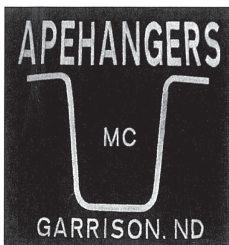

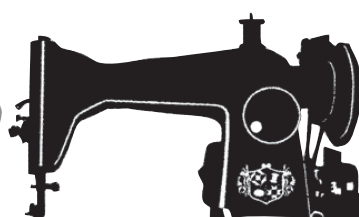

have been known to do that. The reason for my disappearance this week is hay.

Now, I know hay is not real exciting. Hay is not real funny. Hay is not interesting. There is not much you can say about hay. But, as in the “Forrest Gump” movie, when Bubba is talking about shrimp; there is alfalfa hay, CRP hay, slough hay, prairie hay, wet hay, dry hay, haylage, timothy hay....

I have to tell you a little about haying. Fresh cut hay smells nice. It’s the dang cutting that is a nuisance. We are cutting some old hay ground. It is rough. It is real rough. It is full of badger holes, mole hills, vole hills, prairie dog mounds, sagebrush, and other bad stuff. I wish we hadn’t started.

Sometimes I don’t know how Shirley takes it. You start out early in the morning. And

The blood attracts more flies. You look at your watch. It is ten fifteen. Tears begin to form in the corner of your eyes. At ten thirty you start to eye your lunch bucket. Down to 1.8 mph. The ache in your side is starting to build again. Maybe that beer in your lunch bucket will ease the pain.

You reach down and open it. It is shaken up from the molehills and sprays all over the cab. You hit a molehill, drop the beer and it foams all over the floor. Flies like beer better than blood so they leave you alone.

It’s nearly eleven. Beer is gone. Sandwiches are eaten. And you think that maybe you better quit. That hot wind blowing could start a fire if you hit a rock or lose a bearing.

OUR OUTDOORS

Scout Out the Drought

Early last fall, as I rolled up over the hill with my buddy behind me closing out the two-truck caravan in our grouse hunt, I was a bit dismayed to see the stretch of public-access grass from yellow sign to yellow sign completely hayed.

While it wasn’t a big blow to our day, as we each had a couple sharpies in our bags, it did come as a bit of a surprise, and we walked a small swale, which had been spared the baler, but put up no more birds as the onset of early afternoon heat ended our late September walk.

While it had always served as sort of a backup spot, a little bit of scouting earlier on would have crossed it off the list when the season started and shifted the hunt in perhaps a more productive direction. The experience reminded me of the importance of preseason reconnaissance no matter what a person is hunting for.

With the extended heat the region has seen, this fall’s hunting seasons will likely require more scouting than many autumns before. It is also likely that many strands of grass across the region, especially those enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program impacted by the yellow, orange and red blotches that have colored this summer on the drought monitor map,

will be harvested for livestock in short order. That is if they haven’t already been under USDA rules pertaining to emergency haying and grazing.

That makes the coming month the ideal time to check out what habitat remains, and how limited strands of grass change the productivity or walkable areas of a certain parcel of land.

The process is as simple as taking a late summer country cruise to those favorite hunting areas. Whether it’s a quick review of preferred public parcels or checking in with a landowner about the status of private acres hunted in years past, getting the lay of the land and making a plan for fall now and updating it as seasons approach will help prevent any surprises come opening day.

Simply make a note on an atlas, a GPS or smartphone app of current habitat conditions, so you know where to return to and what spots are likely to be unproductive this season.

While scouting, identify alternative habitat areas on various hunting parcels. Are there deeper ravines or cattail sloughs which can’t be cut and will likely provide places for birds to go? Is there a good stand of trees or pockets of brush which might hold game amidst a hayed field?

If so, mark those down as good fallback possibilities in the area as your quarry may concentrate more into what habitat remains after haying. For waterfowlers, it’s likely just as important to get the status on potholes and sloughs at this time of year and whether favorite spots have dried up, or a change in approaching hunts on them is required due to lower shorelines.

Finally, food sources should be considered in scouting efforts as well. While small grains like canola and wheat appear to be doing somewhat well in this dry season, they remain limited on the landscape.

With mourning dove opener just a month away, identifying those small grain stands now, even if they get harvested soon, will provide a good starting point in hunting these early season birds when they fly in each morning and evening for the seeds that don’t make it into the hopper.

