Our Outdoors

I'll be the first to tell you that I'm a homebody when it comes to the outdoors. It doesn't take much for me to get lost chasing walleyes along the river winding through town, casting after trout in the nearby lakes, or picking off a few hungry bass as summer progresses on nearby waters for largemouths and smallmouths alike. In the fall, I don't travel far for hunting, heading a few minutes northeast for a readily available shot at sharpies in September, and southwest about a tumbler's worth of coffee to chase pheasants in October. My deer permit area in November makes coming home and rolling out just as easy. The things I've learned close to home have always paid off on the road, despite being a reluctant traveler.

I've been lucky to the point in the four places I've called home to feel as if I've had the best of just about everything within an hour's drive or so. As a result, I've been quick to write off a trip anywhere, whether that's for fish or game. It may be the simple joy of multiple panfish on the end of the line in a single outing or knowing that catching the biggest fish in a small lake or stream is good enough for me. The draw of the mountains half a day away just means that's 12 hours less time to actually be catching fish than what I could do practically out of my front door. I'm content crushing cattails and stomping field grass with my lab in the fall, knowing that while populations of birds may be higher elsewhere, the windshield time is far outweighed by the chance to take a shot on the wing nearby and maybe be home in time for lunch with a story to tell. It's truly a "bird in the hand" scenario, or fish or deer, depending on the calendar.

However, there are those places a distance away that have stuck with me. The winding streams through the hilly driftless area of Wisconsin where a buddy and I caught wild brown trout on the fly stick in my outdoor memories like emeralds in a crown.

Leaping smallmouth bass on legendary Lake Erie over Memorial Day weekend punctuated a two-week trial in northwestern Pennsylvania while on a business trip. The menagerie of saltwater species - snook, redfish, mackerel and bluefish – caught along the shores of Florida's gulf coast while there with family have left their marks in my memory book and in my fly box. The spaces and species are so different from home, but to learn them and catch them, I take what I have learned there and again go through the trial-and-error efforts,



Brad's Bites: A Wild Week

It's been a wild week. We were blessed with rains in the northern Red River valley that gave the catfish a fresh drink. However, water levels remain seriously low from Oslo to the south and heavy rains brought Drayton up nearly four feet but the river is quickly falling now. The recent cool temperatures have brought water temperatures from a high of about 68 down into the low 60s. The forecast looks to be cool for the next few days, but this is not a bad thing as it will prolong the prespawn bite.

Catfish have been a bit confused with all the weather and are hanging out in slower current areas and even very shallow. Sit

times have been tough to nail down but it appears that 20-30 minutes is the ticket to decide what is going on. Baits have changed to anything fresh cut this week. When an aggressive fish hits they tend to mean it. There has been some picking and pecking after you catch the aggressive fish. Just move onto another spot rather than wait for those fish to

The river remains extremely low and caution should be exercised when boating (especially below dams) to ensure the safety you and your equipment.



Staigle family facing challenges

Amber Staigle swears she will never tell her son Conley to be quiet again. Ever.

There was a time when Conley was a talkative boy. Now, not so much. Each day Amber longs to hear her son's chatter.

Conley was diagnosed with a brain tumor this spring. The 3-year-old underwent surgery, getting the majority of it removed. He is currently participating in physical, occupational and speech therapy. Conley came out of surgery with physical and speech limitations, but Amber and her husband Dan are hoping and praying their son will emerge back to an active kid.

"He used to talk a lot," Amber said. "I will never tell him to be quiet ever again."

Conley had been in the hospital since April 22. After almost a month, the Staigles were able to return home with their son on May 21.

Medical debt has piled up for the Staigles. A benefit account has been set up at Security First Bank in Center and all its other branches. A fundraiser supper will take place toward the end of June and that date will be announced later. Conley also has a gofundme.com account set up, listed under Superman Conley's Medical

Journey.

"You don't ever think something like this will ever happen to you," Amber said. "Nobody is invincible."

The Staigles noticed Conley started getting hand tremors a little more than a year ago, which made it hard for him to drink from a cup. He was tested for other issues, such as diabetes. Then he developed issues with his eyes, which resulted in him getting fitted for glasses. It's still unknown if his eye problems are connected to the tumor. Shortly after getting glasses, Conley went through a fainting episode.

Conley also struggled sleeping at night. He also had difficulties in walking and the balance on his right side was off, which caused him to fall often. His head hurt - bad. Unknown at the time, the headaches were caused by fluid on the brain.

All of this prompted doctors to run an MRI, which resulted in the discovery of a tumor on his brain stem. The surgery, which was held on April 26, removed all but a sliver of the tumor. A small portion of the tumor remains because it was so close to one of the main arteries of the brain.

'We told the doctor to do what she can," Amber said. "We would like his brain to be as functional as it can be

after something like this. If he would need chemo or radiation, it would be small enough to where that would take care of it. At this point, he's not doing any chemo or radiation, but he will need frequent MRIs to make sure it's not growing.'

On May 10, Conley had another procedure to release fluid and pressure.

The Staigles are waiting for DNA test results from the Mayo Clinic to find out exactly what condition Con-

ley has and what caused it. For now, he's been undergoing lots of therapy to help

During the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Hazen Clinic was designated as the clinic to see patients with respiratory illnesses and the Beulah Clinic designated to see patients with other healthcare concerns.

Effective Tuesday, June 1st, the CCCHC Beulah and Hazen clinics will be transitioning back to normal clinic operations with providers seeing patients for all primary care services at both locations. Patients experiencing respiratory or COVID-19 symptoms will be seen at both Beulah and Hazen clinics.

