Area newspapers change hands

Family newspaper group sells to another family newspaper group

Three area newspapers and a shopper were sold this week by BHG Inc. to NorDak North Publishing, owned by J. Louis Mullen. The company took over ownership this week of the McLean County Independent, Leader-News, Central McLean News-Journal, XTRA and Viking Screen Prints.

J. Louis Mullen lives in Buffalo, Wyo., with his wife and children. He owns weekly newspapers in North Dakota, South Dakota, Michigan, Oregon, Iowa and Washington. He grew up in the industry, starting as a paperboy for the Sioux City Journal at four years old and served in every position in a newspaper from janitor to reporter to publisher.

Kelsey Majeske is the publisher of the North Dakota, South Dakota properties. Majeske currently publishes weekly newspapers in Beulah, Hazen, Center, Linton, Lisbon, Casselton, Mayville, Milnor and in South Dakota, Pollock,

Mobridge, Gettysburg and Eagle Butte.

Sister company, NorDak Central Publishing, purchased the Beulah Beacon, Hazen Star, Center Republican and Coal Country Dollar Saver from BHG in April 2021.

During the last nearly 60 years, BHG Inc. – owned by Mike Gackle and Jill Denning Gackle – operated 11 newspapers and three shoppers, beginning with McLean County Independent in 1963, which was established by Don Gackle, Mike's father; The McClusky Gazette was sold in 2021 to Editor Allan Tinker. New Town News and Mountrail County Record were sold to Editor Jerry Kram in 2020. The Northern Sentry and Velva Area Voice were sold to Ted and Margie Bolton of Minot in 2018. In the 1980s, BHG owned the Roundup, a shopper based in Sidney, Montana.

Today, the Garrison office prints more than 40

newspapers on a weekly basis, as well as real estate guides, magazines and books. BHG Inc. employed more than 90 employees at one time, but at the time of the sale this week, there were 35 full and part-time employees.

Mike Gackle, BHG Inc. president, said, "Years ago, Don coined the phrase 'A Family of Family Newspapers' and it stuck. The newspaper staffs of this region have been family to us. They've produced high quality award-winning newspapers that served the readers and advertisers well. We're confident they'll continue to be in good hands under new ownership."

The Gackles will continue to live in rural Garrison. Mike is active in Better Living for Garrison and Garrison Area Improvement Association. Jill is active in the North Dakota Newspaper Association Education Foundation and a newly formed 501(c)3, North Dakota News Cooperative.

Fish and Wildlife Service

DAKOTA GARDENER

Dakota Datebook written by Lane Sunwall

March 7, 2022 — From the stubble fields of fall farmland to the grass-lined pools of water dotting the state's prairie, North Dakota is widely recognized for its excellent hunting and fishing opportunities. The abundance of deer, pheasants, grouse, ducks, geese, and even the occasional mountain lion, serve as a testament to the state's natural bounty. The federal organization dedicated to the preservation of these North Dakota natural wonders is the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

The history of the Fish and Wildlife Service stretches back to two separate government programs created in the later half of the 19th century. The first, the U.S. Commission on Fish and Fisheries, was created in 1871 by Congress inside the Department of Commerce

to investigate the declining numbers of fish numbers in U.S. waters. Fourteen years later in 1885 the Division of Economic Ornithology and Mammalogy, later known as the Bureau of Biological Survey, was established within the Department of Agriculture to study the effects birds had in controlling pests and also to document the geographical distribution of plants and animals throughout the United States.

In 1903 the Bureau was given another task by former North Dakota resident Theodore Roosevelt, the preservation of the first national wildlife refuge, Pelican Island, Florida.

From 1939 through 1940, the U.S. Commission on Fish and Fisheries and the Bureau of Biological Survey were combined under the Department of the Interior into one program, the Fish and Wildlife Service. Along with

state and local organizations, the Service began addressing the decline in wildlife in states like ND, where hunting excess and pervasive drought in previous decades had damaged their numbers.

The Fish and Wildlife Service reported on the initial success of their programs in an official announcement released on this day, March 7, 1941. The number and habitat of many animals and game birds such as pheasants, sharp-tail, grouse, waterfowl were rebounding. Today, the Fish and Wildlife Service manages 62 National Wildlife Refuges in North Dakota, the highest number in any state, as well as the 12 Wetland Management Districts. All totaled these refuges and wetland districts protect over 1.3 million acres of North Dakota beauty.

Besides the preservation

How's your Parenting? Is it Human?

I usually start all of my parenting classes with my "perfect parenting" speech which usually goes something like this:

"There is no such thing as a perfect parent because we are all imperfect humans. Every person in this room has ways they can improve their parenting. Parenting is a continual journey with new things to learn about our kids and ourselves for our whole lifetime. There are hundreds of ways to raise great kids."

What I would like to add to this speech is to get rid of the "good" parenting and "bad" parenting labels. Why? These labels are completely dependent on the opinions of each person. The labels also bring about lots of feelings of shame which often don't motivate people to self-reflect on ways they can improve as a parent. Let's try to replace those "good" parenting and "bad" parenting labels with better descriptive words.

The National Institute of Child Health and Human Development has identified the following words to describe parenting: active parenting, effective parenting, consistent parenting, and attentive parenting and we can be those types of parents through what that National Institute calls the RPM3: respond, prevent, monitor, mentor, and model.

