Theater returns with new musical comedy

After a long hiatus, the local community theater organization is returning to the stage this year.

The Sakakawea South Shore Theater is putting together a performance of "The Addams Family." Rehearsals began in mid-May, with performances scheduled for the upcoming week.

Shows will be held Thursday, June 24 through Sunday, June 27. There will be 7 p.m. performances Thursday through Saturday, with the Sunday performance at 2 p.m. All shows will be at the Hazen High School Theater.

"It's been really good," Ashley Schrenk, director, said. "We have a really wide experience range, from first years trying it out to veterans that have done this often."

Kynlee Plienis, from Beulah, is one of the newcomers to the stage this year. She is playing the part of Pugsley Addams.

"I've liked it," she said.
"My favorite part is probably the solo I get to sing."

Tammie Vernon, Hazen, is one of the veterans, but that doesn't mean that this show doesn't have both unique challenges and opportunities for acting.

"Every show asks something different from you than the last one," she said.

Vernon has the role of Alice Beineke, trying to adapt to the bizarre lifestyle of the Addams family. She said one of her favorite moments for her character is dancing on a table.

Schrenk said it's been "re-

"It's also getting to a new generation that has never done this before and get to see why it's so much fun," she added.

As for challenges, Plienis found out particular element of acting to be the most demanding of her.

"Screaming," she said.
"That's been the hardest part."

This year's musical also features a full orchestral soundtrack accompaniment, which is new for the South Shore Theater actors and actresses. But Schrenk said the

group has been very good at adapting to that.

Learning to love basil

In my early gardening years, one of my friends asked me to grow some herb transplants for him. So, of course, I said yes, and then I saw the seed. Most herbs like basil, thyme and rosemary have teeny tiny seeds with an intimidating aura.

Planting large seeds like pumpkin and zucchini, or even seeds the size of peppers and tomatoes, seems more straightforward than keeping track of seeds the size of a pencil lead or small. Take Stevia, for example – those seeds are so tiny they come wrapped in a secondary envelope inside the seed packet.

It was so much fun to see those herbs grow from those tiny seeds. I'm not sure how I did it, but I did. I was hooked. Basil has become a staple in my garden from that point forward. Too bad I'm not too fond of the taste of basil.

That's right. Basil pesto is yuck in my mind. I only grow it because I love the way it smells. And, there are so many types of basil like cinnamon, lemon, licorice, purple and several green varieties. It's fast-growing and produces like crazy. Herein lies the rub.

My basil coughed up a whole colander full of leaves from its first pruning on Sunday. I made a pact with myself not to waste anything from the garden this year. However, it's not time to do farmers markets until July 1, so what could I do with my bounty. I'm also up to my eyeballs in peas and lettuce.

The first week of June, we accepted an invitation to have pizza cooked outdoors in a brick oven at a friend's house while in Fargo for graduation. With a desire to have a wood-fired brick oven of my own someday, I accepted with the hopes of coaxing that same interest in the person who would be building my oven – my husband.

Our hosts made pizza with a sourdough crust topped with sauce, fresh mozzarella and fresh basil. I kind of like it. So after trimming that basil, I decided to

give a few new recipes a try.

Before we go there, how about a bit about basil?
Basil is an aromatic herb (I love the smell) originating in Asia and Africa. Sweet basil is the most commonly grown around these parts.
We are, after all, practical people. However, if you can grow any other varieties, they do have the scent of cinnamon or licorice.

Basil is used in small amounts, so the benefits from its nutrients are minimal apart from Vitamin K. There are studies on how basil can benefit a whole long list of ailments, but today I am mostly concerned with learning to love basil.

Basil grows well in pots, loves warm weather and sun and can be propagated from cuttings. You can dry it for year-round use, and if you prune it properly, it will continue to produce and produce and produce.

Cut basil right below a



stem and put your cuttings in freshwater to keep it fresh. The cold will cause the leaves to discolor, so you may want to leave it on your counter. That way, you won't forget to use it either.

on't forget to use it either. Now, about those recipes. I made a basil jelly (which has yet to set up at the time of my writing this column) and some strawberry



Pour mixture into the freezer can of an ice-cream freezer, and freeze according to the manufacturer's instructions. Spoon sorbet into a freezer-safe container; cover and freeze one hour or until firm.

STAGE 2 BURN BAN OLIVER COUNTY

As of June 10, 2021 Oliver County will be under a Stage 2 Burn Ban until further notice.

RESTRICTIONS:

The following acts are prohibited until further notice:

Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire of any type, to include pit, burn barrel and/or a campfire.

"Note, this change makes it so no fires at all are allowed in the County.

Cities & State Parks will set

restrictions in their jurisdictions as noted in Exemptions below."

- Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site or while stopped in an area at least three (3) feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.
- Welding or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame.
 Using an explosive.

Operating motorized vehicles off designated roads and trails. EXEMPTIONS:

Persons with a written permit that specifically authorizes the otherwise prohibited act.

