OUR OUTDOORS

Turn of Phrase

I've never been much for coincidences, believing that all things are connected, particularly those in the natural world. While luck, chance and odd occurrences do exist, everything happens for a reason. Preparing for a long weekend trip to see friends in northern California and the redwood trees near the state's northern border, the phrase that kept running through my head, as we prepared for the air travel and drive up the coast to see the towering giants was: "better do it before they're gone."

It's a pessimistic way of looking at our natural world, and as a conservationist, I hate the negative connotation it carries. It's as if we're unable to save something so towering, and beautiful, and important that we'd better just take it all in before it's gone, leaving nothing behind beyond the text on a webpage or faded print on a folded newspaper in a trunk.

Times being what they are, however, with noted drought conditions throughout the west coast and much of the western United States, hydrological issues, and so many other headline-grabbing events beyond conservation it's easy to get sucked into that mentality.

That was more so the case when chatting with our flight attendant on the descent of our first leg of the trip. We

discussed the current state of air travel, the return to somewhat normal conditions following the pandemic, and the not-so-normal ones her colleagues were facing in Europe this spring. When we turned to my world, and reasons for travel, she responded to my destination and our family's plans with: "good, you really should see them" then quietly as an aside with a zinging mix of sarcasm and acknowledgement of world affairs with a closing "...before they're gone."

Shocked by the identical statement that had served as the propelling reason for my trip, it became obvious I'm not the only one thinking that way about our amazing natural world, but whether a cities-based flight attendant or an avid hunter and angler, it's not hard to get pulled into that thought pattern.

Chronic wasting disease, drought, and the prospect of lacking water this spring close to home are a microcosm of national and world-wide natural issues which parallel the sedimentation and low flows that have led to annually decreasing salmon runs on the Eel River I read about as we made our way up the coast of northern California, and how climate change may impact the flow and its surrounding forests.


At the entrance to the Ladybird Johnson Grove in the Redwood National Forest, we were greeted by a towering redwood, which was really just a young one compared to some of the sequoias and coastal species that were more than 2,000 years old still scattered about the state. The old scar of a saw blade marked its trunk, as if this was where the logging which felled thousands of other old growth redwoods sixty years ago stopped in mid-stroke, sparing the giant as the final shift whistle blew

for the lumberjack crew. The land around the grove had been cleared almost completely as the old image on the information placard showed the former first lady on the edge of a jagged and bald hillside.

Behind her, outside of the frame was the edge of the park and the grove of redwoods named in her honor. As we walked the loop and my boys played on the trunks of the protected trees and the stumps of those that had fallen after several centuries, the guided tour read aloud by our family friend explained the life cycle of the redwood. Through fires, droughts and winter windstorms long before humankind, the first peoples, and even those seeking gold had arrived in the area, the trees had evolved and survived as blackened and hollowed trunks still amazingly held their green branches aloft hundreds of feet in the air.

Even following the clear-cutting of the 1900s, young redwoods found their way skyward and a new generation of trees began to rise on the landscape. Through conservation efforts of the old growth areas, and protections for the new ones learned from the digital tour on our walk about the loop of 1.5 miles, I began to realize that I would not outlive these trees and they would likely be here long after me, conditioned to deal with fire, dry conditions, and the other threats they've been facing and protected from the ones we might present.

Somewhere along the trip, in my readings of articles and listening to stories about the region, and conservation in general, another phrase turned up amidst the towering trunks,

Country Kitchen Recipes

BLUEBERRY BREAKFAST BUNDT CAKE

Ingredients

- 2 c blueberries, frozen (thawed) or fresh
- 1 tbs all-purpose flour, to coat blueberries before adding to mix
- 2 3/4 c all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp salt
- 3/4 c butter, unsalted, room temperature
- 2 c granulated sugar
- 4 eggs, room temperature
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/4 c vegetable oil
- 1 c sour cream, full fat, room temperature

Glaze

- 1 c powdered sugar
- 3-5 tsp milk, pour in a little bit of milk at a time, constantly stirring. The more milk will make the consistency more runny.