To ensure the safety of our patients and clinic staff, we ask that you call ahead to schedule an appointment. All patients will be screened appropriately before being seen in the clinic.

his recovery, which results in trips to Bismarck three to five days a week.

"He has significant right side weakness," Amber said. "Walking is hard. When he goes out, he goes in a wheelchair. For a while he was mute, but he's on meds to help with that and his right side. We are taking it day by day.

Physically, Conley isn't independent. His right arm and leg aren't working properly. His left eye lid is shut, but he's able to open it a little bit. His cognition is normal as he can recognize shapes and numbers. He often uses sign language, such as using thumbs up and thumbs down. He's slowly getting his voice back.

"There was a week where we didn't hear anything," Amber said. "His little sweet voice is appreciated."

Amber is a public health nurse and her co-workers donated enough sick time for her to be absent from work until mid June without using time off from the Family Medical Leave Act. Dan is a farmer, so Amber carries the family's benefits. The Staigles have another son named Laramie, 6.

Conley has come out of everything with a great attitude. He put a Superman sticker on his chest and declared he was Superman. which the hospital staff knows him as.

around 22,000 hits, which has resulted from people all around the country sending him notes and prayers.

"Thousands of people are praying for us and our family, and we don't even know half them," Amber said. "We realize there are still a lot of good people in the world."


The Staigles can also work on therapy at home. In addition to Amber being a nurse, they are related to a physical therapist, an occupational therapist and a speech therapist.

"We are very fortunate that family can help us out," Amber said. "At this point we are trying hard to do therapy with him at home."

Amber said a total recovery could take five years. The Staigles will get a better idea on his recovery progress in six months.

"The goal is to get him back to where he can be independent," Amber said. "He doesn't want to quit. We ask him if he's tired or done and he says no. He wants to do everything. We will take it day by day and get what we can out of him.

The Staigles will still need to do a lot of traveling between Bismarck and Fargo to see doctors, but they are fine with that. They just want their son to recover.





Orange you glad you decided to plant carrots?

Gardeners of a particular era will remember pulling a carrot out of the ground, wiping it across their pant leg and enjoying the crunch of the first carrot harvest of the season. Carrots are easy to grow and are the very last crop we pull from our garden in the fall.

There are climates warm enough to store carrots in the ground all winter, but my spouse made me promise never to do that again. He said it wasn't effortless chopping them out of the frozen North Dakota soil.

When people tell me they have no luck with carrots, I can safely assume a few things they are doing incorrectly. First, germination of those tiny seeds takes a little doing, and second, you must thin them early, so they have more room to grow.

Today's carrot is a relative of wild Queen's Anne lace, and that is apparent if you have ever forgotten to dig out a carrot and it goes to seed. Carrots are biennial vegetables and do not produce seeds the first year. However, if you leave that carrot in the ground and it does go to seed, lookout - you will have rogue carrots everywhere.

Before we plant those lovely carrots, we should choose a variety. And there are many varieties of carrots, each with its own set of healthy vitamins. Orange carrots are considered the most

healthy because of alpha and beta carotene, which gives them the orange color. Before cultivated garden carrots were available, a wide array of colors grew in the wild - white, red, yellow and purple.

I love purple carrots, and two of my favorites are Purple Haze or Cosmic Purple, as they are purple through and through. Some carrots only have purple skin that turns orange when heated.

Carrots need well-worked light soil to grow correctly. If your carrots have "legs," your soil is too hard, impenetrable by the root, so it begins to grow in any direction it can. There's nothing wrong with these vegetables, but cleaning takes longer.

Carrots also don't mind a little cold weather and can be planted three weeks before the last frost and harvested after a fall freeze, or in our case, that October blizzard.

Now about planting those tiny seeds. First, wet your furrow well. The moisture will keep those seeds on the ground until you get them covered before our famous North Dakota wind carries them to South Dakota. If you are covering your rows with soil, make sure it is not too deep. Rather than bury my carrot seeds, I use some well-dried and chemical-free grass clippings to cover the rows. This keeps them moist until they germinate, and you can remove

the grass when seedlings are an inch or taller.

Since I love to experiment. which is how gardening works - whatever works for you is the correct way. Someone posted a video on a Facebook group about gel-planting carrots. It sounded ingenious, and I thought I would try it myself.

Soak your carrot seed in water until you can see at least one seed germinate. This will not happen overnight, so plan. Using one tablespoon of cornstarch to one cup of water, cook until thick - you know, as in gravy. Allow to cool. Then drain the water off the carrot seed, mix with the gel in a heavy zip-lock bag and cut off the tip. Pipe the ingredients into the furrow. The seed flows out fairly evenly, and the gel will keep it moist until it settles in. Okay, so I didn't have much luck with the bag; I found a squeeze bottle for frosting, cut the tip a little bigger and like mustard on a hot dog bun, I spread those carrot seeds.

It was so much fun.

After those babies germinate and stabilize, they need room to grow. Thinning row crops was such a painful lesson to learn when I began gardening inde-



carrots. Using manicure scissors, I get down to their level and clip out every other plant. This accomplishes thinning without disturbing the soil and uprooting the ones you are expecting to produce. It also makes some people crazy, lying in the garden like that.

If you garden in a box, select a short fat carrot variety like Scarlet Nantes. Most of those boxes, the ones on the legs, are not too deep. And, go ahead and do it; it's not too late to plant carrots. My mother used to plant her entire garden at the end of May, and everything produced just fine.

Live a little and try planting a

package of rainbow-colored carrots this year. Eat them along the way, but if you wait until after the first good frost to harvest the bulk of them, the flavor will be sweeter. In the fall, we will