Persons using a device fueled solely by liquid petroleum

or LPG fuels that can be turned on and off.

Emergency repair of public utilities and railroads.

Persons conducting activities in those designated areas where the activity is specifically authorized by written posted notice.

Any Federal, State or local officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

All land within a city boundary is exempted. "Note: All Cities will set their own Fire Ban Rules as they see appropriate."

Welding or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame.

Welding or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame, with extinguishment capabilities immediately accessible.

Other exceptions unique to each agency/tribe.

AND REMEMBER...

ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN BAN IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10.1) PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF UP TO \$1500 AND 30 DAYS IN JAIL. THE OLIVER COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS ARE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS.

STAGE 1 BURN BAN MERCER COUNTY

As of June 10, 2021 for Mercer County which includes all Cities within the county, will be under a Stage I Burn Ban ONLY WHEN the ND Fire Danger Ratings Map shows high, very high, extreme and/or a Red Flag warning has been issued for Mercer County. A STAGE I BURN BAN MEANS:

No controlled burns, no large pit fires and no burning garbage of any kind.

No throwing cigarette butts or anything out in a grassy area or any area that may start to burn.

No Special burning permission will be given for any reason.

BUT,

You can have a Campfire in a developed recreational site or improved site, while always keeping an eye on it. You can use grills and units that have an on/off switch in an area that you can safely operate without starting a fire.

Remember even though you are allowed some options to burn this doesn't absolve an individual or organization from liability or responsibility for any fire started by the allowed activity.

AND REMEMBER...



On a Mission

Through the valleys and hills of the sporting clays course east of town, we tracked the movements of our five high school shooters logging their final rounds of the season. Sunday's rounds were different, in that they comprised the last 100 targets of the year and the first to be entered into the tournament scoring system for the USA High School Clay Target League (USA CTL), with the inaugural season nearing its completion. Five participants from two schools put on a shooting clinic, with the scores ranging from 79 to 89 on some very challenging stations, many of which have given me fits over the past couple of years. Diligently, I marked down the hits and misses on the scoresheet as we went from station-to-station in the finale. As the tallies mounted, I wondered how many more kids we could accommodate next season, while the group shared smiles and fist bumps as they closed out their season.

While the group was

small, I like to think that's how all big things start. Word spreads quickly through schools, social media and even the oldfashioned way and things begin to grow. It certainly has been the case for high school trap shooting across the country. Where once there were only a handful of teams near Minneapolis when the organization began in 2001, the league has expanded dramatically, especially in the in the last decade, growing from around 3,000 shooters in the Land of 10,000 Lakes in the spring of 2011 to more than 38,000 shooters across 37 states this past season. Even through the pandemic, numbers remained high, despite the cancelation of some schools' seasons and the state tournaments, which thankfully are back on the calendar this spring, not only for trap and skeet but the added disciplines as well; continuing the organization's mission of expansive and inclusive shooting sports.

Sporting clays is one of

the two new offerings added to USA CTL this season, along with the more stationary version, 5-stand. In the latter, shooters still get the experience of targets whizzing across and from behind them, a bouncing rabbit and an incoming floater from eight different stations, mixing things up while staying in a familiar five-post setup. It too, with a combination of single birds and report pairs, tests a shooter's ability to track and crush targets across the range. That group of eight who had logged their tournament rounds earlier in the day included some of our sporting clays shooters, also helped usher in the discipline for our local clay target league. Locally, we've added 50 new shooters this spring, bringing seam-busting totals of 240 strong and including the six local high schools and a college team to our organization. In total, 11 of those shooters participated in the 5-stand season, and for many it was an eye-opening experience. One shooter - a participant who was well

established at the top of his team's rankings in trap - remarked as he logged his final league rounds in 5-stand that he'd never shoot trap again, citing the excitement and variability of the new offering.

It is in those increased options that continued growth is possible. Like sporting clays, 5-stand offers that challenge of something different, a place where experienced shooters can go to find a new mountain to climb, or where new shooters can forge their own path. While facility availability may be the biggest challenge to teams across the country - as sporting clays often requires an area of 40 acres or more, and 5-stand needs a bit more space than a standard trap range – enough exist to meet the moment

ed by the growing throngs of safe and passionate high school shooting sports enthusiasts.

Through this expansion, the greater organization and our local group's mission is clear: more shooters with more opportunities than ever before, all while stressing safety, fun and marksmanship in the process. As a result, a growing new generation of shooters will take the line behind a trap house, the semi-circle of a skeet range, the cages of a 5-stand setup, or the trails of a local sporting clays course. In exchange, the world will be blessed with thousands of young adults who know not only the importance of safe firearm use, but they will also develop the competency with a shotgun required of recreational shooters and ethical hunters. The greatest by-product of this growing program, however, is the confidence developed in a young person that comes with the smashing of more and more orange clays in each round, and the highfives, fist bumps and smiles shared with coaches, classmates and friends that come after...in our outdoors.