Additionally, crops like corn and soybeans, which are more drought sensitive, may not be doing as well this summer. Checking on their status will identify if their fields will be attractive to upland birds, or if they may be in bad shape and unable to be harvested. The height of corn and its quality can also impact deer season, if it doesn’t provide the cover or food it might normally produce.

Keep these factors in mind and get an understanding of how drought conditions may impact hunting spots this fall. From the habitat birds and deer use for loafing and escape cover, to those sloughs and potholes which ducks and geese depend on, things are changing quickly (and could turn on a dime as we’ve seen with sudden wet autumns before).

Make note of those shifts in habitat and where and how food sources are shaping up now to make the most of your hunting later and avoid any surprises over the next rise ... in our outdoors.

Harvest Fresh Herbs to Add Flavor to Your Recipes

PRAIRIE FARE

I pulled some weeds from my raised gardens the other day, and I must have accidentally pulled some basil leaves in my quest.

The unique scent of basil followed me into my house. My daughter commented about the aroma of basil when I walked by.

She likes to gather fresh mint and make hot tea. I like to add mint and basil to ice water to make flavor-infused water.

You can buy fresh herbs in many grocery stores and at farmers markets. You may have a friend with prolific culinary herbs who might share some with you.

Using freshly harvested herbs in cooking tops the taste of dried herbs in just about every instance.

Be a little adventuresome with flavorful herbs. Try preparing a pizza or pasta dish with dried oregano and basil vs. fresh, and you'll see which imparts the most pronounced flavor and aroma.

Make a simple salad of skewered fresh mozzarella,

cherry tomatoes, basil leaves and a drizzle of balsamic vinegar. Your friends will label you a gourmet chef.

Herbs add flavor and negligible, if any, calories and other nutritional value. However, using herbs in cooking can offer some potential health benefits.

Many people find they can cut down on the amount of salt and fat in their recipes when they add herbs. Using less sodium and less fat are good moves toward heart-healthy cooking.

Before using fresh herbs, be sure to rinse them well under running water. Next, use a pair of scissors to snip the herbs or a sharp knife to chop them into tiny pieces.

For optimal flavor, expose as much surface area as possible. For dried herbs, use a mortar and pestle (available in most kitchen supply stores or catalogs) to grind the herbs into a powder.

Here's a rule to remember: Don't overdo herbs in a dish. Use herbs for variety and accent only. Usually one strongly flavored herb alone or paired with one or two more mildly flavored herbs is a better bet. In

recipes calling for dried herbs, substitute a larger amount of fresh herbs.

No two herbs are exactly alike, so generalizing is difficult; however, the usual comparison is 2 teaspoons of fresh herbs equals three-fourths teaspoon of dried herbs equals one-fourth teaspoon of powdered herbs.

Herbs also can be categorized by strength. Strongly flavored herbs include bay, rosemary and sage. About 1 teaspoon per six servings will suffice.

Moderately flavored herbs include basil, dill, mint, marjoram and oregano. Use about 2 teaspoons for every six servings.

Mildly flavored herbs include chives and parsley. These combine well with other herbs and can be used generously.

With the amount of fresh herbs I have, drying or freezing herbs probably is among my future summer endeavors. You can air-dry, oven or dehydrator dry, microwave dry or freeze.

To air-dry, tie the leaves together with string and hang upside down in a well-ventilated, dark place such as a cool basement.

In general, pick plants at their peak, rinse and pat dry. To dehydrator dry, follow the manufacturer's instructions.

Microwave drying usually involves placing bunches of rinsed leaves between microwave-safe paper towels. Microwave on high for 30 seconds at a time, then cool. The leaves should crumble easily when dry.

Store the dried herbs in labeled, air-tight containers such as glass jars. For best flavor, use dried herbs within one year.

To freeze, place rinsed herbs in freezer bags and press out air. Or place chopped herbs in ice cube trays, cover with water and freeze. Pop the ice cubes into labeled freezer bags. Add a cube or two to soups or stews to add flavor. Visit <https://www.ag.ndsu.edu/food> and search for "garden to table herbs" for more information.

Here's a tasty way to enjoy fresh herbs. Experiment with your favorite fresh or dried herbs. Add a little at a time. This goes well with warmed slices of French bread or crisp crackers.

