry Potter and do their bedtime prayers over FaceTime.

"We do our best, but we're hitting the exhaustion point right now," Kayla said. "We try to do one thing together, even if it's for 10 minutes."

Let's not forget that a marriage takes a lot of work, and the Olsons aren't getting time together as a couple. Thankfully their employers have been understanding and have granted time off when needed. Kayla is a certified physician's assistant at Coal Country Community Health, and Steve works at the Coteau coal mine.

"I feel, in some ways, it has made us stronger," Kayla said. "The time we do have together, we know we have to take advantage of it, even if it's just on the phone. We're using our time together better."

The Olsons aren't going to complain much, however. Their son is alive and is improving. When he was born, there was a 50-50 chance that he would actually survive. Luke's story is certainly worth hearing, and he is beating the odds.

At Kayla's 19-week ultrasound, it was discovered that Luke had CDH, which is the result of a "hiccup" during development and there was a hole in his diaphragm. As a result, his stomach, part of his bowels and part of his liver were up in his chest. The dislocation of the organs restricted growth of his lungs, left worse than right, and caused his heart to be pushed over to the right. It was repaired with surgery after birth.

Áround 23 weeks of gestation, the Olsons met with a genetic counselor, maternal fetal medicine doctor, pediatric cardiologist and a pediatric sur-

geon, where they learned that Kayla would have to relocate to Minneapolis at 37 weeks to ensure that delivery would be where there is a specialized-care team that could help Luke. She relocated to Minneapolis on Dec. 12.

Luke's arrival at Mother Baby Center, which is attached to Children's Minnesota-Minneapolis Hospital, was a surprise. Kayla had a planned induction scheduled for Dec. 29, 2020.

Because of his lungs, Luke didn't have a chance to develop normally. He was taken from his mom immediately after he was born. He was intubated and needed to be resuscitated immediately because he wasn't strong enough or was able to breathe effectively on his own. He was brought to the children's hospital, where he was stabilized.

Kayla's medical background helped her understand what was happening to her son, but watching her own kid fight for his life still left a pit in her stomach.

"Luke is probably one of the sickest people I've seen," Kayla said. "It stinks when it's your own kid. I had to prepare Steve and my kids. I would say 'He's going to have these things. He's going to have those tubes. This tube will come out and this is what it's for."

One of the biggest complications of CDH is pulmonary hypertension, which is high blood pressure in the lungs. Because there wasn't much room for Luke's lungs to develop, the vessels that carry blood to the lungs were also smaller and underdeveloped. His heart still had to pump blood to the lungs to get oxygenated but had to do so against much more pressure because the vessels were so small. He was given medicine to help reduce this pressure, however, it's a very delicate and fragile balance. Luke's room was very dim, very quiet with very little stimulation because any sort of agitation could upset or irritate him and put him into crisis.

Luke will likely have a feeding tube for a couple years, until he is able to tolerate feeds in his stomach and ultimately oral feeds. Right now, he is working on getting his oxygen needs down, which will likely take a couple weeks. Once he masters that, Kayla and Luke should get to come home.

"We celebrate the little victories like crazy around here," Kayla said. "The fact that we are talking about home is huge. He's just amazing and moving right along. We will keep plugging along and hope to be home soon."

Once Luke does get home, he will need lots of therapy to work on his feedings. Because he has spent his whole life in a hospital, he will need to do physical therapy and occupational therapy to make sure he meets his milestones with his motor development.

Kayla has been living at the Ronald McDonald house, which is inside the children's hospital. Her room is located on the same floor, so she can be next to her son in less than two minutes if needed. She has not left him for a single day. Kayla has family in Maple

Grove that visits her and takes her to get groceries or personal items.

Steve and the girls visit every couple weeks. Despite COVID restrictions, two parents are allowed in the room. Emma and Adeline have visited their brother three times.

"The hospital has an amazing staff with their Child Life program to keep siblings involved, even from a distance to make sure their visits are special too," Kayla said. "Their first visit, they got to help with Luke's cares, and the Child Life specialist had all the tubes, lines and wires Luke had as spares for

the girls to touch and be reassured he wasn't hurt with those things."

The Olsons have appreciated the community support. They have received cards, letters, gift cards, money, gifts for Luke and gifts for the girls. Their church sent down a car load of food, hand sanitizer, cleaning supplies, paper plates and paper towels for the Ronald McDonald house.

The Mott school raised \$500 during spirit week and donated it to the Olsons. Kayla is from Mott and her mom is the business manager at the school.

"The communities have really rallied around us," Kayla said. "It is truly humbling. We're so thankful. Everybody wanted to know how they could help. We had no real answer for it."

Kayla can feel that their stay in Minneapolis is coming to an end and they can return home soon. Weaning off oxygen is the final step for Luke, something he's working on.


"Unfortunately, that timing is in the hands of a happy and now active four-month old," Kayla said. "It all depends on him and how he handles the weans."
