



Try Hunting Doves This Season

Want to take someone new hunting this fall? If so, the upcoming dove season offers a great opportunity to introduce a new hunter to North Dakota's outdoors.

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department has a Virtual Dove Hunting Mentor webpage with all the basics, including license

requirements, regulations, gear recommendations and tips for finding a place to hunt.

The season opens Sept.1 and continues through Nov. 29.

All dove hunters regardless of age must possess a general game and habitat license, and hunters 16 and older need a small game license.

Hunters are also reminded

to register with the Harvest Information Program prior to hunting any migratory game birds, including doves. Those who already HIP registered prior to hunting the spring light goose or August management take/early September Canada goose seasons in North Dakota do not have to register with HIP

Lower Water Levels Require Caution at Ramps

drought will likely begin to impact boating access throughout the state. With that in mind, boat owners need to be aware of water levels and exercise patience and caution when launching and loading a boat.

Fisheries development supervisor Bob Frohlich said

The ongoing extreme as water levels decline, the bottom of many ramps lack sufficient water to launch boats and/or cause the ramps to become exposed. In many cases, he said boat ramps have large prop-wash holes and steep drop-offs at the bottom, which can damage boat trailers and axles if backed off the end of the cement.

"Boaters should back their trailer in slowly and be aware of the end of the ramp on lakes with lower-than-normal water levels," Frohlich said. "And it's likely that some lakes could still lose another 1-2 feet of water this year given the extremely dry conditions."

commissioned by the city of Fargo as part of an ongoing public arts program. With the theme "Fargo Commerce" on his mind, he started work.

After eight months of sketching, revisions, and painting, Gunvaldson completed his task — a 45-foot mural for the Fargo Skywalk. The mural was transported from Fergus Falls and mounted in the Skywalk, wallpaperstyle, in September of 2005. Located approximately 500 feet from the Prairie Public television and radio studios, the mural overlooks Broadway Street, with commuters and downtowners passing by

underneath. The mural reads like a

Dakota Datebook written Who's Who in Gunvaldson's life. To quote the artist, "Both of my daughters are in the September 1, 2021 — painting—my oldest daughter Artist Scott Gunvaldson was is the most prominent figure in the technology section. My youngest daughter is sitting at a table with her friends in the entertainment/arts section. Many of her friends are in other sections of the mural as is a representation of my parents. A couple of my close musician friends are portrayed as musicians in the entertainment/arts section." By painting family and friends into the lengthy mural, Gunvaldson truly made it a labor of love.

Standard Procedure

"Now, you get to do the strap up on top of it," I said with a laugh as on my tip toes I cranked hard on the ratchet which secured the stabilizing pole of my buddy's new deer stand to his chosen tree, putting a pair of red lines into my palm, which suggested the brace was secure.

It was his first experience with the process of dragging the awkward combination of seat and ladder into the brushy bottom, as from season-toseason, a case of grass-isgreener syndrome and greater awareness of deer movements on the properties I've hunted have resulted in my shifting of hunting perches around on an almost annual basis.

More importantly, it was his first time scaling such a contraption to stand nearly 20 feet in the air. Having the both of us together for the morning effort made the most recent process more tolerable than my usual struggles of breaking my stands down and dragging them through the brush, grass and fields single-handedly.

The most recent being back at the start of July on an off day that just happened to coincide with sweltering he processed the project and morning temperatures and locked it down, then turned

thick humidity, with a dash of airborne smoke to make things interesting. Moving the stand from one draw to another, where I had just seen so many more deer last autumn, was a process, but one I knew I had to get done before mid-summer.

A far cry from that sweatdrenched effort, this weekend's northwest winds brought hints of fall on the cool Canadian air funneling down through the river valley and made the process almost pleasant by comparison.

We assembled the last two segments of ladder in the field and flipped the stand over about four feet from the base of the mid-sized cottonwood which overlooked the junction of four distinct deer trails, two of which already showed early morning use in the sandy soils dotted with the split-hoof tracks of a does and fawns.

Together we wedged the base of the stand into the ground before angling it up into the air rung-by-rung, until it teetered unsteadily straight above us and came crashing forward into the trunk of the tree, resting soundly against the dead branches along its midsection. From there we went to work, locking it in

My buddy nervously scaled the ladder as I held it and instructed him on how to attach the hook of the strap along the angled metal with pointed teeth designed to dig into the bark before tossing it around the trunk and catching it so it could be fed into the ratchet on the other side.

In a workmanlike manner,

and sat in the fabric sling of the seat before tying on the tow rope and attaching the safety strap above his head for his harness to clip on to when the season starts.

Having never seen such a view before — only getting serious about the hunt after a very successful autumn last year — he asked me: "How do you get used to being 18 feet in the air and then doing everything you need to do to take the shot, especially with an increased heart rate.

I laughed and informed him of my fear of heights and told him none of my stands are over

"But what a view you have from up there," I said with a chuckle, standing near the point where the four trails came together in the meadow.

Cautiously he descended from the perch and we packed up the wrench and drill, excess camo fabric and the shooting bar we opted to remove from the stand to make his draw a little bit easier and to eliminate an unnecessary noise-maker.

With what remained of our efforts in tow, we plotted a stealthy entrance and exit path that didn't cross the main travel corridors and recorded it on his GPS for opening day of archery season, now less than two weeks away. With the following day's rain forecasted to wash our morning's worth of scent away and everything in place for the opener, it was a good feeling to know he was set for autumn and continued good deer hunting ... in our outdoors.

The East and the West

DAKOTA GARDENER

Last week, my wife and I took some time off to visit my family in Ohio.

While we were there, I checked out the trees and the forests (of course!). Of course, my little nieces and nephews have changed since we were last there, but how have the forests changed since I was

In all ecosystems, change is constant, but often is really has had emerald ash borer (EAB) for more than 15 years and most of the ash trees are gone, although a few still linger. Other trees - the sugar maples and oaks, especially – are huge. My hometown averages nearly 46 inches of rain each year. With that amount of precipitation, the trees grow amazingly fast.

North Dakota gets relatively little precipitation, so it's dominated by prairies. The forests that we do have are not nearly as diverse as those where I grew up. But that's OK. The eastern forests and western forests come together in North Dakota in fascinating

Riparian forests – those

found along rivers and streams - are found throughout the state. In some places, these waterways support only the smallest willows, while other places are dominated by massive cottonwoods.

American elm is found less commonly now in these forests, replaced by green ash, hackberry, boxelder and American linden. The riparian forests help protect the rivers and streams, keeping the banks in place and providing habitat for myriad wildlife

Other pockets of unique forest can be found in the broader prairie landscape:

Black ash - Black ash is a tree found in the swamps of the eastern U.S. and Canada. In North Dakota, we have a pocket of black ash between the communities of Cavalier and Walhalla. The area where they're located follows a line of subirrigated soils that emerge from the Pembina Escarpment. Black ash wood makes beautiful paneling and it's also been used by native peoples for constructing baskets.

Limber pine – Limber pine is a western forest tree, often found at higher elevations. However, we have an isolated

stand of limber pine in southwestern North Dakota, in Slope County. The area is small, only about 200 acres. This is the lowest-elevation stand of limber pine, at about 2,850 feet above sea level. This unique area has been studied intensively through the years. The early research looked at the ages of the trees and their distribution, while more recent research has focused on a disease – white pine blister rust. The limber pines are on U.S. Forest Service land and the area has been designated as a Research Natural Area.

Other unique areas of forest are found throughout the state. Visit the oak savannahs found in the sandhills of the Sheyenne National Grassland outside of Lisbon.