Herbed Cream Cheese

- 1 lb. low-fat cream cheese
- 1/2 lb. butter
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1/4 tsp. white pepper
- 1/2 tsp. chopped fresh basil leaves
- 1/4 tsp. chopped fresh marjoram leaves (optional)
- 1/8 tsp. chopped fresh thyme leaves (optional)

Place cream cheese and butter in food processor or mixer. Add minced garlic and herbs and blend. Store the spread in the refrigerator and allow to soften before serving. Serve with bread or crackers.

Makes 24 servings (about 2 tablespoons each). Each serving has 110 calories, 12 grams (g) fat, 2 g protein, 0 g carbohydrate, 0 g fiber and 140 milligrams sodium.

The Joy of Discovery DAKOTA GARDENER

In years past, June was probably my biggest travel time.

At the end of the month, I would come home and re-introduce myself to my wife. This year, July's been awfully busy. As the song says, "I've been everywhere, man."

I'm always on the lookout for unique tree species, no matter where I am. I've seen some exceptional trees this month. One was wild-grown, in its natural environment, while the others have been planted. I know this might sound weird, but I'm always excited at the thrill of discovery, even when other people are doing the discovering.

A single American linden in the Turtle Mountains, in the North Dakota Forest Service's Hartley Boundary Primitive Area (<https://www.ag.ndsu.edu/ndfs/hartley-boundary-primitive-area>) - In the North Dakota State Herbarium, curated at NDSU, American linden never has been recorded further west than Benson County. I hope we find more lindens in the Turtle Mountains in the next few years.

A large and beautiful northern catalpa tree in Grand Forks - Northern catalpa do OK in southern North Dakota,

south of I-94. North of that line, northern catalpa tends to struggle. Nevertheless, there it was, looking great in someone's yard. I love the blossoms on northern catalpa in the spring. They're absolutely amazing.

Old Norway spruce trees and Douglas-fir trees on farmsteads near Crystal, N.D. - While I've seen many Rocky Mountain Douglas-fir around the state, this was one of the few times that I saw Norway spruce. The trees were big, perhaps 50 or 60 feet tall. I saw some young Norway spruce in Manning, N.D., as well. Exciting!

Of course, NDSU has its Woody Plant Improvement Program. Beyond that, we have a lot of other tree experimenters throughout the state, and they're working with unique species and have found some amazing trees:

A burgundy bur oak - A few years ago, a friend planted a bunch of bur oak seedlings. One turned out to have burgundy-colored leaves. I saw it for the first time this month, and it was amazing! It was near sunset, so I didn't get a great look at it, but the leaves were clearly not green. What a discovery!

Pecans? - Yes! A man in Bismarck has been working with hickories and pecans for more than 35 years. Getting a crop from a species that's native to the central and southern U.S. is awfully hard to do in

Bismarck, N.D. Nevertheless, he's had some success and even gave us a couple of pecan seedlings that we're trying this year at the Myra Arboretum near Larimore. I can't wait to see what happens.

Hazelnuts - Dan Johnson of Horace has been growing hazelnuts for more than 40 years. He breeds them and has produced many hybrids that produce great nut crops. His story is fascinating: <http://riverbendhazelnuts.blogspot.com/p/introduction.html>.

Are you an experimenter with trees? I wish you the best. Trees take a long time to mature, and they can be a very costly investment.

Believe it or not, my wife experiments with trees, too. Right now, we have a 4-foot avocado tree growing in a pot outside by the deck. She sprouted a seed several years ago and the tree looks great. It even flowered last year, but I really don't expect we'll get any fruit from it. But it's a great experiment and a lot of fun! Through the years, I guess I've rubbed off on her.

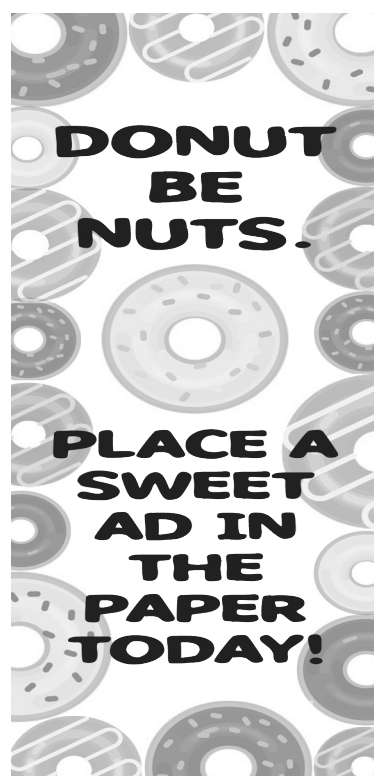