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°F. Add the blueberries and 1 tablespoon of flour to a mixing bowl and toss together until all of the blueberries are coated with the flour. Set aside.

In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Set aside. In another large mixing bowl, beat the butter and sugar for about 4-5 minutes until light and fluffy.

Mix in the eggs one at a time until well combined, then mix in the vanilla. Add oil.

Add the dry ingredients, alternating with the sour cream in small amounts. Add the blueberries and stir carefully with a spatula.

Spray a 10-inch bundt pan well with nonstick cooking spray. Pour the batter into the prepared bundt pan and evenly spread it around.

Bake at 350°F for 50-65 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the cake comes out clean. Cover loosely with foil if needed for the last 5-10 minutes of baking to prevent excess browning.

Remove from the oven and cool. Turn upside down onto a cooling rack. Once cooled, place on a platter and drizzle with glaze.

STRAWBERRY CHEESECAKE DIP

Ingredients

- 8 oz softened cream cheese
- 1/4 cup melted butter (cooled)
- 1 cup Funfetti cake mix
- 3/4 cup powdered sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1/4 cup chopped strawberries
- Optional: mix-ins, we used Toll House new morsels

Directions

Place the Funfetti mix in the microwave for 2 minutes or until it reaches 165F using a food thermometer (this kills the bacteria). Cream together the cream cheese, butter and vanilla. Then mix in your Funfetti cake mix and powdered sugar. Fold in the chopped strawberries and any mix ins. Serve and Enjoy.

Watering and Waiting

If you are reading this article, I hope you have stuck with me and listened to my advice on starting seeds. By now, you may have started a few seeds and your other seeds are waiting patiently in the wings. My oregano and thyme have been seeded, and I am patiently awaiting the first seedlings to emerge.

While we are waiting to start more seeds, let's discuss watering and fertilizing your seedlings.

Watering seedlings indoors can be somewhat more complicated than watering plants in the garden or in containers outdoors. Indoors, soil moisture levels may not change very fast, or they might vary more depending on your growing setup. Fortunately, it is easy to monitor the moisture levels while you are looking to see what seedlings have popped up every day!

Water is essential for plants and helps roots to take up nutrients for plant growth. The

roots need a mixture of both water and air in the potting soil to grow. Potting soil should be moist but not soggy. Too much water will decrease the amount of air in the media and lead to water-logged potting soil, which can result in seedling death, not how we want to start the growing season.

So how do you keep your seedling potting soil at just the right soil moisture level? The trick is letting the water and potting soil to do the work for you.

Did you know water is sticky? Water will stick to itself and to other particles, like those found in potting soil. We can use this characteristic to our advantage by simply watering our seedlings from the bottom up.

Regardless of what containers you use to grow your seedlings, the bottom should have holes for water drainage and be placed in a container to collect the excess water. Resulting in a route for the potting soil to take-up water. Instead of watering from the top, simply pour water in the container meant to collect excess water and wait for the

media to pull up the water. You might have to add water several times as the water moves up the potting soil in the containers. Be sure to give the potting soil an hour or so to soak up the water and then drain the excess water from the bottom container.

Along with watering comes the application of fertilizer. Seedlings have all the food they need stored in their seed leaves until the plant can start producing its own food. Seedlings will benefit from water-soluble fertilizer applications, just not right away.

Wait to apply fertilizer until after the seedlings have several sets of true leaves. True leaves are leaves that grow after the first set leaves emerge from the potting soil. You can apply fertilizer at quarter- or half-strength for the first couple of applications and then fertilize at full strength.

I sure hope all our patience pays off this summer. I have had to remind myself to slow down more than once! Happy gardening!

Historic Impact of Public Health

Life expectancy is a measure commonly considered when it comes to the overall health of a population. In this day and age, when most of us think about which medical interventions are most important to increase life expectancy, we probably think about things like treatment of cancer, interventions to treat heart attacks, or surgeries for life threatening illnesses. While those things are all important, their overall impact on a population's life expectancy pales in comparison to the prevention of infectious disease.