Respond: Responding is different from our first reaction. Responding is taking a moment to think about the kinds of words we want our kids to hear and the actions we want them to see. Thoughtful responses take our

brain power. Our thoughtless reactions are what comes out when we are frustrated or annoyed. When you are able to respond with a thoughtful question ("How do you feel about how your school work is going?) after a particularly difficult parent teacher conference, you are showing your child you are attentive to what they think and are an active member of their life. We also are able to improve our consistency and the effectiveness of our parenting when our kids aren't worried about the reaction they will get from their parents.

Prevent: As parents, we can start preventing unsafe situations from the moment they are born. Car seats, outlet covers, and moving electrical cords all are examples of ways we prevent accidents in our homes and in the communities. As children get older, parents can make boundaries for their kids regarding bedtime, screen time, friends, activities and substance use to protect the overall health of the child. Please know that every parent has problems that arise with their children, and one of the best things you can do is to seek help from others. Chances are another parent has gone through exactly what you have, and support, listening and encouragement can help parents prevent further unsafe situations with their kids.

Monitor, mentor and model will wait for my next article writing opportunity, as I want to be able to explain these without worrying about my word count.

In the meantime, at the end of your day, ask yourself: "How did I respond to my kids today? Was I patient or annoyed? Did I listen or did I rush? Did I assume or did I ask questions? Did I do my best to make sure my kids were safe today? How can I be better at responding to my child tomorrow? How can I help encourage another parent tomorrow?"

I am cheering you on, dear parents. This parenting gig is tough, but those kids are worth it and they love you.

Young Anglers

In the dreamsicle light of dusk on the backwater bay, I led a line of young anglers out onto the snow-covered water in hopes that a few willing crappies would fill the couple of hours between our afternoon of sledding and a planned pizza dinner back at the cabin.

The line, however, was longer this time as my oldest son and the three kids of two of my wife's friends joined me. Among them was my godson, Gavin, and his younger brother, Lincoln, now three years older than when I had last seen them and five years older than when we had last fished together.

That pairing was my first trial run as an ice fishing mentor, as Gavin then at age five, and I, sought crappies and bluegills on the ice of a small farm pond west of where I used to live, and his brother joined us for a couple winters thereafter before I moved away. In the fading sunset, I eyeballed a spot along the channel's bend against the near shoreline and punched a hole, calling out to Gavin to grab the Vexilar and asking if he remembered how to use it.

Assuring me he had plenty of experience since our last fishing trip together, he yelled out a depth of 18 feet as I created a couple more slushy cones in a nearby line and he noted a rise up the channel edge. We popped the hubs out of the oversized thermal tent and set it up, punching holes for bobber rods and kicking out the legs of the bench seat the younger anglers would join us on. After sliding the shack into place, I set about adjusting the bobber stops on an assortment of rods, keying the dangling minnows to a foot off the bottom in the hole just outside the shack,

about the right height from memory from previous seasons spent fishing the bay.

I had hoped the success would be similar but was happy just for some ice time with old students and new ones. With each slide of the string and adjustment of foam, Gavin was there to take the rod from my hand and deploy it inside the blue-sided tarp house for the already antsy younger anglers waiting for the evening to begin.

"Remember when I used to do that for you," I asked him as I handed another rod over, recalling our times on the hardwater of southwestern Minnesota, "and I remember when you made the switch from the float to the Vexilar, watching my spring bobber for a hit from those crappies," I continued as he chuckled in recognition, running the last of the combos into the icehouse. Making certain my son and his newest angling buddy Kaiden had their bobbers in place, lights properly hung and illuminating the shack for our efforts, I sat next to Gavin and dropped the

transducer down alongside his line and set my jig in the adjacent hole.

Despite the change in location, the crowd of young anglers with us, and the astounding growth of a kindergartener into a teenager, it all felt so familiar as together we watched the screen and a fish rolled in below my jig and the small spoon he was working. Taken back in time, I recommended a jiggle and pause presentation as the fish rose and I reminded him to watch the tip of his rod as the line engulfed his stalled lure on the screen. The last eyelet jumped, and before I could say "get him," Gavin set the hook on the fish below. A green-and-gold crappie came up the hole and he lifted it for the rest in the house to see and completed for me the memory reborn as reality a half decade from our last fishing trip.

While the crappie wasn't quite the foot-long slabs we had come to expect from what he and his brother now refer to as "the secret pond," it was perhaps the most significant fish of the season for me as the realization

that the young angler I had mentored had now become a mentor to others, a solid right-hand-man on the ice when I would likely need to call on him again, and ultimately, a capable sportsman in his own right. Pushing through the finicky fish that remained, together with Lincoln we helped the two younger ice anglers stave off boredom as we passed the puck of the Vexilar around and showed them the fish moving below, but frustratingly not biting. Up until we received the dinner bell text from the cabin, together we passed on information, experience, and sometimes just the silly stories we had in days gone by of wet boots, stuck trucks, and wild fishing.

The fact that Gavin told more stories than I did, and the lone crappie he pulled up was enough to make it one of the most memorable outings of the year, if only for the chance to experience the coming full circle of my efforts and the enduring hope that it will continue turning ... in our outdoors.

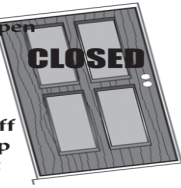