Average life expectancy around the world has doubled in the last two hundred years, from about 40 years to 80 years, with the bulk of that change occurring long before we had

effective cancer treatment or cardiac catheterization. Before the 20th century, infant and childhood death was extremely common due to infections spread by contaminated water and food. It is estimated that through most of human history nearly half of children died before adulthood, almost entirely due to infections.

Armed with the new knowledge of germ theory, societies in the late 1800's began instituting early public health interventions such as sewage management, water treatment, milk pasteurization, and garbage collection, which resulted in rapid decreases in death from food and water borne infections, and thus increased population wide life expectancy.

Later, widespread use of vaccines for many fatal diseases led to enormous improvements in the health and longevity of populations across the globe.

Try to imagine a world in which almost everyone is affected by the death of children due to polio, measles, smallpox, tetanus, the list goes on. That these deaths are now extremely rare or eliminated altogether is nothing short of a modern miracle, and we ought not take it for granted.

Antibiotic use has exploded since the discovery of penicillin in 1928, and the proper use of antibiotics continues to help us prevent early death due to infections that might have been fatal left untreated. Modern science has led to effective treatments for even the most challenging infections such as tuberculosis and HIV.

Modern medicine uses abundant, wonderful technologies and treatments which help us extend lives and reduce suffering of our individual patients. But



A seedling is a start. A

pair of spawning salmon is hope. And the first few drops of rain after the drought is a turn in the right direction.

Whether we hunt the woods or the rolling plains, fish the waters that flow through them, or simply enjoy walking amidst the grasses and trees available to us, we must work to be sure they are here long after our stories have been written and it is incumbent upon us to make sure that nature can maintain, or better yet, improve on what we have left, to be certain that we are the ones outlived by the tallest of trees, the annual returns of fish and those places most special ... in our outdoors.

Prairie Dog Velcro DAKOTA DATEBOOK

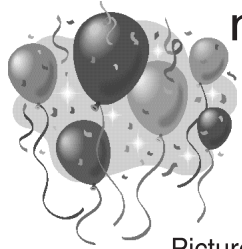
April 1, 2022 — Today marks the day that genetic researcher-turned entrepreneur Cy Ludovicianus started his ranch west of Betrugen in Dupřr County. There he does not raise the usual cattle or horses – or even bison or emu. Instead he is raising prairie dogs. But these are bioengineered prairie dogs whose fur has been genetically modified to emulate the hooks and loops of – Velcro!

According to Dr. Cy, as he's called, he has engineered the males to have the Velcro hook fur and the females to have the loop type. One problem, so far, has been that the animals become fastened to each other. The scientist says it's quite a sight to see them running

around in tandem, but the fact that they can't get through their burrow entrances while, as he calls it "hooked up" has caused an increase in predation that is troublesome. Nonetheless, he hopes for a bright future for this newest North Dakota industry.

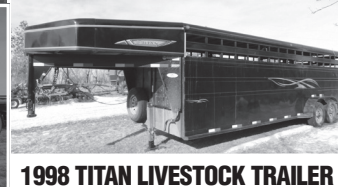

This decision may be appealed to the Interior Board of Indian Appeals, 801 North Quincy Street, Suite 300, Arlington, Virginia 22203, following 43 CFR, 4.310 - 4.340.

Your notice of appeal must be signed by you or your attorney and must be mailed within 30 days of the date it is posted. It should clearly identify the decision being appealed. If possible, attach a copy of the decision. Your notice of appeal sent to the Interior Board of Indian Appeals must certify that you have sent copies to these parties.

If you file a notice of appeal, the Interior Board of Indian Appeals will notify you of further appeal procedures. If no appeal is timely filed, this decision will become final for the Department of the Interior at the expiration of the appeal period. No extension of time may be granted for filing a notice of appeal.
